OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-6) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (7-2)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Los Angeles (AL) in a three-game series to start the homestand after sweeping a three-game series in Seattle last weekend...are 4-6 for the season, which matches the A's worst record after 10 games over the last 15 years...have spent each of the last three days in third place after three consecutive days with at least a share of first... have one day in sole possession of first this year, two tied for first, one tied for second, three in third, two tied for third and two tied for fourth...this is the A's 49th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 116th season in the AL...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have more World Championships.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have started the season 1-6 at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Minnesota, 0-3)...it matches the worst record after seven home games in Oakland history (1968, 1979, 2001)...both the 1968 and 1979 clubs won their eighth home game but the 2001 club fell to 1-9 at home before winning their second game...have now lost 17 of their last 21 home games dating back to Sept. 1, 2015...have played 37 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...are 0-3 on this six-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (three games)...lost three of four to Chicago (AL) on the first homestand...are scheduled to play 10 of their first 13 games at home this year...leave following the game Sunday for a 10-game road trip to New York (three games), Toronto (three games) and Detroit (four games)...that begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...went 3-0 on the first road trip of the season to Seattle, marking the third time in the last four years the A's have swept their first road series of the season (2013 at Houston, 2014 at Minnesota).

ON THE BASES: The A's are a perfect 6-for-6 in stolen base attempts and are the only Major League team without a caught stealing...the season-opening streak of 10 consecutive games without a caught stealing is the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history...the longest is a 23-game streak last year when the A's started the season 13-for-13...opponents have been successful in just 3-of-7 (42.9%) attempts, which is the third lowest percentage in the American League...A's pitchers are tied for the Major League lead with two pickoffs (Atlanta, Milwaukee).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Six of the A's first 10 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 3-3 in those games...lead the majors in one-run decisions, are tied for the lead in one-run losses and rank second in one-run wins (Kansas City, 4)...last year, the A's started the season 1-13 in one-run games and did not win their third one-run decision until May 28 (number four came on June 10)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

PITCHING: The A's are one of three teams that has not allowed a run in the first inning (Toronto, Cleveland)...rank third in the American League with a 3.07 ERA overall...that includes 4.00 (28 er in 63.0 ip) at home compared to 0.96 (3 er in 28.0 ip) on the road...lead the league in hit batters (7)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last eight games and have a 2.96 ERA (18 er in 54.2 ip) for the season, which also ranks third in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .185 (25-for-135) with eight runs scored over the last four games...are 2-for-24 (.083) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...have walked three times or fewer in each of the first 10 games and are tied with Tampa Bay and Kansas City for the fewest walks in the majors (20)...have the lowest on-base percentage (.262)...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.332) and rank fourth in fewest runs scored (27) and lowest batting average (.215)...A's pinch hitters are 0-for-12.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone errorless in three consecutive games for the first time this year...have committed one error in the last five

games after making six in the first five...have seven errors overall, which is tied with Los Angeles and Texas for the most in the American League...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...rank third in the AL in double plays (11) this year.

ROSTER NOTES: Only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...Crisp is the longest tenured Athletic as he made his A's debut May 21, 2010...Doolittle and Reddick made their Oakland debuts in 2012...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.28 years...that was the A's oldest Opening Day roster since 2004 when it was 30.16...Kendall Graveman was the youngest player at the age of 25 years, 105 days...it marked the first time in Oakland history the A's did not had a player under the age of 25 on the Opening Day roster...it is believed to be just the second time in Athletics history, although official Opening Day rosters are not available...the only other probable time the A's did not start the season with a player under 25 was 1902...three of the 25 players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Axford, Hill, Madson) and six were acquired in a trade (Alonso, Coghlan, Davis, Hendriks, Lowrie, Rzepczynski).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Sogard began a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton Monday night...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 when they went 12-21-1...committed 45 errors, which was six more than any other team (39, Chicago-NL)...they were the most by an A's team since at least 2000...the pitching staff issued 125 walks, which was the most among CL teams and second most in the majors to Boston (129)...the walks were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990...compiled a 6.10 ERA, which was third highest in the majors to San Diego (6.89) and San Francisco (6.37)...the ERA was second highest by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (6.22 in 1999)...stole just 13 bases, which was the fewest in the CL and fourth fewest in the majors.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the season series last year as they went 1-5 against Kansas City...that was the A's worst mark ever against the Royals...lost two of three in Kansas City and were swept in a three-game series in Oakland...have dropped seven of their last eight games and have a four-game losing streak in the Coliseum...the only time the A's have lost more than four straight to the Royals in Oakland was from Sept. 11, 1987 to Sept. 16, 1988 when they dropped seven in a row...have lost each of the last two season series and three of the last four...are 12-16 against Kansas City over the last four years...all-time, the A's are 308-259 against the Royals...that breaks down to 169-114 in Oakland and 139-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Burns is the only Athletic without a strikeout and his 26 plate appearances are the most in the majors among players with no strikeouts...**Ryan Dull** has not allowed a hit or walk in his first six games (6.0 ip, 6 so)...**Marcus Semien** homered for the fourth time in his last four games on Wednesday and is tied for third in the American League in home runs (4)...this is the first time he has hit more than three home runs in a month in his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle...with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (1-1, 3.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season, his seventh in the last seven years and the 77th of his career...was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...the A's are his seventh team and this is his 12th season in the majors...made 70 of his starts in his first five seasons with Chicago-NL (2005-08) and Baltimore (2009)...pitched exclusively in relief from 2010-14 before making four starts with Boston last year.

HIT BATTER: Has hit two batters in each of his first two starts of the season and leads the majors with four hit batters for the season...is the first Athletics pitcher on an Opening Day roster since at least 1913 to hit two or more batters in each of his first two games in a season.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle last Saturday...struck out 10 batters, his ninth career game with 10 or more strikeouts...his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by Iannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

HILL vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 2-0 with a 5.91 ERA (10.2 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 10 so, 0 hr) in 11 career appearances, including two starts...that includes 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in six games, one start, at Kaufmann Stadium and 1-0 with a 9.82 ERA (4 er in 3.2 ip) in five games, one start, in his home ballparks...is 1-0 with a 5.63 ERA (5 er in 8.0 ip) in his two starting assignments...last faced Kansas City on Sept. 17, 2013 when he retired the only batter he faced, a Moustakas fly out in the fifth inning at Kansas City while pitching for Cleveland...has not started against the Royals since July 27, 2009 at Baltimore...had a no decision in a 5-3 loss...allowed a Butler RBI single in the first and back-to-back RBI doubles to Butler and Teahen in the third...left after 2.1 innings trailing 3-2 but the Orioles tied the game in the fifth to get him off the hook.

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20...has 109 strikeouts in 81.2 innings over the last four years (12.01 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 (11-for-80) with both of his home runs against right-handed hitters compared to .158 (3-for-19) against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...had a .242 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .091 after that.

WITH BOSTON: Was selected by Boston Sept. 8 and made his first start Sept. 13 at Tampa Bay...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out 10, but had a no decision in a 2-0 Red Sox win...it was his first start since July 27, 2009 against Kansas City...joined Hideo Nomo (no-hitter, April 4, 2001) as the only pitchers in the last 100 years with 10 or more strikeouts and one hit or fewer in their first career start as a Red Sox...picked up his first win in his second start Sept. 20 at Toronto...struck out 10 in 7.0 innings again and allowed three runs in a 4-3 decision...then tossed the Red Sox only complete game shutout of the season, a two-hitter in a 7-0 win over Baltimore Sept. 25 in his only start at Fenway...walked one and struck out 10...it was his third career complete game, his first since Sept. 22, 2006 at Cincinnati...it was his second career shutout (Sept. 16, 2006 against Cincinnati)...it came in his 200th career appearance...became the first pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in each of his first three starts with any American League team...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only pitcher since 1900 to make his season debut in September or later and record 10 or more strikeouts in each of his first three starts...is the fifth pitcher in Red Sox history to reach double-digits in strikeouts in at least three straight games...took the loss in his final start Oct. 1 at New York (AL)...tossed 6.0 innings to bring his career total to 500.0.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 10.17 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .206 opponents batting average, including .190 (26-for-137) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handers...yielded a .171 average to batters leading off an inning but issued 10 walks and hit two batters for a .358 on-base percentage.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed 9-of-23 (39.1%) inherited runners to score...tossed fewer than one inning in 13 of his 25 relief appearances with Syracuse and six or more innings in each of his five starts with Pawtucket...his longest outing as a reliever was 2.0 innings three times.

MORE MINOR LEAGUES: Compiled a 0.90 ERA in eight relief appearances in April and had a 1.10 ERA over his first 17 appearances through May 20...struck out two or more batters in eight of his first 10 games through May 4 (21 so in 13.0 ip)...tossed fewer than one inning in 11 of his 12 appearances from May 6 to June 3 (4 er in 6.0 ip, 6.00 ERA)...was on the disabled list from June 5 to 11 with a strained neck...pitched in just three games following his return (2 er in 2.2 ip) before he was released June 24...allowed his only home run with Syracuse in his final outing June 19 against Buffalo...tossed 6.1 shutout innings for the win in his first start with Pawtucket Aug. 15 at Lehigh Valley...added 6.0 shutout innings in his third start Aug. 27 at Buffalo, giving him a 0.93 ERA over his first three starts...struck out a season-high nine batters in a season-high tying 7.0 innings for the win Sept. 1 against Lehigh Valley...allowed seven runs on 10 hits in 6.0 innings for the loss in his final Triple-A start Sept. 6 against Buffalo.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25...issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)...opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (1-1, 2.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...started the A's third game of the season April 6 after being scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Monday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 8-2 with a 2.13 ERA in 12 career starts in the month...is 0-2 with a 3.15 ERA in three career starts against Kansas City...the Royals are one of two American League teams (besides the A's) that he has not defeated (Boston)...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...allowed a .311 opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in seven of its first 10 games and has a 0.71 ERA (2 er in 25.1 ip) in those contests...however, has allowed three or more runs in its three others games (11 er in 11.0 ip, 9.00 ERA).
- Has tossed 36.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 36.2), and allowed just three walks, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (Chicago-NL, 2)...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (0.74).
- Has inherited the most runners in the majors without allowing one to score (16)...is one of four ML bullpens not to allow an inherited runner to score.
- Is fifth in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.336) and tied for fifth in wins (2) and saves (3)...has the fourth highest opponents batting average (.255) and is tied for fourth in losses (2).
