OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-93) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (83-74)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight and nine of the last 10 games...are 65-93 (.411), which is the fourth worst record in the majors...will finish with the worst record in the American League for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997) and will finish last in the AL West for eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009)...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have lost 90 or more games, the first time since 1997 (65-97)...from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...will end the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...have spent every day in last dating back to July 23 and all but four days in last dating back to May 8.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 7-19 (.269) in September and will finish the month with the worst record in the majors...have lost 20 games in a month 12 times in Oakland history (last: 10-20 in Aug., 2008), including twice in September (last: 8-20 in 1985)...with a loss today, the A's will match the worst September in Oakland history (1978) and will equal their fifth worst record in any month...a win would give the A's their third worst September and their worst since 1985 (8-20, .286)...the pitching staff has compiled a 6.72 ERA (173 er in 231.2 ip), which is more than 1½ runs higher than the next closest team (Atlanta, 5.15)...it is currently the highest single-month ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in May, 1997)...the last time the Athletics posted an ERA above 6.59 in a month of at least 15 games was in July of 1939 (7.50)...have allowed 181 runs, which is second most in any month in Oakland history (206 in May, 1997)...have surrendered a Major League leading 43 home runs, which are the second most home runs in a month in Oakland history...the record is 44 in August of 1969...the offense has 11 triples, which are tied for second most in a month in Oakland history...they are the most since September of 1984 when the A's also had 11...the record is 13 in July, 1968.

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 43 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...will likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 14 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1084), third in triples and lowest slugging percentage (.395) and fourth in fewest home runs (142)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (156)...the infield hits are second most by an A's team since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987 (165 in 1989)...have 458 walks, which are currently the second fewest walks in a non-strike season in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979, 506 in 1980).

PITCHING: The A's were leading the American League with a 3.47 ERA as late as Aug. 13...have compiled a 5.97 ERA (250 er in 376.2 ip) since then, which is the highest in the majors (Atlanta, 5.70)...the season ERA has risen .67 runs since then to 4.14, which ranks 11th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have allowed 77 home runs over the last 50 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have yielded 164 home runs for the season, which matches the most by an A's team over the last 17 years (also 2004)...have 1158 strikeouts, which is the fourth highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1160 in 2011)...lead the AL in shutouts (15).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in five of the last seven games (29 er in 27.2 ip, 9.43 ERA)...are now 5-14 with an 8.37 ERA (111 er in 119.1 ip) and .342 (171-for-500) opponents batting average in 26 games in September...have tossed five innings or fewer 15 times and are averaging 4.59 innings per start this month...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 94 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 120 errors, which is the most in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (118)...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are second most by an A's team over

the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 48 errors in the last 85 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 65 unearned runs, which are second most in the majors (San Diego, 73)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 24, which rank first and second in the American League...the 58 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Ed Busch (41) and Irv Hall (26) combined for 67 with the 1944 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and Seattle (three games)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 31-46 (.408) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the American League (Houston, 30-47)...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season and seventh time in the last nine years...went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-2)...finished the season 34-47 (.420) at home, which is the second worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...currently have the worst home record in the majors (Cincinnati, 34-45)...the A's have not finished the season with the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321).

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set Oakland single season records for one-run losses (34) and losses by two runs or fewer (52)...the 52 losses by two runs or fewer are fourth most in Athletics history (55 in 1945, 54 in 1916, 53 in 1908) and the 34 one-run losses are tied for fourth (40 in 1908, 38 in 1945, 35 in 1943, 34 in 1967)...are 18-34 (.346) in one-run games, which is the worst record in the majors and the worst by an A's team since 1946 (13-29, .310)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...lead the majors in one-run losses and rank seventh in games...are 28-52 (.350) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is also the worst record in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Bryan Anderson had the A's 33rd pinch hit of the season last night, which ranks second in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 1998 (35)...the A's had a positive run differential over their first 139 games through Sept. 8 (+5)...have been outscored by 44 runs in 19 games since then...have used a franchise record 30 pitchers and an Oakland record 24 relievers...have employed 52 players overall...currently have 37 players on the active roster, which includes Blair, Phegley and Pomeranz, who are out for the season...are averaging 3 hours and 16 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season...have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...including this series with the Angels, have played 25 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive season as they trail 7-11 entering the final game today...went 4-5 in Oakland and are 3-6 in Anaheim...are 48-46 against the Angels over the last five years...including 39-10 when scoring four or more runs...have been held to one run or fewer in 23 of their last 37 losses, including 12 shutouts...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 413-342 against the Angels...that includes 215-161 in Oakland and 198-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 462-419 against the Angels.

Mark Canha leads AL rookies in RBI (68).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Sal Bando is a perfect 5 for 5 in an 8-4 A's win at Seattle against the Pilots...he was 5 for 5 against Seattle earlier in the same season on July 17...in **1987** Dave Stewart becomes the A's first 20-game winner in seven years when he picks up the decision in the A's 4-3 victory over Cleveland...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley becomes the ninth major leaguer to pitch 900 games in his career when he tossed one inning at California...in **2000** the A's set Oakland records with 23 runs scored and a 21-run margin of victory in a 23-2 win over Texas...Adam Piatt has four hits and Miguel Tejada has five RBI...in **2014** Brandon Moss hits two home runs and sets an Athletics postseason record with five RBI in a 9-8, 12-inning loss to Kansas City in the American League Wild Card game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Barry Zito (0-0, 18.00 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 16 and is scheduled to make his third appearance and second start of the season...is one of three left-handed pitchers in Athletics history to start a game at age 37 or older along with Eddie Plank (52 starts at age 37 and 38 in 1913-14) and Tommy John (11 starts at age 42 in 1985)...was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring after sitting out the 2014 season...signed a minor league deal Feb. 17 and spent the entire season at Nashville where he went 8-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts.

IN RELIEF: He made his first appearance of 2015 Sept. 20 at Houston...entered the game in the eighth inning with the A's trailing 3-1 and allowed a two-run home run to Rasmus...it was his first Major League outing since a relief appearance for San Francisco on Sept. 29, 2013 against San Diego (0.1 ip, 1 so).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 14-10 loss to San Francisco and former teammate Tim Hudson last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a two-run double to Byrd in the first inning and two more runs in the second inning on a Parker home run and a Tomlinson RBI single...walked Posey to start the third and was relieved by Venditte with the A's trailing 4-3... Oakland came back to take an 8-4 lead to get him off the hook...it was his first Major League start since Sept. 25, 2013, a 6-4 Giants win over the Dodgers in San Francisco (5.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so)...it was his first start with the A's since taking the loss in Game 1 of the 2006 ALCS against Detroit, a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland on Oct. 10 (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 0 so).

LAST WIN WITH OAKLAND: He was the winning pitcher in Game 1 of the 2006 ALDS at Minnesota, a 3-2 A's win (8.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the seventh inning on a two-out solo home run by Rondell White.

LAST REGULAR SEASON WIN WITH OAKLAND: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win against Chicago (AL) on Sept. 16, 2006 (7.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 7 bb, 3 so)...allowed a two-run home run to Dye in the third and a two-run single to Alomar in the sixth...the A's were trailing 4-3 entering the bottom of the seventh but scored four times for the win.

ZITO vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 12-11 with a 4.14 ERA (184.2 ip, 164 h, 87 r, 85 er, 71 bb, 136 so, 19 hr) in 30 career appearances, all starts...the losses match his most against any team (San Diego)...is 0-4 with a 6.91 ERA (22 er in 28.2 ip) over his last five starts...is 6-5 with a 3.07 ERA (28 er in 82.0 ip) in 13 career starts at Angel Stadium, 6-5 with a 4.55 ERA in 16 starts in Oakland and 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in one start at AT&T Park...last faced the Angels on June 19, 2012 at Anaheim while pitching for San Francisco...was the losing pitcher in the Giants 12-5 loss...allowed four runs in the first inning, including a three-run home run by Pujols, and a Pujols RBI single in the second...loaded the bases with no outs in the fourth and was relieved by Kontos, who allowed all three runs to score...made his Major League debut against the Angels on July 22, 2000...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-3 victory...loaded the bases with no outs in the fifth inning and then struck out Vaughn, Salmon and Anderson.

CAREER: Has pitched 15 seasons in the majors with Oakland (2000-06, 15) and San Francisco (2007-13)...won the AL Cy Young Award with the A's in 2002 and is a three-time AL All-Star (2002-03, 2006)...was originally drafted by Oakland in the 1st round of the June, 1999 draft and went 102-63 with a 3.55 ERA in 222 starts in seven seasons with Oakland before signing a seven-year contract with San Francisco Dec. 29, 2006...compiled a 63-80 record and a 4.62 ERA in 208 games, including 197 starts, in seven seasons with the Giants...did not pitch in 2014 and returned to the majors with the A's earlier this month...is now 165-143 with a 4.04 ERA (1155 er in 2572.2 ip) in 432 career appearances, including 420 starts.

WITH NASHVILLE: Spent the entire season at Nashville where he went 8-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 24 games, including 22 starts...entered the season with just 37 career minor league starts in 15 professional seasons...surrendered 10 home runs in 138.0 innings, an average of 0.65 per nine innings...allowed a .234 opponents batting average, including .228 (81-for-355) against right-handed hitters compared to .245 (40-for-163) against left-handers...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...held the opposition to a .197 batting average when leading off an inning...went 1-4 with a 5.29 ERA over his first nine starts through May 21...then compiled a 7-3 record and a 2.44 ERA over his final 15 games...was on the disabled list from Aug. 7-Sept. 5 with a strained left shoulder.
