TONIGHT'S GAME: The Giants will try to snap their two-game losing streak...SF is currently on their final road trip of the season where they played three in San Diego (1-2) and now have a three-game set here in Oakland.

TIME IS RUNNING OUT: San Francisco enters tonight 8.0 games behind the Dodgers in the NL West and 10.0 games back of Chicago for the second wild card spot...SF could be eliminated from the Wild Card race with either a loss or Cubs win today.

ON THE MOUND: RHP Mike Leake (10-9, 3.81) has struggled lately, posting a 7.36 ERA (12er, 14.2ip) over his last three outings...he is coming off his shortest start in nearly two years after allowing three runs and eight hits in just 3.0 innings of work during the Giants' 6-0 loss to Arizona last Saturday.

STARTING STRONG: Giants starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each of their last 14 games, posting a 2.19 ERA (20er, 82.1ip) and a .187 (55-for-294) opponents' avg. against in this span.

BULLPEN STRUGGLES: Giants relievers have struggled during the first three games of this road trip blowing three of four save opportunities and posting a 9.35 ERA (9er, 8.2ip).

ROAD WOES: SF has lost 18 of their last 24 games away from AT&T Park...the Giants have gone 0-6-1 (win-lost-split) in their last seven road series and will be seeking their first road series win since taking two of three at Atlanta from Aug. 3-5.

STIFF CHALLENGE: The Giants have dropped their last five games here in Oakland and have not won a series at O.co Coliseum since taking two of three games from June 22-24, 2012.

CLOSE CALLS: SF is 16-26 (.381) in games decided by one run, going 8-5 at home and 8-21 on the road...SF has lost 14 of their last 15 one-run games and 20 of their last 25.

RUNNING WILD: The Giants have gone 19-for-25 in stolen base attempts in their last 13 games...SF is tied for sixth in the NL in steals this season with 90, however, since the All-Star break, they have gone 51-for-65 (78.5%) in stolen base attempts, which stands as the most steals in the big leagues.

THE ROOKIE: IF Matt Duffy stole two bases last night and became the third Giants rookie in franchise history with at least 70 runs scored, 70 RBI and 10 stolen bases...**Orlando Cepeda** accomplished the feat in 1958 (88 runs, 96 RBI, 15 steals) and **Chili Davis** did it in 1982 (86 runs, 76 RBI, 24 steals) (Stats, Inc.).

FLEXING HIS MUSCLES: IF Brandon Crawford slugged his team leading 20th home run of the season last night and joined **Rich Aurilia** (accomplished feat three times) as the only Giants shortstops to hit 20 home runs in a season since the club moved to San Francisco in 1958.

WITH THE BATS: The Giants have been one of the top offensive teams in the National League this season, ranking first in team batting average (.267), second in on-base percentage (.327), fifth in slugging pct. (.406) and fifth in runs per game (4.30).

WITH THE GLOVES: The Giants' 73 errors this season are the third-fewest in the NL (Dodgers, 71 and Dodgers, 72)...since the All-Star break, SF's 27 miscues are the fewest among NL clubs.

IN THE TRAINERS ROOM: The following Giants players are currently on the DL: **RHP Tim Lincecum** (left hip surgery), **IF Joe Panik** (back inflammation), **OF Hunter Pence** (strained left oblique), **OF Juan Perez** (strained left oblique), **C Hector Sanchez** (strained left hamstring, ankle sprain) and **C Andrew Susac** (right wrist surgery)...the following players are on the active roster, however are unavailable due to injury: **IF Ehire Adrianza** (concussion), **OF Nori Aoki** (concussion), **OF Gregor Blanco** (concussion) and **IF Brandon Belt** (concussion).

MEDIA AVAILABILITY: Giants pitcher **Tim Hudson** and A's pitcher Barry Zito, the scheduled starting pitchers for tomorrow's game, will be available to the media today at 4:45 p.m., in the A's interview room on Level 1 of the O.co Coliseum.

THIS DATE IN GIANTS HISTORY

Sept. 25, 1965: At age 34, **Willie Mays** became the oldest player to slug 50 home runs in a season...the Giants center fielder was also the youngest to accomplish the feat, hitting 51 homers in 1955.

10-9 Record, 3.81 ERA

- The 27-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 29th start of the season and his eighth with the Giants...was acquired by San Francisco on July 30 from Cincinnati in exchange for minor league infielder Adam Duvall and RHP Keury Mella.
- Was 9-6 with a 3.55 ERA (54er, 137.0ip) in 22 starts this season with the Reds...has gone 1-4 with a 4.69 ERA (21er, 40.1ip) in seven outings with the Giants.
- Was on the disabled list for 18 days after he strained his left hamstring running sprints in the outfield in Texas on Aug. 3, the day after his first start with the Giants.
- Took the loss this past Saturday in the Giants' 6-0 loss to the Diamondbacks...allowed three runs on eight hits and one walk in just 3.0 innings of work...marked his shortest outing since Sept. 24, 2013 vs. New York-NL, when he lasted just 1.2 innings.
- Has received just 2.68 runs of support per game since joining the Giants, getting one run-or-fewer of support in five of his seven starts.
- Has posted a 2.72 ERA (29er, 96.0ip) in 14 starts on the road this season, compared to a 5.11 ERA (46er, 81.0ip) in 14 home starts.
- Has surrendered six home runs in seven starts with the Giants...had allowed just 14 homers in 21 starts with the Reds.
- Left-handed batters are 13-for-27 (.481) against him in his last three outings.
- Has faced Oakland just one time in his career, allowing one run in 6.0 innings of work on June 21, 2010...has struggled in Interleague starts this season, going 1-2 with a 6.64 ERA (15er, 20.1ip) in four contests.
- His 77 career hits are the most by any ML pitcher since his debut in 2010...has twice in his career led NL pitchers in batting average (.356 in 2010, .305 in 2012).
