OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-10) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (9-9)

TUESDAY, APRIL 26, 2016 — COMERICA PARK — 7:08 P.M. EDT LHP RICH HILL (2-2, 3.32) VS. RHP MIKE PELFREY (0-3, 3.68) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight games after a season-high sixgame winning streak (April 16-22)...the winning streak followed a seasonhigh four-game losing streak (April 11-15)...are 10-10 for the season and the 10 wins are one more than the A's April win total from last year...are .500 for the fourth time this year and have been as high as three games over .500 (10-7 on April 22) and as low as three games under .500 (4-7 on April 15)...dropped into a tie for second place in the American League West with the loss last night after three consecutive days with a share of first...trail first place Seattle by ½ game...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (0-1)...are 7-3 (.700) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League (Chicago, 8-3)...won each of their first seven road games, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's started the year at least 7-0 on the road...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...this road trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the second worst home record in the AL (Seattle, 2-5).

OFFENSE: The A's have a .288 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Philadelphia, .287)...have walked just seven times over the last four games and have 47 walks for the season, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors (Philadelphia, 46)...are batting .265 (82-for-310) with 40 runs scored over the last nine games (4.44 runs per game) after hitting .212 with 29 runs scored over the first 11 contests (2.64 runs per game)...are averaging 3.45 runs per game for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest doubles in the AL (24) but are tied for the second most triples (4)...have hit nine home runs in the last five games after going homerless over the previous three contests.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters had two hits last night and have four for the season, which ranks third in the American League...are 4 for their last 7 (.571) after starting the season 0-for-12...also rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (19)...have gone 268 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in three of the last four games but have 16 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have made 585 errors over the last six seasons, which are the most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 574)...have eight unearned runs, which is third most in the AL...rank third in double plays (23).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 27 runs over the last four games (25 er in 33.0 ip, 6.82 ERA) after yielding 12 runs over the previous five contests (1.72 ERA)...now have a 3.45 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth in the American League...have allowed 11 home runs over the last six games after surrendering nine over the first 14 contests...are tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed six runs in each of the last three games (18 er in 14.1 ip, 11.30 ERA) and have tossed five innings or fewer in each contest...allowed four runs or fewer in each of the first 17 games...now have a 3.96 ERA (49 er in 111.1 ip) for the season, which ranks ninth in the American League...have issued 50 walks, which is tied with Kansas City for second most in the AL (Texas, 52).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in onerun games but all eight of those games came over the first 14 contests... each of the A's last six games have been decided by three runs or more... are tied for the most one-run games and wins in the majors...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat (Minnesota, 9)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 15 of the last 17 games...are 9-6 (.600) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...the A's have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is tied with the Cubs for the second best percentage in the majors (Detroit, 4-for-5, 80.0%).

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: A week ago today, the A's began a stretch where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...return home after this series with Detroit for six games and then travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...Parker and R.J. Alvarez are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2016 season...John Axford and Billy Butler are signed through 2017 while Jed Lowrie is signed through 2017 with a club option for 2018...Sean Doolittle and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...in addition, Coco Crisp has a vesting option for 2017.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-2...swept a three-game series in Detroit after losing two of three in Oakland...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 21-23 against the Tigers since the start of the 2010 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 249-243 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 109-132 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 33-26 (.559) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (San Francisco, 5-4 .556)...all-time, the A's are 917-996 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

John Axford has not allowed a run or walk in his first nine games and 10.0 innings...the innings pitched are third most in the American League among relievers that have not allowed a run...*Ryan Madson* is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities and the seven saves are tied for second in the AL...*Jed Lowrie* is 12-for-26 (.462) over his last seven games... *Josh Reddick* has three straight multiple hit games (6-for-13, .462)... *Marc Rzepczynski* has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich, SF).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in **1997** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in **2001** the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (2-2, 3.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his ninth in the last seven years and the 79th of his career...was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...the A's are his seventh team and this is his 12th season in the majors...made 70 of his starts in his first five seasons with Chicago-NL (2005-08) and Baltimore (2009)...pitched exclusively in relief from 2010-14 before making four starts with Boston last year.

STRIKEOUTS: Had his second 10-strikeout game of the season and the 10th of his career in his last start...is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...is tied for sixth in the American League in strikeouts (29)...has tossed just 19.0 innings and is averaging 13.74 strikeouts per nine innings...now has 125 strikeouts in 92.0 innings over the last four years (12.23 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) and .195 (8-for-41) opponents batting average in two starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA (5 er in 7.0 ip) and .375 (12-for-32) opponents average in two start at home...has struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings in each of his first two road starts and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-toback 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

THIS AND THAT: Hit two batters in each of his first two starts this year and his four hit batters are tied for the most in the majors...has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among Major League pitchers (De La Rosa, COL; Zimmerman, DET)...has not allowed an earned run after the third inning (7.1 ip)...has a 5.40 ERA (7 er in 11.2 ip) in innings 1-3...is tied for fourth in the American League in unearned runs (3)...opponents are 2-for-14 (.143) when leading off an inning but he has walked four and hit two for a .400 on-base percentage.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third ... Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of lannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by lannetta... blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City April 15 in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) last Thursday...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the second inning but the A's tied the game in the fourth...yielded another run on a Romine RBI single in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game in the fifth and scored twice in the seventh to give him the win.

HILL vs. DETROIT: Is 0-0 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in 13 career appearances, all in relief...that includes 0-0 with a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in six games at Comerica Park and 0-0 with a 6.35 ERA (4 er in 5.2 ip) in seven games in his home ballparks...last faced Detroit on Aug. 5, 2014 at New York (AL) in a 4-3 Yankees loss in 12 innings...entered the game in the 11th inning with two outs and a runner on first and hit the only batter he faced (Carrera).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25. issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)... opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 (11-for-80) with both of his home runs against right-handed hitters compared to .158 (3-for-19) against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...had a .242 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .091 after that.

WITH BOSTON: Was selected by Boston Sept. 8 and made his first start Sept. 13 at Tampa Bay...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out 10, but had a no decision in a 2-0 Red Sox win...it was his first start since July 27, 2009 against Kansas City. joined Hideo Nomo (no-hitter, April 4, 2001) as the only pitchers in the last 100 years with 10 or more strikeouts and one hit or fewer in their first career start as a Red Sox...picked up his first win in his second start Sept. 20 at Toronto...struck out 10 in 7.0 innings again and allowed three runs in a 4-3 decision...then tossed the Red Sox only complete game shutout of the season, a two-hitter in a 7-0 win over Baltimore Sept. 25 in his only start at Fenway...walked one and struck out 10...it was his third career complete game, his first since Sept. 22, 2006 at Cincinnati...it was his second career shutout (Sept. 16, 2006 against Cincinnati)...it came in his 200th career appearance...became the first pitcher to strikeout 10 or more batters in each of his first three starts with any American League team...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the only pitcher since 1900 to make his season debut in September or later and record 10 or more strikeouts in each of his first three starts...is the fifth pitcher in Red Sox history to reach double-digits in strikeouts in at least three straight games...took the loss in his final start Oct. 1 at New York (AL)...tossed 6.0 innings to bring his career total to 500.0.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket.. struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 10.17 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .206 opponents batting average, including .190 (26-for-137) against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handers...yielded a .171 average to batters leading off an inning but issued 10 walks and hit two batters for a .358 on-base percentage.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed 9-of-23 (39.1%) inherited runners to score... tossed fewer than one inning in 13 of his 25 relief appearances with Syracuse and six or more innings in each of his five starts with Pawtucket...his longest outing as a reliever was 2.0 innings three times.

RHP Sonny Gray (3-1, 2.73 ERA): Is 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA over his first four starts and is now 10-2 with a 2.21 ERA in 14 career starts in April...the wins are second most by a Major Leaguer in April over the last three years (Greinke, 11)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 victory at Toronto last Friday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 7 so)...is now 15-6 with a 2.61 ERA in 32 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-12 with a 3.15 ERA in 36 starts at home...is 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA in two career regular season starts against Detroit...is also 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two career postseason starts and is 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA in four starts overall ... went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...allowed a .311 opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year ... went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA

 Has allowed just 2-of-33 (6.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors...allowed both of its inherited runners to score Friday night after stranding each of its first 28 inherited runners.
- Has tossed 68.2 innings, which is the third most in the AL, and allowed just 10 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.31) and strikeouts per walk (5.60).
- Tied for the AL lead in saves (9), ranks third in save percentage (90.0%), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.269) and slugging percentage (.324), and is tied for fourth in wins (4)...has the sixth highest opponents batting average (.237).
