ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak on Wednesday and have now lost nine of the last 11 games...are 66-93 (.415), which is tied for the fourth worst record in the majors...will finish with the worst record in the American League for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997) and will finish last in the AL West for eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009)...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have lost 90 or more games, the first time since 1997 (65-97)... from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...will end the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...have spent every day in last dating back to July 23 and all but four days in last dating back to May 8.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's pitching staff compiled a 6.73 ERA in September, which was the highest single-month ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in May, 1997)...it was the highest single-month ERA by an Athletics team in a month of at least 15 games since the 1939 Philadelphia A's had a 7.50 ERA in July...the ERA was the highest in the majors by nearly 1½ runs (Atlanta, 5.25)...allowed 188 runs, which were second most in any month in Oakland history (206 in May, 1997)...surrendered a Major League leading 48 home runs, which were the most in Oakland history in any month (previous: 44, August of 1969) and third most in Athletics history (57 in May, 1964; 56 in July, 1962)...finished with a record of 8-19 (.296), which was the worst mark in the majors and the third worst September in Oakland history (7-20 in 1978, 8-20 in 1985)...the offense had 12 triples, which was the second best single-month total in Oakland history (13 in July, 1968).

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 44 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...will likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 14 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1094) and lowest slugging percentage (.395), tied for second in triples and fourth in fewest home runs (142) and fewest extra base hits (461)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (156)...the infield hits are second most by an A's team since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987 (165 in 1989)...have 465 walks, which are currently the second fewest walks in a non-strike season in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979, 506 in 1980).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high five home runs Wednesday and won...it was the third time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least five home runs in a game and won and all have come against the Angels (April 23, 1985 and Aug. 8, 2012)...have now allowed 82 home runs over the last 51 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have yielded 169 home runs for the season, which are the most by an A's team since 1998 (179) and seventh most in Oakland history (sixth is 172 in 1985)...the A's were leading the American League with a 3.47 ERA as late as Aug. 13...have compiled a 6.00 ERA (257 er in 385.2 ip) since then, which is the highest in the majors (Atlanta, 5.46)...the season ERA has risen .69 runs since then to 4.16, which ranks 11th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have 1161 strikeouts, which is the third highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014 and 1183 in 2013)...lead the AL in shutouts (15).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in six of the last eight games (31 er in 31.2 ip, 8.81 ERA)...went 5-14 with an 8.24 ERA (113 er in 123.1 ip) and .341 (175-for-514) opponents batting average in 27 games in September...tossed five innings or fewer in 16 of those games and averaged 4.57 innings per start...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 96 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 122 errors, which are the most in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (119)...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 50 errors in the last 86 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 65 unearned runs,

which are second most in the majors (San Diego, 73)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 24, which rank first and second in the American League...the 58 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Ed Busch (41) and Irv Hall (26) combined for 67 with the 1944 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (three games)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 32-46 (.410) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season and seventh time in the last nine years...went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-2)...finished the season 34-47 (.420) at home, which is the second worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...it will tie for the worst home record in the majors with at least Cincinnati, which marks the first time the A's had the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321).

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set Oakland single season records for one-run losses (34) and losses by two runs or fewer (52)...the 52 losses by two runs or fewer are fourth most in Athletics history (55 in 1945, 54 in 1916, 53 in 1908) and the 34 one-run losses are tied for fourth (40 in 1908, 38 in 1945, 35 in 1943, 34 in 1967)...are 19-34 (.358) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 15-27) and the worst by an A's team since 1946 (13-29, .310)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...the 53 one-run games are second most by an A's team over the last 39 years (54 in 2006)...lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for sixth in games...are 29-52 (.358) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the worst record in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-19 (.240) on Friday, which is the worst mark in the majors...Coco Crisp had the A's 34th pinch hit of the season Wednesday, which ranks second in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 1998 (35)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (130) and rank second in batting (.340)...the A's had a positive run differential over their first 139 games through Sept. 8 (+5)...have been outscored by 42 runs in 20 games since then...are averaging 3 hours and 17 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have two players on the roster eligible for free agency (Mujica, Zito) and 14 that are arbitration eligible (Abad, Chavez, Davis, Doubront, Fuld, Gentry, Griffin, Lawrie, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sogard, Valencia)...in addition, Evan Scribner (2 years, 142 days) and Dan Otero (2 years, 124 days) are super 2 candidates...the A's have used a franchise record 30 pitchers and an Oakland record 24 relievers...have employed 52 players overall...currently have 37 players on the active roster, which includes Blair, Phegley and Pomeranz, who are out for the season.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost each of the last five games and are 4-12 against the Mariners...the only times the A's have lost more games against Seattle are in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...are 3-7 in Oakland and 1-5 in Seattle...seven of the A's 12 losses have been by one run...15 of the A's 22 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...have lost the season series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are 42-50 against Seattle over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 325-257 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 145-142 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 69-78 at Safeco Field.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** George Earnshaw tosses a six-hitter as the A's defeat St. Louis 6-1 in Game 2 of the World Series...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits his 30th home run of the season, making the A's the first team in major league history to have both their shortstop and third baseman (Eric Chavez) hit 30 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Aaron Brooks (2-4, 7.26 ERA)

LAST EIGHT GAMES: Is 1-4 with a 10.31 ERA (34 er in 29.2 ip) and .391 (52-for-133) opponents batting average over his last eight games, including six starts...went 1-0 with a 2.41 ERA and .217 opponents batting average over his first four games, including two starts...has a 7.26 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings.

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 29 and is 1-3 with a 8.03 ERA (25 er in 28.0 ip) in six games, including five starts, since his return...was 1-1 with a 6.19 ERA in four games, including three starts, during his first stint from Aug. 1 to 14 and is 2-4 with a 7.36 ERA (36 er in 44.0 ip) in 10 games, eight starts, with the A's...the ERA is tied for third highest in Oakland history among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...began the season in the Kansas City organization and went 0-0 with a 6.23 ERA in two relief appearances over four stints with the Royals...was also 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha...was traded to the A's with minor league pitcher Sean Manaea on July 28 for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville but did not pitch before his promotion to Oakland Aug. 1...went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with the Sounds following his Aug. 15 option.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-4 with a 6.97 ERA (32 er in 41.1 ip) and .320 (54-for-169) opponents batting average in his eight starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA and .394 opponents average in four relief appearances...has issued 11 of his 12 walks as a starter.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .408 (20-for-49) opponents average to batters leading off an inning...opponents are hitting .370 (20-for-54) with runners in scoring position...the opponents two and three hitters in the batting order are batting a combined .467 (21-for-45).

WITH KANSAS CITY: Was recalled for the first time April 26 as the 26th man but did not pitch...recalled for his second stint May 12 and made one appearance on May 15 against New York, retiring the side in order in the ninth inning of the Royals 12-1 win (1.0 ip, 1 so)...was optioned following the game...recalled for a third time June 20 and pitched the next day against Boston (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...was optioned back to Omaha the next day...was recalled July 7 as the 26th man and stayed one more day without pitching before he was optioned to Omaha for the final time July 8.

WITH OAKLAND: Tossed at least seven innings and allowed one run in each of his first two starts with the A's...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least seven innings while allowing one run or fewer in each of his first two games with the A's...joins Ron Darling (1991), Kevin Appier (1999) and Rich Harden (2003)...the A's are 3-5 (.375) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his eight starts.

START-BY-START: He earned his first Major League win in his first start with the A's, a 5-1 victory over Cleveland **Aug. 1** in Oakland...retired 13 of the first 14 batters he faced...allowed his only run on a one-out solo home run by Chisenhall in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss to Houston **Aug. 6** in Oakland...allowed a sacrifice fly to Lowrie in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...left with a 2-1 lead but Rodriguez allowed a two-run home run to Correa for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss at Toronto **Aug. 12**...allowed a career-high eight runs in 1.2 innings...yielded a three-run home run to Colabello in the first and was charged with five of the Blue Jays seven runs in the bottom of the second...had a no decision in a 3-2 A's win at Arizona **Sept. 4**...blanked the Diamondbacks on four hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing two runs in the fifth...Pollock had a RBI single and the tying run scored when Goldschmidt grounded into a double play...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-8 loss to Seattle **Sept. 4** in Oakland...allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second and had a 5-1 lead when he allowed five of the Mariners six runs in the third inning for the loss...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 11-5 loss to Houston **Sept. 9** in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Rasmus in the second and three more runs in the fourth on a two-run single by Conger and a RBI double by Altuve...was the winning pitcher in the A's 17-6 win at Chicago (AL) **Sept. 15**...yielded a career-high 10 hits but the A's scored 10 times in the fourth inning and he had a 16-2 lead entering the bottom of the fourth.

LAST APPEARANCE: He entered the game in the fourth inning last Saturday against San Francisco and tossed 2.2 innings of relief in the A's 14-10 loss...entered the game with the A's leading 8-4 and did not allow a run in the fourth or fifth innings...then allowed a two-run double to Duffy and a RBI single to Posey in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rodriguez with an 8-7 lead.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston on Sept. 20...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed a

leadoff home run to Rasmus in the bottom of the second...also allowed a two-run home run to Springer in the fifth inning.

first but he allowed a Miller sacrifice fly in the second...the A's got that run back in the bottom of the second but he allowed five of the Mariners six runs in the third inning for the loss...allowed a RBI double to Seager and a RBI single to Romero and was relieved by Venditte with the bases loaded and one out...Venditte allowed all three runs to score plus one of his own.

MINORS: Went 6-5 with a 3.71 ERA in 18 games, including 17 starts, with Triple-A Omaha and 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts with Triple-A Nashville...combined to go 7-5 with a 3.56 ERA in 20 games, 19 starts, overall...issued just 21 walks in 118.2 innings, an average of 1.59 walks per nine innings...allowed a .275 opponents batting average, including .254 (54-for-213) against left-handed hitters compared to .294 (73-for-248) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...seven were solo shots...yielded five home runs in his first four starts and 20.1 innings and five home runs over his final 16 games and 98.1 innings...at the time of the July 28 trade to the A's, he ranked fourth in the Pacific Coast League in strikeouts (92) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (106.2)...his teams were 13-6 (.685) in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sean Nolin (1-2, 5.25 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and is 1-2 with a 5.25 ERA in five starts...is 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA and .438 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA and .242 average over his first three starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland (2.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA in two career appearances, including one start, against Seattle...the start came earlier this year, a loss on Sept. 6 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...began the season on the Oakland DL as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder...was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds

- The A's bullpen has a 7.04 ERA (36 er in 46.0 ip) over the last 11 games and now has a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
