OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-7) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (5-8)

THURSDAY, APRIL 21, 2016 — YANKEE STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP RICH HILL (1-2, 4.15) VS. RHP LUIS SEVERINO (0-2, 5.91) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to a season-high four games last night...it marks the first time the A's have won more than three straight games since June 20-25 of last year when they won five straight... the winning streak comes on the heels of a season-high four-game losing streak...are now 8-7 and are one game over .500 for the second time this year (4-3 on April 10)...have not been more than one game over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...are in second place in the American League West and trail first place Texas by one game for the fourth consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, two days tied for first, three days in second, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's improved to 5-0 on the road with the win last night and are the only team that has yet to lose on the road...this is the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have won their first five road games, the first time since 2013 when they went 6-0...have won their first six road games three times...are 2-0 on this 10-game road trip to New York (2-0), Toronto (three games) and Detroit (four games)...this trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle. 1-5).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Eight of the A's first 15 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 5-3 in those contests...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...lead the majors in one-run decisions, are tied with Cincinnati for the most wins and are tied for fourth in losses... the A's went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win Tuesday night and are one of three teams with two extra inning victories (Dodgers, Phillies)...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Cincinnati and Tampa Bay for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat (Minnesota, 7)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .263 (36-for-137) over their last four games after hitting .186 over their previous five contests…have the third lowest on-base percentage (.279) and slugging percentage (.348) in the American League, are tied for the third fewest runs scored (45) and have the fourth fewest doubles (18)…are tied for the most triples (4)…have not scored more than six runs in a game this year and the season-opening stretch of 15 consecutive games with six runs or fewer is the longest such streak in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs in each of the last three games and have a 1.66 ERA (7 er in 38.0 ip) over the last four contests...have a 2.74 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Chicago, 2.45)...have a 1.31 ERA (7 er in 48.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.50 (35 er in 90.0 ip) at home...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.339) and fourth lowest batting average (.231)...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the first 15 games and four runs or fewer in all 15 contests...have a 2.89 ERA (27 er in 84.0 ip), which is second lowest in the AL (Chicago, 2.88).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last five games (seven errors total)...now have 14 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year... the errors have led to five unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 10)...rank third in the AL in double plays (18).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 6-for-7 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...were caught stealing for the first time on Tuesday, snapping a season-opening streak of 13 consecutive games without a caught stealing...that was the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (23 in 2015)...A's pitchers lead the majors with three pickoffs...opponents have been successful in 6-of-12 (50.0%) stolen base attempts, which is the second lowest percentage in the AL (Detroit, 46.2%).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 4 (.500) after starting the season 0-for-12...are 2-for-16 (.125) for the season and rank third in the American League in pinch plate appearances (16)...have gone 263 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's designated hitter entered the game defensively for the fourth time this year last night...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least four times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...the A's are 2-0 against the American League East...last year, the A's went 10-23 (.303) against AL East competition, which was the worst mark against the East in A's history (previous: .327 in 1998)...the A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 11 of the last 12 games...are 7-4 in games started by a right-hander, 1-3 against lefties...are 4-0 on the weekend, 4-7 during the week.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: Tuesday night, the A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...also face Toronto and Detroit on this trip and will travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's have won the first two games of this series and have never swept a series in this ballpark (this is the 10th series)... last swept a series in New York June 9-11, 2006 and that is the A's only sweep at New York over the previous 21 seasons...won the season series last year, 4-3...went 1-2 in New York and 3-1 in Oakland...it was the A's third consecutive season series win and Oakland is 15-6 (.714) against the Yankees since the start of the 2013 season...that is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span (Texas, 12-9)...have won 20 of their last 28 games against New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 241-272 against the Yankees...that includes 132-123 in Oakland and 109-149 in New York...are 12-18 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 782-1138 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

John Axford has not allowed a run or walk in his first eight games and 8.2 innings...Jed Lowrie is 7-for-11 with runners in scoring position and his .636 batting average with RISP is the best mark in the majors...Marc Rzepczynski has stranded all nine of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1958** Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run 8th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in **1981** Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900th career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (1-2, 4.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season, his eighth in the last seven years and the 78th of his career...was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...the A's are his seventh team and this is his 12th season in the majors...made 70 of his starts in his first five seasons with Chicago-NL (2005-08) and Baltimore (2009)...pitched exclusively in relief from 2010-14 before making four starts with Boston

AMONG THE LEADERS: Hit two batters in each of his first two starts this year and his four hit batters are tied for the most in the majors (Hamels, TEX)...has two losses, which is tied for sixth in the American League.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out 19 batters over his first three starts and 13.0 innings...is averaging 13.15 strikeouts per nine inning...now has 115 strikeouts in 86.0 innings over the last four years (12.03 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 1-for-9 (.111) when leading off an inning but he has walked three and hit two for a .429 on-base percentage...has allowed a .235 (4-for-17) average against left-handed hitters compared to .361 (13-for-36) against right-handers...opponents are 0-for-7 with runners in scoring position and two outs.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters, his ninth career game with 10 or more strikeouts...his final strikeout of lannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by lannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City last Friday in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)... opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip. 4.15 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 (11-for-80) with both of his home runs against right-handed hitters compared to .158 (3-for-19) against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...had a .242 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .091 after that.

WITH BOSTON: Was selected by Boston Sept. 8 and made his first start Sept. 13 at Tampa Bay...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out 10, but had a no decision in a 2-0 Red Sox win...it was his first start since July 27, 2009 against Kansas City... joined Hideo Nomo (no-hitter, April 4, 2001) as the only pitchers in the last 100 years with 10 or more strikeouts and one hit or fewer in their first career start as a Red Sox...picked up his first win in his second start Sept. 20 at Toronto...struck out 10 in 7.0 innings again and allowed three runs in a 4-3 decision...then tossed the Red Sox only complete game shutout of the season, a two-hitter in a 7-0 win over Baltimore Sept. 25 in his only start at Fenway...walked one and struck out 10...it was his third career complete game, his first since Sept. 22, 2006 at Cincinnati...it was his second career shutout (Sept. 16, 2006 against Cincinnati)...it came in his 200th career appearance...became the first pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in each of his first three starts with any American League team...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only pitcher since 1900 to make his season debut in September or later and record 10 or more strikeouts in each of his first three starts...is the fifth pitcher in Red Sox history to reach double-digits in strikeouts in at least three straight games...took the loss in his final start Oct. 1 at New York (AL)...tossed 6.0 innings to bring his career total to 500.0.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket... struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 10.17 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .206 opponents batting average, including .190 (26-for-137) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handers...yielded a .171 average to batters leading off an inning but issued 10 walks and hit two batters for a .358 on-base percentage.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed 9-of-23 (39.1%) inherited runners to score... tossed fewer than one inning in 13 of his 25 relief appearances with Syracuse and six or more innings in each of his five starts with Pawtucket...his longest outing as a reliever was 2.0 innings three times.

MORE MINOR LEAGUES: Compiled a 0.90 ERA in eight relief appearances in April and had a 1.10 ERA over his first 17 appearances through May 20...struck out two or more batters in eight of his first 10 games through May 4 (21 so in 13.0 ip)...was on the disabled list from June 5 to 11 with a strained neck...pitched in just three games following his return (2 er in 2.2 ip) before he was released June 24...allowed his only home run with Syracuse in his final outing June 19 against Buffalo...tossed 6.1 shutout innings for the win in his first start with Pawtucket Aug. 15 at Lehigh Valley...added 6.0 shutout innings in his third start Aug. 27 at Buffalo, giving him a 0.93 ERA over his first three starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (2-1, 2.33 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season, his first on the road...started the A's third game of the season April 6 after being scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...went 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year and is now 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA (21 er in 90.2 ip) in 13 career starts in the month...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Kansas City last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (20.0 ip, 17 h, 7 r, 5 er, 8 bb, 13 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Toronto...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...allowed a .311 opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA
