2015 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 68-94, finishing in fourth place in the National League Central Division, 32.0 games behind the Cardinals.... the team drew 2,542,558 fans at Miller Park, eclipsing the 2.5-million mark in home attendance for the ninth straight season.....following a 7-18 start, Craig Counsell took over as manager on 5/4, replacing Ron Roenicke.....the Brewers named David Stearns general manager on 9/21, replacing Doug Melvin, who remained with the organization as senior advisor.....the team had 12 players make their Major League debuts last season, setting a new franchise record.....OF Ryan Braun became the all-time franchise leader in home runs with #252 coming on 8/19 vs. Miami.

TODAY'S STARTER: RHP JIMMY NELSON

RHP Jimmy Nelson, 26, is making his first start of the spring.....Nelson went 11-13 with a 4.11 ERA in 30 starts last season, his first full Major League season.....he led the team in starts, quality starts (13), wins, innings pitched (177.1) and strikeouts (148).....the Brewers went 14-16 in his starts.....Nelson posted an 8-1 record with a 1.08 ERA in his 13 quality starts (91.1ip, 11er).....he produced a streak of 25.2 innings without allowing an earned run from 7/24-8/9, which marked the fifth-longest streak in a single season by a Brewers starter.....in his final start of the season, 9/17 vs. St. Louis, he left the game in the third inning after being struck in the head by a line drive.....he was placed on the 60-day disabled list on 9/22 with a head contusion.....bio is on p. 114 of the media guide.
