CHICAGO WHITE SOX (2-1) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-2) RHP Mat Latos (NR) vs. RHP Kendall Graveman (NR) Game #4/Road #4 • Thursday, April 7, 2016

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox conclude a season-opening, four-game series this afternoon in Oakland ... RHP Mat Latos, who signed as a free agent on 2/8/16, makes his White Sox debut.
- The Sox have opened the season by winning two of the first three games from the A's, taking the first two by one run before dropping a one-run decision last night.
- Following today's game, the White Sox return to Chicago to open the home portion of their schedule with three games vs. Cleveland (4/8-10) before taking a six-game, seven-day trip to Minnesota (4/11-14) and Tampa Bay (4/15-17).
- The Sox have one off day in April (4/12) before playing a stretch of 19 consecutive games from 4/13-5/1 ... they play 17 of their first 27 games on the road and 33 of their first 42 outside the AL Central division.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are looking to win consecutive series at The Coliseum for the first time since 2008-09.
- Chicago has opened the season with three consecutive one-run games for the first time since 1972.
- Adam Eaton has reached base safely in 25 consecutive games dating back to 9/9/15, hitting .396 (40-101) with a .470 on-base percentage and a 1.004 OPS.
- RHP Mat Latos is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.1 IP) in two career games (one start) against Oakland.
- Robin Ventura has 299 victories as White Sox manager.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox were limited to six hits in a 2-1 loss to the A's.
- The Sox went 0-4 with RISP and left seven runners on base, including two in the eighth inning and one in the ninth, as their six-game winning streak in Oakland came to an end.
- Carlos Rodon suffered the loss despite allowing two runs on seven hits over 7.0 IP ... Rodon owns a 1.90 ERA (13 ER/61.2 IP) over his last nine starts dating back to last season.
- Adam Eaton went 2-3 with a walk to become the first Sox player to open the season with three consecutive multihit games since Darrin Jackson in 1999.

LEADOFF MAN

- Adam Eaton has reached base safely in 25 consecutive games dating back to 9/9/15, hitting .396 (40-101) with a .470 on-base percentage and a 1.004 OPS.
- Eaton also owns a 12-game hitting streak (.457, 21-46) dating back to 9/24/15 and has reached base safely nine times this season, going 7-11 (.636) with a walk and HBP.

HOME OPENER PREVIEW

- The White Sox home opener tomorrow vs. Cleveland (3:10 p.m. CT) is sold out ... the Sox are 62-53 all-time in home openers and have won 12 of their last 14.
- John Rzeznik, lead singer of the Goo Goo Dolls, will perform the National Anthem on Friday, while local music artist Chance The Rapper will throw out a ceremonial first pitch.
- The Sox also will debut an 8,000 square foot video board in center field, four times bigger than the one used from 2003-15.

HOW THE WEST WAS WON

- The White Sox have gone 23-13 (.639) vs. the American League West since 2015, the second-best winning percentage in the major leagues behind San Francisco (.650).
- Sox pitchers have recorded a 3.31 ERA (123 ER/334.1 IP) and have made 28 quality starts in 36 games.
- Chicago's three-game sweep on 5/15-17/15 at Oakland was its first at The Coliseum since 5/16-18/97.

SPRING RECAP

- The White Sox went 17-13-1 in spring training, concluding with a pair of wins at San Diego from 4/1-2.
- The Sox finished with a winning record in spring training for the first time since 2004 (15-13-1), and the 17 wins were their most since 2003 (also 17).
- Chicago led the major leagues with 51 home runs, its most during spring training since at least 1980.

ROSTER QUICK FACTS

- The White Sox 25-man roster includes 12 pitchers (six lefties), two catchers, six infielders and five outfielders.
- SS Jimmy Rollins (37) is the oldest player, LHP Carlos Rodon (23) is the youngest, and LHP John Danks (2007-) is the longest tenured, followed by LHP Chris Sale (2010-).
- The White Sox began the season with no players on the disabled list (four in 2015) and no rookies (two in 2015).

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox lead the season series, 2-1, with all three games decided by one run.
- The Sox have won 13 of their last 19 games overall against the A's, including six of their last seven at The Coliseum after losing the previous seven.
- Chicago went 5-2 against Oakland last season (3-0 at The Coliseum) and have won back-to-back season series (2014-15) against the A's for the first time since 1993-95.
- The White Sox trail the all-time series, 283-301 ... they are 147-142 at home (88-82 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 136-159 on the road.

FAMILIAR FACES

- This series marks the return of shortstop Jimmy Rollins and coaches Todd Steverson and Greg Sparks to the Bay Area.
- Rollins graduated in 1996 from Encinal High School in Alameda and was selected by Philadelphia in the second round of the 1996 draft.
- Steverson worked nine seasons in the Oakland organization, including two as the A's first base coach and two as the minor-league hitting coordinator.
- Sparks spent 19 seasons (1997-2015) in the Athletics organization, including nine as the minor-league hitting coordinator.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

- The White Sox have made 1,159 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, the second-highest total in the major leagues behind the Mets (1,164).
- The Sox led the American League with 98 quality starts in 2015, their highest total since 2003 (also 98) ... Jose Quintana (2nd, 25) and Chris Sale (5th, 23) ranked second and fifth in the AL in 2015.

ABREU IN ELITE COMPANY

- Jose Abreu (2014-15) and Albert Pujols (2001-02) are the only players in major-league history to record 30-plus home runs and 100-plus RBI in each of his first two seasons.
- Abreu batted .290 with 30 homers and 101 RBI last season after hitting .317 with 36 and 107 as a rookie in 2014.
- Pujols accomplished the feat in each of his first 10 seasons before the streak ended in 2011.

HONORING EDDIE

- The White Sox mourn the loss of sports broadcasting legend and long-time club executive Eddie Einhorn, who passed away on 2/23/16 from complications involving a stroke.
- Einhorn, who was 80 years old, served as vice chairman of the White Sox for 25 years and was the team's president and chief operating officer from 1981-90 ... he also was a member of the Chicago Bulls board of directors.
- The Sox will honor Einhorn by wearing an "Eddie" patch on their uniform sleeve during the 2016 regular season.

AT THE HELM

- Robin Ventura is in his fifth season as White Sox manager ... owns a 299-352 (.459) record, including a 76-86 mark in 2015.
- Ventura has managed 651 games with the Sox, 10th-most in franchise history ... was a finalist for American League Manager of the Year in 2012.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Melky Cabrera:** 65 hits for 1,500 ... 28 doubles for 300.
- **John Danks:** Seven starts to tie Richard Dotson for 10th in Sox history (250) ... 19.0 IP for 1,500 ... 12 strikeouts to tie Gary Peters for sixth in Sox history (1,098).
- **Austin Jackson:** Three triples for 50 ... 72 hits for 300.
- **Mat Latos:** 41 strikeouts for 1,000.
- **Brett Lawrie:** Three games for 500 ... seven hits for 500 ... 10 doubles for 100.
- **David Robertson:** 36 games for 500 ... 17 saves for 100.
- **Jimmy Rollins:** 76 hits for 2,500.
- **Chris Sale:** 3 games for 200 ... 48 strikeouts to tie Doc White for 9th in Sox history (1,067).

ON DECK: CLEVELAND INDIANS

- The White Sox open a three-game homestand tomorrow vs. Cleveland (3:10 p.m. CT) ... LHP John Danks (7-15, 4.71 in 2015) is scheduled to start tomorrow's home opener.
- Danks is 5-14 with a 5.29 ERA (87 ER/148.0 IP) in 26 career starts against the Indians ... Jose Abreu is a .312 (43-138) hitter with 11 home runs and 25 RBI in 35 career games vs. Cleveland.
- The Sox won the 2015 series, 10-9, going 4-6 at U.S. Cellular Field and 6-3 in Cleveland.

LATOS AT A GLANCE

- The 28-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 2016 debut ... is in his eighth major-league season, and first with the White Sox.
- Owns a 1-0 record with 9.1 scoreless IP in two career appearances (one start) against Oakland.
- Is looking for his first win since 7/21/15 at Arizona with Miami ... was 0-4 with a 6.09 ERA (23 ER/34.0 IP) and six homers allowed in his final nine games (six starts) of 2015 between the Marlins, Dodgers and Angels.
- Is making his 175th career start and needs 41 strikeouts to reach 1,000 in his career ... only three of his 959 career strikeouts have come while pitching for an American League club (Angels in 2015).
- Made just 40 appearances (37 starts) from 2014-15 due to surgery on his left knee (3/21-6/14/14) and left knee inflammation (5/22-6/13/15).
- Finished eighth in National League Cy Young Award voting in 2010 after going 14-10 with a 2.92 ERA (60 ER/184.2 IP), 189 strikeouts and a career-best 9.2 strikeouts per 9.0 IP.
- Signed a one-year, \$3-million contract on 2/9/16.

2016 SPRING RECAP

- Posted a 10.38 ERA (15 ER/13.0 IP) and nine strikeouts in three spring training starts.
- Allowed three runs on five hits in 4.1 IP (3 BB, 3 SO) at San Diego in his final start on 4/1.
- Made his CL debut on 3/22 vs. San Francisco after pitching exclusively in B-games during the first half of the spring.

2015 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Combined to go 4-10 with a 4.95 ERA (64 ER/116.1 IP), 100 strikeouts, and a .267 (120-450) opponents average over 24 appearances (21 starts) between Miami, Los Angeles-NL and Los Angeles-AL.
- Began the season with Miami, posting a 4-7 record and 4.48 ERA (44 ER/88.1 IP) in 16 starts.
- Was traded by the Marlins with pitcher Luis Avilan and infielder Michael Morse to the Dodgers in exchange for pitchers Victor Araujo, Jeff Brigham and Kevin Guzman on 7/30.
- Made six appearances (five starts) with Los Angeles-NL, going 0-3 with a 6.66 ERA (18 ER/24.1 IP) before being designated for assignment on 9/17 and released on 9/25 ... signed by the Angels on 9/28 and appeared in two games, yielding two runs in 3.2 IP.
- Went 1-2 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER/20.0 IP), 19 strikeouts and a .159 (11-69) opponents average in three July starts.

STELLAR STRETCH

- Went 51-35 with a 3.27 ERA (290 ER/799.0 IP), four complete games, one shutout and 746 strikeouts over 127 starts (80 quality) from 2010-13 with San Diego and Cincinnati.
- Ranked among the National League leaders in opp. average (3rd, .232), strikeouts (5th) and wins (8th).
- Made 30-plus starts and struck 185 or more four times during the four-season stretch ... won 14 games three times and threw 200.0-plus IP twice.

ROAD SWEET ROAD?

- Was 2-5 with a 3.90 ERA (25 ER/57.2 IP), a .259 opponents average (57-220) and .729 opponents OPS over 11 road games (10 starts) in 2015 compared to a 2-5 record with a 5.98 ERA (39 ER/58.2 IP) in 13 games (11 starts) at home.
- Has gone 34-25 with a 3.42 ERA (198 ER/521.1 IP) in 86 games (84 starts) at his home ballpark compared to 30-30 with a 3.60 ERA (219 ER/547.0 IP) in 91 games (90 starts) on the road.
- Owns a lifetime 8.29 SO/9.0 IP mark (504 strikeouts) on the road compared to 7.85 (455 SO) at home.

APRIL SHOWERS

- Is 4-11 with a 4.74 ERA (69 ER/131.0 IP), 110 strikeouts, a .275 (141-513) opponents average and .792 opponents OPS in April.
- Has made his first start of the season in April five times (2010-13, 2015), going 0-3 with a 7.88 ERA (21 ER/24.0 IP) and 23 strikeouts in those outings (79.4 pitches per start).
- Went 0-3 with a 6.86 ERA (16 ER/21.0 IP), 17 strikeouts, nine walks, a .326 (28-86) opponents average, and .897 opponents OPS in April 2015.

LIMITED OPPORTUNITIES TO STRIKE

- Ranks among the major-league leaders in opponents average (15th, .237), opponents OPS (T15th, .665), opponents BABIP (16th, .286) and opponents OBP (18th, .294) since 2009.
- Has held the opposition to a .241 (362-1500) average with runners on base in his career, including a .238 mark (197-827) with RISP.
- Opponents are hitting just .221 (85-385) with RISP/two outs.

VS. AMERICAN LEAGUE WEST

- Is 3-3 with a 3.31 ERA (20 ER/54.1 IP), 49 strikeouts, .239 opponents average (49-205) and .695 opponents OPS in 10 career games (eight starts) vs. the American League West.
- Allowed two runs on two hits (two homers) over 1.2 IP in relief in his last appearance on 10/3/15 at Texas.
- Received a no decision in his last start vs. the division on 8/2/15 vs. the Angels, allowing one run on four hits over 6.0 IP.

VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- Is scheduled to make his third career appearance (second start) against the Athletics and first at the Oakland Coliseum ... is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.1 scoreless IP) and five strikeouts lifetime.
- Threw 2.0 scoreless IP in his last outing on 9/29/15 in relief at home with the Angels.
- Won his only start on 8/6/13 at the Great American Ball Park with Cincinnati, tossing 7.1 scoreless IP.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- LHP John Danks is scheduled to make his first start of the season in tomorrow's home opener vs. Cleveland ... went 7-15 with a 4.71 ERA (93 ER/177.2 IP) and 124 strikeouts in 30 starts last season.
- Was 5-2 with a 5.40 ERA (19 ER/31.2 IP) and 28 strikeouts in seven spring starts this year ... his five spring training wins led the majors.
- Ranks seventh in franchise history with 1,086 strikeouts ... is 12 shy of tying Gary Peters for sixth.
- Is 5-14 with a 5.29 ERA (87 ER/148.0 IP) and 104 strikeouts in 26 career starts against Cleveland ... has gone 1-8 with a 6.41 ERA (47 ER/66.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts in 12 lifetime starts vs. Cleveland at U.S. Cellular Field.
