DIEKMAN

CAREER: The 28-year-old Diekman emerged as a reliable left-handed reliever for the Phillies in 2014, appearing in a team-high 73 games...has pitched in 191 games for Philadelphia since his debut with the club in 2012...has averaged 11.7 strikeouts per 9 innings and just 0.5 home runs per 9 innings in his big league career...his career-high 100 strikeouts in 2014 ranked 3rd among National League relievers behind Aroldis Chapman (106) and Kenley Jansen (101)...has held left-handed batters to a .219 (56-256) average in his career, allowing just 2 home runs to lefties...was drafted by Philadelphia in the 30th round of the 2007 draft out of Cloud County Community College in Concordia, Kansas.

2014: Made his 1st Opening Day roster and spent his 1st full season in the majors...among NL relievers, finished 3rd in SO (100), 4th in SO/9.0 IP (12.68), T-6th in innings (71.0) and T-9th in games (73)...set career highs in wins (5), games, innings and SO...his 100 SO were the most by a Phillies reliever since Al Holland also recorded 100 SO in 1983 (91.2 IP)...had a career-best 10.2-inning scoreless streak (8 G, 5/2-20)...pitched a scoreless 7th inning (2 SO) in the Phillies combined no-hitter, 9/1 at ATL...21 of his final 25 appearances were scoreless (2.38 ERA, 6 ER, 22.2 IP)...pitched at least 2.0 innings in 7 games and posted a 1.29 ERA (2 ER, 14.0 IP) in those games...the Phillies went 39-34 (.534) in games he appeared.

2013: Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA)...was recalled on 6/14 and spent the rest of the season with the Phillies...struck out a career-high 5 batters (in order), 7/3 at PIT (1.2 IP)...appeared in both games of a doubleheader on 7/13 vs CWS (1.1 IP, 2 H, BB, SO)...had a 10.0-inning scoreless streak (10 G), 8/11-9/1...recorded 6 consecutive SO over 3 appearances, 9/4-12...posted a 0.52 ERA (1 ER, 17.1 IP) in his final 19 ML games and finished the season riding a 6.1-inning scoreless streak...held LHH to a .073 AVG (3-41) over his final 28 games...did not allow an XBH over his final 26 games...allowed 6 ER in 29.2 IP (1.82 ERA) with a .190 opponent's AVG (20-105) over his final 34 games after allowing 5 ER in 8.2 IP (5.19 ERA), .350 opponent's AVG (14-40) over his 1st 11 appearances...**2012:** Began the season with Lehigh Valley...named Phillies Minor League Pitcher of the Week, 4/30-5/6 (1-0, 2 SV, 0.00 ERA, 3.1 IP)...went 1-0, 5 SV, 6 SVO, 0.59 ERA (1 ER, 15.1 IP), 3 BB, 22 SO in his first 13 appearances, 4/5-5/9...held opponents to a .196 AVG (19-97) and .185 (5-27) with RISP...recalled on 5/11...made his ML debut on 5/15 vs HOU (1.1 IP) and earned the win in Phillies' 4-3 walk-off victory in 10 innings...was the 1st Phillies reliever to earn his 1st ML win in his debut since 5/17/09 (Sergio Escalona at WSH)...had 4 SO in 1.2 IP, 5/22 vs WSH...averaged 11.52 SO/9.0 IP (35 SO/27.1 IP) with the Phillies...held LHH to a .200 AVG (9-45) with 18 SO...posted a 3.60 ERA (6 ER, 15.0 IP) in his first 17 games and a 4.38 ERA (6 ER, 12.1 IP) over his final 15 games...

optioned to Lehigh Valley on 7/31...allowed runs in only 2 of his last 12 appearances in the minors, 8/1-29...recalled for the 2nd time on 9/3 and posted a 1.50 ERA (1 ER, 6.0 IP) over his final 9 games...**2011:** Spent the season with Reading (AA) where he T-4th in the Eastern League in appearances (53)...averaged 11.49 SO/9.0 IP (83 SO/65.0 IP)...held opponents to a .199 AVG (47-236); LHH hit .099 (9-91) against him and RHH hit .262 (38-145)...went 3-for-3 in save opportunities; had two 2.0-inning saves: 7/10 vs Trenton and 7/22 vs Binghamton...posted an ERA lower than 1.80 in June (1.46, 12.1 IP), July (1.59, 17.0 IP) and August (1.76, 15.1 IP)...had a season-best 11.2-inning scoreless streak (9 G), 7/22-8/13...posted a 1.95 ERA (6 ER, 27.2 IP) over his final 21 games of the season; had a 3.86 ERA over his first 32 appearances...pitched at least 2.0 innings in 13 of his 53 appearances...played for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League where he was named to the AFL Top Prospects team...had a 0.79 ERA (1 ER, 11.1 IP) with 14 SO in 11 AFL relief appearances...**2010:** Began season with Lakewood (A), where 18 of his 21 relief appearances were scoreless...promoted to Clearwater (A), 6/24...held opponents to a .187 AVG (38-203) combined between Lakewood and Clearwater...played for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League...participated in Florida Instructional League...**2009:** Began the season with Lakewood...transferred to Williamsport (A) on 6/15, but did not pitch...transferred back to Lakewood, 6/19...was 1-0, 7.09 ERA (21 ER, 26.2 IP) in first 11 appearances and 1-0, 1.24 ERA (4 ER, 29.0 IP) with a .176 opponents AVG in final 21 appearances...participated in FIL...**2008:** Began the season with Lakewood...transferred to Williamsport on 7/22 where he finished the season...participated in FIL...**2007:** Began his pro career with the Gulf Coast League Phillies (R)...made 3 scoreless appearances to open the season (9.0 IP), including a win in his pro debut, 6/22 vs Indians...promoted to Williamsport on 8/24 where he finished the season.

DYSON

CAREER: The 27-year-old right hander is in his fourth professional season after spending parts of each of the last three seasons with Toronto (2012) and Miami (2013-14)...has appeared almost exclusively in relief during his big league career, posting a 4.02 ERA (24 ER/53.2 IP) over 38 games and 1 start...entered 2015 having given up just 3 home runs over 243 batters faced for a HR/9 IP mark of 0.5...made his major league debut with Toronto on July 5, 2012 vs. KC and made the first start of his big league career on Sept. 16, 2013 at PHI while with Miami...posted a 10-14 record with a 2.78 ERA (65 ER/210.2 IP) over 3 minor-league seasons, making 74 total appearances...has been named a midseason all-start twice at the Double-A level, earning the recognition in both the Eastern and Southern Leagues...missed the 2011 season due to Tommy John ligament replacement surgery on his right elbow...was drafted twice (2006 - WSH, 2009 - OAK) before being selected in the fourth round of the 2010 June draft by the Toronto Blue Jays.

WITH MIAMI: Tallied an even 3-3 record with a 3.57 ERA (21 ER/53.0 IP), working a total of 36 games over parts of two seasons with the Marlins...averaged 8.2 SO/9 IP with the club, holding opponents to a .263 average with a 0.6 HR/9 IP mark.

2014: Went 3-1, 2.14 (10 ER/42.0 IP) over 31 major-league appearances with Miami, posting 33 SO to 15 BB on the season...allowed just one home run to total of 284 batters faced...opened season with the Zephyrs (AAA), appearing in eight games with a 0-1 record and one save with a 2.76 ERA (5 ER/16.1 IP) prior to being placed on 7-day disabled list with a facial fracture on April 30...finished the season at 2-1, 2.49 for the Zephyrs, as 9 of 13 appearances with the club spanned 2.0+ IP, including a season-high 3.0 IP on 4/15 at Iowa...earned save in Zephyrs 8-4 win, allowing just one hit...recalled by Miami on June 15 and earned first Major League win on 6/17 vs. Cubs (1.1 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 1 SO)...also earned wins on 8/19 vs. TEX and 9/15 at NYM...posted a 1.37 ERA (3 ER/19.2 IP) while holding opponents to a .219 average over his first 13 outings from 6/28-8/10, recording 12 scoreless appearances over that span...logged career-high 3.1 innings on July 19 vs. San Francisco and equaled that mark on 8/26 at LAA...allowed multiple earned runs just two times over 31 appearances with Miami...went 1-0, 1.52 (2 ER/11.2 IP) over final 11 games, and his 2.14 ERA ranked third among N.L. rookie relievers (min. 40.0 IP), also finishing T2nd among rookie NL relievers in wins (3).

2013: Made just 5 appearances in the majors, all coming from 8/29-9/22... allowed 11 ER over 11.0 IP to go 0-2, 9.00 with Miami, working 2.0+ IP in each of his first four outings... allowed runs in 3 of 5 games, including career-high 7 R-ER on 6 hits over 2.2 IP on 9/16 at PHI...pitched 3.0 IP in back-to-back outings on 9/7 vs. WSH (2 H, 1 R-ER, 2 SO) and 9/12 vs. ATL (2 H, 2 SO)...saw action across three levels of minor-league play in the Marlins system, combining to go 4-11, 2.67 (33 ER/111.1 IP) with the GCL Marlins (Rookie), Jacksonville (AA) and New Orleans (AAA)...held LHBs to a .133 average, compared to a .244 mark by RHBs at the Triple-A level...was named a midseason All-Star in the Southern League, making 16 appearances with Jacksonville...went 3-3, 2.29 (9 ER/35.1 IP) on the road in Double-A competition, compared to 0-4, 2.93 (13 ER/40.2 IP) at home.

2012: Went 4-2, 3.04 (25 ER/74.0 IP) over 39 games/6 starts across the High-A and Double-A levels in the Toronto system... made 33 appearances with New Hampshire (AA), going 2-2, 2.38 (12 ER/45.1 IP) with a 1.17 WHIP for the club...only allowed runs in 1 outing over his first 15 appearances, including a span of 12 scoreless outings, with New Hampshire, posting a 0.75 ERA (2 ER/24.0 IP) prior to having his contract purchased by the major-league club...pitched exclusively in relief with the Fisher Cats, earning a midseason All-Star selection in the Eastern League...made 6 starts with Dunedin (A+), working to a 2-0 record with a 4.08 ERA (13 ER/28.2 IP), registering 16 SO to just 5 BB...made 2 appearances in the majors, including his big-league debut on 7/5 at KC (0.1 IP, 1 BB, 1 SO)...also threw 0.1 IP on 7/17 at NYY, allowing 3 earned runs on 4 hits in the outing.

PERSONAL: Samuel Isaac Dyson...missed the 2011 season recovering from Tommy John surgery on his right elbow... attended University of South Carolina (Columbia) and earned Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball in 2008...graduated from Jesuit High School in Tampa, Fla., where he earned Sunbelt Player of the Year honors his senior year with a 10-1 record.

FREEMAN

CAREER: The DFW-area native was acquired in a trade with St. Louis at the end of spring training this year...the left-hander has seen action in each of the last three seasons with the Cardinals, setting career highs in most categories over 44 appearances in 2014...Freeman made a postseason roster in two of the last three seasons for the Cardinals (2012 Wild Card and 2014 ALDS)... has made 57 appearances with St. Louis the past two seasons, going 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA (14 ER/50.1 IP), the 8th-lowest ERA in MLB in that span among left-handed relievers with at least 50.0 innings...has held right-handed batters to a .188 (29-154) average over the past three seasons (2012-2014), 5th-lowest among all left-handed pitchers in majors (min. 100 batters faced)...born in Houston, Freeman graduated from Hebron High School in Carrollton, Texas, and still resides in Lewisville, a suburb of Dallas. He pitched at North Central Texas College in Gainesville and was selected by St. Louis in the 32nd round of the 2008 June draft out of the University of Kansas.

POSTSEASON: Was on Cardinals postseason rosters for 2012 N.L. Wild Card Game at Atlanta and 2014 NLDS vs. Los Angeles-NL...was replaced on club's NLCS roster last year by A.J. Pierzynski...lone postseason outing came in Game 1 of 2014 NLDS at LAD, walking both batters faced in relief of Adam Wainwright in Cards' eventual 10-9 win over Clayton Kershaw... in 2013, traveled with ML team during postseason run to World Series, but was not on any official playoff roster.

EXTRA EFFORT: Each of Freeman's 3 MLB wins have come for St. Louis in extra-inning games...wins came 8/13/13 vs. PIT (pitched 14th inning), 6/4/14 at KC (10th), and 9/18/14 vs. MIL (13th).

2014: Went 2-0 with a 2.61 ERA (11 ER/38.0 IP) over 44 relief outings with St. Louis, setting MLB career highs in most categories, including games, innings, strikeouts (35) and games finished (9)...his 2.61 ERA ranked 15th in MLB among pitchers with 40-or-more appearances...had 2 stints with Cardinals: 5/13-17 and 5/24-end of season...scoreless in 35 of 44 appearances...had career-high 11 holds, T4th on staff... allowed one of 8 inherited runners to score (12.5%)...still does not have a save opportunity in his ML career...first batters hit .243 (9-37) with 7 BB...his groundball percentage was 60.0%, 14th in N.L. among pitchers with 35.0+ IP...opponents slugged just .299, as he permitted only 5 extra-base hits all season... had a 1.31 ERA (3 ER/20.2 IP) in 25 appearances with Yadier Molina behind the plate...posted 3.0 scoreless innings in extra frames, with opponents going 0-for-8, as both of his wins came in extras (6/4 at KC, 9/18 vs. MIL)...held right-handed batters to a .195 (17-87) average with 2 extra base hits (both doubles), 11th-lowest average against among ML lefty relievers...had a career-high 8.0 inning scoreless streak over his first 8 games with St. Louis, 5/13-6/10...career-high 4 K's on 8/11 at MIA, tying career high with 2.0 IP...both HR allowed came 8/8 at BAL... appeared in 16 G for Memphis, allowing 4 of his 7 ER in one

outing (4/9 at Omaha)...no ER over 8 G/9.2 IP between 4/24-5/21 w/ Memphis.

2013: Made 13 appearances over 2 stints with Cardinals: 8/8-15 and 8/29-end of season...scoreless in 11 of 13 outings...did not allow a run in first 7 G/7.2 IP for STL covering 8/8-9/4...first ML win on 8/13 vs. PIT, a 14-inning walk-off victory for Cards... faced 50 batters and did not allow a HR...spent bulk of season with Memphis, ranking among team leaders in games (49) and wins (T2nd, 7)...led staff with 10 holds...making 49 relief appearances...did not allow a run over 15 games and 25.0 innings from 5/28-7/9, opponents batting .157 (14-89) w/ 32 SO in that span...**2012:** Saw first ML action over 2 stints with St. Louis: 6/1-29, 9/1-end of season...recalled from Memphis by Cardinals on 6/1 and made ML debut that night at NYM (0.2 IP, 1 H, 1 R-ER, 2 BB, 1 SO) in 8-0 STL loss...appeared in 13 of team's 26 games during his June stint, going 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (8 ER/12.0 IP)...during September stint, was 0-1, 4.50 (4 ER/8.0 IP) in 11 G...began year with Springfield (AA) before promotion to Memphis on 5/14...had 15 G with Springfield, going 1-3, 1.56...pitched for Surprise in the Arizona Fall League (7 G, 7.0 IP, 3 R-ER)...**2011:** Combined to go 2-2, 3.16 (24 ER/68.1 IP) in 59 games with Palm Beach (High-A) and Springfield, his first action since elbow surgery the previous year...his 59 appearances ranked 4th among minors lefty pitchers, T13th overall...his 3.16 ERA was 5th-lowest among minors pitchers with 59+ appearances...led Springfield with 25 games finished while going 3-for-3 in save opportunities...scoreless in 41 of 52 at Double-A, including 13 straight scoreless outings from 5/20-6/17 (14.1 IP)...**2010:** Invited to major league camp in spring as a non-roster invitee but missed the entire season after having left elbow ulnar collateral ligament reconstruction surgery on 3/10...**2009:** Went a combined 2-2, 2.41 (15 ER/56.0 IP) in 41 relief appearances with Palm Beach and Springfield...the 41 games ranked 4th among Cards minors lefties...selected to Florida State League All-Star Game, but was called up to Springfield on 6/12 and did not appear in that contest...at Palm Beach, lefties hit .147...sidelined 7/25-end of season with a left elbow sprain...**2008:** After signing, pitched for Johnson City in Appalachian League...made pro debut on 6/18 at Bristol (1.0 IP, 1 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 3 SO)...had 2.50 ERA (5 ER/18.0 IP) last 14 G in Appy League before finishing reg. season with High-A debut on 8/28 vs. St. Lucie (2.0 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 4 SO)...also pitched twice for Palm Beach in FSL playoffs (2.1 IP, 2 SO).
