OAKLAND ATHLETICS (61-83) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (68-74)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2015 – U.S. CELLULAR FIELD – 7:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, four of the last five and nine of the last 12 games to fall a season-high 22 games under .500...this marks the first time the A's have been 22 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are 10-21 (.323) over the last 31 games and 61-83 (.424) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 144 games and is the worst since 1997 (57-87)... have clinched a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...this marks the fifth time in the last 17 seasons the A's have finished under .500...have a tragic number of three for elimination in the AL West and four for elimination from the playoffs...are in last place in the West for the 53rd consecutive day...have spent 121 of the last 125 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 27-42 (.391) since then.

LAST NIGHT: The A's lost to the White Sox last night in 5 hours and 9 minutes, which was their longest game by time over the last two years...are now averaging 3 hours and 22 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season...the 14-inning contest was the longest game by innings this year...the A's pitching staff struck out 19 batters, which is the best single-game total over the last four years and tied for the fourth best single-game total in Oakland history...also walked a season-high 10 batters

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their 32nd one-run game of the season last night, which ties the Oakland record for most one-run losses in a season (also in 1976)...it was also their 49th loss by two runs or fewer, which also ties an Oakland record set in 1968...are 16-32 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and ranks fifth in one-run games (48)...are 25-49 (.338) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...the 16 extra inning games are tied for second in the American League, the losses rank third and the winning percentage is fourth lowest...are 9-18 in games decided in the last at bat... the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the AL and the losses are third most.

OFFENSE: The A's have 36 triples, which ranks fourth in the American League and is the fourth best single season total in Oakland history...they are the most since the 1977 club had 37...also had 37 triples in 1974 and the Oakland record is 40 set in 1968...have homered in 18 of the last 19 games (27 home runs total), including a season-best streak of 15 straight that was snapped on Friday in Texas...however, have just 125 home runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...the A's are batting .191 (41-for-215) over the last six games after hitting .287 over the previous 14 contests...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (147)... have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have the second fewest strikeouts in the AL (980) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.391)...have the fewest sacrifice hits in the majors (12) and are tied for the fewest hit by pitches (29)...the Athletics record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 84 runs over the first 12 games in September and have a 6.51 ERA (80 er in 110.2 ip) this month, which is the highest in the majors (Kansas City, 6.46)...now have a 3.88 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the AL...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest home runs (141), fewest extra base hits (386) and opponents slugging percentage (.386) and fourth in opponents batting average (.248)...opponents have been successful in just 69-of-108 (63.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-17 with a 5.94 ERA (104 er in 157.2 ip) over the last 31 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 15 of those 31 contests...now have a 3.58 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...have allowed 79 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors in the last 71 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 110 errors for the season, which is three more than any other team (Pittsburgh, 107) and one short of the A's season total from last year (111)...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: With the loss last night, the A's have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...are 28-41 (.406) on the road, which is third worst in the American League...are 1-3 on this 10-game road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (0-1) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip to Seattle (1-2) and Arizona (2-1) and have lost 14 of the last 18 road games and 20 of the last 27...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1)...are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and second worst in the majors (Colorado, 31-40)...have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.48 (297 er in 596.2 ip) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 12-for-19 (.667) with two walks over the last 16 games...are batting .254 (28-for-110) with 17 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits and plate appearances (130) and third in batting average...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 9-for-16 (.563) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 20 games...are batting .344 (42-for-122) for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in Oakland history...are tied for second in the AL in grand slams (6) and rank third in plate appearances (141) and RBI (112).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have set a franchise record by using 29 pitchers and have set an Oakland record by using 22 relievers...currently have 35 players on the active roster...are 13-27 (.325) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 7-27)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979... including this series with the White Sox, the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 21 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's are 0-4 against the White Sox and have lost the season series for the second consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...lost the first game in Chicago last night after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland in May...it was the first time the A's were swept by the White Sox in Oakland since May 16-18, 1997...have lost six straight and eight of the last nine games...the six-game losing streak is the A's longest against Chicago since they dropped nine in a row from Aug. 1, 1996-Aug. 5, 1997...are 15-19 against Chicago since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 298-280 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-134 in Oakland and 140-146 in Chicago...including 58-58 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 975-1035 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (43)...leads American League rookies in runs (66), hits (138) and total bases (180)...Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (63).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommel defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in 1971 the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in 1990 Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137th game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (1-3, 7.44 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 14.14 ERA (22 er in 14.0 ip) and .439 (29-for-66) opponents batting average over his last five games, including four starts...went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games, including two starts.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 29 and is 0-2 with a 9.49 ERA (13 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts since his return...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...began the season in the Kansas City organization and went 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Mañaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland Aug. 1...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Sounds following his Aug. 15 option.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 7.31 ERA (23 er in 28.1 ip) and .319 (37-for-116) opponents batting average in his six starting assignments compared to 0-0 with an 8.31 ERA and .368 opponents average in three relief appearances...has issued all seven of his walks as a starter.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his first two starts with the A's...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least seven innings while allowing one run or fewer in each of his first two games with the A's...joins Ron Darling (1991), Kevin Appier (1999) and Rich Harden (2003)...the A's are 2-4 (.333) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his six starts.

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland Aug. 1 in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced, allowing just a two-out single to Brantley in the first inning...then allowed his only home run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.1 innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss to Houston Aug. 6 in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Lowrie in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...retired 11 straight at one point and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth inning with the A's leading 2-1...Rodriguez allowed a two-run home run to Correa for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Toronto Aug. 12...allowed a career-high eight runs in 1.2 innings...yielded a three-run home run to Colabello in the first but the A's came back with two runs in the second inning...was charged with five of the Blue Jays seven runs in the bottom of the second...allowed a two-run single to Donaldson and a RBI single to Colabello and was relieved by Doubront with runners on first and third and one out...Doubront allowed both runners to score plus two of his own.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in a 3-2 A's win at Arizona Sept. 4...Oakland scored twice in the second inning and he blanked the Diamondbacks on four hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Pollock had a RBI single and the tying run scored when Goldschmidt grounded into a double play...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh and the A's scored once in the eighth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-8 loss to Seattle Sept. 4 in Oakland...the A's scored four times in the first but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second...the A's got that run back in the bottom of the second but he allowed five of the Mariners six runs in the third inning for the loss...allowed a RBI double to Seager and a RBI single to Romero and was relieved by Venditte with the bases loaded and one out...Venditte allowed all three runs to score plus one of his own.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 11-5 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Rasmus in the second and three more runs in the fourth on a two-run single by Conger and a RBI double by Altuve...allowed a leadoff double to Gomez in the fifth and was relieved by Venditte, who allowed Gomez to score.

MINORS: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha and 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Nashville...combined to go 7-5 with a 3.56 ERA in 20 games, 19 starts, overall...issued just 21 walks in 118.2 innings, an average of 1.59 walks per nine innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .254 (54-for-213) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (73-for-248) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...seven were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings and five home runs over his final 16 games and 98.1 innings...at the time of the July 28 trade to the A's, he ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (92) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...his teams were 13-6 (.685) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer and tossed at least five innings in each of his 20 appearances.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Made his lone relief appearance in his second outing, April 15 at Memphis...entered the game to start the third inning with a 2-1 lead but ended up taking the loss in a 4-2 decision...was 0-2 with a 4.70 ERA over his first three games before his promotion to Kansas City April 26...returned the next day and went 4-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his first seven starts following his return...was sent to Kansas City for the second time May 12 and was optioned back to Omaha May 15...was promoted to Kansas City a third time June 20...then went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA over his first five starts from June 27 to July 21 following his return...joined the Royals for his fourth stint July 7...tossed his lone complete game of the season in his first start following his return on July 11 against Iowa...fired a seven-hitter in a 3-2 seven-inning loss in the second game of a doubleheader...made two starts with Nashville on Aug. 18 against El Paso and Aug. 23 at Reno and did not walk a batter in either start.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Chavez (7-15, 4.18 ERA): Is 3-9 with a 5.65 ERA and .295 opponents batting average over his last 14 starts dating back to June 28...was 4-6 with a 3.16 ERA and .246 opponents average over his first 12 starts...is tied for the Major League lead with 15 losses...over the last 33 years, the only A's pitchers to lose more than 15 games are Tom Candiotti (16 in 1998) and Greg Smith (16 in 2008)...is 3-6 with a 5.59 ERA in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 4-9 with a 3.40 ERA in 19 games before the break...his post-break ERA is fifth highest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's loss at Texas last Friday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 2-1 with a 3.04 ERA in 10 career appearances, including two starts, against Chicago...had a no decision in his only appearance this year, a starts in a 4-3 A's loss in Oakland May 16 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen allowed one run in 10.2 innings last night...the innings were its most since April 29, 2013 against Los Angeles (AL) when it tossed 14.1 innings.
- Has 5.36 ERA (61 er in 102.1 ip) over its past 26 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.46 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.63).
- Has the third most losses (26) in the AL and the third fewest wins (17)...has allowed the second most home runs (62) and extra base hits (162) and third highest percentage of inherited runners to score (74-of-227, 32.6%).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the second most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Is tied for the most first batter RBI in the majors (58) and tied for third in first batter home runs (15).
- The A's are 11-48 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 46-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
