### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-3) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (2-2)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Began the season by losing by losing three of four to the White Sox in Oakland before taking the series opener in Seattle last night to begin their first road trip of the season...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Kansas City...the A's are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home before playing 19 of their next 25 on the road...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 0-for-8 with three strikeouts to start the season...the eight plate appearances are the most in the American League...last year, A's pinch hitters batted .248 with an American League leading 19 walks...ranked second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (158).

**ONE-RUN GAMES:** The A's started the season by playing three consecutive one-run games for the second time in Oakland history (also 1972) and sixth time in Athletics history (1905, 1913, 1919, 1949)...four of their first five games have been decided by one run (2-2)...have played in the most one-run games in the Majors and are tied for the most one-run wins in the majors...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their third two-error game of the season yesterday and now have six errors for the season, which ties St. Louis for the most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpassing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium, 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...eight players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

**TENURE:** Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Ath-

letic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oakland debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

**ROOKIE AND VETERANS:** The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

**THE YOUNG AND THE OLD:** The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old...Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth on Monday (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years as they went 6-13 against the Mariners...the only times Oakland lost more games against Seattle were in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...went 3-7 in Oakland and 3-6 in Seattle...eight of the A's 13 losses were by one run...16 of the A's 23 losses over the previous two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 45-51 against Seattle over the previous five years...all-time, the A's are 328-258 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 148-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 72-79 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** has 299 career stolen bases and needs one more to become one of nine active players with 300 career steals...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his first three games and now has a 15-game, 14.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year...the **A's bullpen** has 16 strikeouts and just one walk in 20.1 ip to start the season, which is the best ratio in the American League...lead the majors in innings pitched.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1974** Joe Rudi ties an Oakland record with three doubles as the A's defeat Kansas City 6-4...in **2004** the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 8-6 win over Seattle...in **2008** Fernando Hernandez becomes the first reliever in Oakland history to record a win in his Major League debut when he pitches a scoreless eighth inning in the A's 6-3 win at Toronto.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (0-1, 6.75 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season, his sixth in the last seven years and the 76th of his career...was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...the A's are his seventh team and this is his 12th season in the majors...made 70 of his starts in his first five seasons with Chicago-NL (2005-08) and Baltimore (2009)...pitched exclusively in relief from 2010-14 before making four starts with Boston last year.

**LAST START:** Made his first career Opening Day start last Monday against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

**HILL vs. SEATTLE:** Is 2-0 with a 1.86 ERA (19.1 ip, 14 h, 4 r, 4 er, 8 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in nine career appearances, including two starts...that includes 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.0 ip) in four games, one start, at Safeco Field and 0-0 with a 3.48 ERA (4 er in 10.1 ip) in five games, one start, in his home ballpark...is 1-0 with a 1.98 ERA (3 er in 13.2 ip) in his two starts...last faced the Mariners on July 22, 2013 at Seattle when he tossed a scoreless seventh inning in a 2-1 Indians loss (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 so)...his last start came on June 1, 2009 at Seattle...combined with Jim Johnson and George Sherill on a two-hit, 1-0 shutout...tossed seven innings and allowed both of the hits (Suzuki lead off double in first, Betancourt one-out single in the third) for the win.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25...issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)...opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

**2015 RECAP:** Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20...has 99 strikeouts in 75.2 innings over the last three years (11.78 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 (11-for-80) with both of his home runs against right-handed hitters compared to .158 (3-for-19) against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...had a .242 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .091 after that.

**WITH BOSTON:** Was selected by Boston Sept. 8 and made his first start Sept. 13 at Tampa Bay...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out 10, but had a no decision in a 2-0 Red Sox win...it was his first start since July 27, 2009 against Kansas City...joined Hideo Nomo (no-hitter, April 4, 2001) as the only pitchers in the last 100 years with 10 or more strikeouts and one hit or fewer in their first career start as a Red Sox...picked up his first win in his second start Sept. 20 at Toronto...struck out 10 in 7.0 innings again and allowed three runs in a 4-3 decision...then tossed the Red Sox only complete game shutout of the season, a two-hitter in a 7-0 win over Baltimore Sept. 25 in his only start at Fenway...walked one and struck out 10...it was his third career complete game, his first since Sept. 22, 2006 at Cincinnati...it was his second career shutout (Sept. 16, 2006 against Cincinnati)...it came in his 200th career appearance...became the first pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in each of his first three starts with any American League team...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only pitcher since 1900 to make his season debut in September or later and record 10 or more strikeouts in each of his first three starts...is the fifth pitcher in Red Sox history to reach double-digits in strikeouts in at least three straight games...took the loss in his final start Oct. 1 at New York (AL)...tossed 6.0 innings to bring his career total to 500.0.

**MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 10.17 per nine innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .206 opponents batting average, including .190 (26-for-137) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handers...yielded a .171 average to batters leading off an inning but issued 10 walks and hit two batters for a .358 on-base percentage.

**THIS AND THAT:** Allowed 9-of-23 (39.1%) inherited runners to score...tossed fewer than one inning in 13 of his 25 relief appearances with Syracuse and six or more innings in each of his five starts with Pawtucket...his longest outing as a reliever was 2.0 innings three times.

**MORE MINOR LEAGUES:** Compiled a 0.90 ERA in eight relief appearances in April and had a 1.10 ERA over his first 17 appearances through May 20...struck out two or more batters in eight of his first 10 games through May 4 (21 so in 13.0 ip)...tossed fewer than one inning in 11 of his 12 appearances from May 6 to June 3 (4 er in 6.0 ip, 6.00 ERA)...was on the disabled list from June 5 to 11 with a strained neck...pitched in just three games following his return (2 er in 2.2 ip) before he was released June 24...allowed his only home run with Syracuse in his final outing June 19 against Buffalo...tossed 6.1 shutout innings for the win in his first start with Pawtucket Aug. 15 at Lehigh Valley...added 6.0 shutout innings in his third start Aug. 27 at Buffalo, giving him a 0.93 ERA over his first three starts...struck out a season-high nine batters in a season-high tying 7.0 innings for the win Sept. 1 against Lehigh Valley...allowed seven runs on 10 hits in 6.0 innings for the loss in his final Triple-A start Sept. 6 against Buffalo.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Chris Bassitt (0-0, 6.75 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 20th of his career...had a no decision in his first start, a 5-4 A's loss to Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA (17.1 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 12 bb, 7 so, 0 hr) in four career appearances against Seattle, including three starts, all last year...went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in five spring training starts...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...last year, he split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

Saves/Opportunities: 2-for-2 (100.0%)

- The A's bullpen allowed four runs in 3.2 innings Thursday but just one run in its other four games and 16.2 innings (0.54 ERA).
- Has walked one batter in 20.1 innings and has struck out 16.
- Had a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
- Ranked last in the majors in saves (28) and save percentage (52.8%)... placed second in the AL in blown saves (25)...the save percentage was third lowest in Oakland history, the saves tied for fifth fewest in a non-strike season and were the fewest since 1982 (22) and the blown saves tied for third.
- Allowed 74 home runs, which was second most in the majors to Boston (76) and second most in Athletics history (92, 1964 Kansas City A's)... had the second highest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.428).
- Allowed 88-of-257 (34.2%) inherited runners to score, which was the highest percentage in the majors.
- Had the highest opponents slugging percentage in the majors against first batters faced (.469) and the most RBI (68).

- Appeared in four games this spring and was 0-1 with 14.73 ERA in four relief appearances.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 retroactive to March 25 after undergoing surgery on his right elbow March 29...the surgery included a debridement of the right elbow and the removal of loose bodies...was transferred to the 60-day disabled list today.

Last Year: Had four stints with the A's and posted a 9.90 ERA in 21 relief appearances...struck out 23 in 20.0 innings but also walked 13 and allowed seven home runs...also went 3-3 with five saves and a 4.11 ERA in 31 games with Nashville.

- Begins his eighth season in the majors with his sixth team (Milwaukee, St. Louis, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Colorado).
- Is on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster (2011-13 with Milwaukee, 2014 with Cleveland, 2015 with Colorado).
- Did not allow a run in nine outings and 8.1 innings during the spring... opponents were 1-for-26 (.038)...however, issued six walks.
- Had two saves in four appearances against the Mariners in 2015 (4.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 1 hr, 4.50 ERA)...has not yielded a run in nine of 10 games in his career against Seattle (9.1 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 15so, 1 hr, 1.93 ERA).
- Signed as a free agent to a two-year contract, Dec. 11, 2015.
