THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: Sept. 9

2000 - The Astros belt a club-record home runs in a 14-4 win at Wrigley Field...Tim Bogar, Richard Hidalgo and Lance Berkman each homer twice while Darvle Ward adds a solo shot.

1987 - Nolan Rvan notches his 4.500th strikeout during a 4-2 victory over San Francisco...**Mike Aldrete** is the milestone victim in the 7th...Ryan end up with 16 strikeouts.

1967 - Jimmy Wynn becomes the 1st player in franchise history to reach 100 RBI in a 5-3 win at Dodger Stadium...Wynn goes 3x4 with 2 home runs and 2 RBI.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros will continue ERA LEADERS: The Astros own the best team this season-long, 11-day, 10-game road trip through Oakland (0-2), Anaheim and Texas with the finale of this 3-game series with the A's tonight...RHP Collin McHugh (15-7) will start for the Astros opposite A's starter RHP Aaron Brooks (1-1).

DIVISIONAL GAMES: Tonight, the Astros will play game 3 of a 22-game stretch against AL Western division opponents...on the season, Houston is 29-27 against the AL West: Seattle (10-6), Oakland (7-8), Los Angeles (8-5) and Texas (4-8).

WE HAVE A WINNER: RHP Collin McHugh is 22-7 with a 3.20 ERA (85ER/239IP) in his last 37 starts, dating back to Aug. 1, 2014...since that date, he ranks tied for 2nd in the Majors in wins trailing only **LHP Madison Bumgarner** (23-9).

DYNAMIC DUO: RHP Collin McHugh (15-7) and LHP Dallas Keuchel (17-6) have combined for 32 wins, the most by any pair of teammates in the Majors this season...the last time the Astros had 2 pitchers with at least 15 wins in the same season was in 2005 with **RHP Roy Oswalt** (20-12) and LHP Andy Pettitte (17-9).

INTHE STANDINGS: At 75-64 (.540), the Astros are in 1st place in the AL West with a 1.0-game lead over the 2nd-place Rangers...the Astros have been in 1st place or have shared 1st place for 43 straight days, dating back to July 28, and have owned at least a share for the division lead for 133 out of 156 days so far this season.

IT'S BEEN AWHILE: The Astros 75-64 record is their best after 139 games since 2004, when they were 76-63...the last time the Astros held at least a 1.0-game lead in their division this late in the season was on Sept. 20, 2003, when the Astros led the NL Central by 1.5 games over the Cubs.

75 WINS: The Astros have already surpassed their win total from 2014 (70-92)...the last time Houston posted 75-plus wins was in 2010 (76-86).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Astros were shutout by **RHP Sonny Gray** (7IP) and the Athletics by a score of 4-0 last night in the middle game of this 3-game series...LHP Scott Kazmir (4ER/6IP) started for Houston and allowed all 4 runs on a couple homers by CF Billy Burns (solo) and 1B Mark Canha (3R).

PITCHER'S DUEL: Last night's game featured 2 pitchers within the top 4 in ERA leaders in the AL in LHP Scott Kazmir and RHP Sonny Gray. Lowest AL ERA

SPEED AND POWER: The Astros lead the American League in stolen bases (103) and rank 2nd in the Majors in home runs (188)...individually, 2B Jose Altuve leads all American League players with 36 steals.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: The Astros have set a franchise record with 10 players recording double digit homers this season...the Major League record is 11 players with double-digit homers in a single season, set by the 2004 Tigers...Houston is close to tying and surpassing that record as IF Marwin Gonzalez and OF Jake Marisnick both have 9 home runs.

UP THE CHARTS: The Astros have posted 188 home runs this season, which ranks 4th among single-season totals in franchise history...with 3 home runs, the Astros can match the 3rd-highest total, which was posted by the 2003 Astros (191).

SELECT COMPANY: SS Carlos Correa and OF George Springer are the only 2 players in Astros franchise history to record at least 17 home runs and 50 RBI through their 1st 76 career games... franchise leaders thru 1st 76 career games:

POSTSEASON CREDENTIALS: The Astros are accepting credentials for all postseason options at Minute Maid Park, including a tie-breaker game, the Wild Card game and the American League Division Series...all media wishing to cover these events must apply for each option via MLB's online credentialing system.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS: The Astros have 7 affiliates that have clinched a postseason berth this season, besting their previous franchise record of 6, set in 2013...the club's top 5 affiliates will start postseason play tonight.

GREENEVILLEWINSTITLE: The Rookie Level Greeneville Astros won the Appalachian League Championship last night by defeating Princeton by a score of 8-7 in the deciding game 3...this marks the Astros 2nd time in the Championship Series in the last 3 years, but their 1st League Championship since 2004.

MINOR LEAGUE LEADERS: The Astros finished the minor league regular season with several league leaders throughout their system, including Double A Corpus Christi's 1B A.J. Reed, who led all of minor league baseball in home runs (34) and RBI (127)...additionally, the organization had 2 players win batting titles in **OF Jon Kemmer**, who hit .327 in the Texas League (AA), and **IF Bobby Wernes**, who hit .352 in the NY-Penn League (R).

ABOUT MCHUGH: is set to make his 28th start of the season tonight...has reached single season career highs in starts, innings, wins and quality starts (19).

ranks 3rd in the AL in wins, behind only \boldsymbol{RHP} \boldsymbol{Felix} $\boldsymbol{Hernandez}$ (16) and teammate LHP Dallas Keuchel (17).

IN A GROOVE: has held the opposition to 2 runs or less in 6 consecutive starts, which is tied for the 3rd-longest active streak in the Majors...has posted a 1.54 ERA (7ER/41IP) and 40 strikeouts in that span.

- has won 9 of his last 14 starts, while allowing 3 earned runs or less in 13 of those 14 outings...has gone 9-4 with a 2.60 ERA (27ER/93.1IP) and 80 strikeouts in that span...has held hitters to .239 average and a .613 OPS in those 14 starts.
- his 2.60 ERA ranks 5th among AL pitchers in that span...teammates Dallas Keuchel and Scott Kazmir rank 4th and 2nd, respectively.
- in his 1st 13 starts of the season posted a 5.08 ERA (45ER/79.2IP)... allowed 4-or-more runs in 5 of those 13 starts.

AN AUGUST PERFORMANCE: had his best month of the season in August, going 2-2 with a 1.89 ERA (7ER/33.1IP) and 34 strikeouts...ranked 4th in the AL in ERA during the month, behind RHP Scott Feldman (1.33), RHP Carlos Carrasco (1.47) and RHP Justin Verlander (1.50).

in his career during the month, has gone 5-2 with a 1.73 ERA (15ER/78IP) in 12 starts.

20-GAME WINNER: McHugh has now posted a 22-7 record and a 3.20 ERA (85ER/239IP) in 37 starts since Aug. 1, 2014...he leads the AL in wins in that span...HOU has gone 25-12 in those starts.

DYNAMIC DUO: McHugh and LHP Dallas Keuchel have combined to go 32-13 this season, which is the most combined wins by a pair of teammates in the Majors, ahead of LAD's LHP Clayton Kershaw (13) and RHP Zack Greinke (16).

the Astros have gone a combined 37-18 (.673) in McHugh and Keuchel starts this season...over the last 2 seasons since the start of 2014, the Astros have gone 67-42 (.615) in games started by McHugh and Keuchel.

CAN'T SQUARE HIM UP: per Fangraphs.com, has generated the 7th-highest % of soft contact in the American League this season (21.4%)...the only AL pitchers who have posted a higher soft contact % than McHugh (21.9%) over the last 2 seasons, are RHP Garrett Richards (22.0%) and teammate LHP Dallas Keuchel (23.3%).

is inducing groundballs at a career high clip, as both his $1.50\,$ groundball to flyball ratio and 46.8% groundball rate are the highest of his career.

CAREER TURNAROUND: since joining the Astros rotation on April 22, 2014, has gone 26-16 with a 3.27 ERA (119ER/32732IP) in 52 starts...this followed Major League stints with the Mets and Rockies from 2012-13, during which he posted an 0-8 record and a 8.94 ERA (47ER/47.1IP) in 15 games (9 starts).

FRANCHISE RECORD ACCOMPLISHED: the Astros won a franchise-record, 11-straight starts made by McHugh from Aug. 28, 2014-May 7, 2015.

vs. OAK: has made only 3 career starts against the A's in his career, which have all been in the past 2 seasons... is 2-1 with a 1.77 ERA (4ER/20.1IP) with 26 strikeouts and only 4 walks...last faced the A's on 8/8 in OAK...took the loss despite a quality start (2ER/6IP).
