OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-84) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (77-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the first time on this trip and are 6-5 over the last 11 games...are in last place in the American League West and trail first place Texas by 15½ games...have been officially eliminated from the AL West race and have a tragic number of one to be eliminated from the playoffs...are 13-22 (.371) over the last 35 games and 64-84 (.432) for the season, which is the worst record in the AL and tied for the sixth worst in the majors...it is sixth worst in Oakland history after 148 games and is the worst since 1997 (60-88)...have clinched a losing record for the first time since 2011 when they were 74-88...this marks the fifth time in the last 17 seasons the A's have finished under .500...have spent 57 consecutive days and 125 of the last 129 in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history and second most over the last 18 years (162 in 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's have 37 triples, which ties the 1974 and 1977 A's for second most in Oakland history...the Oakland record for triples in a season is 40 set in 1968...have homered in 22 of the last 23 games (35 home runs total), including a season-best streak of 15 straight that was snapped a week ago yesterday...rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1011), third in lowest slugging percentage (.395), tied for third in triples (37) and fourth in fewest home runs (133)...lead the AL and are third in the majors in infield hits (150)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.18 ERA (100 er in 145.2 ip) in September, which is second highest in the majors (Philadelphia, 6.19)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...have allowed 61 home runs over the last 40 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have allowed 148 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (396) and opponents slugging percentage (.388) and fourth in opponents batting average (.248)...opponents have been successful in just 71-of-110 (64.5%) stolen base attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-18 with a 6.13 ERA (121 er in 177.2 ip) over the last 35 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 17 of those contests and are averaging 5.08 innings per start over that span...now have a 3.68 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League...have allowed 86 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have issued 265 walks, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just 38 errors in the last 75 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 110 errors for the season, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 114) and one short of the A's season total from last year (111)...are third in the majors with 61 unearned runs (San Diego, 72)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won back-to-back games when trailing after seven innings (4-69 this season)...Thursday was the A's first win this year when trailing after eight innings...lost their 32nd one-run game of the season Monday night, which ties the Oakland record for most one-run losses in a season (also in 1976)...it was also their 49th loss by two runs or fewer, which also ties an Oakland record set in 1968...are 17-32 (.347) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors and fifth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940)...lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for sixth in one-run games (49)...are 27-49 (.355) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...the 16 extra inning games are tied for second in the American League, the losses rank third and the winning percentage is fourth lowest...are 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are tied for second fewest in the AL (NYY, 9) and the losses are third most.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this 10-game road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-0)...went 3-3 on the last road trip and have lost 15 of the last 22 road games...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...are 31-42 (.425) on the road, which is fifth worst in the American League...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1) and are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 33-43)...have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time they will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 when they went 39-42...have a 3.36 ERA (257 er in 688.0 ip) at home compared to 4.52 (317 er in 631.2 ip) on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 13-for-24 (.542) with two walks over the last 20 games...are batting .252 (29-for-115) with 17 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits and plate appearances (135) and fourth in batting average...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 11-for-21 (.524) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 24 games...are batting .346 (44-for-127) for the season, which ranks second in the majors (Washington, .380) and third in Oakland history...rank second in the majors in RBI (118), third in plate appearances (146) and tied for third in grand slams (6).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 36 players on the active roster...have set a franchise record by using 29 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 22 relievers (does not include Zito)...the only times in Athletics history the A's used more than 22 relievers was in 1955 (26) and 1965 (23)...the A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is their most since 2010 (23)...players have combined to miss 1,005 games while on the DL, which is the most since 2012 (1072)...currently have seven players on the DL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-27 (.341) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 8-28)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 21 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

A's vs. ASTROS: A's lead the season series, nine games to eight...the A's went 5-5 in Oakland and are 4-3 in Houston...have won each of their first four season series against Houston and lead the all-time series, 40-21...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 21 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 21-11 in Oakland and 19-10 in Houston.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (43) and leads American League rookies in hits (139)...
Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (64).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1931 Lefty Grove wins his 30th game in a 2-1 win over Chicago...in 1954 the Philadelphia A's play the Yankees in their last game at Connie Mack Stadium...in 1972 Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...in 1974 Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in 1988 Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West championship...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record by walking 15 times in a 7-4 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-7, 2.56 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.307), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), ranks second in opponents batting average (.212) third in on-base percentage (.266) and ERA (2.56), tied for third in complete games (3), sixth in innings pitched (196.2) and tied for eighth in wins (13)...also ranks fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.7), tied for fourth in wild pitches (11), tied for fifth in opponents reaching base on an error (8) and tied for 10th in unearned runs (8).

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 1-1 with a 7.80 ERA (13 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts in September this year...is now 5-5 with a 3.92 ERA (37 er in 85.0 ip) in 14 career starts in the month.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 3.45 ERA (28 er in 73.0 ip) in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...last year he went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA after the break compared to 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA before the break...his career splits are 12-14 with a 3.27 ERA (83 er in 228.1 ip) in 36 games after the break compared to 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-3 with a 2.31 ERA (25 er in 97.1 ip) in 15 starts on the road compared to 5-4 with a 2.81 ERA (31 er in 99.1 ip) in 14 starts at home...ranks second in the American League in road ERA and tied for fourth in wins...has allowed five home runs in 97.1 innings on the road, 11 in 99.1 innings at home.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 36 putouts, which is an Athletics single season record for pitchers...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts are the most by a Major League pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...they are the most by an American League pitcher since Brown had 40 for the Orioles in 1995...ranks second among American League pitchers in total chances this year (58).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-3 with a 2.18 ERA (29 er in 119.2 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest compared to 5-4 with a 2.43 ERA (27 er in 77.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more...his ERA on four days rest is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs in his last seven starts (44.0 ip), including a career-high three Aug. 22 against Tampa Bay...yielded just eight home runs over his first 22 starts (152.2 ip) and has surrendered a career-high 16 home runs for the season...his average of 0.73 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...has allowed 10 of his 16 home runs with two strikes...10 have been solo shots.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .196 (37-for-189) with 12 walks (.244 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is third lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks fifth...leads the AL with a .133 (10-for-75) opponents batting average against the number eight hitter in the order, ranks third with a .192 (46-for-240) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, third with a .205 (76-for-371) average against left-handed hitters and sixth with a .145 (52-for-358) average with two strikes...all opponents average rankings are based on pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA (12 er in 60.2 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 8-5 with a 2.91 ERA (44 er in 136.0 ip) in 20 starts at night...has the fourth lowest day ERA in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Has 13 wins, which is one short of his career high of 14 from last year...has a career record of 32-20 and his .615 winning percentage is tied for eighth in Oakland history...the A's bullpen has blown a save in five of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22, Aug. 22)...is 28-2 in 41 career starts with three runs of support or more...was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers...has tossed at least seven innings in 16 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 18 times, one earned run or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...the A's are 16-13 (.552) in his starting assignments and are 40-32 (.556) when he starts in his career.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7, 14-inning loss at Chicago (AL) last Monday...matched his career high by allowing seven runs

(also Aug. 6, 2014 vs. TB)...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was his shortest career outing as a starter (previous: 3.1, Aug. 25, 2013 at Baltimore)...allowed four runs in the third inning on two-run home runs by Abreu and Thompson...then surrendered three more runs in the fourth without recording an out...walked Ramirez with the bases loaded and then yielded a two-run single to Abreu...was relieved by Rodriguez who retired the next three batters.

GRAY vs. HOUSTON: Is 4-2 with a 1.88 ERA (43.0 ip, 37 h, 10 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 33 so, 2 hr) in six career starts...is 4-1 with a 1.42 ERA (6 er in 38.0 ip) in five starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (3 er in 5.0 ip) in one start at Minute Maid Park...is 2-1 with a 1.71 ERA (21.0 ip, 17 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year...the

loss came in a 6-4 decision at Houston May 19...allowed a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and the A's scored a run in the third inning to make the score 2-1...also allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the fifth and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth with the A's trailing 3-2...then tossed a five-hitter in the A's 3-1 win in Oakland Aug. 7...did not walk a batter and struck out five...it was his first complete game in which he allowed a run...allowed his only run on a two-out home run by Valbuena in the fifth...combined with Dull on a five-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win in Oakland Sept. 8...tossed seven of the innings and allowed all five of the hits...the Astros biggest threat came in the second inning when they loaded the bases with one out but he struck out Conger and got Marisnick to pop out to end the inning.

RHP Aaron Brooks (2-3, 7.68 ERA): Is 1-3 with a 12.60 ERA and .419 opponents batting average over his last six games, including five starts...went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games, including two starts...has a 7.68 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 29 and is 1-2 with a 9.32 ERA in four starts since his return...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 17-6 A's win at Chicago-AL (6.0 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (11.0 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Houston, both this year in Oakland

- The A's bullpen has yielded just four runs in 25.2 innings (1.40 ERA) over its past five games but has a 4.91 ERA (64 er in 117.1 ip) over its past 30 contests (dating back to Aug. 16)...has a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.58).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (24), the lowest save percentage (53.3%) and is tied for the fourth most blown saves (21)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Has allowed the second most extra base hits (163) in the AL, the third most home runs (62), tied for the third fewest wins (19) and fourth most losses (26).
- Has allowed the third most first batter RBI in the majors (58) and is tied for fifth in first batter home runs (15).
- Pitched 10.2 innings on Monday, which was its most since April 29, 2013 against Los Angeles (AL) when it tossed 14.1 innings.
- The A's are 11-49 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 49-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 games, a 0.83 ERA over his next 23 games and has a 5.68 ERA (8 er in 12.2 ip) in 14 appearances since then (dating back to Aug. 14).
- Has allowed 11 home runs, which is third most among American League relievers and an ongoing career-high.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs (5) and has allowed the second-most first batter RBI (14) in the majors.
- Has a .208 (10-for-48) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .172 (5-for-29) with RISP and two outs.
