### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-7) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (5-7)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have a season-high tying three-game winning streak after losing a season-high four straight...have not won more than three straight games since June 20-25 of last year when they won five straight... are now 7-7 after 14 games for the second consecutive season and third time in the last five years...are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Texas by one game for the third consecutive day... have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, two days tied for first, two days in second, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

**ONE-RUN GAMES:** The A's have won back-to-back games by a score of 3-2 and eight of their first 14 games have been decided by one run...are 5-3 in one run games after losing 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year...did not win their fifth one-run game last year until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...lead the majors in one-run wins and decisions and are tied for third in losses...the A's went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games

**OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win last night and are the first Major League team with two extra inning victories...are now 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Tampa Bay for the most last at bat wins in the majors and rank second in games decided in the last at bat (Minnesota, 7)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's improved to 4-0 on the road with the win last night and are the only team that has yet to lose on the road...this is the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have won their first four road games, the first time since 2013 when they went 6-0...have won their first five road games four times...are 1-0 on this 10-game road trip to New York (1-0), Toronto (three games) and Detroit (four games)...this trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle, 1-5).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .208 (56-for-269) with 21 runs scored over the last eight games (2.63 runs per game)...are 8-for-49 (.163) with runners in scoring position over that stretch but have won four of the eight contests...have not scored more than six runs in a game this year and the season-opening stretch of 14 consecutive games with six runs or fewer is the longest such streak in Oakland history...for the season, the A's have the second lowest batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.273) in the American League (.219) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.342)...are tied for the most triples (4), but have the fewest doubles (14), are tied for the second fewest runs scored (40) and have the fourth fewest walks (34).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.79 ERA, which ranks second in the American League (Chicago, 2.63)...have a 1.15 ERA (5 er in 39.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.50 (35 er in 90.0 ip) at home...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.334) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.297)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the first 14 games and four runs or fewer in all 14 contests... have a 3.01 ERA (26 er in 77.2 ip), which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...however, have tossed fewer than five innings four times and are averaging 5.55 innings per start.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last four games (five errors total)...now have 12 for the season, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...the 12 errors have led to five unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 10)...rank third in the AL in double plays (17).

**ON THE BASES:** Yesterday, Mark Canha became the first Athletic to be caught stealing...prior to that, the A's were the only team without a caught stealing...the season-opening streak of 13 consecutive games without a caught stealing was second longest in Oakland history (23 in 2015)...are now 6-for-7 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...Eric Surkamp had the A's Major

League leading third pick off of the season last night...opponents have been successful in 6-of-12 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is tied with Texas for the second lowest percentage in the AL (Detroit, 40.0%).

**IN THE PINCH:** Jed Lowrie had a pinch hit single in the seventh inning on Sunday to snap a season-opening 0-for-12 streak by A's pinch hitters... the A's are now 1-for-15 (.067) in the pinch and rank third in the American League in pinch plate appearances (15)...have gone 262 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors... the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's won their first meeting against an American League East team last night...last year, the A's went 10-23 (.303) against AL East competition, which was the worst mark against the East in A's history (previous: .327 in 1998)...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 10 of the last 11 games...are 6-4 in games started by a right-hander, 1-3 against lefties... are 4-0 on the weekend, 3-7 during the week...only three of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster played for Oakland prior to 2013 (Crisp, Doolittle, Reddick)...15 of the 25 were added following the 2014 campaign...the A's went 12-17-3 (.422) this spring, which marked the first time the A's finished Spring Training with a losing record since 2011 (12-21-1).

**THE EASTERN TIME ZONE:** Last night, the A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...also face Toronto and Detroit on this trip and will travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

**A's vs. YANKEES:** The A's won the first game of 2016 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-3...went 1-2 in New York and 3-1 in Oakland...it was the A's third consecutive season series win and Oakland is 14-6 against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 12-9)...have won 19 of their last 27 games against New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 240-272 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 108-149 in New York... are 11-18 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 781-1138 against the Yankees/Orioles.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**John Axford** has not allowed a run or walk in his first eight games and 8.2 innings...**Ryan Dull** is the first A's pitcher since at least 1913 to begin the season with seven consecutive hitless outings...**Jed Lowrie** is 7-for-10 with runners in scoring position and his .700 batting average with RISP is the best mark in the majors.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in **1971** Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in **1982** Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-1, 2.38 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the 24th of his career, all of which have come with the A's...made his Major League debut with five relief appearances for Toronto in 2014...was one of four players traded to the A's for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season.

**SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Lost his first start of 2016 after losing each of his final five decisions of the 2015 season...the six-game losing streak is an on-going career high and the longest by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...has a 5.04 ERA (28 er in 50.0 ip) and .267 (54-for-202) opponents batting average during his losing streak, which spans 10 starts...his last win came on July 4, 2015 against Seattle.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the score was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreu followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1... Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth

**GRAVEMAN vs. NEW YORK:** Had a no decision in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 5-4 win in Oakland on May 28 of last year...allowed a solo home run to McCann in the second inning, a RBI single to McCann in the fourth and a sacrifice fly to Rodriguez in the fifth...was relieved by Abad with two outs in the sixth inning and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook and twice in the seventh for the win.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .275 (61-for-222) against lefties and .278 (65-for-234) against righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties but issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...had a .369 slugging percentage against lefties, .474 against righties...opponents hit .271 with the bases empty, .285 with runners on...10 of the 15 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .356 average against the opponents three, four and five hitters compared to .233 against all other hitters...had a .235 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .289 the second time and .317 after that.

**THIS AND THAT:** Was 4-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 11 starts at night, 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 10 starts during the day...was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts.

**MORE WITH OAKLAND:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his first Major League start April 9 against Texas...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss...yielded a career-high eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career in his next start April 14 at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...was 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA over his first four starts when he was optioned to Nashville April 26...returned to Oakland May 23 and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a six-start streak from June 7 to July 4 where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...began the streak with a no decision and two losses to become just the second A's pitcher since at least 1914 to toss seven or more innings and allow two runs or fewer in three consecutive starts without earning a win...the other was Orlando Pena for the 1963 Kansas City A's (May 5-15)...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth big league start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...did not walk a batter and struck out a career-high seven on a career-high 111 pitches...had a career-high three-game winning streak from June 24 to July 4...allowed just two earned runs during that three-start stretch for a 0.86 ERA...tossed seven shutout innings in back-to-back starts June 29 against Colorado and July 4 against Seattle as part of a career-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak from June 24 to July 10...finished the month of June with a 3-2 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in the month...was tagged with the loss July 10 at Cleveland to begin a season-ending five-game losing streak...compiled a 5.82 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over that stretch...tossed just 1.1 innings in a 4-3 loss at San Francisco July 26, which was the shortest outing of his career as a starter...spun 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision in his final start Aug. 23 against Tampa Bay...was placed on the disabled list with a strained left oblique the next day.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Rich Hill (1-2, 4.15 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season, his eighth in the last seven years and the 78th of his career...has struck out 19 batters over his first three starts and 13.0 innings...is averaging 13.15 strikeouts per nine innings...now has 115 strikeouts in 86.0 innings over the last four years (12.03 per nine innings)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Kansas City last Friday in Oakland (4.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.14 ERA in 10 career appearances, including two starts, against New York...went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of its first 14 games... that includes eight games where it has not allowed an earned run...has a 2.45 ERA (14 er in 51.1 ip), which ranks fourth in the American League.
- Has tossed 51.1 innings, which is the most in the AL, and allowed just six walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.05) and strikeouts per walk (6.83).
- Has stranded all 23 of its inherited runners...the 23 inherited runners are the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score.
- Is tied for the AL lead in wins (4), tied for second in saves (6), ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.251) and slugging percentage (.299) and is tied for fourth in save percentage (85.7%).
- First batters faced are 12-for-44 (.273) with three walks (.319 on-base percentage)...the opponents on-base percentage is third highest in the AL and the batting average is fourth highest.
