ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have started the season 0-2 for the fourth time in the last 10 years and the 14th time in Oakland history...last started the year 0-2 in 2013...have not lost their first three games since 1996...are 0-2 on this season-opening four-game homestand against Chicago (AL)...travel to Seattle for three games this weekend before returning home for a six-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Kansas City...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost each of the first two games of the season by one run for the second time in Oakland history (1986) and fourth time in Athletics history (1908, 1960)...have never started the season by losing each of their first three contests by one run...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...have struck out 10 times in each of the first two games, which marks the first time in Athletics history the A's have fanned 10 or more times in each of the first two contests...went errorless last night after committing two errors in the opener...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...this series with the White Sox marks the A's 36th consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpassing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years (the Lambo/Doubtront move on Monday is officially in-season)...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...eight players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubtront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Ath-

letic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years (now 29.24 with Lambo replacing Doubtront)...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old...Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth on Monday (Doubtront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker is on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have lost the first two games of this series and now have a six-game losing streak to the White Sox in the Coliseum...that is Oakland's longest home losing streak to Chicago since Aug. 3, 1989 to Sept. 18, 1990 when they also dropped six straight...the Oakland record for consecutive home losses to the White Sox is seven (Sept. 27, 1981-Sept. 11, 1982 and Sept. 24, 1987-April 17, 1988)...lost the season series last year, 2-5...were swept in a three-game series in Oakland and split a four-game series in Chicago...it marked the second consecutive season the A's have lost the season series...have lost 11 of their last 14 games to the White Sox...have won just one season series over the previous five years and are 17-22 against Chicago since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 300-283 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-136 in Oakland and 142-147 in Chicago...including 60-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 977-1038 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has 299 career stolen bases and needs one more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals...**Jed Lowrie** is the first Athletic with at least two RBI in each of the A's first two games since Jermaine Dye in 2004...on Monday night, **Ryan Madson** extended his regular season scoreless streak to 13 games and 12.0 innings dating back to last year...**Marcus Semien** has reached base in each of his first two games and now has a 25-game reaching base streak dating back to last year, which is the longest of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1982** an Opening Day crowd of 48,348 watches the A's defeat the California Angels 3-2 in 11 innings...the A's score the winning run when Davey Lopes walks with the bases loaded to force in Dwayne Murphy with the go-ahead run...in **2015** Sonny Gray tosses eight shutout innings of one-hit ball and combines with Evan Scribner on a one-hit, 8-0 shutout of the Texas Rangers to snap the A's Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (14-7, 2.73 ERA in 2015)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start of the season...was scheduled to make his third consecutive Opening Day start on Monday but was scratched due to food poisoning...is on his third straight Opening Day roster...has not allowed a run in his first start of the season in each of the previous two years (14.0 ip, 6 h, 4 bb, 10 so)...has a win and a no decision in those two starts and opponents are 6-for-47 (.128).

IN APRIL: Went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 7-1 with a 2.02 ERA (16 er in 71.1 ip) in 10 career starts in the month...the seven wins match his most in any month (July) and the ERA is second lowest to his 1.64 ERA in July.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 24...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...surrendered nine runs in his last two starts (8 er in 10.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding three in his first two (7.2 ip, 3.52 ERA)...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA and a .354 opponents batting average last spring.

GRAY vs. CHICAGO: Is 0-0 with an 8.10 ERA (10.0 ip, 12 h, 10 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in two career starts, both in Chicago...had a no decision in his only start last year, an 8-7, 14-inning loss at Chicago (AL) Sept.

14...matched his career high by allowing seven runs (also Aug. 6, 2014 vs. TB)...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was his shortest career outing as a starter (previous: 3.1, Aug. 25, 2013 at Baltimore)...allowed four runs in the third inning on two-run home runs by Abreu and Thompson...then surrendered three more runs in the fourth without recording an out...walked Ramirez with the bases loaded and then yielded a two-run single to Abreu...was relieved by Rodriguez who retired the next three batters...also had a no decision in a 5-4 A's loss in 12 innings at Chicago on Sept. 8, 2014...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Moss error and a Garcia sacrifice fly...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Gilaspie in the bottom of the sixth...left with a 4-3 lead.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...the batting average and on-base percentage were seventh lowest in Oakland history and the OPS ranked eighth...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts (169), complete games (3) and walks (59).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 20-6 with a 2.40 ERA (67 er in 251.1 ip) in 38 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts were the most by a pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history (Langford, 62 in 1979) among pitchers with no errors...they were the most errorless chances by an AL pitcher since Josh Towers had 60 for Toronto in 2005...had the second most total chances among AL pitchers.

RANKINGS: Also tied for first in the AL in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games, ranked fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8), tied for fourth in wild pitches (13), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667), seventh in home runs per nine innings (0.74), tied for eighth in opponents grounded into double plays (19) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching on an error (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .217 opponents batting average included a mark of .208 (81-for-389) against left-handed hitters compared to .226 (85-for-376) against right-handers...it increased to .256 with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .146 with two strikes and .194 the first time through the lineup...held the number eight hitter in the batting order to a .139 batting average, which was the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title...yielded a .326 average to the clean-up hitter, .203 against all other spots in the order.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 14-6 with a 2.57 ERA (59 er in 206.2 ip) in 31 starts on the road over the last two years compared to 14-11 with a 3.23 ERA (79 er in 220.1 ip) in 33 starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 22 starts at night...his day ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings and is the lowest since Tim Hudson had a 1.39 ERA in 2003.

AGAINST THE WEST: Went 8-3 against AL West competition, 6-4 against everyone else...is now 20-8 with a 2.46 ERA (68 er in 248.1 ip) in 37 career games against the West compared to 13-12 with a 3.30 ERA (89 er in 242.2 ip) in 39 games against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Logged a 2-1 record and a 1.69 ERA in three interleague starts...ranked sixth in the majors in interleague ERA...was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 29-2 in 43 career starts with run support of three or more...the A's bullpen blew a save in six of his starts.

MORE FROM 2015: Was the A's Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season and became the first A's pitcher to start consecutive openers since Barry Zito in 2005 and 2006...combined with Scribner on a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Texas...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit to become the first pitcher to toss eight or more innings and allow one hit or fewer in an opener since Bob Lemon one-hit the White Sox for Cleveland in 1953...tossed a shutout in his final start of 2014 and had a career-high 20.0-inning scoreless streak from Sept. 23, 2014 to April 11, 2015...struck out 10 in 6.2 shutout innings in a 7-1 win at Texas May 3...it was his second career game with 10 or more strikeouts...struck out nine batters in each of his next two starts, giving him three consecutive starts with nine or more strikeouts...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 44 years...was charged with his first loss May 13 against Boston after starting the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...finished May 3-2 with a 1.67 ERA in six starts, his second consecutive month with an ERA under 2.00 and the third of his career...ranked third in the AL in May ERA...had 41 strikeouts, which tied for third most in Oakland history in May...it was his first month with 40 or more strikeouts...was named to his first AL All-Star team after placing third in player voting among starting pitchers...elected not to be active in the game as he pitched in the Sunday before the game at Cleveland...tossed a two-hit, 2-0 shutout against the Indians July 12...it was his third career complete game, all of which have been shutouts, and his second two-hitter...tossed his fourth career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in a 2-0 win at Los Angeles (NL) July 28...singled in the eighth inning off Pedro Baez for his first Major League hit...added complete game number five two starts later, a five-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Houston Aug. 7 in Oakland...it was his first complete game in the Coliseum and it gave him three complete games over a six-start stretch...it ran his record to 12-4 with a 2.06 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in 23 starts...missed his next start due to back spasms and went 2-3 with a 5.05 ERA and .277 opponents average over his final eight starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Kendall Graveman (6-9, 4.05 ERA): Is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the 22nd of his career, all of which have come with the A's...lost each of his final five decisions of the 2015 season and the losing streak is the longest of his career...compiled a 5.82 ERA (25 er in 38.2 ip) and .294 (47-for-160) opponents batting average over that eight start stretch...his last win came on July 4, 2015 against Seattle...went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, this spring...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2)...has never faced the White Sox in his career...the rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's last year before his season ended when he was placed on the disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique.

- The A's bullpen compiled a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
- Ranked last in the majors in saves (28) and save percentage (52.8%)... placed second in the AL in blown saves (25)...the save percentage was third lowest in Oakland history, the saves tied for fifth fewest in a non-strike season and were the fewest since 1982 (22), and the blown saves tied for third.
- Allowed 74 home runs, which was second most in the majors to Boston (76) and second most in Athletics history (92, 1964 Kansas City A's)... had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.428).
- Allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage in the majors.
- Had the highest opponents slugging percentage in the majors against first batters faced (.469) and the most RBI (68)...had the highest first-batter batting average in the AL (.272), the second fewest walks (26) and third most home runs (19).

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list Saturday retroactive to March 25 after undergoing surgery on his right elbow March 29...the surgery included a debridement of the right elbow and the removal of loose bodies.

Last Year: Had four stints with the A's and posted a 9.90 ERA in 21 relief appearances...struck out 23 in 20.0 innings but also walked 13 and allowed seven home runs...also went 3-3 with five saves and a 4.11 ERA in 31 games with Nashville.
