OAKLAND ATHLETICS (62-84) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (69-75)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last seven and 10 of the last 14 games to fall to a season-high tying 22 games under .500 (also: Sept. 14, 61-83)...have not been more than 22 games under .500 since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are 11-22 (.333) over the last 33 games and 62-84 (.425) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 146 games and is the worst since 1997 (59-87)... have clinched a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...this marks the fifth time in the last 17 seasons the A's have finished under .500...have a tragic number of one for elimination in the AL West and two for elimination from the playoffs...are in last place in the West for the 55th consecutive day...have spent 123 of the last 127 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009)...went 14-30 (.318) over the first 44 games through May 22, 20-11 (.645) over a 31-game stretch from May 23 to June 25 and are 28-43 (.394) since then.

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in 20 of the last 21 games (31 home runs total), including a season-best streak of 15 straight that was snapped on Friday in Texas...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (994), third in lowest slugging percentage (.394), tied for third in triples (37) and fourth in fewest home runs (129)...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors in infield hits (150)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007...Eric Sogard had the A's 37th triple of the season Tuesday night, which ties the 1974 and 1977 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for triples in a season is 40 set in 1968...scored 17 runs Tuesday night, which were their most in a game since they had 18 at Minnesota on Sept. 11, 2013...scored 10 times in the fourth inning, marking the seventh time in Oakland history the A's scored at least 10 runs in an inning (last: Sept. 11, 2013 at Minnesota, also in the 4th)...sent 15 men to the plate in the fourth inning, which were their most since July 5, 1996 against California when they sent 18 men to the plate in a 13-run first inning.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 99 runs in 14 games in September and have a 6.70 ERA (95 er in 127.2 ip) this month, which is the highest in the majors...now have a 3.93 ERA for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...lead the AL in shutouts (15), third in opponents slugging (.389), tied for third in fewest extra base hits (394), tied for fourth in fewest home runs (146), and fourth in opponents batting average (.248)...opponents have been successful in just 70-of-109 (64.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-18 with a 6.26 ERA (116 er in 166.2 ip) over the last 33 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 16 of those 33 contests...now have a 3.67 ERA for the season, which is the second lowest in the American League and seventh lowest in the majors...have allowed 84 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors in the last 73 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 110 errors for the season, which is the second most in the majors Pittsburgh (111)...it is one short of the A's season total from last year (111)...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...rank second in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their 32nd one-run game of the season Monday night, which ties the Oakland record for most one-run losses in a season (also in 1976)...it was also their 49th loss by two runs or fewer, which also ties an Oakland record set in 1968...are 16-32 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in

1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for sixth in one-run games (48)...are 25-49 (.338) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...the 16 extra inning games are tied for second in the American League, the losses rank third and the winning percentage is fourth lowest...are 9-18 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied with the Yankees for the fewest in the AL and the losses are third most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this 10-game road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (1-2) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have lost 15 of the last 20 road games...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...are 29-42 (.408) on the road, which is third worst in the American League...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1)...are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (Colorado, 31-40)...have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.58 (312 er in 613.2 ip) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 13-for-21 (.619) with two walks over the last 17 games...are batting .259 (29-for-112) with 17 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2) and rank second in batting average, hits and plate appearances (132)...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 11-for-21 (.524) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 22 games...are batting .346 (44-for-127) for the season, which ranks second in the majors (Washington, .378) and third in Oakland history...rank second in the AL in RBI (118), tied for second in grand slams (6) and third in plate appearances (146).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 36 players on the active roster... have set a franchise record by using 29 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 22 relievers...the only times in Athletics history the A's used more than 22 relievers was in 1955 (26) and 1965 (23)...with the addition of Jesse Chavez to the disabled list yesterday, the A's have now used the DL 23 times, which is their most since 2010 (23)...players have combined to miss 991 games while on the DL, which is the most since 2012 (1072)... currently have seven players on the DL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-27 (.325) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 8-28)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...including this series with the White Sox, the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 21 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...are averaging 3 hours and 20 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's are 1-5 and have lost the season series for the second consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years... snapped their six-game losing streak against the White Sox Tuesday night and have now dropped nine of the last 11 games...are 1-2 in Chicago after being swept in a three-game series in Oakland in May...are 16-70 against Chicago since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 299-281 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-134 in Oakland and 140-147 in Chicago...including 59-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 976-1036 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (43)...leads American League rookies in hits (138) and total bases (180)...Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (64).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972 Jim "Catfish" Hunter pitches a two hitter as the A's defeat Texas 4-1...it is Hunter's 20th victory, his second of four straight 20 win seasons with the A's...in 1973 Bill North sets a club record by drawing five walks in the A's 3-2, 13 inning win against California.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Nolin (1-1, 3.09 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and is 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts...was one of four players acquired from Toronto for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season and began the season on the Oakland disabled list as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder... was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle September 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Marte, a sacrifice fly by Seager and a wild pitch...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

LAST START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Texas last Saturday...allowed a leadoff home run to Napoli in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in 5.2 innings...the A's scored five times in the fifth for the win.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 14 games, including 12 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 10 games in May and June, 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts in August...walked 17 batters in 33.2 innings in May and June (4.54 per nine innings), two in 13.2 innings in August (1.32 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a mark of .167 (7-for-42) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against right-handers...allowed one double and two walks to lefties for a .190 slugging percentage and .205 on-base percentage...surrendered all five of his home runs and nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...all five of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .319 average with the bases empty compared to .125 with runners on base...opponents were 4-for-35 (.114) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-13 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .396 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.83 ERA in 10 games at night compared to 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts during the day...logged a 0.75 ERA in the first inning...Nashville was 8-4 (.667) in his 12 starting assignments...did not toss more than 5.2 innings in any of his 14 outings...allowed one run or fewer 11 times and four hits or fewer 12 times.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Was sent to Nashville on a rehab assignment from Oakland on May 5...pitched scoreless relief in his first two outings May 5 against Iowa (1.0 ip) and May 9 against Round Rock (2.0 ip)...then started and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings May 14 at Iowa and was reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Nashville the next day...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Sacramento, giving him a 0.71 ERA over his first five games...issued four walks in 12.2 innings over that stretch but then walked a season-high four batters in 4.0 innings May 30 against Las Vegas...finished May with no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in six games, four starts...was placed on the disabled list June 1 with a strained left groin...was reinstated June 9 and went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in four starts in June...picked up his first win of the season June 16 against Memphis when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and three walks...then yielded a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings in his next start June 21 against Omaha for his first loss...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings June 27 against Oklahoma City for his second and final win of the season...also allowed a season-high eight hits and tossed a season-high 102 pitches in that game...was placed on the minor league DL a second time July 1 with a strained left shoulder...was reinstated Aug. 15 and went 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts following his return...tossed fewer than five innings in each of those starts as he increased his pitch count from 32 on Aug. 15 to 76 in his final start on Aug. 31...struck out a season-high six batters in his final start, a no decision in a 5-1 win over Round Rock.

CAREER: Pitched in one game for Toronto in each of the previous two seasons and went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA in two games, one start...is 29-19 with a 3.02 ERA (163 er in 485.2 ip) in 106 games, including 98 starts, in six seasons in the minors...has 489 strikeouts in 485.2 innings...has allowed just 34 home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...was acquired by the A's from Toronto with infielder Brett Lawrie, pitcher Kendall Graveman and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for third baseman Josh Donaldson, Nov. 28, 2014...was named the A's seventh best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade after being named the Blue Jays 10th best prospect following the 2013 season...combined for a perfect 10-0 record and a 2.04 ERA in 20 games, including 18 starts, in 2012 with Single-A Dunedin and Double-A New Hampshire...was drafted three times and signed with Toronto after being selected in the sixth round of the 2010 draft.

LHP Felix Doubront (3-2, 4.99 ERA):	Is 2-1 with an 8.27 ERA and .344 opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first four games with the A's... was acquired by the A's from the Blue Jays on July 31 for cash considerations and is 2-1 with a 5.14 ERA in seven games, including five starts... went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 12-4 loss at Texas (4.1 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 3 hr)...allowed a career-high three home runs in his last start after yielding three home runs over his first 11 games and 53.1 innings...is 2-0 with a 4.97 ERA (12.2 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts, against Houston...including a win in his only start this year on Sept. 7 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 5.22 ERA (64 er in 110.1 ip) over its past 28 games (dating back to Aug. 16) and a 4.44 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.58).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the third most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Has allowed the second most first batter RBI in the majors (58) and is tied for third in first batter home runs (15).
- Tied for the second most home runs allowed (62) and has allowed the second most extra base hits (163) in the AL, has the third fewest wins (17) and is tied for the third most losses (26).
- Pitched 10.2 innings on Monday, which was its most since April 29, 2013 against Los Angeles (AL) when it tossed 14.1 innings.
- The A's are 11-49 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 47-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
