OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-1) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (1-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's opened their 49th season in Oakland last night with a loss...have started the season 0-2 three times over the previous nine years (2007, 2011, 2013), but have been 1-1 after two games eight times over the previous 11 years...have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th sea-son in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost by one run last night...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...committed two errors last night...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...this series with the White Sox will mark the 36th consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games).

FOR OPENERS: The A's lost on Opening Day for the 11th time in the last 12 years last night...are now 5-18 on Opening Day dating back to 1994... it was the first time Oakland lost to the White Sox on Opening Day...won the previous two meetings, 5-2 in 1969 and 3-2 in 1975, both in Oakland... prior to moving to Oakland, the A's and White Sox met once on Opening Day, a 10-9 White Sox win over the Kansas City A's in Chicago in 1960... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 21-28 on Opening Day, including 17-14 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 53-63 in openers.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpassing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...

ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years (the Lambo/ Doubront move yesterday is officially in-season)...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers... eight players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Ath-

letic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years (now 29.24 with Lambo replacing Doubront)...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16... Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old... Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth yesterday (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker is on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night and now have a five-game losing streak to the White Sox in the Coliseum...that is Oakland's longest home losing streak to Chicago since Aug. 1, 1996-Aug. 5, 1997 when they also lost five straight...last lost more than five in a row Aug. 3, 1989-Sept. 18, 1990 when they dropped six straight...lost the season series last year, 2-5...were swept in a three-game series in Oakland and split a four-game series in Chicago...it marked the second consecutive season the A's have lost the season series...have lost 10 of their last 13 games to the White Sox...have won just one season series over the previous five years and are 17-21 against Chicago since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 300-282 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-135 in Oakland and 142-147 in Chicago...including 60-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 977-1037 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has 299 career stolen bases and needs one more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals...last night, **Ryan Madson** extended his regular season scoreless streak to 13 games and 12.0 innings dating back to last year...**Marcus Semien** went 0-for-2 with a walk last night and now has a 24-game reaching base streak dating back to last year, which is the longest of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1993** Eric Fox hits the first Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history as the A's defeat the Detroit Tigers, 9-4...in **1994** Terry Steinbach hits the second Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history, but the A's lose 11-7 at Milwaukee.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-8, 3.56 ERA in 2015)

FOR OPENERS: Is on his first career Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the 19th of his career...went 1-8 with a 3.56 ERA in 18 games, 13 starts, with the A's last year after going 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA in six games, five starts, in his first season with the White Sox in 2014...was originally selected by Chicago in the 16th round of the 2011 draft and was one of four players traded to the A's in the Jeff Samardzija deal following the 2014 season.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts... also pitched in a Triple-A game against the Cubs on the A's lone off day of the spring March 16...allowed a .263 (20-for-76) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a run in his first two starts (5.0 ip), allowed nine in his next two (10.1 ip, 7.84 ERA), and one in 4.0 innings in his final start.

2015 RECAP: Split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: His .111 winning percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started... it tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but was the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...the last Major League pitcher with at least 10 starts, an ERA under 3.75 and a winning percentage of .111 or less was Zane Smith, who went 1-13 (.071) with a 3.49 ERA in 48 games, including 17 starts, for the Braves and Expos in 1989...no American League pitcher has done it since 1968 when Rickey Clark (1-11, 3.53 ERA with California) and Fred Talbot (1-9, 3.36 ERA with New York) both did it.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and his season run support average as a starter was 2.15...his overall run support of 3.14 was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...has one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 18 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.42 (28 rs in 104.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .244 opponents batting average, including .217 (40-for-184) against lefties and .279 (38-for-136) against righties...is-sued 22 of his 30 walks to lefties...opponents hit .215 with two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-5 with a 2.28 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in nine games in Oakland, 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA and .274 opponents average in nine games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-8 with a 3.58 ERA and .258 opponents average in his 13 starts...had no decisions, a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents average in five relief appearances...walked 21 batters in 75.1 innings as a starter (2.51 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.62 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in the first inning compared to a 2.84 ERA and .214 opponents average from the second inning on...was 0-4 with a 5.21 ERA in 10 games against AL West competition, 1-4 with a 2.25 ERA in eight games against all other teams...the A's were 3-10 (.231) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts.

2015 WITH OAKLAND: Began the season at Nashville and was recalled by Oakland April 23...pitched exclusively in relief during his first stint and logged a 3.38 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed at least one run in three of those outings and walked two batters or more four times before he was optioned back to Nashville May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just

three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...was called up a third time July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the disabled list and allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in a no decision that day at Cleveland...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching...returned for good July 25 and went 1-6 with a 3.86 ERA over his final 10 starts...allowed three runs in 7.0 innings July 30 against Cleveland but took the loss in a 3-1 decision...went 0-4 with a 3.00 ERA over his first five starts from June 30 to July 30...tossed at least five innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of those starts to become the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak...combined with Fernando Rodriguez and Fernando Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first and only win as an Athletic ... struck out a career-high 10 batters and tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 6.2 innings Aug. 9 against Houston but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...did not allow a run over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings Aug. 15 at Baltimore but had a no decision in a 4-3 loss...then lost each of his next four starts to finish the season with a career-high tying four-game losing streak .compiled a 6.08 ERA over that five-start stretch...did not pitch from Aug. 27 to Sept. 23 due to a strained right shoulder...started three of the A's final 10 games and went 0-2 with a 7.82 ERA.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville... allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on ... went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in eight games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road... was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in 10 starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score... was 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA in three games before his April 23 promotion to Oakland...went 1-5 with a 3.83 ERA in nine games following his May 11 option...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.0 innings June 3 against Salt Lake...allowed just one unearned run in that game but had a no decision in the Sounds 5-1 win...then walked a season-high four batters in his next start June 8 at New Orleans, a six-inning complete game...allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-1 decision...did not pitch for the Sounds following his July 5 option...had a loss in his only start following his July 12 option despite allowing just two runs in 6.0 innings July 19 against Omaha.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (14-7, 2.73 ERA in 2015): Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was the A's scheduled starter on Opening Night on Monday but was scratched due to food poisoning...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA in 10 career starts in the month...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...also started in a minor league game March 24...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...his final spring start came on March 29 at Chicago (NL), a loss (5.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so)...is 0-0 with an 8.10 ERA in two career starts against the White Sox, both in Chicago...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and third in opponents batting average (.217).
