OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-4) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (3-4)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 4-4...are in a tie for first place in the American League West with Texas and have held at least a share of first for three consecutive days...had nine days with at least a share of first last year, all over the first 12 games of the season...swept a three-game series in Seattle over the weekend...last year, the A's had just two sweeps of a series of three or more games all year (June 2-4 at Detroit, June 23-25 at Texas)...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on the second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Kansas City (three games)...including this series, the A's have now played 37 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...lost three of four to Chicago (AL) on the first homestand and are 1-4 at home...are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home...following Sunday's game against the Royals, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 contests on the road...went 3-0 on the first road trip of the season to Seattle, marking the third time in the last four years the A's have swept their first road series of the season (2013 at Houston, 2014 at Minnesota).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Five of the A's first eight games have been decided by one run and the A's are 3-2 in those games...lead the majors in one-run decisions and are tied with Kansas City for the most one-run wins...last year, the A's started the season 1-13 in one-run games and did not win their third one-run decision until May 28...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in four of the first eight games and have a 2.59 ERA, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.215) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.281) and slugging percentage (.322)...lead the AL in hit batters (6)...A's starting pitchers have a 3.07 ERA (15 er in 44.0 ip), which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have three two-error games this year and have committed seven errors overall, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...have turned nine double plays, which ranks second in the AL...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-0 when hitting a home run and 0-4 when going homerless...are one of four teams that has not allowed a run in the first inning (MIN, CLE, TOR)...rank ninth in the American League in batting (.229) but have the lowest on-base percentage (.276)...pinch hitters are 0-for-10 with three strikeouts to start the season...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively in three of the first eight games.

ROSTER NOTES: Only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...Doolittle and Reddick made their Oakland debuts in 2012...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's did not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics

history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Coco Crisp was the oldest player on the A's Opening Day roster at 36 years, 155 days...the A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...three of the 25 players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Sogard began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last night...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's hold club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night after losing the season series last year when they went 8-11 against the Angels...were 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...it marked the second consecutive season the A's lost the season series after winning each of the previous three...Oakland is 49-47 against Los Angeles since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-10 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 414-343 against the Angels...that includes 215-162 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 463-420 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chris Coghlan has started each of the A's last five games at five different positions (second base, right field, left field, third base, designated hitter)...last year, the A's did not have any players start at least one game at five different positions the entire season...the fifth inning triple by **Coco Crisp** last night was his 23rd as an Athletic, which ties him with Carney Lansford, Reggie Jackson and Billy North for fifth most in Oakland history...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his first four games (4.0 ip) and now has a 16-game, 15.0-inning regular season scoreless streak dating back to last year.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuff" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-1, 3.38 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 23rd of his career, all of which have come with the A's...made his Major League debut with five relief appearances for Toronto in 2014...was one of four players traded to the A's for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season.

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Lost his first start of 2016 after losing each of his final five decisions of the 2015 season...the six-game losing streak is an on-going career high and the longest by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...has a 5.52 ERA (27 er in 44.0 ip) and .276 (50-for-181) opponents batting average during his losing streak, which spans nine starts...his last win came on July 4, 2015 against Seattle.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the score was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

GRAVEMAN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a 2.45 ERA (11.0 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both last year at Anaheim...the no decision came in the A's 6-3 win at Los Angeles April 20...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two in the bottom of the first on a two-run single by Freese...the A's then scored three runs in the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a Pujols RBI single in the bottom of the third...had a 5-3 lead when he walked the first two batters in the fourth inning...was relieved by Otero who stranded both runners and tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for the win...then tossed his first career complete game, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...allowed the only run of the game on a two-out home run to Pujols in the first inning...Wilson, Smith and Street combined to shutout the A's on two hits and four walks.

2015 RECAP: The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-0, 4.15 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Friday and made his A's debut with a start that night at Seattle...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (4.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2, the final day of the spring...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...has never faced the Angels in his career...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Charlotte in the White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers on July 6 against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so).

outs (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .275 (61-for-222) against lefties and .278 (65-for-234) against righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties but issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...had a .369 slugging percentage against lefties, .474 against righties...opponents hit .271 with the bases empty, .285 with runners on...10 of the 15 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .356 average against the opponents three, four and five hitters compared to .233 against all other hitters...had a .235 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .289 the second time and .317 after that.

THIS AND THAT: Was 4-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 11 starts at night, 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 10 starts during the day...was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his first Major League start April 9 against Texas...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss...yielded a career-high eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career in his next start April 14 at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...was 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA over his first four starts when he was optioned to Nashville April 26...returned to Oakland May 23 and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a six-start streak from June 7 to July 4 where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win...the other was Orlando Pena for the 1963 Kansas City A's (May 5-15)...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth big league start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven on a career-high 111 pitches...had a career-high three-game winning streak from June 24 to July 4...allowed just two earned runs during that three-start stretch for a 0.86 ERA...tossed seven shutout innings in back-to-back starts June 29 against Colorado and July 4 against Seattle as part of a career-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak from June 24 to July 10...finished the month of June with a 3-2 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in the month...was tagged with the loss July 10 at Cleveland to begin a season-ending five-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over that stretch...tossed just 1.1 innings in a 4-3 loss at San Francisco July 26, which was the shortest outing of his career as a starter...spun 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision in his final start Aug. 23 against Tampa Bay...was placed on the disabled list with a strained left oblique the next day.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in seven of its first eight games for a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip), which ranks fifth in the American League...that includes five games where it has not yielded a run.
- Has tossed 29.0 innings, which is the most in the majors, and allowed just two walks, which is second fewest (1, Chicago-NL)...also ranks second in walks per nine innings (0.62) and strikeouts per walk (11.50).
- Has inherited the most runners in the majors without allowing one to score (12)...is one of five ML bullpens not to allow an inherited runner to score.
- Is tied for second in the AL in wins (2) and saves (3) and ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.241) and slugging percentage (.269).
- Compiled a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the AL, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.
