OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-8) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (9-10)

SUNDAY, APRIL 24, 2016 — ROGERS CENTRE — 1:07 P.M. EDT LHP ERIC SURKAMP (0-1, 3.68) VS. RHP DREW HUTCHISON (0-0, ---) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped yesterday, which was the A's longest winning streak since July 3-8, 2014 when they also won six straight...the streak came on the heels of a season-high four-game losing streak...are now 10-8 and the 10 wins are one more than the A's April win total from last year...are tied with Texas for first place in the American League West for the second consecutive day after trailing the Rangers by one game each of the previous five days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's had their season-opening seven-game road winning streak snapped yesterday...had been the only team without a loss on the road...it was the third time in Oakland history the A's won at least their first seven road games...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...are 4-1 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-1) and Detroit (four games)...this trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 1-5 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Seattle, 1-5).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high eight runs yesterday and have now yielded 14 runs over the first two games of this series in Toronto (13 er in 17.0 ip, 6.88 ERA)...allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of the previous five games and posted a 1.72 ERA over that span...now have a 3.13 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Chicago, 2.35)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.356)...have a 2.68 ERA (22 er in 74.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.50 (35 er in 90.0 ip) at home...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of the first 18 games and four runs or fewer in 17 contests... have a 3.26 ERA (37 er in 102.0 ip), which is third lowest in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high eight runs Friday night and have scored 34 runs over the past seven games (4.9 per game) after tallying 29 runs over the first 11 games (2.6 per game)...are batting .276 (67-for-243) over their last seven games after hitting .186 over their previous five contests...have homered in three straight games (six home runs total) after going homerless over the previous three games...that includes a season-high four home runs Thursday night at New York (AL)...have the second fewest doubles in the American League (21) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.290) and slugging percentage (.372)...are tied for the most triples (4).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 9-for-11 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the American League...opponents have been successful in just 8-of-14 (57.1%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second lowest percentage in the AL...A's pitchers are tied for the Major League lead with three pickoffs.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in seven of the past eight games (nine errors total)...now have 16 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year... the errors have led to seven unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 10)...rank third in double plays (22).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Eight of the A's first 18 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 5-3 in those contests...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...are tied for the most one-run decisions and wins in the majors and are tied for fifth in losses...the A's went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat (Minnesota, 7)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 4 (.500) after starting the season 0-for-12...are 2-for-16 (.125) for the season and rank third in the American League in pinch plate appearances (16)...have gone 266 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-1 against the American League East...last year, the A's went 10-23 (.303) against AL East competition, which was the worst mark against the East in A's history (previous: .327 in 1998)...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 13 of the last 15 games...are 9-4 in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 against lefties...are 4-1 on the weekend, 6-7 during the week...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: The A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone on Tuesday at New York (AL)...after this series with Toronto, the A's conclude this trip with Detroit...will travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip... after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's and Blue Jays have split the first two games of 2016...the A's went 1-5 against Toronto last year, marking the first time they lost the season series to the Blue Jays since 2010...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Toronto...the A's win Friday night snapped their six-game losing streak at Rogers Centre, which was their longest losing streak ever at Toronto...it was their first win here since Aug. 12, 2013...are 30-37 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2008 but are 213-187 all-time against Toronto...that includes 105-95 in Oakland, 108-91 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 67-59 (.532) in Rogers Centre, which is the second best record by a visiting American League team at this ballpark (Boston, 119-97, .551).

TODAY'S TIDBITS

John Axford has not allowed a run or walk in his first nine games and 10.0 innings...the innings pitched are the most in the American League among relievers that have not allowed a run, second most among all relievers (Neris, PHI 10.1) and third most among all pitchers (Zimmermann, DET 19.1)...*Billy Burns* extended his hitting streak to seven games yesterday (9-for-30, .300), which is an A's season-high...*Mark Canha* has homered in back-to-back games for the third time in his career (last: Sept. 7-8, 2015) and three of his four hits this year have been home runs...*Marc Rzepczynski* has stranded all nine of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out 14 Mariners after fanning a club record 16 batters in his previous start, but the A's lose 3-1...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-1, 3.68 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 8 and will be making his fourth start as an Athletic...signed a minor league deal with Oakland Dec. 4, 2015 and was a non-roster invitee this spring...was with the A's the entire spring before being reassigned to minor league camp on April 2, the final day of spring training...this will be the 47th appearance and his 11th start...has not won as a starter since Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego...made six starts for San Francisco in 2011 and one in 2013... the A's are his fourth team in five seasons in the majors (San Francisco, 2011 and 2013; Chicago-AL, 2014; Los Angeles-NL 2015).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .333 (10-for-30) batting average with the bases empty compared to .200 (6-for-30) with runners on base... opponents are 3-for-18 (.167) with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .182 (4-for-22) average the first time through the lineup, .280 (7-for-25) the second time and .385 (5-for-13) after that

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle April 8... it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 13...allowed at least two base runners in every inning except the fourth when he retired the side in order...yielded two runs on RBI singles by Calhoun in the third and fifth innings...left trailing 2-0.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win at New York (AL) on Tuesday...tossed a career-high 99 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez in the bottom of the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...then yielded a Beltran sacrifice fly in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the sixth...was relieved by Rzepc-zynski with two outs in the sixth inning and the score tied 2-2.

SURKAMP vs. TORONTO: Is 0-0 with a 2.08 ERA (4.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so) in six career appearances, all in relief in 2014 while pitching for the White Sox...pitched in four consecutive games at Rogers Centre from June 26-29 (2.2 ip, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...then worked in consecutive games at U.S. Cellular Field on Aug. 16 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 2 so) and Aug. 17 when he retired the only two batters he faced (Valencia and Rasmus) by ground out (0.2 ip).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings... opponents hit .239 (17-for-81)...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco...relieved an injured Doubront to start the second inning and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits...picked up the win in the A's 4-1 victory in the final game of the spring.

MINORS: Pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts...the 12 wins were his most as a minor leaguer, as were his 11 home runs allowed...tied for third among all Triple-A pitchers in wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .264 opponents batting average, including .244 (73-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .305 (43-for-141) against left-handers...10 of the 11 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .257 batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .136 with RISP and two outs.

SPLITS: Was 7-2 with a 3.77 ERA in 18 games before the Triple-A All-Star Break, 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA in nine starts after the break...was 8-3 with a 3.40 ERA in his 16 starts compared to 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in 11 relief appearances...stranded both of his inherited runners.

THIS AND THAT: Went 3-for-16 (.188) with a double, three RBI, three walks and seven strikeouts as a hitter...tossed at least one inning in each of his 11 relief appearances, including two or more eight times...walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts.

MORE FROM THE MINORS: Began the season on the disabled list with Chicago with a right ribcage muscle strain...was reinstated April 11 and immediately optioned to Charlotte...had a 1.35 ERA in six home games with the Knights compared to 4.38 on the road...was designated for assignment April 26 and outrighted April 27...struck out a season-high seven batters in 5.0 innings in his only start with Charlotte on May 8 at Toledo... logged 3.0 perfect innings of relief against Syracuse May 16 for the win...it matched his longest outing as a reliever (May 3 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre)...was traded to the Dodgers organization May 22 for pitcher Blake Smith and was assigned to Oklahoma City...his nine wins tied for third most in the PCL beginning May 22 and his 3.57 ERA ranked ninth...was 5-1 with a 3.00 ERA in nine games at home, 4-2 with a 4.34 ERA in seven starts on the road...surrendered just one home run in 51.0 innings at home compared to seven in 37.1 innings on the road...lost each of his first two starts with Oklahoma City (12.00 ERA), his only losing streak of the season...including June 1 against Fresno when he walked a season-high five batters in 3.0 innings...went 9-1 with a 2.95 ERA over his final 14 games... was 4-0 with a 2.89 ERA over a five-start stretch from June 8 to 30... tossed his only complete game of the season June 15 at Colorado Springs, a seven-hitter in a 5-2 win that was called after six innings due to rain.. walked one and struck out a season-high tying seven ...made his only relief appearance with Oklahoma City June 20 against Memphis (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 so)...went 4-1 with a 4.06 ERA in six games, including five starts, in June...allowed a season-high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.1 innings July 28 at Memphis and took the loss...pitched 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit and one walk Aug. 17 against Tacoma, but had a no decision in a 2-1 win...that was part of a season-best 15.0-inning scoreless streak from Aug. 2 to 17...was perfect 4-0 with a 1.86 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in five starts in August...also won his only start in September, tossing a season-high 8.0 scoreless innings on the 2nd against lowa, and finished the season with a five-game winning streak over his final six starts (2.19 ERA).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-1, 2.04 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 25th of his career, all of which have come with the A's...has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts... joins John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...snapped his career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year with a win in his last start, a 5-2 A's victory at New York (AL) last Wednesday (6.1 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 8 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Detroit, a start in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit last year on June 2 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, this spring...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2).

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 13 of its first 18 games...
- that includes eight games where it has not allowed an earned run.
 Has tossed 62.0 innings, which is the most in the American League, and allowed just nine walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.31) and strikeouts per walk (5.56).
- Allowed both of its inherited runners to score Friday night...had stranded all 28 of its inherited runners entering that game, which were the most in the majors among teams that had not allowed an inherited runner to score...has now allowed 2-of-30 (6.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Leads the majors in saves (9)...ranks third in the AL in save percentage (90.0%), tied for fourth in wins (4) and is fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.276) and slugging percentage (.335)...has the fourth highest opponents batting average (.243).
- First batters faced are 15-for-54 (.278) with five walks (.339 on-base percentage)...the opponents batting average is third highest in the AL and the on-base percentage is fourth highest.

- Has not allowed a run in his past four games and 2.2 innings (2 h, 1 bb, 1 so) after yielding four runs in his first six games (5.1 ip, 6.75 ERA).
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in games pitched (10)...is also tied for second in home runs allowed (3) and ranks third in losses (2).
- His first batters faced are 4-for-8 (.500) with two walks (.600 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is second highest in the AL and the batting average is tied for fifth highest.
- Has a 6.00 ERA in 11 games in his career against the Blue Jays (9.0 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 1 ibb, 12 so, 1 hr)...allowed four runs in his first career appearance against Toronto, July 26, 2012 but has yielded just two runs in 10 games since then (8.1 ip, 2.16 ERA).
