OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-89) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (79-73)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost their 89th game of the season yesterday, which are their most losses over the last 18 years...with one more loss, the A's will have their first 90-loss season since 1997 (65-97)...every team except the Yankees and Cardinals has at least one 90-loss season since then...the loss yesterday also clinched a last place finish in the American League West for the eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009), but just the second time over the last 17 seasons...will finish the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...will spend the final 74 days (beginning July 23) and 142 of the final 146 (beginning May 8) alone in last...currently have a five-game losing streak to fall 25 games under .500 for the first time since finishing the 1997 season 32 games under (65-97)...are 64-89 (.418), which is the worst record in the AL and tied for fifth worst in the majors...will finish under .500 for the first time since 2011 and just the fifth time in the last 17 seasons.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 33-45 (.423) at home and need to win two of the final three home games to avoid finishing with the second worst home record in Oakland history...are tied with Colorado for the worst home record in the majors...are 0-3 on the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (three games)...have lost four straight home games and nine of the last 11...will have a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time the A's will finish more than one game under .500 at home over that span...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Houston, 29-46)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...leave following the game Sunday for the final road trip of the season to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 10-7 (.588) in interleague play and need one more win to clinch a winning record against the National League for the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years...are batting .279 (166-for-595) in 17 interleague games and have scored 84 runs...rank fifth in the majors in interleague batting and runs per game (4.94)...the batting average is the third best interleague mark in Oakland history (.316 in 2004, .282 in 2002, .277 in 2005)...the pitching staff has a 3.04 ERA (51 er in 151.0 ip), which ranks seventh...went 13-7 against the NL last year and have the fourth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 190-151 (.557)...have won 22 of their last 28 interleague games in the Coliseum.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 6-15 (.286) in September, which is the second worst record in the majors (Philadelphia, 5-16)...the pitching staff has compiled a 6.68 ERA (140 er in 188.2 ip), which is more than a run higher than the next closest team (Kansas City, 5.27)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...have yielded 145 runs, which are their most in a month since August of 2011 (151)...have surrendered 37 home runs, which match the A's most in a month over the last 17 years...have not allowed more than 37 home runs in a month since August of 1998 (40).

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 41 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...the A's rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1047), tied for second in triples, third in lowest slugging percentage (.395) and fourth in fewest home runs (137)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (153)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154)...have 13 sacrifice hits, which are the fewest in the majors and are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season is 18 in 2007.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 26 runs in the three-game series against Texas to start the homestand, which were their most in a three-game series since Sept. 9-11, 2011 at Texas (28)...now have a 4.06 ERA for the season,

which ranks 10th in the American League...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have allowed 71 home runs over the last 45 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have 1133 strikeouts, which is the fifth highest single season total in Athletics history...all five of those seasons have come in the last five years (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011, 1136 in 2012)...lead the AL in shutouts (15), rank third in fewest extra base hits (420) and fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.395)...opponents have been successful in just 74-of-114 (64.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-12 with an 8.34 ERA (92 er in 99.1 ip) and .337 (140-for-416) opponents batting average in 21 games in September...have tossed five innings or fewer 12 times and are averaging 4.73 innings per start this month...now have a 3.81 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 91 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have issued 276 walks, which are fourth most in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last three games, marking the first time this year they have three straight multi-error games...now have 117 errors for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...the 117 errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 45 errors in the last 80 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 62 unearned runs, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 23, which rank first and second in the AL...the 57 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Eddie Joost (38) and Ferris Fain (19) combined for 57 with the 1947 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set an Oakland record with 50 losses by two runs or fewer (previous: 49 in 1968) and tied an Oakland record with 32 one-run losses (also 1976)...are 17-32 (.347) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 13-27) and fifth worst in Athletics history (.256 in 1916, .310 in 1946, .333 in 1919, .341 in 1940, .352 in 1943)...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 27-50 (.351) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have set a franchise record by using 30 pitchers and an Oakland record by using 24 relievers...the 24 relievers are second most in franchise history (26 in 1955)...currently have 37 players on the active roster...have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...have played 23 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...have a streak of 34 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history (35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games).

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's are 0-3 against the Giants after being swept in a three-game series at San Francisco in July...have lost three straight and 16 of the last 19 games in San Francisco but have won five straight and 11 of the last 13 contests in Oakland...have won each of the previous two season series...in the previous 18 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 53-50 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 31-19 in Oakland and 22-31 in San Francisco.

Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (66).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1987 Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit an Oakland and major league rookie record 49 home runs...in 1990 Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (13-7, 2.72 ERA)

IN SEPTEMBER: Is 1-1 with a 7.97 ERA (18 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts in September...tossed seven shutout innings in his one win this month and has allowed at least five runs in his other three starts...the highest single-month ERA of his career is 5.40 in June, 2014...is now 5-5 with a 4.18 ERA (42 er in 90.1 ip) in 15 career starts in the month.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 3.79 ERA (33 er in 78.1 ip) in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 18 starts before the break...last year he went 4-7 with a 3.47 ERA after the break compared to 10-3 with a 2.79 ERA before the break...his career splits are 12-14 with a 3.39 ERA (88 er in 233.2 ip) in 37 games after the break compared to 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA in 38 career appearances before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.314), is tied for the lead in shutouts (2), ranks third in ERA (2.72) and opponents batting average (.217), tied for third in complete games (3), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), seventh in innings pitched (202.0) and tied for ninth in wins (13)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (13), ranks fifth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8) and tied for fifth in opponents reaching base on an error (8).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Has 37 putouts, which is an Athletics single season record for pitchers...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts are the most by a Major League pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...they are the most by an American League pitcher since Brown had 40 for the Orioles in 1995...ranks second among AL pitchers in total chances this year (59).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 1.17 ERA (15.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 14 so) in two interleague starts, including a three-hit shutout at Los Angeles July 28...is now 2-2 with a 3.24 ERA (15 er in 41.2 ip) in seven career interleague appearances, including six starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed eight home runs in his last eight starts (49.1 ip), including a career-high three Aug. 22 against Tampa Bay...yielded just eight home runs over his first 22 starts (152.2 ip) and has surrendered a career-high 16 home runs for the season...his average of 0.71 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...has allowed 10 of his 16 home runs with two strikes...10 have been solo shots.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Leads the American League with a .130 (10-for-77) opponents batting average against the number eight hitter in the order, ranks third with a .197 (48-for-244) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, fifth with a .209 (80-for-382) average against left-handed hitters and seventh with a .145 (53-for-365) average with two strikes...opponents are batting .210 (41-for-195) with 12 walks (.256 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is fifth lowest in the AL and the batting average ranks sixth...all opponents average rankings are based on pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA (30 er in 102.2 ip) in 16 starts on the road compared to 5-4 with a 2.81 ERA (31 er in 99.1 ip) in 14 starts at home...ranks second in the American League in road ERA and tied for fifth in wins...his road ERA is eighth lowest in Oakland history...has allowed five home runs in 102.2 innings on the road, 11 in 99.1 innings at home...has allowed just 11 home runs in 230.0 career innings on the road, an average of 0.43 per nine innings.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA (12 er in 60.2 ip) in nine starts during the day compared to 8-5 with a 3.12 ERA (49 er in 141.1 ip) in 21 starts at night...has the second lowest day ERA in the American League...his day ERA is sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings and is the lowest since Tim Hudson had a 1.39 ERA in 2003.

THIS AND THAT: Has 13 wins, which is one short of his career high of 14 from last year...has a career record of 32-20 and his .615 winning percentage is tied for eighth in Oakland history...the A's bullpen has blown a save in six of his starts (April 11, May 8, June 19, July 22, Aug. 22, Sept. 19)...is 28-2 in 42 career starts with three runs of support or more...was named to his first American League All-Star team but pitched on the Sunday before the game and elected not to be active in the game...placed third in player voting among starting pitchers...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April and 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts in May, marking the second and third time in his career he posted an ERA under 2.00 in a month (also 1.03 in July, 2014)...finished May with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May and fell three short of the record of 44 (Chuck

Dobson in 1968, Vida Blue in 1971)...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...has tossed at least seven innings in 16 of his 30 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 18 times, one earned run or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 22 times...the A's are 16-14 (.533) in his starting assignments and are 40-33 (.548) when he starts in his career.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 10-6 loss at Houston last Saturday...allowed three runs in the first inning, highlighted by a Lowrie RBI double, but the A's scored once in the second, twice in the fourth and three times in the fifth inning to take a 6-3 lead...he allowed a RBI single to Valbuena in the sixth and was relieved by Pomeranz with one out and a runner on first...Pomeranz allowed that run to score and Rodriguez allowed a three-run home run to Gattis in the seventh inning for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Barry Zito (0-0, 18.00 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 16 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and first start of the season...was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring after sitting out the 2014 season...signed a minor league deal Feb. 17 and spent the entire season at Nashville where he went 8-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts...faced the Astros last Sunday at Houston (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 0 so, 1 hr) in his first Major League outing since Sept. 29, 2013...has not started since Sept. 25, 2013, a 6-4 Giants win over the Dodgers in San Francisco (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so)...has not started for the A's since taking the loss in Game 1 of the 2006 ALCS against Detroit (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.33 ERA in four career appearances, all starts, against San Francisco...last faced the Giants on May 22, 2005 at San Francisco, a loss (7.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has yielded 18 runs in its past five games (17 er in 18.0 ip, 8.50 ERA) and has a 5.39 ERA (81 er in 135.1 ip) over its past 35 games (dating back to Aug. 16)...has a 4.53 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (24), the lowest save percentage (52.2%) and is tied for the fifth most blown saves (22)...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982).
- Has allowed the second most home runs (67) in the majors (Boston, 72)...has yielded the second most extra base hits (175) in the AL and is tied for the third most losses (28) and third fewest wins (19).
- Has allowed the third most first batter RBI in the majors (62) and is tied for the third most first batter home runs (17).
- The A's are 11-54 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 49-34 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 games, a 0.83 ERA over his next 23 games and has a 7.24 ERA (11 er in 13.2 ip) in 16 appearances since then (dating back to Aug. 14).
- Has allowed 11 home runs, which is third most among American League relievers and an ongoing career-high.
