OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-7) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (8-10)

SATURDAY, APRIL 23, 2016 — ROGERS CENTRE — 1:07 P.M. EDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (0-0, 2.79) VS. LHP J.A. HAPP (2-0, 1.89) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of their last six games, which is the A's longest winning streak since July 3-8, 2014 when they also won six straight...the last time the A's won more than six straight was April 3-12, 2013 when they won nine in a row...the streak comes on the heels of a season-high four-game losing streak...are now 10-7, marking the first time the A's have been three games over .500 since finishing the 2014 season 88-74...the 10 wins are one more than the A's April win total from last year...are tied with Texas for first place in the American League West... have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, three days tied for first, four days in second, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's improved to 7-0 on the road with the win last night and are the only team that has yet to lose on the road...this is the third time in Oakland history the A's have won at least their first seven road games...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...are 4-0 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-0) and Detroit (four games)...this trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high eight runs last night on a season-high 14 hits...have scored 31 runs during the current six-game winning streak (5.2 per game) after tallying 29 runs over the first 11 games (2.6 per game)...have hit five home runs in the past two games after going homerless over the previous three games...that includes a season-high four home runs Thursday night at New York (AL)...are batting .283 (60-for-212) over their last six games after hitting .186 over their previous five contests...are tied for the second fewest doubles in the American League (21), have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.291) and have the fifth lowest slugging percentage (.375)...are tied for the most triples (4).

PITCHING: The A's allowed five runs last night to snap a five-game streak of allowing two earned runs or fewer...have a 2.83 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Chicago, 2.34)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.337) and fifth lowest batting average (.232) and on-base percentage (.300)...have a 1.91 ERA (14 er in 66.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.50 (35 er in 90.0 ip) at home...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of the first 17 games and four runs or fewer in all 17 contests...have a 2.88 ERA (31 er in 97.0 ip), which is third lowest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...opponents have been successful in just 7-of-13 (53.8%) stolen base attempts, which is the lowest percentage in the AL and tied for fourth lowest in the majors... A's pitchers are tied with Los Angeles (NL) for the Major League lead with three pickoffs.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error last night after committing at least one error in each of the previous six games (eight errors total)...now have 15 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...the errors have led to six unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 10)...rank third in double plays (21).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Eight of the A's first 17 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 5-3 in those contests...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...lead the majors in one-run decisions, are tied with Cincinnati for the most wins and are tied for fifth in losses...the A's went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-0 in extra inning games and are second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat

(Minnesota, 7)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 4 (.500) after starting the season 0-for-12...are 2-for-16 (.125) for the season and rank third in the American League in pinch plate appearances (16)...have gone 265 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-0 against the American League East...last year, the A's went 10-23 (.303) against AL East competition, which was the worst mark against the East in A's history (previous: .327 in 1998)...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 13 of the last 14 games...are 9-4 in games started by a right-hander, 1-3 against lefties...are 4-0 on the weekend, 6-7 during the week...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: The A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone on Tuesday at New York (AL)...after this series with Toronto, the A's conclude this trip with Detroit...will travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip... after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's added Danny Valencia to the disabled list yesterday and now have seven players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's won the first game of 2016 last night after going 1-5 against Toronto last year, marking the first time they lost the season series to the Blue Jays since 2010...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Toronto...the win last night snapped the A's six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre, which was their longest losing streak ever at Toronto...it was their first win here since Aug. 12, 2013...are 30-36 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2008 but are 213-187 all-time against Toronto...that includes 105-95 in Oakland, 108-90 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-58 (.536) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 119-97, .551).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

John Axford has not allowed a run or walk in his first nine games and 10.0 innings...the innings pitched are the most in the American League among relievers that have not allowed a run, second most among all relievers (Neris, PHI 10.1) and third most among all pitchers (Zimmermann, DET 19.1)...Marc Rzepczynski has stranded all nine of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1985 the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the first A's first 14 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-0, 2.79 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season, his third during the day...has no decisions over his first three starts, despite a 2.79 ERA...is now 1-8 with a 3.42 ERA (36 er in 94.2 ip) in 16 career starts with the A's...is on his first career Opening Day roster...went 1-8 with a 3.56 ERA in 18 games, 13 starts, with the A's last year after going 1-1 with a 3.94 ERA in six games, five starts, in his first season with the White Sox in 2014...was originally selected by Chicago in the 16th round of the 2011 draft and was one of four players traded to the A's in the Jeff Samardzija deal following the 2014 season.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his three starts this year and has a season run support average of 2.33 (5 rs in 19.1 ip)...last year, he received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and his season run support average as a starter was 2.15...his overall run support of 3.14 was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...has one run of support or fewer in 12 of his 21 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.41 (33 rs in 123.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .213 opponents batting average, which includes .170 (8-for-47) against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (8-for-28) against right-handers...has issued six of his nine walks to left-ies...last year, he had a .244 opponents batting average, including .217 (40-for-184) against lefties and .279 (38-for-136) against righties...issued 22 of his 30 walks to lefties...opponents are 2-for-20 (.100) with no walks when leading off an inning this year...has a .115 (3-for-26) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .265 (13-for-49) after that.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Chicago (AL) April 5 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...blanked the White Sox on three hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Frazier with two outs in the fifth inning...the A's came back with one run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Jackson in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 4-2.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning win at Seattle April 10...issued a career-high tying five walks (also Oct. 4, 2015 at Seattle)...shut out the Mariners on two hits and four walks over the first five innings before allowing an unearned run in the sixth...Cruz doubled with one out, went to third on a ground out and scored on a Lowrie error...Hernandez blanked the A's on three hits in seven innings, but the A's scored a run in the eighth off the Seattle bullpen to tie the game...was relieved by Madson to start the bottom of the eighth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Kansas City last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 114 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Gordon in the second and a two-out solo home run to Moustakas in the third...then blanked the Royals on two hits and a walk over his final four innings...the A's scored singles runs in the fourth and seventh innings to tie the game and he was relieved by Axford to start the eighth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts... also pitched in a Triple-A game against the Cubs on the A's lone off day of the spring March 16...allowed a .263 (20-for-76) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a run in his first two starts (5.0 ip), allowed nine in his next two (10.1 ip, 7.84 ERA), and one in 4.0 innings in his final start.

2015 RECAP: Split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: His .111 winning percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started... it tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but was the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...the last Major League pitcher with at least 10 starts, an ERA under 3.75 and a winning percentage of .111 or less was Zane Smith, who went 1-13 (.071) with a 3.49 ERA in 48 games, including 17 starts, for the Braves and Expos in 1989...no American League pitcher has done it since 1968 when Rickey Clark (1-11, 3.53 ERA with California) and Fred Talbot (1-9, 3.36 ERA with New York) both did it.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-5 with a 2.28 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in nine games in Oakland, 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA and .274 opponents average in nine games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-8 with a 3.58 ERA and .258 opponents average in his 13 starts...had no decisions, a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents average in five relief appearances...walked 21 batters in 75.1 innings as a starter (2.51 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.62 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in the first inning compared to a 2.84 ERA and .214 opponents average from the second inning on...was 0-4 with a 5.21 ERA in 10 games against AL West competition, 1-4 with a 2.25 ERA in eight games against all other teams...the A's were 3-10 (.231) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts.

2015 WITH OAKLAND: Began the season at Nashville and was recalled by Oakland April 23...pitched exclusively in relief during his first stint and logged a 3.38 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed at least one run in three of those outings and walked two batters or more four times before he was optioned back to Nashville May 10...returned June 30 to make two starts for an ill Sonny Gray...lost both of the starts 2-1 and allowed just three runs in 10.2 innings (2.53 ERA)...was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5...was called up a third time July 11 when Jesse Hahn went on the disabled list and allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in a no decision that day at Cleveland...was optioned back to Nashville the next day with the All-Star Break approaching...returned for good July 25 and went 1-6 with a 3.86 ERA over his final 10 starts...went 0-4 with a 3.00 ERA over his first five starts from June 30 to July 30...tossed at least five innings and allowed three runs or fewer in each of those starts to become the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least five innings and allow three runs or fewer in five consecutive games without recording a win (last: Vin Mazzaro, Aug. 3-26, 2010)...is the only one of those six pitchers with four losses during their streak...combined with Fernando Rodriguez and Fernando Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first and only win as an Athletic...struck out a career-high 10 batters in 6.2 innings Aug. 9 against Houston but had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...did not allow a run over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings Aug. 15 at Baltimore but had a no decision in a 4-3 loss...then lost each of his next four starts to finish the season with a career-high tying four-game losing streak ...compiled a 6.08 ERA over that five-start stretch.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville... allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings and that came to the third batter he faced in his first start...has a 68.0-inning, 282-batters faced Triple-A homerless streak...struck out 70 batters and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 (23-for-101) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (36-for-156) against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on...went 2-3 with a 2.27 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in eight games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.04 ERA and .245 opponents average in five games on the road... was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in his three relief appearances and 1-6 with a 3.79 ERA in 10 starts...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

LHP Eric Surkamp (0-1, 3.68 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 8 and will be making his fourth start as an Athletic...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 11 innings at New York (AL) on Tuesday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 2.08 ERA (4.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so) in six career appearances against Toronto, all in relief in 2014 while pitching for the White Sox...went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in six games, including two starts, this spring before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Charlotte in the White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers on July 6 against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so).
