LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the second game (1-0) of a 10-game road trip to **Oakland** (April 11-12; 1-0), **Minnesota** (April 15-17) and **Chicago White Sox** (April 18-21)...Angels are off on Thursday...Halos went 2-4 on season-opening home stand vs. **Chicago Cubs** (0-2) and **Texas Rangers** (2-2)...LAA has won two of last three games after a 1-4 start.

FAST FACT: Last night **Mike Trout** hit the 140th HR of his career to become one of just three players all-time to reach 140 HR & 100 SB prior to age-25 season (**Alex Rodriguez** and **Andruw Jones**).

KNOW THIS: **Huston Street** (317 career saves) is one save shy of matching **Rick Aguilera** (318) for 19th on all-time list. **Todd Jones** ranks 18th with 319 career saves.

HISTORY CLASS WITH ALBERT: **Albert Pujols** drove in career RBI #1,700 on Saturday, passing **Jim Thome** (1,699) for 24th all-time...He is one RBI shy of matching **Reggie Jackson** for 23rd - 1,702 RBIs)...Last night, he scored the 1,600th run of his career- just 49th player in MLB history to reach plateau.

WHERE'S THE BEEF? Angels have been held to four runs or fewer in each of seven games to start the season - first time the franchise has ever gone a week into a campaign without scoring at least five.

FROM STATS LLC: In eight career starts against A.L. West foes, **Nick Tropeano** is now 5-2 with a 2.62 ERA (44.2 IP – 13 ER)...**Craig Gentry's** .345 (30/87) career clip vs. Oakland leads all MLB actives (min. 75 AB).

MINOR FEAT: **Zach Houchins**, an Angels' third base prospect, homered for a fourth consecutive game Sunday to open the season with Inland Empire (A).

COMINGS & GOINGS: Yesterday, the Angels selected the contract of LHP **Greg Mahle** (sounds like 'O'Malley') and optioned RHP **A.J. Achter**. First appearance for **Mahle** will mark MLB debut...On Sunday, the Halos claimed RHP **Danny Reynolds** off waivers from Houston. **Reynolds**, who returns to the Angels organization, was optioned to double-A Arkansas.

WEAVER WINS: With his victory over the Rangers Sunday, **Jered Weaver** passed **Nolan Ryan** for sole possession of second place on the Club's all-time wins list with 139...Franchise record for wins is 165 held by **Chuck Finley**.

AT OAKLAND: Angels have won nine of last 12 games, including five of last six vs. A's...LAA claimed 2015 series 11-8 (5-4 on road)...**Halos have won 18 of last 25 matchups**...Since 2002, Angels (6) or Athletics (5) have won 11 of 14 A.L. West crowns.

UP NEXT – AT MINNESOTA: Halos claimed 2015 series 5-2 and are 12-2 in last 14 games vs. Minnesota...**Halos went 7-0 vs. Minnesota in 2014 (3-0 at home), first undefeated season series vs. Twins in club history**...Halos are 78-56 vs. Twins since 2000...**Angels have won 11 of last 13 season series vs. Twins.**

HEANEY ON DL: On Wednesday, the Angels placed LHP **Andrew Heaney** on the 15-day disabled list as the result of a flexor muscle strain...In a corresponding roster move, the Angels recalled RHP **Nick Tropeano** from Triple-A Salt Lake.

HARDWARE EVERYWHERE: During the home stand, several Angels were honored with awards from the 2015 campaign...On Thursday, **Andrelton Simmons** was presented with his **Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award**...On Friday, **Mike Trout** received his 2015 **Silver Slugger Award**...He has won the award in each of the last four seasons and joins Hall-of-Famer Mike Piazza as the only players to win a Silver Slugger in each of their first four full Major League seasons...On Saturday, **Kole Calhoun** was presented with his 2015 **RAWLINGS Gold Glove Award**...He is the first Angels player to win a Gold Glove since shortstop **Erick Aybar** in 2011.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR: The Angels roster features players from eight different countries and territories this season: United States, Cuba, Curacao, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico, South Korea and Venezuela.

NOTABLE DEBUT: **Ji-Man Choi** made his Major League debut on Tuesday night vs. Cubs, as a defensive substitute in left field in the 9th inning...**He became the first Korean-born player in Angels history.**

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** enters 2016 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (17 straight years with Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia A's) (STATS LLC)...Scioscia's current .546 (1,419-1180) winning percentage and 1,419 wins are both tops in franchise history...He ranks 24th on the all-time win list (61 victories behind **Earl Weaver** for 23rd).

FAST FACT: Just three players in Major League history have started their career with 25+ HR and 100+ runs scored in each of their first four MLB seasons (STATS LLC):
Joe DiMaggio (1936-39)
Albert Pujols (2001-04)
Mike Trout (2012-15)

WHO'S ON THIRD: **Yunel Escobar** became the Angels ninth different Opening Day starting third baseman since 2004...Escobar was acquired from the Washington Nationals on Dec. 10 in exchange for RHP **Trevor Gott**...Escobar finished the Spring with an American League leading .450 (27/60) batting average and did not strike out in his 65 plate appearances.

April 13

(2014) Angels became the first big-league club to have a 20-year-old (**Mike Trout**), a 30-year-old (**Albert Pujols**) and a 40-year-old (**Raul Ibanez**) hit back-to-back-to-back homers in ascending order by age; (1991) **Dave Winfield** hit three home runs at Minnesota and finished the day with 15 total bases, establishing a club record for total bases in a game.

- **DIVISION DOMINANCE:** In last 18 starts vs. A.L. West opponents, is 7-1 with a 2.42 ERA (104 IP – 28 ER)...Lone loss in that span came on August 31, 2015 at Oakland.
- **5K LAST SATURDAY:** On Saturday morning (April 9), Santiago helped welcome the crowd and assisted with distributing medals at the finish line at the Angels 5K & Fun Run benefiting the Angels Baseball Foundation.
