WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox open the 2016 season tonight against the Oakland Athletics ... LHP Chris Sale will make his third career Opening Day start (also 2013-14).
- Sale will be followed tomorrow by LHP Jose Quintana, LHP Carlos Rodon on Wednesday and RHP Mat Latos in the finale.
- Following this four-game series, the White Sox open the home portion of their schedule with three games vs. Cleveland (4/8-10) before taking a six-game, seven-day trip to Minnesota (4/11-14) and Tampa Bay (4/15-17).
- The Sox have one off day in April (4/12) before beginning a stretch of 19 straight games without an off day from 4/13-5/1.

OPENING DAY STORYLINES

- The White Sox are 60-55 overall on Opening Day (1-2 vs. Oakland) and 32-32 when opening on the road ... the Sox have won five of their last seven season openers but have lost five of their last six on the road.
- Chicago is playing its first night opener since 2006 (10-4 win vs. Cleveland) and first night opener on the road since 1999 (8-2 win at Seattle).
- The Sox are opening away from home for the fifth time in the last 12 seasons after playing 14 straight season openers on the road from 1991-2004.
- The White Sox have won four straight games at The Coliseum following a seven-game losing streak ... they are looking for their first five-game winning streak in Oakland since 8/1/96-8/5/97.
- LHP Chris Sale is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (3 ER/15.0 IP) and 15 strikeouts in two career Opening Day starts.
- SS Jimmy Rollins has made 15 consecutive Opening Day starts, tied with Albert Pujols for the longest active streak in the major leagues ... Rollins owns an 11-game, OD hitting streak.

SPRING RECAP

- The White Sox went 17-13-1 in spring training, concluding with a pair of wins at San Diego from 4/1-2.
- The Sox finished with a winning record in spring training for the first time since 2004 (15-13-1), and the 17 wins were their most since 2003 (also 17).
- Chicago led the major leagues with 51 home runs, its most during spring training since at least 1980.

ROSTER QUICK FACTS

- The White Sox 25-man roster includes 12 pitchers (six left-handers), two catchers, six infielders and five outfielders ... the average age is 28.8 (28.9 for position players and 28.6 for pitchers), up from 28.3 in 2015 ... the starting rotation averages 27.0, compared to 29.7 for the bullpen.
- SS Jimmy Rollins (37) is the oldest player, LHP Carlos Rodon (23) is the youngest, and LHP John Danks (2007-) is the longest tenured, followed by LHP Chris Sale (2010-).
- The White Sox begin the season with no players on the disabled list (four in 2015) and no rookies (two in 2015) ... Rollins made the club as a non-roster invitee to spring training ... LHP Carlos Rodon, INF Tyler Saladino and INF Jerry Sands made their career first Opening Day rosters.

A BUSY OFFSEASON

- The White Sox Opening Day roster includes eight players who were acquired in the offseason, compared to 12 in 2015.
- C Alex Avila (11/25), C Dioner Navarro (12/4), RHP Mat Latos (2/9), SS Jimmy Rollins (2/22) and OF Austin Jackson (3/7) were signed as free agents.
- INF Brett Lawrie (12/9 from Oakland) and Todd Frazier (12/16 from Cincinnati) were acquired via trade ... INF/OF Jerry Sands (12/23 from Cleveland) was claimed off waivers.

GRAB SOME BENCH

- Chris Sale recorded an American League-best and franchise-record 274 strikeouts in 2015, breaking the previous mark of 269 set by Hall-of-Famer Ed Walsh in 1908 ... Sale set the White Sox record in just 208.2 IP, compared to 464.0 for Walsh.
- Sale also set club records last season in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (11.92) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.51) and struck out 10-plus batters 13 times, upping his franchise record to 31.

ABREU IN ELITE COMPANY

- Jose Abreu and Albert Pujols (2001-02) are the only players in major-league history to record 30-plus home runs and 100-plus RBI in each of his first two seasons.
- Abreu batted .290 with 30 homers and 101 RBI last season after hitting .317 with 36 and 107 as a rookie in 2014.
- Pujols accomplished the feat in each of his first 10 seasons before the streak ended in 2011.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox are 1-2 all-time vs. Oakland on Opening Day, with all three games played at The Coliseum ... the Sox dropped a 3-2 decision on 4/8/75, won the opener of a doubleheader on 4/7/71, 6-5, and lost, 5-2, on 4/8/69.
- Chicago defeated the Kansas City A's in the 1960 opener, 10-9, at Comiskey Park, as Minnie Minoso hit a pair of home runs, including a grand slam.
- The Sox went 5-2 against Oakland last season and have won back-to-back season series against the A's for the first time since 1993-95 ... they are 11-5 over their last 16 contests and have won four games in a row at The Coliseum after losing the previous seven.
- The White Sox trail the all-time series, 281-300 ... they are 147-142 at home (88-82 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 134-158 on the road.

HONORING EDDIE

- The White Sox mourn the loss of sports broadcasting legend and long-time Sox executive Eddie Einhorn, who passed away on 2/23/16 from complications involving a stroke.
- Einhorn, who was 80 years old, served as vice chairman of the White Sox for 25 years and was the team's president and chief operating officer from 1981-90 ... he also was a member of the Chicago Bulls board of directors.
- The Sox will honor Einhorn by wearing an "Eddie" patch on their uniform sleeve during the 2016 regular season.

FAMILIAR FACES

- This series marks the return of SS Jimmy Rollins, hitting coach Todd Steverson and assistant hitting coach Greg Sparks.
- Rollins graduated in 1996 from Encinal High School in Alameda and was selected by Philadelphia in the second round of the 1996 draft.
- Steverson worked nine seasons in the Oakland organization, including two as the A's first base coach and two as the minor-league hitting coordinator.
- Sparks spent 19 seasons (1997-2015) in the Athletics organization, including nine as the minor-league hitting coordinator.

HOW THE WEST WAS WON

- The White Sox went 21-12 (.636) vs. the American League West in 2015, the second best winning percentage in the major leagues behind San Francisco (.650).
- Sox pitchers recorded a 3.33 ERA (114 ER/308.1 IP) and made 26 quality starts in 33 games.
- Chicago's three-game sweep on 5/15-17 at Oakland was its first at The Coliseum since 5/16-18/97.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

- The White Sox have made 1,157 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, the second-highest total in the major leagues behind the Mets (1,163).
- The Sox led the American League with 98 quality starts in 2015, their highest total since 2003 (also 98).

ROLLIN(S) ON OPENING DAY

- Shortstop Jimmy Rollins has made 15 consecutive Opening Day starts (all at shortstop), tied with Albert Pujols for the longest active streak in baseball.
- Rollins (37 years, 126 days) is in line to become the oldest Opening Day shortstop in White Sox history since Luke Appling (42 years, 17 days) in 1949.

AT THE HELM

- Robin Ventura enters his fifth season as White Sox manager ... owns a 297-351 (.458) record, including a 76-86 mark in 2015.
- Ventura has managed 648 games with the Sox, tied with Nixey Callahan for 10th-most in franchise history ... was a finalist for American League Manager of the Year in 2012.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Melky Cabrera:** 66 hits for 1,500 ... 28 doubles for 300.
- **John Danks:** Seven starts to tie Richard Dotson for 10th in Sox history (250) ... 19.0 IP for 1,500 ... 12 strikeouts to tie Gary Peters for sixth in Sox history (1,098).
- **Austin Jackson:** Three triples for 50 ... 75 hits for 300.
- **Mat Latos:** 41 strikeouts for 1,000.
- **Brett Lawrie:** Nine games for 500 ... nine hits for 500 ... 10 doubles for 100.
- **David Robertson:** 38 games for 500 ... 19 saves for 100.
- **Jimmy Rollins:** 78 hits for 2,500.
- **Chris Sale:** 4 games for 200 ... 56 strikeouts to tie Doc White for 9th in Sox history (1,067).

SALE AT A GLANCE

- Turned 27 on 3/30 ... is scheduled to make his third career Opening Day start ... is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (3 ER/15.0 IP) over his two previous season-opening assignments, both in Chicago ... won on 4/1/13 vs. Kansas City with 7.2 scoreless IP and defeated Minnesota on 3/31/14, allowing three runs over 7.1 IP.
- Leads all American League pitchers since 2012 in strikeouts (900), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.06) and WHIP (1.07).
- Is 32-15 with a 2.49 ERA (121 ER/437.0 IP) and 488 strikeouts over 64 games (63 starts) in the first half since 2012 ... his 2.49 ERA ranks third in the major leagues behind Clayton Kershaw (2.39) and Sonny Gray (2.40).
- Has gone 17-5 with a 2.44 ERA (53 ER/195.1 IP) and 236 strikeouts in 38 career games (25 starts) vs. AL West opponents ... went 4-0 with a 1.45 ERA (6 ER/37.1 IP) and 62 strikeouts in five starts against the AL West in 2015 ... struck out 13 or more batters in four of the five starts.
- Joins Hall-of-Famer Ed Walsh (1910-12) as the only pitchers in Sox history to strike out 200-plus batters in three consecutive seasons.
- Has allowed one or no runs in 47 of his 116 career starts (40.5 percent), including 19 scoreless outings.

SPRING RECAP

- Went 1-0 with a 3.78 ERA (7 ER/16.2 IP) and 13 strikeouts over three Cactus League starts ... made his spring debut on 3/19 vs. the Dodgers (2 ER/5.1 IP) ... also started on 3/24 vs. the Angels (ND, 4 ER/6.0 IP) and 3/29 vs. Texas (1 ER/5.1 IP) ... made his first three starts in simulated or minor-league games.

2015 RECAP

- Recorded an American League-best and franchise-record 274 strikeouts, breaking the previous mark of 269 set by Hall-of-Famer Ed Walsh in 1908 ... set the new record in just 208.2 IP, compared to 464.0 for Walsh.
- His 274 strikeouts were the third-highest total by a major-league left-hander since 2004, trailing Clayton Kershaw (301 in 2015) and Randy Johnson (290 in 2004).
- Became the first pitcher since Hall-of-Famer Pedro Martinez in 2002 to lead the AL in both strikeouts and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.52).
- His average of 11.92 strikeouts per 9.0 IP set a Sox record and was the highest in the majors since Johnson's 13.41 mark in 2001 ... his 6.51 strikeout-to-walk ratio (274 SO/42 BB) broke his own club record of 5.33 set in 2014.
- Struck out 10-plus batters 13 times, breaking his own franchise record of eight set in 2014 ... became the first pitcher since Randy Johnson in 2004 to record double-digit strikeouts 13 times in one season (STATS).
- Was named to his fourth straight AL All-Star Team, joining Billy Pierce (1955-59) as the only Pitchers in Sox history to make at least four straight All-Star Teams ... his 157 strikeouts in the first half broke Wilbur Wood's mark of 142 set in 1973.
- Led the AL with an average of 107.2 pitches per start and ranked among the leaders in numerous other categories (see box at right).

SALE'S HISTORIC RUN

- Struck out 10-plus batters over eight straight starts from 5/23-6/30/15, tying Pedro Martinez (8/19-9/27/99 with Boston) for the longest streak in major-league history (Elias) ... fanned 12-plus batters in five straight starts from 5/28-6/19/15, joining Martinez and Randy Johnson as the only pitchers to accomplish the feat.
- Recorded three straight starts of 12-plus strikeouts with one or no runs allowed from 5/28-6/8/15, joining Hall-of-Famer Sandy Koufax as the only major-league pitchers since 1900 to accomplish that feat (Elias).
- Became the first pitcher since 1900 to record 10-plus strikeouts in four straight starts (5/23-6/8/15) while upping his total in each outing (Elias).

K-ZONE

- Has struck out 10 or more batters a franchise-record 32 times in 116 career starts (27.6 percent) and 12-plus batters a franchise-record 18 times, the most in the major leagues since 2012.
- Has recorded 10 or more strikeouts with no walks a franchise-record six times, two more than Juan Pizarro in 145 starts.
- Owens six of the Top 11 strikeout games in franchise history ... holds franchise single-season strikeout records at home (129 in 2014-15) and in the first half (157 in 2015).
- Has struck out 10 or more batters in a losing effort seven times since 2012.
- Has fanned 899 batters through his first 116 career starts, which, according to Elias, is the most in Sox history and most among active pitchers (Tim Lincecum is second with 855).
- His 708 combined strikeouts from 2013-15 are the most by a White Sox pitcher over three seasons since Walsh (767) from 1910-12.
- Struck out at least one batter in 38 straight innings from 5/28-6/24/15, the longest streak in the majors since Johan Santana (39) in 2002 (Elias).

SALE AT 1,000

- Recorded his 1,000th career strikeout (Chris Young) in the fourth inning on 9/24/15 at New York-AL, becoming the fifth-fastest pitcher (872.0 IP) in major-league history to reach that milestone.
- Only Billy Wagner (757.2 IP), Octavio Dotel (820.1), Francisco Rodriguez (827.1) and Kerry Wood (853.0) reached 1,000 strikeouts in fewer IP than Sale (Elias).

LITTLE RESISTANCE VS. LEFTIES

- Has limited left-handers to a .198 (117-590) average in four seasons as a starter, the third-lowest mark in the major leagues behind Clayton Kershaw (.186) and Drew Smyly (.188).
- Lefties are hitting .204 (151-741) with a .262 on-base percentage and three home runs in his career ... Brennan Boesch (two) and Travis Hafner (one) are the only lefties to homer off Sale ... Boesch (9/2/12 at Comerica Park) is the last lefty to homer off Sale, who has faced 472 lefties since then.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has finished in the Top-6 of the American League Cy Young voting in each of the last four seasons.
- Is a four-time AL All-Star (2012-15) ... is the first White Sox pitcher to make four straight All-Star Games since Billy Pierce (1955-59) ... was the winning pitcher at the 2013 Midsummer Classic at New York's Citi Field, throwing 2.0 scoreless IP.
