OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-86) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (80-69)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three at Houston over the weekend and are now 6-7 over the last 13 games...are 13-24 (.351) over the last 37 games and 64-86 (.427) for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in the majors...the 86 losses are tied for fourth most by an A's team over the last 18 years (88 in 1998 and 2011, 87 in 2009)...will finish under .500 for the first time since 2011 and just the fifth time in the last 17 seasons...are in last place in the AL West for the 61st consecutive day...have spent 129 of the last 133 days in sole possession of last (dating back to May 8), which are the fourth most days alone in last in Oakland history...have a tragic number of four to clinch a last place finish in the West...have finished last in the West just once over the previous 16 seasons (2009)...should the A's remain in last the rest of the season, they will finish with 142 days alone in last, which is third most in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the final home-stand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Texas (three games) and San Francisco (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2), Seattle (0-3) and Houston (2-1) and are 33-42 (.440) in Oakland, which is the worst home record in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (Milwaukee, 34-44)... have clinched a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time the A's will finish more than one game under .500 at home since 1998 (39-42)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years.

OFFENSE: The A's have 38 triples, which is the second best single season total in Oakland history...it is two short of the record of 40 set in 1968... have hit 28 home runs in 18 games in September, which is tied for third in the American League and matches the A's most in a month this year (May)...for the season, the A's rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1030), third in lowest slugging percentage (.395), tied for third in triples (38) and fourth in fewest home runs (135)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (151)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 12 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.40 ERA (115 er in 161.2 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors (Philadelphia, 5.78)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...now have a 3.97 ERA for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League...over the last 17 years, the only time the A's have not finished in the top four in the AL in ERA was in 2007 when they finished sixth...have allowed 66 home runs over the last 42 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (406) and fourth in opponents batting average (.249) and slugging percentage (.392)...opponents have been successful in just 73-of-112 (65.2%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-19 with a 6.11 ERA (129 er in 190.0 ip) over the last 37 games (dating back to Aug. 11)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 17 of those contests and are averaging 5.14 innings per start over that span...now have a 3.71 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 88 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have issued 271 walks, which is tied for fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just 39 errors in the last 77 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 111 errors for the season, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 115) and matches the A's season total from last year...have 61 unearned runs, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 22, which rank first and tied for second in the American League...the 56 errors are the most by two teammates in Oakland history and are the most by an Athletics duo since Dick Howser (38) and Jerry

Lumpe (18) combined for 56 with the 1961 Kansas City A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have tied the Oakland record for most one-run losses in a season with 32 (also in 1976)...are 17-32 (.347) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 13-27) and fifth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940, .352 in 1943)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...have also tied an Oakland record with 49 losses by two-runs or fewer (also in 1968)...are 27-49 (.355) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors...are 6-10 (.375) in extra inning games...the 16 extra inning games are tied for second in the American League, the losses rank third and the winning percentage is third lowest...are 10-18 in games decided in the last at bat...the last at bat wins are second fewest in the AL (NYY, 9) and the losses are third most.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 13-for-25 (.520) with two walks over the last 22 games...are batting .250 (29-for-116) with 17 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in triples (2), rank second in hits and plate appearances (136) and fourth in batting average...are one of three AL teams without a home run (Boston, Kansas City).

BASES LOADED: The A's are 11-for-22 (.500) with four doubles, a triple and home run with the bases loaded over the last 26 games...are batting .344 (44-for-128) for the season, which ranks second in the majors (Washington, .382) and third in Oakland history...rank second in the majors in RBI (118), tied for third in grand slams (6) and fourth in plate appearances (147).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's currently have 37 players on the active roster... have set a franchise record by using 30 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 23 relievers...the 23 relievers match the 1965 Kansas City A's for second most in franchise history (26 in 1955)...the A's have used the disabled list 23 times, which is their most since 2010 (23)...players have combined to miss 1019 games while on the DL, which is the most since 2012 (1072)...currently have seven players on the DL

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-28 (.333) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second worst record in the majors (Colorado, 9-28)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .328 (19-39) in 1979...the A's have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas and have played 22 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...have a streak of 33 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history (35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series for the third time in the last four years as they lead 10-6 with three games remaining...went 6-3 in Texas and are 4-3 in Oakland...are 40-33 against Texas over the last four years...are 332-340 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 173-161 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...have an all-time record of 429-422 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (44) and leads American League rookies in hits (141)...
Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (65).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game for the second time in 11 days, an American League record that still stands today...in **1913** 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in **1970** Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats, including a pair of doubles, but the A's lose to Minnesota, 5-3...in **1989** Dave Stewart pitches seven innings in the A's 5-2 win at Minnesota to win his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties a major league record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Nolin (1-1, 3.24 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and is 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA (6 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts...was one of four players acquired from Toronto for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season and began the season on the Oakland disabled list as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder...was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .188 (3-for-16) batting average and has walked just one batter to lead off an inning...opponents are batting .286 (12-for-42) with both of his home runs with the bases empty compared to .150 (3-for-20) with runners on base...has surrendered both of his home runs to right-handed hitters...has not allowed a hit to the opponents clean-up hitter (0-for-9).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle September 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Marte, a sacrifice fly by Seager and a wild pitch...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Texas Sept. 12...allowed a leadoff home run to Napoli in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in 5.2 innings...the A's scored five times in the fifth for the win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win at Chicago (AL) last Thursday...shutout the White Sox on two singles and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Olt in the fourth...also yielded a RBI single to Cabrera in the fifth and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-1...Oakland scored three times in the ninth for the win.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 14 games, including 12 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 10 games in May and June, 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts in August...walked 17 batters in 33.2 innings in May and June (4.54 per nine innings), two in 13.2 innings in August (1.32 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a mark of .167 (7-for-42) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against right-handers...allowed one double and two walks to lefties for a .190 slugging percentage and .205 on-base percentage...surrendered all five of his home runs and nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...all five of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .319 average with the bases empty compared to .125 with runners on base...opponents were 4-for-35 (.114) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-13 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .396 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.83 ERA in 10 games at night compared to 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts during the day...logged a 0.75 ERA in the first inning...Nashville was 8-4 (.667) in his 12 starting assignments...did not toss more than 5.2 innings in any of his 14 outings...allowed one run or fewer 11 times and four hits or fewer 12 times.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Was sent to Nashville on a rehab assignment from Oakland on May 5...pitched scoreless relief in his first two outings May 5 against Iowa (1.0 ip) and May 9 against Round Rock (2.0 ip)...then started and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings May 14 at Iowa and was

reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Nashville the next day...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Sacramento, giving him a 0.71 ERA over his first five games...issued four walks in 12.2 innings over that stretch but then walked a season-high four batters in 4.0 innings May 30 against Las Vegas...finished May with no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in six games, four starts...was placed on the disabled list June 1 with a strained left groin...was reinstated June 9 and went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in four starts in June...picked up his first win of the season June 16 against Memphis when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and three walks...then yielded a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings in his next start June 21 against Omaha for his first loss...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings June 27 against Oklahoma City for his second and final win of the season...also allowed a season-high eight hits and tossed a season-high 102 pitches in that game...was placed on the minor league DL a second time July 1 with a strained left shoulder...was reinstated Aug. 15 and went 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts following his return...tossed fewer than five innings in each of those starts as he increased his pitch count from 32 on Aug. 15 to 76 in his final start on Aug. 31...struck out a season-high six batters in his final start, a no decision in a 5-1 win over Round Rock.

CAREER: Pitched in one game for Toronto in each of the previous two seasons and went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA in two games, one start...is 29-19 with a 3.02 ERA (163 er in 485.2 ip) in 106 games, including 98 starts, in six seasons in the minors...has 489 strikeouts in 485.2 innings...has allowed just 34 home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...was acquired by the A's from Toronto with infielder Brett Lawrie, pitcher Kendall Graveman and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for third baseman Josh Donaldson, Nov. 28, 2014...was named the A's seventh best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade after being named the Blue Jays 10th best prospect following the 2013 season...combined for a perfect 10-0 record and a 2.04 ERA in 20 games, including 18 starts, in 2012 with Single-A Dunedin and Double-A New Hampshire...was drafted three times and signed with Toronto after being selected in the sixth round of the 2010 draft.

LHP Felix Doubront (3-2, 4.95 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 7.25 ERA and .318 opponents batting average over his last four starts...went 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first four games with the A's...was acquired by the A's from the Blue Jays on July 31 for cash considerations and is 2-1 with a 5.14 ERA in seven games, including five starts...went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win at Houston last Friday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 0-5 with a 12.68 ERA and .427 opponents batting average in eight career appearances, including five starts, against Texas...the five losses are his most against any team...was the losing pitcher in his only appearance this year, a start in the A's 12-4 loss at Texas on Sept. 13 (4.1 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 5 so), 3 hr).

- The A's bullpen has allowed seven runs in its past two games (3.2 ip, 17.18 ERA) after yielding just four runs in 25.2 innings (1.40 ERA) in its previous five games...has a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is the second highest in the American League (Detroit, 4.55).
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (24), the lowest save percentage (52.2%) and is tied for the third most blown saves (22)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Has allowed the second most home runs (65) and extra base hits (168) in the AL and is tied for the third fewest wins (19) and third most losses (27).
- Has allowed the third most first batter RBI in the majors (59) and is tied for fourth in first batter home runs (16).
- The A's are 11-51 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 49-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 games, a 0.83 ERA over his next 23 games and has a 5.54 ERA (8 er in 13.0 ip) in 15 appearances since then (dating back to Aug. 14).
- Has allowed 11 home runs, which is third most among American League relievers and an ongoing career-high.
- Is tied for the most first batter home runs in the majors (5) and has allowed the second most first batter RBI (14).
- Has a .208 (10-for-48) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .172 (5-for-29) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a 2.45 ERA (7 er in 25.2 ip) in 31 games at home compared to 5.40 (12 er in 20.0 ip) in 27 contests on the road.
- Has a 6.23 ERA (3 er in 4.1 ip) in seven games against the Rangers this year.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 1 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and has a 7.71 ERA (6 er in 7.0 ip) in seven appearances since then.
- Right-handed hitters are 8-for-37 (.216) off him...has a .406 (13-for-32) average against lefties.
- Has made five appearances in his career against Texas, all this year (4.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr, 9.00 ERA).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed nine runs in six appearances before he was optioned to Nashville April 22...allowed five runs in three innings during his second stint from May 2-7...pitched once during his most recent stay July 28 to Aug. 2, tossing one-third of an inning.
