OAKLAND ATHLETICS (61-82) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (67-74)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost their 82nd game of the season yesterday and have clinched a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...this marks the fifth time in the last 17 seasons the A's have finished under .500...have a tragic number of four for elimination in the American League West and six for elimination from the playoffs...have lost eight of the last 11 games and are 10-20 (.333) over the last 30 contests...are 61-82 (.429) for the season, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 143 games and is the worst since 1997 (57-86)...are in last place in the AL West for the 52nd consecutive day...have spent 120 of the last 124 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are tied for the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 27-41 (.397) since then.

OFFENSE: Danny Valencia had the A's 36th triple of the season yesterday, which ranks fourth in the American League and is the fourth best single season total in Oakland history...they are the most since the 1977 club had 37...also had 37 triples in 1974 and the Oakland record is 40 set in 1968...the A's are batting .210 (35-for-167) over the last five games after hitting .287 over the previous 14 contests...have homered in 17 of the last 18 games (24 home runs total), including a season-best streak of 15 straight that was snapped on Friday in Texas...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (147)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (964), the third lowest slugging percentage (.392) and the fourth fewest home runs (122)...have the fewest sacrifice hits in the majors (12) and are tied for the fewest hit by pitches (29)...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 76 runs over the first 11 games in September and have a 6.68 ERA (72 er in 97.0 ip) this month, which is the highest in the majors (Detroit, 6.33)...now have a 3.87 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the AL...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (382) and opponents slugging percentage (.386), tied for third in fewest home runs (139) and fourth in opponents batting average (.247)...opponents have been successful in just 69-of-108 (63.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-17 with a 5.64 ERA (97 er in 154.2 ip) over the last 30 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 14 of those 30 contests...now have a 3.52 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have allowed 77 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors in the last 70 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 110 errors for the season, which is three more than any other team (Pittsburgh, 107) and one short of the A's season total from last year (111)...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 16-31 (.340) in one-run games...the losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Oakland record of 32 set in 1976...the winning percentage is also the worst in the majors and is currently fourth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...are tied for fifth in the majors in one-run games (47)...are 25-48 (.342) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...the Oakland record for losses by two runs or fewer is 49 in 1968...are 9-17 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are second fewest in the AL (NYY, 8) and the losses are third most...are 6-9 (.400) in extra

inning games...the 15 extra inning games are tied for second in the AL and the losses rank third.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 28-40 (.412) on the road, which is third worst in the American League...with one more loss, will clinch a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...are 1-2 on this 10-game road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1) and have lost 13 of the last 17 road games and 19 of the last 26...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1)...are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and second worst in the majors (Colorado, 31-40)...have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.46 (289 er in 583.0 ip) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12-for-18 (.667) with a walk over the last 15 games...are batting .257 (28-for-109) with 16 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2) and rank second in batting average, hits and plate appearances (128)...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 8-for-14 (.571) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 19 games...are batting .342 (41-for-120) with the bases loaded, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in Oakland history...are tied for second in the AL in grand slams (6) and rank third in plate appearances (138) and RBI (109).

THIS AND THAT: Yesterday, Daniel Coulombe became the 29th player to pitch in a game for the A's, which is an on-going franchise record (dating to 1901)...however, it is just third highest in the American League this year (NYY 33, TEX 31)...Coulombe became the 22nd reliever, which sets an Oakland record, breaking the previous mark of 21 set in 1997...currently have 35 players on the active roster...the A's are 10-4 on Monday, which is the second best record in the majors (Mets, 13-2)...are 13-26 (.333) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 7-26)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 20 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's are 0-3 against Chicago this year as they were swept in a three-game series in Oakland in May...it was the first time the A's were swept by the White Sox in Oakland since May 16-18, 1997...have lost five straight and seven of the last eight games...the five-game losing streak is the A's longest against Chicago since they dropped nine straight from Aug. 1, 1996-Aug. 5, 1997...have lost three of the previous four season series to the White Sox and are 15-18 since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-279 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-134 in Oakland and 140-145 in Chicago...including 58-57 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 975-1034 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (43)...leads American League rookies in runs (66), hits (138) and total bases (180)...**Mark Canha** leads AL rookies in RBI (63)...**Danny Valencia** has an 11-game road hitting streak (14-for-47, .298).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-7, 2.28 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.205) and slugging percentage (.293), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), ranks second in ERA (2.28), third in opponents on-base percentage (.258), tied for third in complete games (3), sixth in innings pitched (193.2) and tied for eighth in wins (13)... is also tied for second in opponents reaching base on an error (8), ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.5), tied for fourth in wild pitches (11) and tied for ninth in unearned runs (8).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 2.70 ERA (21 er in 70.0 ip) in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...last year he went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA after the break compared to 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA before the break...his career splits are 12-14 with a 3.04 ERA (76 er in 225.1 ip) in 35 games after the break compared to 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-3 with a 1.72 ERA (18 er in 94.1 ip) in 14 starts on the road compared to 5-4 with a 2.81 ERA (31 er in 99.1 ip) in 14 starts at home...has the lowest road ERA in the majors and is tied for fourth in the American League in road wins...the lowest road ERA in Oakland history is 2.41 by Jim Nash in 1968... has allowed three home runs in 94.1 innings on the road, 11 in 99.1 innings at home.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Was credited with his 36th putout of the season in his last start, which sets an Athletics single season record for pitchers...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts are the most by a Major League pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...they are the most by an American League pitcher since Brown had 40 for the Orioles in 1995...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances this year (58) and tied for ninth in assists (22).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last six starts (41.0 ip), including a career-high three Aug. 22 against Tampa Bay...yielded just eight home runs over his first 22 starts (152.2 ip) and has surrendered 14 home runs in 193.2 innings for the season...his average of 0.65 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League...has allowed 10 of his 14 home runs with two strikes...10 have been solo shots.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .194 (36-for-186) with 11 walks (.239 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is third lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks fourth...has allowed a .224 (54-for-241) batting average with four doubles and four home runs with runners on base (.290 slugging percentage)...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the AL and the batting average ranks sixth...also ranks third in the AL with a .199 (73-for-366) batting average against left-handed hitters and seventh with a .143 (50-for-350) average with two strikes...all opponents average rankings are based on pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA (12 er in 60.2 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 8-5 with a 2.50 ERA (37 er in 133.0 ip) in 19 starts at night...has the second lowest day ERA in the American League.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.18 ERA (29 er in 119.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest compared to 5-4 with a 2.43 ERA (20 er in 74.0 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more...his ERA on four days rest is second lowest in the American League.

GO THE DISTANCE: Has three complete games in his last 11 starts, including a two-hit shutout at Cleveland July 12 and a three-hit shutout at Los Angeles (NL) July 28...became the first A's pitcher with two shutouts in a month since Barry Zito had two in August, 2001...now has four career shutouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 12 years...has allowed three hits or fewer in three of the shutouts.

THIS AND THAT: The A's bullpen has blown a save in five of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22, Aug. 22)...is 28-2 in 41 career starts with three runs of support or more...was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he posted an ERA under 2.00 in a month (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished

May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...has tossed at least seven innings in 16 of his 28 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 18 times, one earned run or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...the A's are 16-12 (.571) in his starting assignments and are 40-31 (.563) when he starts in his career.

LAST START: He combined with Dull on a five-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win over Houston last Tuesday in Oakland...it was his 13th win of the season, which is one short of his career high of 14 from last year...tossed seven of the innings and allowed all five of the hits...the Astros biggest threat came in the second inning when they loaded the bases with one out but he struck out Conger and got Marisnick to pop out to end the inning.

two batters of the game who came around to score on a Moss error and a Garcia sacrifice fly...the A's scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a leadoff home run to Gillaspie in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Gregerson to start the eighth inning with a 4-3 lead but O'Flaherty allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save.

RHP Aaron Brooks (1-3, 7.44 ERA): Is 0-3 with a 14.14 ERA and .439 opponents batting average over his last five games, including four starts...went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games, including two starts...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 29 and is 0-2 with a 9.49 ERA in three starts since his return...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...began the season in the Kansas City organization and went 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA and .333 opponents batting average in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 11-5 A's loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

- The A's bullpen has 5.89 ERA (60 er in 91.2 ip) over its past 25 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.55 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.68).
- Has the third most losses (25) in the AL and the third fewest wins (17)... has allowed the second most home runs (62) and extra base hits (161) and fourth highest percentage of inherited runners to score (74-of-225, 32.9%).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Is tied for the most first batter RBI in the majors (58) and tied for third in first batter home runs (15).
- The A's are 11-48 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 46-33 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
