OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-90) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (80-74)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost their 90th game of the season yesterday... this is the A's first 90-loss season since 1997 (65-97) and the seventh in Oakland history...from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...have lost six of the last seven games and are 65-90 (.422), which is the worst record in the American League and tied for fourth worst in the majors...with an A's loss or a Detroit win today, the A's will clinch the worst record in the AL for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997)...have clinched a last place finish in the AL West for the eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009), but just the second time over the last 17 seasons...will finish the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...will spend the final 74 days (beginning July 23) and 142 of the final 146 (beginning May 8) alone in last ...will finish the seasons...

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 34-46 (.425) in Oakland entering the final home game of the season... with a loss today, the A's will finish with the second worst home record in Oakland history...a win will tie for the third worst mark...currently have the worst home record in the majors...the A's have not finished the season with the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321)...are 1-4 on the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Texas (0-3) and San

Francisco (1-1) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...will finish with a losing record at home for just the third time in the last 17 seasons, but this will be the first time the A's will finish more than one game under .500 at home over that span...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Houston, 29-46)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season (went 40-41 last year) and seventh time in the last nine years...leave following the game today for the final road trip of the season to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years as they are 11-8 (.579) against the National League entering the final game today...are batting .279 (186-for-666) and have scored 99 runs...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored and fifth in batting...the batting average is the third best interleague

mark in Oakland history (.316 in 2004, .282 in 2002, .277 in 2005) and the runs scored are tied for third (121 in 2004, 103 in 2002, 99 in 2014)...went 13-7 against the NL last year and are tied for the fourth best all-time interleague record with a mark of 191-152 (.557)...have won 23 of their last 30 interleague games in the Coliseum.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 7-16 (.304) in September, which is the second worst record in the majors (Philadelphia, 6-17)...the pitching staff has compiled a 6.88 ERA (158 er in 206.2 ip), which is more than a run higher than the next closest team (Kansas City, 5.41)...have finished a month with an ERA of at least 6.00 twice in Oakland history: 6.59 in May, 1997 and 6.20 in April, 1994...have surrendered a Major League leading 42 home runs, which are tied for the second most home runs in a month in Oakland history (44 in August, 1969; 42 in August, 1987)...have 10 triples, which are the A's most in a month since August, 2002 (also 10).

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 42 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...will also likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 12 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1055), third in triples and lowest slugging percentage (.396) and fourth in fewest home runs (140)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (154)...since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987, the 154 hits are tied with the 1992 A's for second most by an Oakland team (165 in 1989).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 163 runs over the last 23 games dating back to Sept. 1, which is second most in Oakland history over a 23-game stretch (164, July 26-Aug. 19, 1995)...the season ERA has risen .49 runs over that span to 4.12, which ranks 11th in the American League...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have allowed at least one home run in each of the last 14 games (29 home runs total), which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history (16, Aug. 5-22, 2015 and 15, Aug. 6-21, 1987)...have allowed 76 home runs over the last 47 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have 1146 strikeouts, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011)...lead the AL in shutouts (15)...opponents have been successful in just 74-of-114 (64.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-12 with an 8.22 ERA (98 er in 107.1 ip) and .336 (151-for-450) opponents batting average in 23 games in September...have tossed five innings or fewer 13 times and are averaging 4.67 innings per start this month...now have a 3.83 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 93 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 117 errors, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 45 errors in the last 82 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 62 unearned runs, which are the most in the AL and third most in the majors...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 23, which rank first and tied for second in the AL... the 57 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Eddie Joost (38) and Ferris Fain (19) combined for 57 with the 1947 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set an Oakland record with 50 losses by two runs or fewer (previous: 49 in 1968) and tied an Oakland record with 32 one-run losses (also 1976)...are 18-32 (.360) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 13-27)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 28-50 (.359) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's are 1-4 against the Giants and have lost the season series for just the fourth time in 19 years of interleague play... have won six season series and split nine...the A's worst record against San Francisco is 1-5 in 2009...have split the first two games in Oakland this year after being swept in a three-game series at San Francisco in July...had their six-game home winning streak snapped yesterday, which matched the A's longest such streak against the Giants (May 21, 2010-June 19, 2011)...have won 12 of the last 15 games in Oakland but have lost three straight and 16 of the last 19 games in San Francisco...the A's are 54-51 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 32-20 in Oakland and 22-31 in San Francisco.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's used eight pitchers yesterday, which ties the Oakland record for pitchers in a nine inning game (July 7, 1994 at BAL)...**Billy Burns** leads ML rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (45) and leads AL rookies in hits (147)...**Mark Canha** leads AL rookies in RBI (68).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...in **1914** the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in **1970** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in **1989** Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship...in **1997** Jason Giambi breaks his own club record with his 41st double of the season in the A's 9-3 loss at Seattle...in **1998**, one year after Jason Giambi breaks the Oakland record for doubles in a season, Ben Grieve ties the mark with his 41st double in the A's 4-2 loss to Anaheim.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Nolin (1-1, 4.57 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and is 1-1 with a 4.57 ERA (11 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts...was one of four players acquired from Toronto for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season and began the season on the Oakland disabled list as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder... was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first career interleague appearance.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle September 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Marte, a sacrifice fly by Seager and a wild pitch...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Texas Sept. 12...allowed a leadoff home run to Napoli in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in 5.2 innings...the A's scored five times in the fifth for the win.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win at Chicago (AL) Sept. 17...shutout the White Sox on two singles and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Olt in the fourth...also yielded a RBI single to Cabrera in the fifth and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-1... Oakland scored three times in the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-8 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the second and once in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead... allowed back-to-back sacrifice flies to Choo and Beltre in the fifth but the A's scored once in the bottom of the inning to make the score 5-3...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the sixth and left with the score tied 2-2.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 14 games, including 12 starts...went 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 10 games in May and June, 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts in August... walked 17 batters in 33.2 innings in May and June (4.54 per nine innings), two in 13.2 innings in August (1.32 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a mark of .167 (7-for-42) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against right-handers...allowed one double and two walks to lefties for a .190 slugging percentage and .205 on-base percentage...surrendered all five of his home runs and nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...all five of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .319 average with the bases empty compared to .125 with runners on base...opponents were 4-for-35 (.114) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-13 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .396 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.83 ERA in 10 games at night compared to 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts during the day... logged a 0.75 ERA in the first inning...Nashville was 8-4 (.667) in his 12 starting assignments...did not toss more than 5.2 innings in any of his 14 outlings...allowed one run or fewer 11 times and four hits or fewer 12 times.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Was sent to Nashville on a rehab assignment from Oakland on May 5...pitched scoreless relief in his first two outings May 5 against Iowa (1.0 ip) and May 9 against Round Rock (2.0 ip)... then started and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings May 14 at Iowa and was reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Nashville the next day... tossed 4.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Sacramento, giving him a 0.71 ERA over his first five games...issued four walks in 12.2 innings over that stretch but then walked a season-high four batters in 4.0 innings May 30 against Las Vegas...finished May with no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in six games, four starts...was placed on the disabled list June 1 with a strained left groin...was reinstated June 9 and went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in four

starts in June...picked up his first win of the season June 16 against Memphis when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and three walks...then yielded a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings in his next start June 21 against Omaha for his first loss...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings June 27 against Oklahoma City for his second and final win of the season...also allowed a season-high eight hits and tossed a season-high 102 pitches in that game...was placed on the minor league DL a second time July 1 with a strained left shoulder...was reinstated Aug. 15 and went 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts following his return...tossed fewer than five innings in each of those starts as he increased his pitch count from 32 on Aug. 15 to 76 in his final start on Aug. 31...struck out a season-high six batters in his final start, a no decision in a 5-1 win over Round Rock.


