OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-3) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (2-1)

FRIDAY, APRIL 8, 2016 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT LHP ERIC SURKAMP (0-0, 10.80 IN 2015) VS. RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (11-8, 4.56 IN 2015) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Began the season by losing by losing three of four to the White Sox in Oakland...last started the season 1-3 in 2012...went 2-2 over the first four games in each of the previous three seasons...begin their first road trip of the season tonight with this three-game series at Seattle...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homes-tand against Los Angeles (AL) and Kansas City...the A's are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home before playing 19 of their next 25 on the road...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Champion-ships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 0-for-8 with three strikeouts to start the season...the eight plate appearances are second most in the majors to Arizona (12)...last year, A's pinch hitters batted .248 with an American League leading 19 walks...ranked second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (158).

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's started the season by playing three consecutive one-run games for the second time in Oakland history (also 1972) and sixth time in Athletics history (1905, 1913, 1919, 1949)...went 1-2 in those three games and are tied with the White Sox for the most one-run decisions in the majors...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their second two-error game of the season yesterday and now have four errors for the season, which ties Miami and St. Louis for the most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpass-ing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams... ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...eight players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Ath-

letic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902... Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old...Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth on Monday (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years as they went 6-13 against the Mariners...the only times Oakland lost more games against Seattle were in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...went 3-7 in Oakland and 3-6 in Seattle...eight of the A's 13 losses were by one run...16 of the A's 23 losses over the previous two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 44-51 against Seattle over the previous five years...all-time, the A's are 327-258 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 147-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 71-79 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has 299 career stolen bases and needs one more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his first two games and now has a 14-game, 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year...**Marcus Semien** has reached base in each of his first four games and now has a 27-game reaching base streak dating back to last year, which is the longest of his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** the A's and the Phillies meet in a City Series game before 15,000 fans at Shibe Park for the first legal Sunday baseball game ever played in Philadelphia...in **1982** Rickey Henderson ties a club record with five walks but the A's lose to California 8-6 in 16 innings...in **2003** Barry Zito extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 2-1 win at Texas, the fifth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...in **2006** Zito combines with the A's bullpen on a one-hit shutout in a 3-0 win at Seattle after the A's pitching staff tosses a two-hit shutout against the Mariners the night before...the three hits allowed in consecutive games sets an Oakland record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-0, 10.80 ERA in 2015)

FOR OPENERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his A's debut...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...was with the A's the entire spring before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2, the final day of the spring...this will be the eighth start of his career, his first since 2013 with San Francisco...also made six starts for the Giants in 2011...it will be his 44th career appearance overall...the A's are his fourth team in five seasons in the majors (San Francisco, 2011 and 2013; Chicago-AL, 2014; Los Angeles-NL 2015).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings... opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing last Saturday against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring.

SURKAMP vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (1.2 ip, 0 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 0 so) in five career appearances, all in relief in 2014...made three appearances at Safeco Field (1.1 ip, 1 bb) and two at U.S. Cellular Field for the White Sox (0.1 ip, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...his last outing was on Aug. 10, 2014 at Seattle...entered the game in the seventh inning with one out and a runner on second and the White Sox trailing 4-0...got Ackley to line out and then intentionally walked Cano before he was relieved...the win came a day earlier against the Mariners when he got the final two outs in the bottom of the ninth inning in a game the White Sox would win 2-1 in 10 innings.

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day.

MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 (73-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (43-for-141) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs.

SPLITS: Was 7-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 18 games before the Triple-AAII-Star Break, 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts after the break...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in his 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...stranded both of his inherited runners.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-for-16 (.188) with a double, three RBI, three walks and seven strikeouts as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in each of his 11 relief appearances, including two or more eight times...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

MORE FROM THE MINORS: Began the season on the disabled list with Chicago with a right ribcage muscle strain...was reinstated April 11 and

immediately optioned to Charlotte...had a 1.35 ERA in six home games with the Knights compared to 4.38 on the road...was designated for assignment April 26 and outrighted April 27...struck out a season-high seven batters in 5.0 innings in his only start with Charlotte on May 8 at Toledo... logged 3.0 perfect innings of relief against Syracuse May 16 for the win...it matched his longest outing as a reliever (May 3 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre)...was traded to the Dodgers organization May 22 for pitcher Blake Smith and was assigned to Oklahoma City...his nine wins tied for third most in the PCL beginning May 22 and his 3.57 ERA ranked ninth...was 5-1 with a 3.00 ERA in nine games at home, 4-2 with a 4.34 ERA in seven starts on the road...surrendered just one home run in 51.0 innings at home compared to seven in 37.1 innings on the road...lost each of his first two starts with Oklahoma City (12.00 ERA), his only losing streak of the season...including June 1 against Fresno when he walked a season-high five batters in 3.0 innings...went 9-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his final 14 games... was 4-0 with a 2.89 ERA over a five-start stretch from June 8 to 30... tossed his only complete game of the season June 15 at Colorado Springs, a seven-hitter in a 5-2 win that was called after six innings due to rain... walked one and struck out a season-high tying seven ...made his only relief appearance with Oklahoma City June 20 against Memphis (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 so)...went 4-1 with a 4.06 ERA in six games, including five starts, in June...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.1 innings July 28 at Memphis and took the loss...pitched 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit and one walk Aug. 17 against Tacoma, but had a no decision in a 2-1 win...that was part of a season-best 15.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 2 to 17...was perfect 4-0 with a 1.86 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in five starts in August...also won his only start in September, tossing a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings on the 2nd against lowa, and finished the season with a five-game winning streak over his final six starts (2.19 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Rich Hill (0-1, 6.75 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season, his sixth in the last seven years and the 76th of his career... was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...made his first career Opening Day start last Monday against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss (2.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.86 ERA (19.1 ip, 14 h, 4 r, 4 er, 8 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including two starts, against Seattle...went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20.

- The A's bullpen allowed four runs in 3.2 innings yesterday after yielding just one run in its first three games and 12.0 innings (0.75 ERA).
- Has not walked a batter in 15.2 innings and has struck out 12.
- Had a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
- Ranked last in the majors in saves (28) and save percentage (52.8%)... placed second in the AL in blown saves (25)...the save percentage was third lowest in Oakland history, the saves tied for fifth fewest in a nonstrike season and were the fewest since 1982 (22) and the blown saves tied for third.
- Allowed 74 home runs, which was second most in the majors to Boston (76) and second most in Athletics history (92, 1964 Kansas City A's)... had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.428).
- Allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage in the majors.
- Had the highest opponents slugging percentage in the majors against first batters faced (.469) and the most RBI (68).
