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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-10) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (9-10)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak last night and are now 7-3 over their last 10 games...are 11-10 for the season and the 11 wins are two more than the A's April win total from last year...are in a tie for second place in the American League West for the second consecutive day after three consecutive days with a share of first...trail first place Seattle by ½ game...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, three days in third, two days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth...had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped on Saturday in Toronto...the winning streak followed a season-high four-game losing streak

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-3 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-1)...need one more win to clinch a winning record on the trip...have not finished with a winning record on a road trip longer than five games since going 5-4 on a nine-game trip to New York (AL), Baltimore and Los Angeles (AL), June 3-11, 2014...are 8-3 (.727) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League (Chicago, 9-3)...won each of their first seven road games, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's started the year at least 7-0 on the road...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...this road trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and third worst in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's did not walk last night for the first time this year...have walked just seven times over the last five games and have 47 walks for the season, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the majors...have a .288 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...are batting .267 (92-for-344) with 45 runs scored over the last 10 games (4.50 runs per game) after hitting .212 with 29 runs scored over the first 11 contests (2.64 runs per game)...are averaging 3.52 runs per game for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest doubles in the AL (25) but are tied for the second most triples (4)...have the third lowest slugging percentage (.377)...have hit 10 home runs in the last six games after going homerless over the previous three contests.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters had two hits Monday night and have four for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...are 4 for their last 7 (.571) after starting the season 0-for-12...also rank third in the AL in pinch plate appearances (19)...have gone 269 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in four of the last five games but have 16 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have eight unearned runs, which is tied for third most in the AL...rank third in double plays (25).

PITCHING: The A's held the Tigers to one run last night after allowing 27 runs over the previous four games...now have a 3.33 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...did not walk a batter last night for the first time in 2016...have allowed 11 home runs over the last seven games after surrendering nine over the first 14 contests...are tied for the Major League lead in pickoffs (3).

STARTING PITCHING: Rich Hill had the first scoreless outing by an A's starting pitcher last night after A's starters allowed six runs in each of the previous three games...starters now have a 3.73 ERA (49 er in 118.1 ip) for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...have issued 50 walks, which is third most in the AL...rank fourth in strikeouts (107).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in one-run games but all eight of those games came over the first 14 contests...each of the A's last seven games have been decided by three runs or more...are tied for the most one-run wins in the majors and are tied for

the third most games...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins and games (Minnesota, 5-5)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 16 of the last 18 games...are 10-6 (.625) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...the A's have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: The A's are in a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...return home after this series with Detroit for six games and then travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have split the first two games of 2016 after winning the season series last year, 4-2...swept a three-game series in Detroit after losing two of three in Oakland...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 22-23 against the Tigers since the start of the 2010 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-243 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 110-132 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 34-26 (.567) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (San Francisco, 5-4 .556)...all-time, the A's are 918-996 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Madson is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities and the seven saves are tied for second in the American League...**Jed Lowrie** is 13-for-30 (.433) over his last eight games...**Josh Reddick** has four straight multiple hit games (9-for-17, .529) for the second time in his career (Sept. 26, 2014-April 12, 2015)...**Marc Rzepczynski** has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich, SF)...**Marcus Semien** hit his fifth home run of the season last night, which is tied for eighth in the AL...this marks the first time he has hit more than three home runs in a month in his career.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in **1981** former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in **2002** the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-1, 2.73 ERA)

IN APRIL: Is 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA over his first four starts after going 3-0 with a 1.98 ERA in five starts in April last year...is now 10-2 with a 2.21 ERA (24 er in 97.2 ip) in 14 career starts in April...the wins are his most in any month and the ERA is second lowest to his 1.64 ERA in July...his 10 wins in April are the second most in the Majors over the last three years (Greinke, 11)...has won at least four games in a month twice in his career (5 in July, 2014; 4 in April, 2014).

HOME AND AWAY: Picked up the win in his first road start last Friday at Toronto and is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in one start on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts at home... last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 15-6 with a 2.61 ERA (62 er in 213.2 ip) in 32 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-12 with a 3.15 ERA (84 er in 239.2 ip) in 36 starts at home.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

LAST START: He picked up his third win of the season in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto last Friday...is tied for sixth in the American League in wins...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning...the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

GRAY vs. DETROIT: Is 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (14.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career regular season starts...the win came in his only outing last year, a 6-1 A's victory at Detroit June 3...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just two hits...did not allow a runner past first base...had a no decision in his other start, a 6-5 A's loss in Oakland on May 27, 2014...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Cabrera and a RBI double by J.D. Martinez but the A's tied the game with two runs in the second...allowed a solo home run to Cabrera in the third and a RBI double to Avila in the fourth but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the fourth...left after six innings with a 5-4 lead but Otero allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save and Abad was charged with a run in the eighth for the loss...is also 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career postseason starts, both in the 2013 ALDS...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win in Oakland in Game 2 on Oct. 5 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so) but had a no decision...then took the loss in the A's 3-0 loss in Game 5 in Oakland on Oct. 10 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA (27.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 24 so, 2 hr) in four starts against Detroit during the regular season and postseason.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 24...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...surrendered nine runs in his last two starts (8 er in 10.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding three in his first two (7.2 ip, 3.52 ERA)...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA and a .354 opponents batting average last spring.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...the batting average and on-base percentage were seventh lowest in Oakland history and the OPS ranked eighth...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...led the A's in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts (169), complete games (3) and walks (59).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 23-7 with a 2.43 ERA (75 er in 277.2 ip) in 42 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...broke the previous mark of 35 set by Chick Fraser in 1901...the putouts were the most by a pitcher since Kevin Brown had 41 for the Dodgers in 1999...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history (Langford, 62 in 1979) among pitchers with no errors...they were the most errorless chances by an AL pitcher since Josh Towers had 60 for Toronto in 2005...had the second most total chances among AL pitchers.

RANKINGS: Also tied for first in the AL in shutouts (2), tied for third in complete games, ranked fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.8), tied for fourth in wild pitches (13), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.667), seventh in home runs per nine innings (0.74), tied for eighth in opponents grounded into double plays (19) and tied for ninth in opponents reaching on an error (8).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His .217 opponents batting average included a mark of .208 (81-for-389) against left-handed hitters compared to .226 (85-for-376) against right-handers...it increased to .256 with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .146 with two strikes and .194 the first time through the lineup...held the number eight hitter in the batting order to a .139 batting average, which was the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualified for the ERA title...yielded a .326 average to the clean-up hitter, .203 against all other spots in the order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day compared to 9-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 22 starts at night...his day ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings and is the lowest since Tim Hudson had a 1.39 ERA in 2003.

RHP Chris Bassitt (0-1, 4.44 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his fourth during the day...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-3 A's loss at Toronto last Saturday (5.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...now has a five-game losing streak dating back to Aug. 21, 2015, which is a new career high...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four starts this year (2.59 RSA) and 18 of his 22 career starts (2.45 RSA)...is 1-1 with a 3.21 ERA in two career starts against Detroit, both while pitching for the White Sox in 2014...went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA and .263 opponents batting average in five spring training starts...last year, he split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings (0.52 per nine innings).

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 16 of its first 21 games for a 2.67 ERA (21 er in 70.2 ip), which ranks sixth in the American League...that includes 10 games in which it has allowed no earned runs.
- Has allowed just 2-of-33 (6.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors...allowed both of its inherited runners to score Friday night after stranding each of its first 28 inherited runners.
- Has tossed 70.2 innings, which is tied for the second most in the AL, and allowed just 10 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.27) and strikeouts per walk (5.90).
- Tied for the AL lead in saves (9), ranks third in save percentage (90.0%), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.268) and slugging percentage (.326), and is tied for fifth in wins (4)...has the sixth highest opponents batting average (.238).
- First batters faced are 16-for-62 (.258) with five walks (.313 on-base percentage)...the opponents batting average is fourth highest in the AL and the on-base percentage is fifth highest.

- Allowed his first run of the season last night after not allowing a run over his first nine games and 10.0 innings.
- Has not walked a batter...has thrown the most innings of any Major League reliever without issuing a walk.
- Is tied for second among American League relievers in wins (2).
- Has a 10.38 ERA in six games in his career against the Tigers (4.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 1 ibb, 5 so, 1 hr)...last night was his first appearance against Detroit since July 19, 2014.
