OAKLAND ATHLETICS (63-84) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (77-70)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series at Chicago (AL) and are 5-5 over the last 10 games...are in last place in the American League West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games...have been officially eliminated from the AL West race and have a tragic number of one to be eliminated from the playoffs...are 12-22 (.353) over the last 34 games and 63-84 (.429) for the season, which is the worst record in the AL and sixth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 147 games and is the worst since 1997 (60-87)...have clinched a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...this marks the fifth time in the last 17 seasons the A's have finished under .500...have spent 56 consecutive days and 124 of the last 128 in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's have 37 triples, which ties the 1974 and 1977 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for triples in a season is 40 set in 1968...have homered in 21 of the last 22 games (32 home runs total), including a season-best streak of 15 straight that was snapped a week ago today...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1001), third in lowest slugging percentage (.394), tied for third in triples (37) and fourth in fewest home runs (130)...lead the AL and are tied for second in the majors in infield hits (150)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.39 ERA (97 er in 136.2 ip) in September, which is second highest in the majors (Philadelphia, 6.43)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...now have a 3.92 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...have allowed 60 home runs over the last 39 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have allowed 147 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (395) and opponents slugging percentage (.388) and fourth in opponents batting average (.248)...opponents have been successful in just 70-of-109 (64.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-18 with a 6.19 ERA (118 er in 171.2 ip) over the last 34 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 17 of those contests and are averaging 5.05 innings per start over that span...now have a 3.67 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have allowed 85 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have issued 264 walks, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just 38 errors in the last 74 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 110 errors for the season, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 113) and one short of the A's season total from last year (111)...are tied for second in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 71)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's scored three times in the ninth inning yesterday at Chicago (AL) to win 4-2...it was the first time this year the A's won a game when trailing after eight innings...lost their 32nd one-run game of the season Monday night, which ties the Oakland record for most one-run losses in a season (also in 1976)...it was also their 49th loss by two runs or fewer, which also ties an Oakland record set in 1968...are 16-32 (.333) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and is currently tied for third worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in one-run games (48)...are 26-49 (.347) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...the 16 extra inning games are tied for second in the American League, the losses rank third and the winning percentage is fourth lowest...are 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL (NYY, 9) and the losses are third most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this 10-game road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have lost 15 of the last 21 road games...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...are 30-42 (.417) on the road, which is third worst in the American League...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1) and are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (Colorado, 31-40)...have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.54 (314 er in 622.2 ip) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 13-for-23 (.565) with two walks over the last 19 games...are batting .254 (29-for-114) with 17 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits and plate appearances (134) and fourth in batting average...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 11-for-21 (.524) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 23 games...are batting .346 (44-for-127) for the season, which ranks second in the majors (Washington, .380) and third in Oakland history...rank second in the majors in RBI (118), third in plate appearances (146) and tied for third in grand slams (6).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 36 players on the active roster...have set a franchise record by using 29 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 22 relievers (does not include Zito)...the only times in Athletics history the A's used more than 22 relievers was in 1955 (26) and 1965 (23)...the A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is their most since 2010 (23)...players have combined to miss 998 games while on the DL, which is the most since 2012 (1072)...currently have seven players on the DL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-19 (.174) on Friday, which is the worst mark in the majors...are 14-27 (.341) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 8-28)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 21 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

A's vs. ASTROS: The season series is even at eight games each...the A's went 5-5 in Oakland and are 3-3 in Houston...have won each of their first four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 39-21...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 21 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 21-11 in Oakland and 18-10 in Houston.

Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (64).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1930** the A's clinch their second consecutive AL Championship with a 14-10 win over Chicago...in **1982** the A's strand a club record 17 baserunners in a nine inning game but come back to defeat Chicago 5-4 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **2000** Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...Giambi would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...in **2002** Billy Koch saves his 40th game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in major league history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (3-2, 4.99 ERA)

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 2-1 with an 8.27 ERA (15 er in 16.1 ip) and .344 (22-for-64) opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first four games with the A's.

BRIEFLY: Was acquired by the A's from the Blue Jays on July 31 for cash considerations and is 2-1 with a 5.14 ERA (20 er in 35.0 ip) in seven games, including five starts, with Oakland...went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was with Chicago (NL) during the spring but was released March 28...signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a career-high three home runs in his last start after yielding three home runs over his first 11 games and 53.1 innings...has surrendered 19 of his 21 extra base hits to right-handed hitters...lefties are slugging .360 (1 double, 1 home run) compared to .472 by righties...has yielded a .340 (18-for-53) average with runners in scoring position

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-2 with a 5.24 ERA (26 er in 44.2 ip) and .316 (56-for-177) opponents batting average in his eight starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 30-25 with a 4.53 ERA (225 er in 447.1 ip) in 82 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA in 32 relief appearances.

WITH TORONTO: Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings in relief of Drew Hutchison...picked up his first win of the season in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a Sanchez RBI single...shutout the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...had a no decision in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12**...yielded a career-high tying seven runs, including six runs in the first inning and another in the fifth...left with an 8-7 lead but Delabar allowed three runs for the blown save...had a no decision in a 4-3, 10-inning loss at Oakland **July 22**...left after 4.2 innings trailing 3-1... was the losing pitcher in Toronto's 3-2 loss to Philadelphia on **July 28**...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Asche and a RBI double by Blanco.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) **Aug. 18** in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit but issued a career-high tying six walks... had a no decision in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle **Aug. 24**...left the game after two innings with a right foot contusion and the scored tied 0-0...the start was the shortest of his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 31** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the first inning and two more runs in the second on an Aybar sacrifice fly and a Cron steal of home...the A's then scored five times in the third inning to take the lead for good...won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-9 win over Houston **Sept. 7** in Oakland...allowed single runs in the first and second innings but the A's scored six runs in the sixth inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-4 loss at Texas last Sunday...yielded a career-high three home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings...allowed a solo home run to Choo in the first and a two-run home run to Beltre in the fourth...then allowed four of the Rangers five runs in the fifth inning, including a three-run home run by Beltre.

DOUBRONT vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-0 with a 4.97 ERA (12.2 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts...one of the wins came in the A's 10-9 victory in Oakland on Sept. 7...allowed a run on a Correa ground out in the first but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the first...surrendered a sacrifice fly to Marisnick in the second but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth and scored six times in the sixth to take the lead for good...allowed a leadoff home run to Villar in the seventh, followed by a Stassi single and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed Stassi to score plus two runs of his own...the other win came at Boston in an 8-4 decision on April 27, 2013...allowed two runs in the first inning on a bases loaded walk by Carter and a Cedeno sacrifice fly...the Red Sox scored four times in the second to take the lead for good...had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a run to score on an Altuve ground out in the seventh.

WITH BUFFALO: Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings...the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

RHP Sonny Gray (13-7, 2.56 ERA): Ranks third in the American League with a 2.56 ERA...that is the lowest ERA by an A's pitcher since Dave Stewart also had a 2.56 ERA in 1990...is 1-1 with a 7.80 ERA in three starts in September this year...is now 5-5 with a 3.92 ERA in 14 career starts in the month...is 3-4 with a 3.45 ERA in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...is 12-14 with a 3.27 ERA in 36 career games after the break compared to 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break...is 8-3 with a 2.31 ERA in 15 starts on the road and ranks second in the AL in road ERA...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-7 A's loss in 14 innings at Chicago (AL) last Monday (3.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 4-2 with a 1.88 ERA in six career starts against Houston...including 2-1 with a 1.71 ERA in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has yielded just four runs in 22.2 innings (1.59 ERA) over its past four games but has a 5.04 ERA (64 er in 114.1 ip) over its past 29 contests (dating back to Aug. 16)...has a 4.40 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.58).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (23), the lowest save percentage (52.3%) and is tied for the fourth most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Has allowed the second most extra base hits (163) in the AL, is tied for the second most home runs (62) and tied for the third fewest wins (18) and third most losses (26).
- Has allowed the third most first batter RBI in the majors (58) and is tied for fourth in first batter home runs (15).
- Pitched 10.2 innings on Monday, which was its most since April 29, 2013 against Los Angeles (AL) when it tossed 14.1 innings.
- The A's are 11-49 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 48-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).
