ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning three in a row...are 4-5 overall, which matches the A's worst nine game record over the last 15 years...dropped into third place with the loss last night after three consecutive days with at least a share of first...have one day in sole possession of first this year, two tied for first, one tied for second, one in third, two tied for third and two tied for fourth...swept a three-game series in Seattle over the weekend...last year, the A's had just two sweeps of a series of three or more games all year (June 2-4 at Detroit, June 23-25 at Texas)...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3975-3670 (.520) record over the previous 48 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on the second homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and Kansas City (three games)...lost three of four to Chicago (AL) on the first homestand and are 1-5 at home...that is the A's worst start at home since the 2001 club also went 1-5...went on to lose nine of the first 10 home games in 2001...have now lost 16 of their last 20 home games dating back to Sept. 1, 2015...including this series, the A's have now played 37 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home this year...following Sunday's game against the Royals, the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their next 25 contests on the road...went 3-0 on the first road trip of the season to Seattle, marking the third time in the last four years the A's have swept their first road series of the season (2013 at Houston, 2014 at Minnesota).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Six of the A's first nine games have been decided by one run and the A's are 3-3 in those games...lead the majors in one-run decisions, are tied for the lead in one-run losses and rank second in one-run wins (Kansas City, 4)...last year, the A's started the season 1-13 in one-run games and did not win their third one-run decision until May 28 (number four came on June 10)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 5-for-5 in stolen base attempts and are one of three American League teams without a caught stealing (Baltimore, Toronto)...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive games without a caught stealing matches the 2002 club for the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...the longest is a 23-game streak last year when the A's started the season 13-for-13...opponents have been successful in just 2-of-6 (33.3%) attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...A's pitchers are tied for the Major League lead with two pickoffs (Atlanta, Milwaukee).

PITCHING: The A's rank second in the American League in ERA (2.85), opponents batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.338) and third in on-base percentage (.288)...lead the league in hit batters (6)...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in three of the last four games (5 er in 25.1 ip, 1.78 ERA)...have a 2.88 ERA (16 er in 50.0 ip) for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have three two-error games this year and have committed seven errors overall, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...have turned 11 double plays, which ranks second in the AL (Texas, 13)...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are one of four teams that has not allowed a run in the first inning (Minnesota, Toronto, Cleveland)...rank ninth in the American League in batting (.227) but have the lowest on-base percentage

(.271)...pinch hitters are 0-for-11 with three strikeouts to start the season...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively in three of the first eight games.

ROSTER NOTES: Only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...Doolittle and Reddick made their Oakland debuts in 2012...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's did not have a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...Coco Crisp was the oldest player on the A's Opening Day roster at 36 years, 155 days...the A's had one rookie on the Opening Day roster (Ryan Dull), which is four fewer than last year but one more than 2014...three of the 25 players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Sogard began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton Monday night...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...the offense struck out 225 times, which was second fewest among CL teams...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors...hit 40 home runs, which was the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 (50).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost the first two games of 2016 and have now lost six of their last seven games against the Angels, including four straight in Oakland...lost the season series last year when they went 8-11 against the Angels...were 4-5 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...it marked the second consecutive season the A's lost the season series after winning each of the previous three...Oakland is 49-48 against Los Angeles since the start of the 2011 season...including 40-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 414-344 against the Angels...that includes 215-163 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 463-421 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The fifth inning triple by **Coco Crisp** Monday night was his 23rd as an Athletic, which ties him with Carney Lansford, Reggie Jackson and Billy North for fifth most in Oakland history...**Marcus Semien** had his second career two-homer game last night...each of his three home runs this year and 13 of his 26 career home runs have come with two strikes.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in **1994** the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-0, 4.15 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Friday and made his A's debut with a start that night at Seattle...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring... was with the A's the entire spring before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2, the final day of the spring...this will be the 45th appearance and his ninth start...made six starts for San Francisco in 2011 and one in 2013...the A's are his fourth team in five seasons in the majors (San Francisco, 2011 and 2013; Chicago-AL, 2014; Los Angeles-NL 2015).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle last Friday...it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...has not won as a starter since Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring.

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day.

MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 (73-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (43-for-141) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs.

SPLITS: Was 7-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 18 games before the Triple-A All-Star Break, 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts after the break...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in his 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...stranded both of his inherited runners.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-for-16 (.188) with a double, three RBI, three walks and seven strikeouts as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in each of his 11 relief appearances, including two or more eight times...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

MORE FROM THE MINORS: Began the season on the disabled list with Chicago with a right ribcage muscle strain...was reinstated April 11 and

immediately optioned to Charlotte...had a 1.35 ERA in six home games with the Knights compared to 4.38 on the road...was designated for assignment April 26 and outrighted April 27...struck out a season-high seven batters in 5.0 innings in his only start with Charlotte on May 8 at Toledo...logged 3.0 perfect innings of relief against Syracuse May 16 for the win...it matched his longest outing as a reliever (May 3 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre)...was traded to the Dodgers organization May 22 for pitcher Blake Smith and was assigned to Oklahoma City...his nine wins tied for third most in the PCL beginning May 22 and his 3.57 ERA ranked ninth...was 5-1 with a 3.00 ERA in nine games at home, 4-2 with a 4.34 ERA in seven starts on the road...surrendered just one home run in 51.0 innings at home compared to seven in 37.1 innings on the road...lost each of his first two starts with Oklahoma City (12.00 ERA), his only losing streak of the season...including June 1 against Fresno when he walked a season-high five batters in 3.0 innings...went 9-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his final 14 games... was 4-0 with a 2.89 ERA over a five-start stretch from June 8 to 30... tossed his only complete game of the season June 15 at Colorado Springs, a seven-hitter in a 5-2 win that was called after six innings due to rain... walked one and struck out a season-high tying seven...made his only relief appearance with Oklahoma City June 20 against Memphis (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 so)...went 4-1 with a 4.06 ERA in six games, including five starts, in June...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.1 innings July 28 at Memphis and took the loss...pitched 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit and one walk Aug. 17 against Tacoma, but had a no decision in a 2-1 win...that was part of a season-best 15.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 2 to 17...was perfect 4-0 with a 1.86 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in five starts in August...also won his only start in September, tossing a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings on the 2nd against Iowa, and finished the season with a five-game winning streak over his final six starts (2.19 ERA).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Rich Hill (1-1, 3.12 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season, his seventh in the last seven years and the 77th of his career... was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win at Seattle last Saturday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...it was his ninth career game of 10 or more strikeouts... now has 109 strikeouts in 81.2 innings over the last four years (12.01 per nine innings)...is 2-0 with a 5.91 ERA in 11 career appearances, including two starts, against Kansas City...went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in seven of its first nine games and has a 0.71 ERA (2 er in 25.1 ip) in those contests...however, has allowed four runs in each of its two other games (8 er in 6.2 ip, 10.80 ERA).
- Has tossed 32.0 innings, which is the most in the majors, and allowed just three walks, which is tied for second fewest...ranks second in walks per nine innings (0.84) and strikeouts per walk (8.33).
- Has inherited the most runners in the majors without allowing one to score (12)...is one of four ML bullpens not to allow an inherited runner to score.
- Is tied for second in the American League in saves (3), tied for third in wins (2) and tied for fourth in losses (2).
- Compiled a 4.56 ERA last year, which was the highest in the AL, third highest in the majors and eighth highest in Oakland history.

- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 retroactive to March 25 after undergoing surgery on his right elbow March 29...the surgery included a debridement of the right elbow and the removal of loose bodies...was transferred to the 60-day disabled list April 8.

Last Year: Had four stints with the A's and posted a 9.90 ERA in 21 relief appearances...struck out 23 in 20.0 innings but also walked 13 and allowed seven home runs...also went 3-3 with five saves and a 4.11 ERA in 31 games with Nashville.
