OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-2) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (2-1)

THURSDAY, APRIL 7, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (6-9, 4.05) VS. RHP MAT LATOS (4-10, 4.95) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won their first game of the season last night after losing each of the first two contests...have started the season 1-2 for the fifth time in the last six years (were 2-1 last year)...are 1-2 on this season-opening four-game homestand against Chicago (AL)...leave following the game today for a three-game road trip to Seattle before returning home for a six-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Kansas City...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's have started the season by playing three consecutive one-run games for the second time in Oakland history (also 1972) and sixth time in Athletics history (1905, 1913, 1919, 1949)...have never started the season with four straight one-run decisions...the A's and White Sox are the only American League teams with more than one one-run game...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have gone errorless in the last two games after committing two errors in the opener...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...this series with the White Sox marks the A's 36th consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League ... it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpass-ing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams... ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years (the Lambo/ Doubront move on Monday is officially in-season)...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers... eight players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oak-

land debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years (now 29.24 with Lambo replacing Doubront)...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16... Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old... Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth on Monday (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker is on the 60-day DL... the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's trail in the season series, 1-2...snapped a six-game Coliseum losing streak to the White Sox last night, which was Oakland's longest home losing streak to Chicago since Aug. 3, 1989 to Sept. 18, 1990 when they also dropped six straight...lost the season series last year, 2-5...were swept in a three-game series in Oakland and split a four-game series in Chicago...it marked the second consecutive season the A's have lost the season series...have lost 11 of their last 15 games to the White Sox...have won just one season series over the previous five years and are 18-22 against Chicago since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 301-283 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-136 in Oakland and 142-147 in Chicago...including 60-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 978-1038 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has 299 career stolen bases and needs one more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals...**Jed Lowrie** is the ninth player in Oakland history to drive in at least one run in each of the A's first three games (last: Jermaine Dye in 2004)...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his first two games and now has a 14-game, 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year...**Marcus Semien** has reached base in each of his first three games and now has a 26game reaching base streak dating back to last year, which is the longest of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Ernie Young starts the sixth triple play in Oakland history with a spectacular catch against Detroit in Las Vegas...after slamming into the wall to catch a Bobby Higginson fly ball, his return throw doubled up Alan Trammell and Chad Curtis.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-9, 4.05 ERA in 2015)

FOR STARTERS: Is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the 22nd of his career, all of which have come with the A's...made his Major League debut with five relief appearances for Toronto in 2014...was one of four players traded to the A's for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Lost each of his final five decisions of the 2015 season and the losing streak is the longest of his career...compiled a 5.82 ERA (25 er in 38.2 ip) and .294 (47-for-160) opponents batting average over that eight start stretch...his last win came on July 4, 2015 against Seattle...the last A's pitcher to lose more than five consecutive games is Tyson Ross, who had an eight-game losing streak from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA in six games, including five starts...allowed a .253 (25-for-99) opponents batting average...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2)...allowed three runs in 12.0 innings over his last two starts (3.00 ERA) after surrendering 12 runs in 14.2 innings over his first four games (11 er, 6.75 ERA).

2015 RECAP: The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .275 (61-for-222) against lefties and .278 (65-for-234) against righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties but issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...had a .369 slugging percentage against lefties, .474 against righties...opponents hit .271 with the bases empty, .285 with runners on...10 of the 15 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .356 average against the opponents three, four and five hitters compared to .233 against all other hitters...had a .235 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .289 the second time and .317 after that.

THIS AND THAT: Was 4-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 11 starts at night, 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 10 starts during the day...was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more... walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his first Major League start April 9 against Texas...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss...yielded a career-high eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)... picked up the first win of his career in his next start April 14 at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eighthit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...was 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA over his first four starts when he was optioned to Nashville April 26...returned to Oakland May 23 and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay... tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a six-start streak from June 7 to July 4 where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a

rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20. 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak... began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win...the other was Orlando Pena for the 1963 Kansas City A's (May 5-15)...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth big league start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven on a career-high 111 pitches...had a careerhigh three-game winning streak from June 24 to July 4...allowed just two earned runs during that three-start stretch for a 0.86 ERA...tossed seven shutout innings in back-to-back starts June 29 against Colorado and July 4 against Seattle as part of a career-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak from June 24 to July 10...finished the month of June with a 3-2 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in the month...was tagged with the loss July 10 at Cleveland to begin a season-ending and career-high five-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over that stretch...tossed just 1.1 innings in a 4-3 loss at San Francisco July 26, which was the shortest outing of his career as a starter...spun 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision in his final start Aug. 23 against Tampa Bay...was placed on the disabled list with a strained left oblique the next day

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-0, 10.80 ERA): Will be selected from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making his A's debut...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring... went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2, the final day of the spring...led the A's with 19 strikeouts... surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...this will be the eighth start of his career, his first since 2013 with San Francisco...is 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (1.2 ip, 0 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 0 so) in five career appearances against Seattle, all in relief in 2014...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Charlotte in the White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers on July 6 against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

0-1, 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 1-for-1 (100.0%)

- The A's bullpen compiled a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
- Ranked last in the majors in saves (28) and save percentage (52.8%)... placed second in the AL in blown saves (25)...the save percentage was third lowest in Oakland history, the saves tied for fifth fewest in a nonstrike season and were the fewest since 1982 (22), and the blown saves tied for third.
- Allowed 74 home runs, which was second most in the majors to Boston (76) and second most in Athletics history (92, 1964 Kansas City A's)...
- had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.428). Allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage in the majors.
- Had the highest opponents slugging percentage in the majors against first batters faced (.469) and the most RBI (68)...had the highest firstbatter batting average in the AL (.272), the second fewest walks (26) and third most home runs (19).
