TODAY'S GAME: The Giants will try and close out a series win today with another road victory against the rival Oakland Athletics...SF is currently on their final road trip of the season, going 1-2 in San Diego and now 1-1 here in Oakland.

TIME IS RUNNING OUT: San Francisco enters the day 7.0 games behind the Dodgers in the NL West with just eight games remaining...the Giants could be eliminated from the playoffs today with a loss and a Dodgers win.

INSIDE THE SERIES: Yesterday's win gave the Giants a 4-1 record against the A's this season, securing just its second season series win in six years...a win today would also mark just the Giants' second road series win against the A's in six sets...SF has gone just 3-12 against the A's here at the Coliseum since 2010.

LAST ROAD GAME: The Giants play road game #81 today, their final road contest of the regular season...the Giants' road record ranks eighth in the NL at 36-44 (.450)...SF has lost 19 of their last 26 games away from AT&T Park and have gone 0-6-1 (win-lost-split) in their last seven road series...today they will be seeking their first road series win since taking two of three at Atlanta from Aug. 3-5.

JARRETT PARKER'S BIG DAY: OF Jarrett Parker hit three home runs yesterday and drove in seven runs in the Giants' 14-10 win...he fell just one RBI shy of the Giants' rookie record of eight, by Travis Jackson in 1923...a look at what Parker accomplished yesterday:

- First Giants rookie to ever have a three-homer game in franchise history.
- First Giant with a three-homer game since 2013 (Pablo Sandoval).
- First Giants rookie with a homer in three straight games since 2011 (Brandon Belt).
 First MLB rookie with a three-homer game since 2009 (Andrew McCutchen).
- First Giant with five homers in nine at-bats since 2004 (Barry Bonds).
- First Giant with three homers and seven RBI in a game since 1961 (Willie Mays).

MORE ON PARKER: OF Jarrett Parker is now slugging 1.074 in his first 14 games; he's the only player to debut in the modern era (since 1900) to slug 1.000-or-higher through his first 14 games, with at least 25 at-bats (Elias).

JUST IN CASE: If OF Jarrett Parker were to hit another home run in his next game, he would become the first Giants rookie to homer in four consecutive contests since Jack Clark did so from June 17-20, 1977 (Stats Inc.).

ON THE MOUND: RHP Chris Heston (11-10, 3.51) is still looking for his first victory since July 27, going 0-5 with a 4.60 ERA (22er, 43.0ip) in nine starts since...he owns a 2.7 run support average in that span compared to 5.9 previously...Heston has completed just 4.2 innings or fewer six times in his last nine games.

CLOSE CALLS: SF is 16-27 (.372) in games decided by one run, going 8-5 at home and 8-22 on the road...SF has lost 14 of their last 15 one-run games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The Giants own the second-best Interleague record among NL clubs this season with a 12-7 (.632) record...however, San Francisco is just 4-5 when playing in American League ballparks compared to an 8-2 record in Interleague games at home.

WITH THE BATS: The Giants have been one of the top offensive teams in the National League this season, ranking first in team batting average (.269), first in on-base percentage (.328), fourth in slugging pct. (.410) and fifth in runs per game (4.36).

WITH THE GLOVES: The Giants' 74 errors are tied with the Dodgers for the second-fewest in the NL (Marlins, 73)...since the All-Star break, SF's 28 miscues are the fewest among NL clubs.

IN THE TRAINERS ROOM: The following Giants players are currently on the DL: RHP Tim Lincecum (left hip surgery), IF Joe Panik (back inflammation), OF Hunter Pence (strained left oblique), OF Juan Perez (strained left oblique), C Hector Sanchez (strained left hamstring, ankle sprain) and **C Andrew Susac** (right wrist surgery)...the following players are on the active roster, however are unavailable due to injury: **IF Ehire Adrianza** (concussion), **OF Nori** Aoki (concussion), OF Gregor Blanco (concussion) and IF Brandon Belt (concussion).



2.21 walks per 9.0 innings (21 walks in 85.2ip) in his first 15 outings this season...has allowed nine walks in his last two starts (9.1ip).

- Last pitched Tuesday night at San Diego and did not factor into the decision after lasting just 4.1 innings...did not allow a run on two hits and five walks and struck out seven batters...the Giants won 4-2.
