ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and seven of the last eight games...are 65-91 (.417) and will finish with the worst record in the American League for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997)...currently have the fourth worst record in the majors...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have lost 90 or more games, the first time since 1997 (65-97)...from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...will finish last in the AL West for eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009) and will end the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...have spent every day in last dating back to July 23 and all but four days in last dating back to May 8.

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's lost their 33rd one-run game of the season yesterday, which is a new Oakland record...broke the previous mark of 32 set in 1976...have also set an Oakland record with 51 losses by two runs or fewer (previous: 49 in 1968)...are 18-33 (.353) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 14-27) and the worst by an A's team since 1946 (13-29, .310)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 28-51 (.354) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 7-17 (.292) in September, which is tied with Philadelphia for the worst record in the majors...it is currently the third worst mark in September in Oakland history (7-20 in 1978 and 8-20 in 1985)...the pitching staff has compiled a 6.72 ERA (161 er in 215.2 ip), which is more than a run higher than the next closest team (Atlanta, 5.28)...it is currently the highest single-month ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in May, 1997)...have allowed 168 runs, which are their most in a month since May, 2002 (169)...have surrendered a Major League leading 42 home runs, which are tied for the second most home runs in a month in Oakland history (44 in August, 1969; 42 in August, 1987)...the offense has 11 triples, which are tied for second most in a month in Oakland history...they are the most since September of 1984 when the A's also had 11...the record is 13 in July, 1968.

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 43 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...will likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 12 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1062), third in triples and lowest slugging percentage (.396) and fourth in fewest home runs (140)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (155)...the infield hits are second most by an A's team since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987 (165 in 1989).

PITCHING: The A's were leading the American League with a 3.47 ERA as late as Aug. 13...have compiled a 5.94 ERA (238 er in 360.2 ip) since then, which is the highest in the majors (Atlanta, 5.79)...the season ERA has risen .64 runs since then to 4.11, which ranks 11th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...did not surrender a home run yesterday, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive games with a home run...that was third longest such streak in Oakland history and was two short of the record of 16 set earlier this year from Aug. 5-22...have allowed 76 home runs over the last 48 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have 1149 strikeouts, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011)...lead the AL in shutouts (15)...opponents have been successful in just 74-of-114 (64.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in four of the last five games (19 er in 18.0 ip, 9.50 ERA)...are now 5-13 with an 8.29 ERA (101 er in 109.2 ip) and .341 (158-for-463) opponents batting average in 24 games in September...have tossed five innings or fewer 14 times and are averaging 4.57 innings per start this

month...now have a 3.85 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 93 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 118 errors, which is the most in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (117)...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 46 errors in the last 83 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 64 unearned runs, which are second most in the majors (San Diego, 73)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 24, which rank first and second in the American League...the 58 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Ed Busch (41) and Irv Hall (26) combined for 67 with the 1944 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the final road trip of the season tonight, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-44 (.413) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season and seventh time in the last nine years...went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-2)...finished the season 34-47 (.420) at home, which is the second worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...currently have the worst home record in the majors (Cincinnati and Milwaukee, 34-44)...the A's have not finished the season with the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had a positive run differential over their first 139 games through Sept. 8 (+5)...have been outscored by 36 runs in 17 games since then...are 10-5 on Monday, which is tied with the Cubs for the second best record in the majors (Mets, 15-2)...have used a franchise record 30 pitchers and an Oakland record 24 relievers...have employed 52 players overall...currently have 37 players on the active roster, which includes Blair and Phegley, who are out for the season...are averaging 3 hours and 16 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season...have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...have played 24 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's trail in the season series, 7-9...with one more loss, will lose the season series for the second consecutive year (went 9-10 last year)...are 4-5 in Oakland and 3-4 in Anaheim...are 48-44 against the Angels over the last five years...including 39-9 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 22 of their last 35 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 413-340 against the Angels...that includes 215-161 in Oakland and 198-179 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 462-417 against the Angels.

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (46) and leads American League rookies in hits (149) and total bases (200)...**Mark Canha** leads AL rookies in RBI (68).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as the A's defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...all the runs score on solo home runs on the two teams combine for just six hits and four walks... in **1972** the A's score six times in the final three innings to defeat Minnesota 8-7 and clinch their second consecutive AL West title...in **1975** Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels, 5-0, in the first four-pitcher no-hitter in Major League history...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th game of the season...he would go on to save 48 games while compiling a microscopic 0.61 ERA...in **1995** Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California, a seventh inning single off Mark Langston...he becomes the seventh Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **1996**, in his final at bat as an Athletic, Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's AL record for home runs by a catcher.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Felix Doubront (3-3, 5.53 ERA)

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 2-2 with an 8.33 ERA (25 er in 27.0 ip) and .330 (35-for-106) opponents batting average over his last five starts...went 0-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .214 opponents average over his first four games with the A's.

BRIEFLY: Was acquired by the A's from the Blue Jays on July 31 for cash considerations and is 2-2 with a 5.91 ERA (30 er in 45.2 ip) in nine games, including seven starts, with Oakland...went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in five games, four starts, with Toronto prior to being designated for assignment July 29...was with Chicago (NL) during the spring but was released March 28...signed a minor league contract with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the disabled list at Triple-A Buffalo with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13 and went 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA in nine starts with the Bisons before he was selected by the Blue Jays July 3.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .246 (16-for-65) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .322 (66-for-205) against right-handers...has surrendered 24 of his 26 extra base hits to righties for a .517 slugging percentage...lefties are slugging .308 (1 double, 1 home run)...has surrendered seven home runs in his last four starts (21.0 ip), including a career-high three on Sept. 13 at Texas, after yielding just two home runs over his first 10 games (47.1 ip)...six of his nine home runs have come with runners on base...has allowed a .349 (22-for-63) average with runners in scoring position...the opponents number four hitter is batting .406 (13-for-32).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-2 with a 7.22 ERA (27 er in 33.2 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 1-1 with a 3.89 ERA (15 er in 34.2 ip) in seven games against everyone else...his career splits are 6-9 with a 6.62 ERA (77 er in 104.2 ip) in 26 games against the AL West, 25-17 with a 4.43 ERA (198 er in 402.0 ip) in 90 games against everyone else.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-3 with a 5.86 ERA (36 er in 55.1 ip) and .315 (69-for-219) opponents batting average in his 11 starts compared to 0-0 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) and .255 (13-for-51) opponents average in three relief appearances...allowed 2-of-6 (33.3%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 1-for-3 in his relief appearances...is now 30-26 with a 4.62 ERA (235 er in 458.0 ip) in 84 career starts, 1-0 with a 7.40 ERA in 32 relief appearances.

WITH TORONTO: Made his Blue Jays debut in relief on **July 3** at Detroit, allowing one run in 2.1 innings...picked up his first win in his first start, a 2-1 Toronto win at Chicago (AL) **July 7**...allowed a run in the second inning before blanking the White Sox on three hits over his final 4.2 innings...yielded a career-high tying seven runs in an 11-10 loss at Kansas City **July 12** but had a no decision as he left with an 8-7 lead.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed 4.1 innings of relief **Aug. 3** against Baltimore in his Oakland debut, which was an A's season-high for a reliever at the time...then tossed 6.1 innings of relief at Toronto **Aug. 12**...it was the longest relief appearance of his career (previous: 5.1 on May 8, 2013 vs. Minnesota) and the longest by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.1 innings July 7, 2007 vs. Seattle...did not strike out a batter and his 6.1 innings pitched were the most by an A's reliever in a game in which he did not record a strikeout since Johnny Kucks tossed 6.2 innings May 7, 1960 for the Kansas City A's against New York (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) **Aug. 18** in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed just one hit but issued a career-high tying six walks...had a no decision in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle **Aug. 24**...left the game after two innings with a right foot contusion and the scored tied 0-0...the start was the shortest of his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-5 win over Los Angeles (AL) **Aug. 31** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the first inning and two more runs in the second on an Aybar sacrifice fly and a Cron steal of home...the A's then scored five times in the third inning to take the lead for good...won his second consecutive start in the A's 10-9 win over Houston **Sept. 7** in Oakland...allowed single runs in the first and second innings but the A's scored six runs in the sixth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-4 loss at Texas **Sept. 13**...yielded a career-high three home runs and a career-high tying seven runs in 4.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win at Houston Sept. 8...allowed single runs in each of the first three innings on a Lowrie RBI single, a Carter home run and a Lowrie sacrifice fly.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...blanked the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a Moreland RBI single and an Andrus three-run home run...also allowed a three-run home run to Beltre in the fifth

DOUBRONT vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-1 with a 4.12 ERA (19.2 ip, 20 h, 9 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts...is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (2 er in 6.2 ip) in one start at Los Angeles and 1-1 with a 4.85 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) in three games in his home ballparks...was the winning pitcher in his only outing this year, a start in the A's 11-5 win in Oakland on Aug. 31...allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the first inning and two more runs in the second on an Aybar sacrifice fly and a Cron steal of home...the A's then scored five times in the third inning to take the lead for good...was relieved by Mujica with runners on first and second and no outs in the seventh inning and he allowed one of those runs to score.

WITH BUFFALO: Was 1-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .205 opponents batting average in nine games, all starts, with Triple-A Buffalo...signed a minor league deal with Toronto April 2 and began the season on the Triple-A DL with a left shin contusion...was reinstated May 13...surrendered just one home run in 48.0 innings...allowed a .197 (24-for-122) batting average and his lone home run against right-handed hitters compared to .222 (12-for-54) against left-handers...opponents hit .178 with runners in scoring position and .190 when leading off an inning...went 1-2 with a 1.69 ERA in six starts on the road, 0-1 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts at home...did not allow a run in the fourth (8.0 ip), fifth (6.0 ip) or seventh (3.0 ip) innings...the Bisons were 4-5 (.444) in his starting assignments...tossed five innings or fewer in five of his nine starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (1-7, 3.07 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 17th appearance and 12 start of the season, his second since straining his shoulder on Aug. 26...is 1-7 despite a 3.07 ERA in 16 games, 11 starts...his .125 winning percentage is tied for fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 games started, but is the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 4.50...based on a minimum of 75 innings pitched, he ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (3.07) and opponents slugging percentage (.342)...however, he has the lowest winning percentage (.125) and sixth lowest run support (3.30)...has received one run of support or fewer in eight of his 11 starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss to Texas last Thursday in Oakland (3.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has faced the Angels once in his career and it came in relief earlier this year on April 29 in Oakland (2.0 ip, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen tossed 6.2 scoreless innings yesterday after allowing 10 runs in seven innings the day before...now has a 7.53 ERA (29 er in 34.2 ip) over the last eight games and a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has surrendered 70 home runs, which ties the Oakland record for home runs by the bullpen set in 1997...the home runs are second most in the majors (Boston, 72).
