OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-93) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (75-86)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 68-93 (.422) entering the final game today and are tied for the fifth worst record in the majors...with a win today, the A's will match the sixth worst record in Oakland history... with a loss, will match the fourth worst...have won three straight games for the first time since Aug. 29-31 and have not won four straight since a seasonhigh five-game winning streak from June 20-25... have finished the season with a winning streak of at least four games four times in Oakland history (6 in 2012, 6 in 2001, 4 in 2010, 4 in 2002)...will finish

with the worst record in the American League for the third time in Oakland history (1993 and 1997) and will finish last in the AL West for eighth time in Oakland history (1977, 79, 93, 95, 97, 98, 2009)...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have lost 90 or more games, the first time since 1997 (65-97)...from 1998-2014, only the A's, Yankees and Cardinals did not lose 90 games in a season...will end the season with 142 days alone in last place, which will be the third most such days in Oakland history (162 in 2009, 153 in 1997)...have spent every day in last dating back to July 23 and all but four days in last dating back to May 8.

GOING FOR THE SWEEP: The A's have won the first two games of this series and have not swept a series of three or more games since June 23-25 at Texas...have played 25 consecutive series of three or more games without a sweep...did not sweep a home series of three or more games and have a streak of 35 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984).

OFFENSE: The A's have set an Oakland single season record with 45 triples, breaking the previous mark of 40 set in 1968, which was the A's first season in Oakland...the triples are the most by an A's team since the 1967 club had 50 in their final season in Kansas City...will likely set a franchise record for fewest sacrifice hits in a season...have a Major League-low 14 and the franchise record is 18 in 2007...the A's rank second in the American League in triples (45), fewest strikeouts (1111) and lowest slugging percentage (.395), third in fewest extra base hits (467) and fourth in fewest home runs (145)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in infield hits (158)...the infield hits are second most by an A's team since Stats, Inc. began tracking infield hits in 1987 (165 in 1989)...have 473 walks, which are currently the third fewest walks in a non-strike season in Oakland history (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968, 482 in 1979, 506 in 1980).

PITCHING: The A's were leading the American League with a 3.47 ERA as late as Aug. 13...have compiled a 5.83 ERA (264 er in 407.2 ip) since then, which is the highest in the majors (Atlanta, 5.34)...the season ERA has risen .67 runs since then to 4.14, which ranks 11th in the AL...have finished in the top four in the AL in ERA in 15 of the previous 16 seasons, with the exception being a sixth place finish in 2007...have not finished 10th or worse since 1997 when they were last...have allowed 84 home runs over the last 53 games after surrendering just 87 over the first 108 games... have yielded 171 home runs for the season, which are the most by an A's team since 1998 (179) and seventh most in Oakland history (sixth is 172 in 1985, fifth is 176 in 1987)...have 1175 strikeouts, which is the third highest single season total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014 and 1183 in 2013)... lead the AL in shutouts (15).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-14 with a 7.85 ERA (118 er in 135.1 ip) and .333 (187-for-561) opponents batting average over the last 29 games...have tossed five innings or fewer in 17 of those contests and are averaging 4.67 innings per start...now have a 3.91 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have allowed 98 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 125 errors, which are the most in the majors ahead of Pittsburgh (122)...have not led the majors in errors since 1978 (179)...the errors are the most by an A's team since 2001 when they also had 125 (had 134 in 2000)...have committed 53 errors in the last 88 games after making 72 in the first 73 contests...have 65 unearned runs, which are second most in the majors (San Diego, 76)... Marcus Semien has 35 errors and Brett Lawrie 24, which rank first and second in the AL...the 59 errors are the most by two A's teammates since Ed Busch (41) and Irv Hall (26) combined for 67 with the 1944 Philadelphia A's...they are the most in the majors by two teammates since 1993 when Wil Cordero (36) and Mike Lansing (24) combined for 60 with Montreal.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Seattle (2-0)...have not had a winning record on a road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014... went 4-6 on the last road trip to Texas (1-2), Chicago-AL (2-2) and Houston (1-2) and are 34-46 (.425) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the second consecutive season and seventh time in the last nine years... went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Texas (0-3) and San Francisco (1-2)...finished the season 34-47 (.420) at home, which is the second worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...it will tie for the worst home record in the majors with at least Cincinnati (also Milwaukee if they lose today)...this marks the first time the A's had the worst home record in the majors since the 1964 Kansas City A's went 26-55 (.321).

ONE-RUN AND TWO-RUN GAMES: The A's have set Oakland single season records for one-run losses (34) and losses by two runs or fewer (52)... the 52 losses by two runs or fewer are fourth most in Athletics history (55 in 1945, 54 in 1916, 53 in 1908) and the 34 one-run losses are tied for fourth (40 in 1908, 38 in 1945, 35 in 1943, 34 in 1967)...are 19-34 (.358) in one-run games, which is the second worst record in the majors (Toronto, 15-28)...will set an Oakland record for worst record in one-run game (previous: .381 in 1980)...if the A's do not win by one run today, they will finish with the worst record in one-run games by an A's team since 1946 (13-29, .310)...the 53 one-run games are second most by an A's team over the last 39 years (54 in 2006)...lead the majors in one-run losses and are tied for sixth in games...are 31-52 (.374) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 26-45).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have a .422 winning percentage and a run differential of -34...in modern Major League history (since 1900), the only team to finish with a winning percentage under .430 and a run differential better than -37 is the 1924 St. Louis Cardinals (.422 winning percentage, -10)...the A's are averaging 3 hours and 18 minutes per game in September after averaging 2:58 over the first five months of the season...have 34 pinch hits, which rank second in the American League and is the most by an A's team since 1998 (35)...the A's lead the majors in RBI with the bases loaded (132) and rank second in batting (.336)

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have two players on the roster eligible for free agency (Mujica, Zito) and 14 that are arbitration eligible (Abad, Chavez, Davis, Doubront, Fuld, Gentry, Griffin, Lawrie, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick, Rodriguez, Sogard, Valencia)...in addition, Evan Scribner (2 years, 142 days) and Dan Otero (2 years, 124 days) are super 2 candidates...the A's have used a franchise record 30 pitchers and an Oakland record 24 relievers...have employed 52 players overall.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 6-12 against the Mariners this year...the only times the A's have lost more games against Seattle are in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...are 3-7 in Oakland and 3-5 in Seattle...seven of the A's 12 losses have been by one run...15 of the A's 22 losses over the last two years have been by two runs or fewer...have lost the season series for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years... are 44-50 against Seattle over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 327-257 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 147-142 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 71-78 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns leads Major League rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (47) and leads American League rookies in hits (153)... **Mark Canha** leads AL rookies in RBI (69).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980 Rickey Henderson steals two bases in the penultimate game of the season to become the first Athletic to swipe 100 bases in a season... in 1987, in his final Major League at bat, Reggie Jackson singles to center field for his 2584th career hit in the A's 5-2 loss at Chicago...in 1989 Rickey Henderson is 2 for 2 with two walks and four steals in the A's 6-3 win over Toronto in Game 2 of the ALCS...in 1992 Rickey Henderson singles off Milwaukee's Cal Eldred in his final at bat of the regular season for his 2000th career hit...in 2002 Ray Durham and Scott Hatteberg start the game with back-to-back home runs as the A's defeat Minnesota 6-3 in Game 3 of the ALDS...in 2006 Mark Kotsay has an inside-the-park home run in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota in Game 2 of the ALDS.

S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-8, 3.60)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 7.13 ERA (14 er in 17.2 ip) and .346 (27-for-78) opponents batting average over his last four starts... the losing streak matches his career high established earlier this year from June 30 to July 30 (3.00 ERA).

BRIEFLY: Is scheduled to make his 18th appearance and 13th start of the season...it is his third start since straining his shoulder on Aug. 26 and he is 0-2 with a 12.15 ERA (9 er in 6.2 ip) in two starts since his return...began the season at Triple-A Nashville and was called up for the first time April 23...logged a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in five relief appearances before being optioned May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...returned July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and had a no decision that day at Cleveland (2 er in 6.1 ip, 2.84 ERA)...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching. recalled for his fourth stint July 25 and went 1-4 with a 2.76 ERA and .226 opponents batting average in seven starts before straining his shoulder.

ERA AND WINNING PERCENTAGE: Is 1-8 despite a 3.60 ERA in 17 games, 12 starts...his .111 winning percentage is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started...it is tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but is the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...the last Major League pitcher with at least 10 starts, an ERA under 4.00 and a winning percentage of .111 or less is Anthony Young, who went 1-16 (.059) with a 3.77 ERA in 39 games, including 10 starts, for the Mets in 1993...no American League pitcher has done it since 1968 when Rickey Clark (1-11, 3.53 ERA with California) and Fred Talbot (1-9, 3.36 ERA with New York) both did it.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in each of his last four starts and nine of 12 for the season...his run support average as a starter is 2.08 (16 rs in 69.1 ip)...his overall run support of 3.15 (28 rs in 80.0 ip) is fifth lowest among American League pitchers with 80 or more innings pitched...has 26 runs of support in 17 career starting assignments (98.0 ip, 2.39 RSA).

INNING BY INNING: Has an 8.25 ERA (11 er in 12.0 ip) and .382 (21-for-55) opponents batting average in the first inning, a 2.03 ERA (10 er in 44.1 ip) and .201 (31-for-154) opponents average in innings two through five and a 4.18 ERA (11 er in 23.2 ip) and .233 (21-for-90) opponents average from the sixth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-5 with a 2.28 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in nine games in Oakland...is 0-3 with a 5.51 ERA (20 er in 32.2 ip) and .280 (35-for-125) opponents average in eight games on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 0-4 with a 5.63 ERA (20 er in 32.0 ip) in nine games against American League West competition compared to 1-4 with a 2.25 ERA in eight games against all other teams.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-8 with a 3.63 ERA (28 er in 69.1 ip) and .260 (68-for-262) opponents batting average in his 12 starting assignments compared to 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents batting average in his five relief appearances...has walked 16 batters in 69.1 innings as a starter (2.08 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...all five of his relief appearances came during his first stint.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-9 (.250) in his 12 starting assignments... has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his starts...has issued 18 of his 25 walks to left-handed hitters...opponents are batting .315 (23-for-73) with runners in scoring position.

2015 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his first start with the A's. a 2-1 loss to Colorado June 30 in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Cleveland July 30 in Oakland...retired 18 of the final 21 batters he faced but Carrasco tossed a two-hitter for Cleveland...combined with Rodriguez and Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first win as an Athletic...tossed seven innings and allowed five of the hits while walking two...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win over Houston Aug. 9 in Oakland...struck out a career-high 10 batters and tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 6.2 innings...shut out the Astros over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Baltimore Aug. 15...tossed a careerhigh 8.0 innings...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 8-1 loss to Texas Sept. 24 in Oakland...it was his first start since Aug. 26 due to a strained shoulder and he tossed just three innings, which was his shortest career outing as a starter.

LAST START: He lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 8-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Tuesday...yielded a career-high six runs on a career-high

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters in 69.0 innings and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers. opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on...went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA in seven games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA in five games on the road...the Sounds were 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just two of his starts.

- The A's bullpen has a 6.11 ERA (38 er in 56.0 ip) over the last 13 games and now has a 4.56 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League and third highest in the majors.
- Has the fewest saves in the majors (28), the lowest save percentage (52.8%) and are tied for the third most blown saves (25)...the saves will be the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1982 (22), which was also the last time the A's finished last in the majors in saves... they are currently tied for fifth fewest in Oakland history in a non strike season...the save percentage is currently third worst in Oakland history (50.0% in 1979, 52.0% in 1980, 53.7% in 1982) and the blown saves are tied for third (28 in 2004, 26 in 1987).
- Allowed three home runs Wednesday, which brings the season total to 73...that breaks the Oakland record for home runs allowed by the bullpen (70 in 1997) and is second most in Athletics history (92 in 1964)... rank second in the majors in home runs (Boston, 76).
- Was charged with its 30th loss of the season Monday night, which ranks third in the AL and is one short of the Oakland record of 31 set in 1993.
- Has the second most extra base hits in the AL (187) and is tied for the fourth fewest wins (21).
- Has allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the highest percentage in the majors (NYM, 33.8%).
- Has allowed the most first batter RBI in the majors (68) and is tied for second in most home runs (19)...the home runs are the most by an A's team since the stat was first tracked in 1974.
- The A's are 13-57 when the bullpen allows two runs or more, 50-36 when it allows one run or fewer (five complete games).

- Posted a 7.36 ERA over his first 20 games through May 19, a 0.83 ERA over his next 23 games through Aug. 9 and has a 6.60 ERA (11 er in 15.0 ip) in 18 appearances since then.
