ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the first time since Sept. 17-18...have not put together three straight wins since Aug. 29-31...have lost nine of the last 12 games and are 67-93 (.419), which is tied for the fourth worst record in the majors...will finish with the worst record in the American League for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997) and will finish last in the AL West for eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009)...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have lost 90 or more games, the first time since 1997 (65-97)...from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...will end the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...have spent every day in last dating back to July 23 and all but four days in last dating back to May 8.

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 44 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...will likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 14 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in fewest strikeouts (1104), tied for second in triples, third in lowest slugging percentage (.395) and fewest extra base hits (464) and fourth in fewest home runs (143)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (157)...the infield hits are second most by an A's team since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987 (165 in 1989)...have 465 walks, which are currently the second fewest walks in a non-strike season in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979, 506 in 1980).

PITCHING: The A's were leading the American League with a 3.47 ERA as late as Aug. 13...have compiled a 5.91 ERA (259 er in 394.2 ip) since then, which is the highest in the majors (Atlanta, 5.34)...the season ERA has risen .68 runs since then to 4.15, which ranks 11th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have allowed 83 home runs over the last 52 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games...have yielded 170 home runs for the season, which are the most by an A's team since 1998 (179) and seventh most in Oakland history (sixth is 172 in 1985)...have 1165 strikeouts, which is the third highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014 and 1183 in 2013)...lead the AL in shutouts (15).

STARTING PITCHING: Aaron Brooks tossed 7.0 innings yesterday, marking just the third time in the last 36 games an A's starter pitched seven innings...starters are 6-14 with a 7.94 ERA (115 er in 130.1 ip) and .336 (181-for-539) opponents batting average over the last 28 games...have tossed five innings or fewer in 16 of those contests and are averaging 4.65 innings per start...now have a 3.90 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 97 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 122 errors, which are the most in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (121)...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are second most by an A's team over the last 14 years (124 in 2011)...have committed 50 errors in the last 87 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 65 unearned runs, which are second most in the majors (San Diego, 76)...Marcus Semien has 34 errors and Brett Lawrie 24, which rank first and second in the American League...the 58 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Ed Busch (41) and Irv Hall (26) combined for 67 with the 1944 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (1-0)...went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 33-46 (.418) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season and seventh time in the last nine years...went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-2)...finished the season 34-47 (.420) at home, which is the second worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...it will tie for the worst home record in the majors with at least Cincinnati, which marks the

first time the A's had the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321).

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set Oakland single season records for one-run losses (34) and losses by two runs or fewer (52)...the 52 losses by two runs or fewer are fourth most in Athletics history (55 in 1945, 54 in 1916, 53 in 1908) and the 34 one-run losses are tied for fourth (40 in 1908, 38 in 1945, 35 in 1943, 34 in 1967)...are 19-34 (.358) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 15-27) and the worst by an A's team since 1946 (13-29, .310)...the worst mark in Oakland history is .381 in 1980...the 53 one-run games are second most by an A's team over the last 39 years (54 in 2006)...lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for sixth in games...are 30-52 (.366) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 25-45).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have 34 pinch hits, which rank second in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 1998 (35)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (131) and rank second in batting (.338)...the A's had a positive run differential over their first 139 games through Sept. 8 (+5)...have been outscored by 41 runs in 21 games since then...are averaging 3 hours and 15 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have two players on the roster eligible for free agency (Mujica, Zito) and 14 that are arbitration eligible (Abad, Chavez, Davis, Doubront, Fuld, Gentry, Griffin, Lawrie, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sogard, Valencia)...in addition, Evan Scribner (2 years, 142 days) and Dan Otero (2 years, 124 days) are super 2 candidates...the A's have used a franchise record 30 pitchers and an Oakland record 24 relievers...have employed 52 players overall...currently have 37 players on the active roster, which includes Blair, Phegley and Pomeranz, who are out for the season.

IN SEPTEMBER: The A's pitching staff compiled a 6.73 ERA in September, which was the highest single-month ERA in Oakland history (6.59 in May, 1997)...it was the highest single-month ERA by an Athletics team in a month of at least 15 games since the 1939 Philadelphia A's had a 7.50 ERA in July...the ERA was the highest in the majors by nearly 1½ runs (Atlanta, 5.25)...allowed 188 runs, which were second most in any month in Oakland history (206 in May, 1997)...surrendered a Major League leading 48 home runs, which were the most in Oakland history in any month (previous: 44, August of 1969) and third most in Athletics history (57 in May, 1964; 56 in July, 1962)...finished with a record of 8-19 (.296), which was the worst mark in the majors and the third worst September in Oakland history (7-20 in 1978, 8-20 in 1985)...the offense had 12 triples, which was the second best single-month total in Oakland history (13 in July, 1968).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's snapped their five-game losing against Seattle last night and are 5-12 against the Mariners this year...the only times the A's have lost more games against Seattle are in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...are 3-7 in Oakland and 2-5 in Seattle...seven of the A's 12 losses have been by one run...15 of the A's 22 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...have lost the season series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are 43-50 against Seattle over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 326-257 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 146-142 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 70-78 at Safeco Field.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989** Dave Henderson and Mark McGwire homer and Rickey Henderson steals two bases as the A's defeat Toronto 7-3 in Game 1 of the ALCS...in **2001** the A's defeat Texas 5-4 to finish the regular season with a 17-game home winning streak...in **2006** Frank Thomas hits two home runs in Game 1 of the ALDS, a 3-2 A's win at Minnesota...at the age of 38 years, 128 days, he becomes the oldest player in Major League history with a multi-homer game in the post season...in **2012** the A's defeat Texas 12-5 to complete a three-game sweep of the first place Rangers and win the American League West by one game...the A's trailed by as many as five games with nine games to go and 13 games at the end of June.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Nolin (1-2, 5.25 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 4 and is 1-2 with a 5.25 ERA (14 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts...is 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (8 er in 7.1 ip) and .438 (14-for-32) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 3.24 ERA and .242 average over his first three starts...was one of four players acquired from Toronto for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season and began the season on the Oakland disabled list as he continued to recover from off-season bilateral core surgery... was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 15...also spent time on the Triple-A DL from June 1 to 8 with a strained left groin and July 1 to Aug. 14 with a strained left shoulder...was 2-2 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with the Sounds.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle September 6 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a RBI single by Marte, a sacrifice fly by Seager and a wild pitch...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

SECOND START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 5-3 victory at Texas Sept. 12...allowed a leadoff home run to Napoli in the second inning but that was the only run he would allow in 5.2 innings...the A's scored five times in the fifth for the win.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win at Chicago (AL) Sept. 17...shutout the White Sox on two singles and a walk over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Olt in the fourth...also yielded a RBI single to Cabrera in the fifth and was relieved by Rodriguez to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 2-1... Oakland scored three times in the ninth for the win.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-8 loss to Texas Sept. 22 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Beltre in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the second and once in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead... allowed back-to-back sacrifice flies to Choo and Beltre in the fifth but the A's scored once in the bottom of the inning to make the score 5-3...allowed a two-run home run to Moreland in the sixth and left with the score tied 2-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the second inning on back-to-back sacrifice flies by Brown and Pagan and a RBI single by Tomlinson...then allowed two unearned runs in the third inning as a Brett Lawrie error contributed to his loading the bases with one out...was relieved by Leon who allowed two of those runners to score.

NOLIN vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA (7.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 1 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start...the start came earlier this year on Sept. 6 in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss (see first start above)... also faced the Mariners in relief last year at Toronto on Sept. 22 (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 hr).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .230 opponents batting average included a mark of .167 (7-for-42) against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (33-for-132) against right-handers...allowed one double and two walks to lefties for a .190 slugging percentage and .205 on-base percentage...surrendered all five of his home runs and nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...all five of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .319 average with the bases empty compared to .125 with runners on base...opponents were 4-for-35 (.114) with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-13 with RISP and two outs...opponents batted .396 when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2-1 record and a 1.83 ERA in 10 games at night compared to 0-1 with a 4.85 ERA in four starts during the day... logged a 0.75 ERA in the first inning...Nashville was 8-4 (.667) in his 12 starting assignments...did not toss more than 5.2 innings in any of his 14 outings...allowed one run or fewer 11 times and four hits or fewer 12 times.

NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Was sent to Nashville on a rehab assignment from Oakland on May 5...pitched scoreless relief in his first two outings May 5 against Iowa (1.0 ip) and May 9 against Round Rock (2.0 ip)... then started and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings May 14 at Iowa and was reinstated from the disabled list and optioned to Nashville the next day... tossed 4.0 scoreless innings May 25 at Sacramento, giving him a 0.71 ERA over his first five games...issued four walks in 12.2 innings over that stretch but then walked a season-high four batters in 4.0 innings May 30 against Las Vegas...finished May with no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in six games, four starts...was placed on the disabled list June 1 with a strained left groin...was reinstated June 9 and went 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA in four starts in June...picked up his first win of the season June 16 against Memphis when he tossed 5.1 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and three walks...then yielded a season-high six runs in 2.1 innings in his next start June 21 against Omaha for his first loss...tossed a season-high 5.2 innings June 27 against Oklahoma City for his second and final win of the season...also allowed a season-high eight hits and tossed a season-high 102 pitches in that game...was placed on the minor league DL a second time July 1 with a strained left shoulder...was reinstated Aug. 15 and went 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA in four starts following his return...tossed fewer than five innings in each of those starts as he increased his pitch count from 32 on Aug. 15 to 76 in his final start on Aug. 31...struck out a season-high six batters in his final start, a no decision in a 5-1 win over Round Rock.

CAREER: Pitched in one game for Toronto in each of the previous two seasons and went 0-1 with a 27.00 ERA in two games, one start...is 29-19 with a 3.02 ERA (163 er in 485.2 ip) in 106 games, including 98 starts, in six seasons in the minors...has 489 strikeouts in 485.2 innings...has allowed just 34 home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...was acquired by the A's from Toronto with infielder Brett Lawrie, pitcher Kendall Graveman and minor league infielder Franklin Barreto for third baseman Josh Donaldson, Nov. 28, 2014...was named the A's seventh best prospect by *Baseball America* following the trade after being named the Blue Jays 10th best prospect following the 2013 season...combined for a perfect 10-0 record and a 2.04 ERA in 20 games, including 18 starts, in 2012 with Single-A Dunedin and Double-A New Hampshire...was drafted three times and signed with Toronto after being selected in the sixth round of the 2010 draft.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Chris Bassitt (1-8, 3.60 ERA):	Is 0-4 with a 7.13 ERA and .346 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the losing streak matches his career high established earlier this year from June 30 to July 30...is 1-8 despite a 3.60 ERA in 17 games, 12 starts...his .111 winning percentage is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started... it is tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but is the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...has received one run of support or fewer in each of his last four starts and nine of 12 for the season...his overall run support of 3.15 is fifth lowest among American League pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Tuesday (3.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA in three career appearances against Seattle, including two starts, all this year.

Saves/Opportunities: 27-for-51 (52.9%)

- The A's bullpen has a 6.75 ERA (36 er in 48.0 ip) over the last 12 games and now has a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (27), the lowest save percentage (52.9%) and the fourth most blown saves (24)...the saves will be the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22), which was also the last time the A's finished last in the majors in saves...they are currently fifth fewest in Oakland history in a non strike season...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982) and the blown saves are tied for fifth.
- Allowed three home runs Wednesday, which brings the season total to 73...that breaks the Oakland record for home runs allowed by the bullpen (70 in 1997) and is second most in Athletics history (92 in 1964)...rank second in the majors in home runs (Boston, 76).
- Was charged with its 30th loss of the season Monday night, which ranks third in the AL and is one short of the Oakland record of 31 set in 1993.
- Has the second most extra base hits in the AL (187) and is tied for the third fewest wins (20).
