OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-9) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (8-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost back-to-back games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are now 10-9 for the season and the 10 wins are one more than the A's April win total from last year... remain in a tie for first place in the American League West with Texas for the third consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year and five days tied for first...last year, the A's had nine days with at least a share of first place but none after April 18 (game 12)...also have four days in second this year, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (four games)...are 7-2 (.778) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors ahead of the Cubs (10-3, .769)...won each of their first seven road games this year, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's started the year at least 7-0 on the road...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...this road trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 20 runs in the three-game series at Toronto over the weekend (19 er in 25.0 ip, 6.84 ERA) after yielding 12 runs over the previous five contests (1.72 ERA)...now have a 3.30 ERA for the season, which ranks third in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.369)...have allowed eight home runs over the last five games after surrendering nine over the first 14 contests...are tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed six runs in each of the last two games (12 er in 9.2 ip, 11.17 ERA) after allowing four runs or fewer in each of the first 17 contests...now have a 3.63 ERA (43 er in 106.2 ip) for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...have issued 49 walks, which is second most in the AL (Texas, 50).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .264 (72-for-273) with 37 runs scored over their last eight games (4.63 runs per game) after hitting .212 with 29 runs scored over the first 11 contests (2.64 runs per game)...are averaging 3.47 runs per game for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have homered in four straight games (nine home runs total) after going homerless over the previous three contests...have gone back-to-back games without a double and have 21 for the season, which is second fewest in the AL...are tied for second in triples (4)...have the second lowest on-base percentage (.288) and are tied for the third fewest walks (46).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed just one error in the three game series at Toronto after making at least one miscue in each of the previous six games...have 16 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have made 585 errors over the last six seasons, which are the most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 574)...the 16 errors this year have led to seven unearned runs, which is tied with Detroit and Toronto for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 11)...rank third in double plays (23).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in one-run games...are tied with Chicago (AL) for the most one-run games in the majors and are tied with the White Sox and Reds for the most one-run wins...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat (Minnesota, 8)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 5 (.400) after starting the season 0-for-12...are 2-for-17 (.118) for the season...rank third in the

American League in pinch plate appearances (17) and have the fourth lowest batting average...have gone 267 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 14 of the last 16 games...are 9-5 (.643) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...the A's have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is the third best percentage in the American League.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: Last Tuesday, the A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...return home after this series with Detroit for six games and then travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the season series last year, 4-2...swept a three-game series in Detroit after losing two of three in Oakland...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 21-22 against the Tigers since the start of the 2010 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-242 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 109-131 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 33-25 (.569) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (San Francisco, 5-4 .556)...all-time, the A's are 917-995 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

John Axford has not allowed a run or walk in his first nine games and 10.0 innings...the innings pitched are second most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed a run (Herrera, KC 10.1 ip)...**Mark Canha** has four hits this year, three of which have been home runs...**Chris Coghlan** has homered in three of his last four games and now has four home runs, which match his most ever in a month...**Khris Davis** is 6-for-19 (.316) with two home runs and five RBI over his last five games after hitting .143 with no home runs and one RBI over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities and the seven saves are tied for the AL lead...**Marc Rzepczynski** has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history...he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-1, 2.04 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 25th of his career, all of which have come with the A's...made his Major League debut with five relief appearances for Toronto in 2014...was one of four players traded to the A's for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season.

FOUR HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts...joins John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...opponents are 10-for-63 (.159).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 0-for-10 with runners in scoring position...has a .215 (5-for-23) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .125 (5-for-40) after that...has allowed a .118 (2-for-17) batting average to hitters leading off an inning...opponents are 3-for-38 (.079) with two strikes.

LOSING STREAK SNAPPED: Picked up his first win of the season in his last start, which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on Wednesday...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

GRAVEMAN vs. DETROIT: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit last year on June 2...allowed three runs, all in the fourth inning...

one run scored on a wild pitch and he allowed a two-run single to Castellanos...the A's scored five runs in the seventh to take the lead...Scribner tossed a scoreless seventh and eighth and Clippard a scoreless ninth to earn him the win.

2015 RECAP: The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .275 (61-for-222) against lefties and .278 (65-for-234) against righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties but issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...had a .369 slugging percentage against lefties, .474 against righties...opponents hit .271 with the bases empty, .285 with runners on...10 of the 15 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .356 average against the opponents three, four and five hitters compared to .233 against all other hitters...had a .235 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .289 the second time and .317 after that.

THIS AND THAT: Was 4-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 11 starts at night, 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 10 starts during the day...was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and made his first Major League start April 9 against Texas...was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss...yielded a career-high eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut (last: Clayton Mortensen, 8 on Aug. 8, 2009 at Kansas City)...picked up the first win of his career in his next start April 14 at Houston when he combined with O'Flaherty, Otero, Abad and Clippard on an eight-hit shutout...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four of the hits...was 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA over his first four starts when he was optioned to Nashville April 26...returned to Oakland May 23 and combined with Scribner and Clippard on a six-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win that day at Tampa Bay...tossed six innings and allowed three of the hits...had a six-start streak from June 7 to July 4 where he tossed seven or more innings while allowing two runs or fewer in each start...that was the longest such streak by a rookie pitcher in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches the longest streak by any rookie over the last 20 years (Francisco Liriano, MIN 2006)...it tied for third longest by any pitcher in Oakland history and was the longest since Justin Duchscherer had an eight-game streak from June 11-July 20, 2008...went 3-2 with a 1.26 ERA during the streak...tossed his first career complete game in his ninth big league start, an eight-hitter in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) June 13...tossed a career-high 111 pitches...had a career-high three-game winning streak from June 24 to July 4...allowed just two earned runs during that three-start stretch for a 0.86 ERA...tossed seven shutout innings in back-to-back starts June 29 against Colorado and July 4 against Seattle as part of a career-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak from June 24 to July 10...finished the month of June with a 3-2 record and a 1.93 ERA in six starts...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in the month...was tagged with the loss July 10 at Cleveland to begin a season-ending five-game losing streak...spun 6.0 shutout innings in a no decision in his final start Aug. 23 against Tampa Bay...was placed on the disabled list with a strained left oblique the next day.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Rich Hill (2-2, 3.32 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his ninth in the last seven years and the 79th of his career...had his second 10-strikeout game of the season in his last start, a 7-3 A's win at New York (AL) on Thursday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 10 so)...has 29 strikeouts in 19.0 innings this year (13.74 per nine innings) and 125 strikeouts in 92.0 innings over the last four years (12.23 per nine innings)...is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in two starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA and .375 opponents average in two start at home...is 0-0 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in 13 career appearances against Detroit, all in relief...went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...began the 2015 season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 14 of its first 19 games for a 2.76 ERA (20 er in 65.1 ip), which ranks fifth in the American League... that includes nine games where it has not allowed an earned run.
- Has allowed just 2-of-31 (6.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors...allowed both of its inherited runners to score Friday night after stranding each of its first 28 inherited runners.
- Has tossed 65.1 innings, which is tied for second most in the AL, and allowed just 10 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.38) and strikeouts per walk (5.30).
- Leads the AL in saves (9), ranks third in save percentage (90.0%), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), is tied for fourth in wins (4) and is fifth in slugging percentage (.331)...has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.240).
- First batters faced are 15-for-57 (.263) with five walks (.323 on-base percentage)...the opponents batting average is third highest in the AL and the on-base percentage is fifth highest.
