### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-89) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (79-74)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 2015 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's snapped their five-game losing streak last night...are 65-89 (.422), which is the worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in the majors...the 89 losses are the A's most over the last 18 years and with one more loss, the A's will have their first 90-loss season since 1997 (65-97)...every team except the Yankees and Cardinals has at least one 90-loss season since then...with an A's loss and a Detroit win today, the A's will clinch the worst record in the AL for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997)...have clinched a last place finish in the AL West for the eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009), but just the second time over the last 17 seasons...will finish the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...will spend the final 74 days (beginning July 23) and 142 of the final 146 (beginning May 8) alone in last...will finish under .500 for the first time since 2011 and just the fifth time in the last 17 seasons.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 34-45 (.430) at home and need to win one of the final two home games to avoid finishing with the second worst home record in Oakland history...are tied with Colorado for the worst home record in the majors...are 1-3 on the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-0)...have lost nine of the last 12 home games...will finish with a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time the A's will finish more than one game under .500 at home over that span...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Houston, 29-46)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...leave following the game tomorrow for the final road trip of the season to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years as they are 11-7 (.611) against the National League with two games remaining...are tied with the Giants for the sixth best interleague record...are batting .279 (175-for-628) in 18 interleague games and have scored 89 runs...rank fifth in the majors in interleague batting and tied for ninth in runs...the batting average is the third best interleague mark in Oakland history (.316 in 2004, .282 in 2002, .277 in 2005)...the pitching staff has a 3.09 ERA (55 er in 160.0 ip), which ranks seventh...went 13-7 against the NL last year and have the fourth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 191-151 (.558)...have won 23 of their last 29 interleague games in the Coliseum.

**IN SEPTEMBER:** The A's are 7-15 (.286) in September, which is tied with Houston for the second worst record in the majors (Philadelphia, 6-16)...the pitching staff has compiled a 6.56 ERA (144 er in 197.2 ip), which is more than a run higher than the next closest team (Kansas City, 5.30)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...have surrendered 39 home runs, which are the A's most in a month since August, 1998 (40)...have 10 triples, which are the A's most in a month since August, 2002 (also 10).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 42 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...will also likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 12 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (1051), tied for second in triples, third in lowest slugging percentage (.396) and fourth in fewest home runs (139)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (153)...have the most infield hits by an A's team since 1992 (154).

**PITCHING:** The A's rank ninth in the American League with a 4.05 ERA...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16

seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished lower than sixth since they were ninth in 1998...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last 13 games (26 home runs total)...that is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history (16, Aug. 5-22, 2015 and 15, Aug. 6-21, 1987)...have allowed 73 home runs over the last 46 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have 1142 strikeouts, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011)...lead the AL in shutouts (15) and rank fourth in fewest extra base hits (423) and opponents slugging percentage (.396)...opponents have been successful in just 74-of-114 (64.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-12 with an 8.03 ERA (94 er in 105.1 ip) and .331 (145-for-438) opponents batting average in 22 games in September...have tossed five innings or fewer 12 times and are averaging 4.79 innings per start this month...now have a 3.80 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 92 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed six errors in the last four games and have 117 for the season, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...have not led the majors in errors since they made 179 in 1978...the errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 45 errors in the last 81 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 62 unearned runs, which are the most in the American League and third most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 23, which rank first and tied for second in the AL...the 57 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Eddie Joost (38) and Ferris Fain (19) combined for 57 with the 1947 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal

**ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES:** The A's have set an Oakland record with 50 losses by two runs or fewer (previous: 49 in 1968) and tied an Oakland record with 32 one-run losses (also 1976)...are 18-32 (.360) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 13-27)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 28-50 (.359) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors.

**A's vs. GIANTS:** The A's are 1-3 against the Giants...won the first meeting in Oakland last night after being swept in a three-game series at San Francisco in July...have won six straight and 12 of the last 14 contests in Oakland but have lost three straight and 16 of the last 19 games in San Francisco...the six-game home winning streak matches the A's longest such streak against the Giants (May 21, 2010-June 19, 2011)...have won each of the previous two season series...in the previous 18 years of interleague play, the A's have won six season series, lost three and split nine...the A's are 54-50 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 32-19 in Oakland and 22-31 in San Francisco.

**Mark Canha** leads AL rookies in RBI (66).

**THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY**  
 In **1954** the Philadelphia Athletics play at New York in their last game ever and defeat the Yankees, 8-6...in **1971** Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start of the season to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell as the only two Athletic pitchers to fan 300 in a single season...in **1974** Jim Hunter tosses a seven-hitter to defeat the Minnesota Twins 2-1...it is his 25<sup>th</sup> win, which establishes an Oakland record, and is also his fourth straight 20-win season...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits an inside the park home run in the A's 7-5 win over Seattle in the Coliseum...the home run ties Carlton Fisk's record for most home runs by an American League catcher, a record Steinbach would later break...in **2002** the A's clinch their second AL West title in three years and win their 100<sup>th</sup> game of the season with a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200<sup>th</sup> hit of the season in that game to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Barry Zito (0-0, 18.00 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 16 and is scheduled to make his second appearance and first start of the season...was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring after sitting out the 2014 season...signed a minor league deal Feb. 17 and spent the entire season at Nashville where he went 8-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** He made his only 2015 appearance last Sunday at Houston (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 0 so, 1 hr)...entered the game in the eighth inning with the A's trailing 3-1 and allowed a two-run home run to Rasmus...it was his first Major League outing since a relief appearance for San Francisco on Sept. 29, 2013 against San Diego (0.1 ip, 1 so).

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** He was the winning pitcher in his last Major League start on Sept. 25, 2013, a 6-4 Giants win over the Dodgers in San Francisco (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so)...the Giants scored three times in the third and he retired the side in order over the first three innings before allowing two runs in the fourth on a Kemp RBI double and an error.

**LAST START WITH OAKLAND:** He was the losing pitcher in Game 1 of the 2006 ALCS against Detroit, a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland on Oct. 10 (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...allowed two runs in the third inning on an Inge home run and an Ordonez RBI single, and three more runs in the fourth inning on a Rodriguez home run, an Inge RBI double and a Polanco RBI single.

**LAST WIN WITH OAKLAND:** He was the winning pitcher in Game 1 of the 2006 ALDS at Minnesota, a 3-2 A's win (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the seventh inning on a two-out solo home run by Rondell White.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is 14-23 with a 5.09 ERA (141 er in 249.1 ip) in 43 career interleague appearances, including 42 starts...the 23 losses are tied with Tim Hudson and Derek Lowe for the most in interleague history...is 8-8 with a 3.53 ERA (53 er in 135.0 ip) in 21 interleague starts with the A's against the National League compared to 6-15 with a 6.93 ERA in 22 interleague games with the Giants against the American League.

**ZITO vs. SAN FRANCISCO:** Is 1-2 with a 3.33 ERA (27.0 ip, 27 h, 16 r, 10 er, 9 bb, 14 so, 5 hr) in four career appearances, all starts...is 0-1 with a 1.29 ERA (1 er in 7.0 ip) in one start in Oakland and 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (9 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts at AT&T Park...last faced the Giants on May 22, 2005 at San Francisco...was the losing pitcher in a 3-1 A's loss...shutout the Giants on four hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Moises Alou in the sixth inning.

**"BIG THREE" MATCH-UPS:** This marks just the second time two of the A's "Big Three" trio of Mark Mulder, Tim Hudson and Barry Zito have faced each other in a game...the other time was on April 29, 2005 when Mulder faced Hudson in a match-up between the Cardinals and Braves at Atlanta, a 6-5 St. Louis win...Mulder picked up the win in that game (7.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) while Hudson took the loss (6.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr).

**CAREER:** Has pitched 15 seasons in the majors with Oakland (2000-06, 15) and San Francisco (2007-13)...won the American League Cy Young Award with the A's in 2002 and is a three-time AL All-Star (2002-03, 2006)...was originally drafted by Oakland in the 1st round of the June, 1999 draft and went 102-63 with a 3.55 ERA in 222 starts in seven seasons with Oakland before signing a seven-year contract with San Francisco Dec. 29, 2006...compiled a 63-80 record and a 4.62 ERA in 208 games, including 197 starts, in seven seasons with the Giants...did not pitch in 2014 and returned to the majors with the A's earlier this month...is now 165-143 with a 4.03 ERA (1151 er in 2570.2 ip) in 432 career appearances, including 419 starts.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Spent the entire season at Nashville where he went 8-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts...entered the season with just 37 career minor league starts in 15 professional seasons...surrendered 10 home runs in 138.0 innings, an average of 0.65 per nine innings...allowed a .234 opponents batting average, including .228 (81-for-355) against right-handed hitters compared to .245 (40-for-163) against left-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...held the opposition to a .197 batting average when leading off an inning...went 1-4 with a 5.29 ERA over his first nine starts through May 21...then compiled a 7-3 record and a 2.44 ERA over his final 15 games...was on the disabled list from Aug. 7-Sept. 5 with a strained left shoulder.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
