LEADING OFF: Club has won three straight games following a 1-4 start...Today the Angels play the third contest (2-0) of a 10-game road trip to **Oakland** (April 11-13; 2-0), **Minnesota** (April 15-17) and **Chicago White Sox** (April 18-21)...**Angels seek first three-game road sweep of Oakland since Sept. 3-5, 2012...LAA is off tomorrow...** Halos went 2-4 on season-opening home stand vs. **Chicago Cubs** (0-2) and **Texas Rangers** (2-2).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The 5-4 victory marked LAA's second comeback win of 2016 and second win in the Club's last at-bat (**LAA led A.L. with 23 last at-bat wins in 2015**) – **STATS LLC**.

SOTO SEALS IT: Geovany Soto's two-run HR off Sean Doolittle with one out in 9th proved to be game-winner - marked third career go-ahead HR in 9th or later for Soto...First 9th inn. or later blown save for Doolittle since Sept. 17, 2014.

TAKE IT TO THE STREET: Huston Street (318th career save last night) has tied **Rick Aguilera** for 19th on all-time saves list. **Todd Jones** ranks 18th with 319 career saves.

ALBERT ASCENDING: Last night's two-run double in 8th for **Albert Pujols** (1,703 career RBI) moved him past **Reggie Jackson** (1,702 RBI) for 23rd on MLB all-time RBI list...**Frank Thomas** ranks 22nd with 1,704 RBI...On Monday, **Pujols** scored the 1,600th run of his career - just 49th player in MLB history to reach plateau.

TROUT TALE: On Monday, **Mike Trout** hit the 140th HR of his career to become one of just three players all-time to reach 140 HR & 100 SB prior to age-25 season (**Alex Rodriguez** and **Andruw Jones**).

AT OAKLAND: Halos have won four straight games at the Coliseum...**Angels seek first three-game road sweep of Oakland since Sept. 3-5, 2012...**Angels have won 10 of last 13 overall games, including six of last seven vs. A's...LAA claimed 2015 series 11-8 (5-4 on road)...**Halos have won 19 of last 26 matchups...Since 2002, Angels (6) or Athletics (5) have won 11 of 14 A.L. West crowns.**

UP NEXT – AT MINNESOTA: Halos claimed 2015 series 5-2 and are 12-2 in last 14 games vs. Minnesota...**Halos went 7-0 vs. Minnesota in 2014 (3-0 at home), first undefeated season series vs. Twins in club history...**Halos are 78-56 vs. Twins since 2000...**Angels have won 11 of last 13 season series vs. Twins.**

HARDWARE EVERYWHERE: During the home stand, several Angels were honored with awards from the 2015 campaign...On Thursday, **Andrelton Simmons** was presented with his **Wilson Defensive Player of the Year Award**...On Friday, **Mike Trout** received his 2015 **Silver Slugger Award**...**He has won the award in each of the last four seasons and joins Hall-of-Famer Mike Piazza as the only players to win a Silver Slugger in each of their first four full Major League seasons...**On Saturday, **Kole Calhoun** was presented with his 2015 **RAWLINGS Gold Glove Award**...He is the first Angels player to win a Gold Glove since shortstop **Erick Aybar** in 2011.

WEAVER WINS: With his victory over the Rangers Sunday, **Jered Weaver** passed **Nolan Ryan** for sole possession of second place on the Club's all-time wins list with 139...Franchise record for wins is 165 held by **Chuck Finley**.

THE MANAGER: **Mike Scioscia** is the longest tenured manager in the Majors (17th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels are tied with **Sparky Anderson** (17 straight years with Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only **Connie Mack's** 50 seasons with Philadelphia A's) (STATS LLC)...Scioscia's current .546 (1,420-1180) winning percentage and 1,420 wins are both tops in franchise history...He ranks 24th on the all-time win list (60 victories behind **Earl Weaver** for 23rd).

FAST FACT: Just three players in Major League history have started their career with 25+ HR and 100+ runs scored in each of their first four MLB seasons (STATS LLC):
Joe DiMaggio (1936-39)
Albert Pujols (2001-04)
Mike Trout (2012-15)

RUN WITH THIS: **Mike Trout** has scored 457 runs over the last four years (2012-15), no other player has more than 384 in the span (FSW/STATS).

WHO'S ON THIRD: **Yunel Escobar** became the Angels ninth different Opening Day starting third baseman since 2004...Escobar was acquired from the Washington Nationals on Dec. 10 in exchange for RHP **Trevor Gott**...Escobar finished the Spring with an American League leading .450 (27/60) average and did not strike out in his 65 plate appearances.

Owns a 13-5 career record away from Angel Stadium

- Making second start of the season and first on the road.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Took the loss in season debut on Friday vs. Texas after allowing six earned runs on seven hits across three innings pitched...It was his first start at Angel Stadium since August 4, 2015 (pitched five straight road games to close 2015).
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** Owns a 13-5 career record across 26 appearances (23 starts) away from The Big A (6-4 road record last season).
- **SUPPORT ME:** Last season, Shoemaker received an average of 3.46 runs of support per nine innings, which was third fewest mark in the American League (min. 125 IP)...In 2014, he led the league with an average of 6.68 runs of support per nine innings (STATS LLC).
- **DAY AND NIGHT:** Owns a 3.09 ERA (43.2 IP – 15 ER) in day games compared with a 3.97 mark (235.2 IP – 104 ER) at night.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In seven career games (six starts) against the A's, is 2-2 with a 4.68 ERA (32.2 IP – 17 ER)...In five starts last season, was 1-2 with a 6.04 ERA (25.1 IP – 17 ER)...Pitched 7.1 shutout innings against Athletics in two games (one start) in 2014.
- **VS. A.L. WEST:** Is 10-6 with a 4.06 ERA (122 IP – 55 ER) in 25 career games (20 starts) against divisional foes.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In three career games at the Coliseum, is 1-0 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2 IP – 9 ER)...Earned the win in last start in Oakland on Sept. 1, 2015 after tossing seven innings and allowing one earned run on five hits.
- **2016 SPRING TRAINING:** In six games (five starts) this Spring, went 2-2 with a 6.84 ERA (25 IP – 19 ER) and 21 strikeouts.
