OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-3) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (2-3)

SUNDAY, APRIL 10, 2016 — SAFECO FIELD — 1:10 P.M. PDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (0-0, 6.75) VS. RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (0-1, 1.50) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Began the season by losing by losing three of four to the White Sox in Oakland but have won the first two games of the current three-game series in Seattle...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Kansas City...the A's are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home before playing 19 of their next 25 on the road...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)... this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8690-9142 (.487) in their previous 115 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 0-for-8 with three strikeouts to start the season...the eight plate appearances are tied for the second most in the American League...last year, A's pinch hitters batted .248 with an American League leading 19 walks...ranked second in the AL in pinch plate appearances (158).

ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's started the season by playing three consecutive one-run games for the second time in Oakland history (also 1972) and sixth time in Athletics history (1905, 1913, 1919, 1949)...four of their first six games have been decided by one run (2-2)...are tied for the most one-run games and one-run wins in the Majors (San Francisco)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their third two-error game of the season Friday and now have six errors for the season, which is tied for second most in majors (St. Louis, 9)...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990, surpassing the previous high of 123 in 1997, 2000 and 2010...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...starting pitchers had a 6.81 ERA (83 er in 109.2 ip) compared to 5.64 (106 er in 169.0 ip) by relievers...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams... ranked fifth in most walks (106)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50)...the A's went 5-7-3 at Hohokam Stadium. 1-0 in Oakland and 6-10 on the road...this marks the third time in the last four springs the A's have played at least three tie games (13 ties total).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the eighth time in the last 10 years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...eight players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Burns, Butler, Canha, Graveman, Gray, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...eight other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Bassitt, Crisp, Doolittle, Doubront, Dull, Reddick, Rodriguez, Valencia), three were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only three played for Oakland prior to 2013...Coco Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...two players made their Oak-

land debut in 2012 (Doolittle, Reddick) and the other 22 first played for the A's in 2013 or later...Sean Doolittle has been with the A's organization the longest as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...Coco Crisp, who signed as a free agent Dec. 23, 2009, is next...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...five players had six or more years of service: Coco Crisp (12 years, 158 days), Ryan Madson (10 years, 155 days), Billy Butler (8 years, 102 days), Jed Lowrie (7 years, 111 days) and Rich Hill (6 years, 127 days).

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's have not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902... Marcus Semien (25 years, 200 days) was the only other player under the age of 26...there are 10 players that were at least 30 years old...Coco Crisp was the oldest at 36 years, 155 days...he is followed by Rich Hill (36 years, 24 days), Ryan Madson (35 years, 220 days) and John Axford (33 years, 3 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's began the season with five players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and added a sixth on Monday (Doubront)...began the season with eight players on the DL last year and seven the year before...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL....the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years as they went 6-13 against the Mariners...the only times Oakland lost more games against Seattle were in 2007 and 2009 when they lost 14...went 3-7 in Oakland and 3-6 in Seattle...eight of the A's 13 losses were by one run...16 of the A's 23 losses over the previous two years have been by two runs or fewer...are 46-51 against Seattle over the previous five years...all-time, the A's are 329-258 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 149-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 73-79 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp stole his 300th and 301st bases of his career last night...is now one of nine active players with 300 career steals...Ryan Madson has not allowed a run in his first three games and now has a 15-game, 14.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to last year...Ryan Dull has retired all 12 batters he's faced this season, including five via strikeout... the A's bullpen has 18 strikeouts and just two walks in 23.1 ip to start the season, which is tied for the best ratio in the American League...lead the majors in innings pitched.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 the Oakland A's play their first game, a 3-1 loss at Baltimore... John Donaldson collected the A's first hit, a second inning single, and Reggie Jackson hit the first home run, an eighth inning solo shot...in 1975 Mike Norris tossed a complete-game three-hit shutout in his Major League debut in the A's 9-0 win over Chicago...in 1990 Rickey Henderson draws his 1000th career walk in the fourth inning off Minnesota pitcher Roy Smith.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-0, 6.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 20th of his career...is on his first career Opening Day roster...went 1-8 with a 3.56 ERA in 18 games, 13 starts, with the A's last year after going 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA in six games, five starts, in his first season with the White Sox in 2014...was originally selected by Chicago in the 16th round of the 2011 draft and was one of four players traded to the A's in the Jeff Samardzija deal following the 2014 season.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...blanked the White Sox on three hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Frazier with two outs in the fifth inning...the A's came back with one run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Jackson in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 4-2.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA (17.1 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 12 bb, 7 so, 0 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, all last year...the relief appearance came on May 9 at Seattle (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...entered the game to

start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 6-1...walked the first batter before retiring the next three...then loaded the bases in the eighth inning on a single, walk and hit by pitch...was relieved by Abad who allowed one of the runs to score...then took the loss in a 2-1 decision in Oakland on July 5...the A's scored a run in the third inning and he blanked the Mariners on three hits and a walk over the first five innings...retired the first two batters in the sixth before hitting Cano and allowing a double to Cruz...Smith then followed with a two-run single...also lost at Seattle Aug. 26 in an 8-2 A's loss...yielded four runs, all in the first inning when the Mariners sent 10 men to the plate...allowed a RBI single to Cruz, a RBI double to Smith and back-to-back RBI singles to Trumbo and Morrison...did not allow a run over his final 3.1 innings...was relieved by Mujica with the bases loaded and one out in the fifth and Mujica escaped the jam...had a no decision in his fourth start, a 3-2 A's loss in the final game of the season at Seattle Oct. 4...the A's scored twice in the third and he allowed a Morrison sacrifice fly in the fourth and a Sucre RBI ground out in the sixth...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts... also pitched in a Triple-A game against the Cubs on the A's lone off day of the spring March 16...allowed a .263 (20-for-76) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a run in his first two starts (5.0 ip), allowed nine in his next two (10.1 ip, 7.84 ERA), and one in 4.0 innings in his final start.

2015 RECAP: Split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: His .111 winning percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started... it tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but was the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...the last Major League pitcher with at least 10 starts, an ERA under 3.75 and a winning percentage of .111 or less was Zane Smith, who went 1-13 (.071) with a 3.49 ERA in 48 games, including 17 starts, for the Braves and Expos in 1989...no American League pitcher has done it since 1968 when Rickey Clark (1-11, 3.53 ERA with California) and Fred Talbot (1-9, 3.36 ERA with New York) both did it.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and his season run support average as a starter was 2.15...his overall run support of 3.14 was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...has one run of support or fewer in 11 of his 19 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.47 (30 rs in 109.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .244 opponents batting average, including .217 (40-for-184) against lefties and .279 (38-for-136) against righties...issued 22 of his 30 walks to lefties...opponents hit .215 with two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-5 with a 2.28 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in nine games in Oakland, 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA and .274 opponents average in nine games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-8 with a 3.58 ERA and .258 opponents average in his 13 starts...had no decisions, a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents average in five relief appearances...walked 21 batters in 75.1 innings as a starter (2.51 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.62 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in the first inning compared to a 2.84 ERA and .214 opponents average from the second inning on...was 0-4 with a 5.21 ERA in 10 games against AL West competition, 1-4 with a 2.25 ERA in eight games against all other teams...the A's were 3-10 (.231) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts.

2015 WITH OAKLAND: Began the season at Nashville and was recalled by Oakland April 23...pitched exclusively in relief during his first stint and logged a 3.38 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed at least one run in three of those outings and walked two batters or more four times before he was optioned back to Nashville May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...was called up a third time July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the disabled list and allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in a no decision that day at Cleveland...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching...returned for good July 25 and went 1-6 with a 3.86 ERA over his final 10 starts...went 0-4 with a 3.00 ERA over his first five starts from June 30 to July 30...tossed at least five innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of those starts to become the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak...combined with Fernando Rodriguez and Fernando Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first and only win as an Athletic...struck out a career-high 10 batters and tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 6.2 innings Aug. 9 against Houston but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...did not allow a run over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings Aug. 15 at Baltimore but had a no decision in a 4-3 loss...then lost each of his next four starts to finish the season with a career-high tying four-game losing streak ..compiled a 6.08 ERA over that five-start stretch.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville... allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on...went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in eight games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road... was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in 10 starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-0, 1.29 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...started the A's third game of the season last Wednesday after being scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start a week ago today due to food poisoning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Chicago-AL (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 5 so)...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 8-1 with a 1.95 ERA in 11 career starts in the month...is 5-2 with a 3.18 ERA (70.2 ip, 54 h, 28 r, 25 er, 20 bb, 62 so, 5 hr) in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts, against Seattle...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...also started in a minor league game March 24...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA.
