OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-11) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (10-10)

THURSDAY, APRIL 28, 2016 — COMERICA PARK — 1:08 P.M. EDT RHP CHRIS BASSITT (0-1, 4.44) VS. RHP ANIBAL SANCHEZ (2-2, 7.00) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the past five games but are 7-4 over their last 11 contests...are 11-11 for the season and the 11 wins are two more than the A's April win total from last year...are in a tie for third place in the American League West after spending the previous two days tied for second...trail first place Texas by one game...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, three days in third, three days tied for third, one day in fourth and three days tied for fourth...had their season-high six-game winning streak snapped last Saturday in Toronto...the winning streak followed a season-high four-game losing streak.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this 10-game road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-2)...need a win today to clinch a winning record on the trip...have not finished with a winning record on a road trip longer than five games since going 5-4 on a nine-game trip to New York (AL), Baltimore and Los Angeles (AL), June 3-11, 2014...are 8-4 (.667) on the road for the season, which is tied for the third best road record in the American League...won each of their first seven road games, marking the third time in Oakland history the A's started the year at least 7-0 on the road...went 11-0 in 1981 and 8-0 in 1990...this road trip starts a stretch that runs through May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 contests on the road...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...played 10 of their first 13 games at home...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and third worst in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have walked just seven times over the last five games and have 49 walks for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...did not walk Tuesday night for the first time this year...have a .287 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...are batting .264 (100-for-379) with 49 runs scored over the last 11 games (4.45 runs per game) after hitting .212 with 29 runs scored over the first 11 contests (2.64 runs per game)...are averaging 3.55 runs per game for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...have the third fewest doubles in the AL (27) but the second most triples (5)...have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.379)... have hit 11 home runs in the last seven games after going homerless over the previous three contests.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 8 (.500) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in pinch plate appearances (20) and are tied for third in pinch hits...have gone 270 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying two errors last night (sixth time, last: April 20 at New York) and have 18 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year... have nine unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL...rank third in double plays (26).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high tying nine runs last night (second time, also: April 23 at Toronto) and have now yielded 37 runs over the past six games (34 er in 50.0 ip, 6.12 ERA)...now have a 3.56 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...allowed a season-high seven walks last night after they did not walk a batter the previous night for the first time in 2016...have allowed 13 home runs over the last eight games after surrendering nine over the first 14 contests...are tied for second in the majors with three pickoffs (Los Angeles-AL, 4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed four or more runs in three of the past four games for an 8.49 ERA (22 er in 23.1 ip) over that span...starters now have a 3.96 ERA (53 er in 120.1 ip) for the season, which ranks sixth in the American League...have issued 54 walks, which is tied for second most in the AL.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in one-run games but all eight of those games came over the first 14 contests...each of the A's last eight games have been decided by three runs or more...are tied for the most one-run wins in the majors and are tied for

the third most games...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins and games (Minnesota, 5-5)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the American League in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the score is tied after seven innings and 3-1 when tied after eight innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 17 of the last 19 games...are 10-7 (.588) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times...the A's have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges.

THE EASTERN TIME ZONE: The A's are in a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where they are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...return home after this series with Detroit for six games and then travel to Baltimore, Boston and Tampa Bay on the next trip... after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have lost two of the first three games after winning the season series last year, 4-2...swept a three-game series in Detroit after losing two of three in Oakland...over the previous six seasons, the A's have won two season series, lost two and split two...are 22-24 against the Tigers since the start of the 2010 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 250-244 against the Tigers...that includes 138-109 in Oakland, 110-133 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 34-27 (.557) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team in this ballpark (San Francisco, 5-4 .556)...all-time, the A's are 918-997 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is 11-for-31 (.355) with three home runs and seven RBI over his last eight games after hitting .143 with no home runs and one RBI over his first 12 contests...Jed Lowrie has hit safely in each of his past six games (10-for-25, .400) and nine of his past 10 contests (16-for-38, .421)...is 10-for-18 (.556) with runners in scoring position...leads the American League and is tied for third in the majors in batting with RISP... Ryan Madson is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities and the seven saves are tied for second in the American League...Marc Rzepczynski has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich, SF).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1987 Dennis Eckersley commits an error in the A's 7-1 win over Boston...he would not commit another error for eight years, setting what was then an American League record for pitchers with 470 consecutive errorless games...in 2002 Tim Hudson and Billy Koch combine on a three-hit shutout and Eric Chavez homers and drives in four runs in the A's 10-0 win over Chicago...in 2010 Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (0-1, 4.44 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season, his fourth during the day...the four day starts tie him for second in the American League behind Anibal Sanchez, who is scheduled to make his fifth day start today...is 0-1 with a 4.44 ERA in four starts overall this year and is now 1-9 with a 3.75 ERA (46 er in 110.1 ip) in 22 career appearances with the A's.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Was the losing pitcher in his last start after beginning the season with three consecutive no decisions...now has a five-game losing streak dating back to Aug. 21, 2015, which is a new career high (previous: 4, June 30-July 30, 2015)...has a 5.25 ERA (28 er in 48.0 ip) and .288 (57-for-198) opponents batting average over that stretch, which spans nine starts.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four starts this year and his season run support average is 2.59 (7 rs in 24.1 ip)...has the fifth lowest run support in the American League...last year, he received one run of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and his season run support average as a starter was 2.15...his overall run support of 3.14 was fifth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 81 or more innings pitched...has two runs of support or fewer in 18 of his 22 career starts and his career RSA as a starter is 2.45 (35 rs in 128.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed four home runs over his first four starts and 24.1 innings (1.48 per nine innings)...last year, he allowed just five home runs in 86.0 innings for the season (0.52 per nine innings)... opponents are 5-for-25 (.200) with no walks when leading off an inning this year...has allowed a .253 opponents batting average, which includes .200 (11-for-55) against left-handed hitters compared to .318 (14-for-44) against right-handers...has issued seven of his 11 walks to lefties...last year, he had a .244 opponents batting average, including .217 (40-for-184) against lefties and .279 (38-for-136) against righties...issued 22 of his 30 walks to lefties

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Chicago (AL) April 5 in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three hits and two walks over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Frazier with two outs in the fifth inning...the A's came back with one run in the bottom of the fifth but he allowed a RBI single to Jackson in the sixth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 4-2.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning win at Seattle April 10...issued a career-high tying five walks (also Oct. 4, 2015 at Seattle)...shutout the Mariners on two hits and four walks over the first five innings before allowing an unearned run in the sixth...Cruz double with one out, went to third on a ground out and scored on a Lowrie error...Hernandez blanked the A's on three hits in seven innings, but the A's scored a run in the eighth off the Seattle bullpen to tie the game...was relieved by Madson to start the bottom of the eighth.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Kansas City April 17 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 114 pitches...allowed a RBI single to Gordon in the second and a two-out solo home run to Moustakas in the third...then blanked the Royals on two hits and a walk over his final four innings...the A's scored singles runs in the fourth and seventh innings to tie the game and he was relieved by Axford to start the eighth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-3 loss at Toronto last Saturday...allowed a career-high tying six runs on a career-high nine hits...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a Bautista RBI ground out and a Martin RBI single...also allowed a three-run home run to Donaldson in the second and a leadoff home run to Tulowitzki in the fifth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts... also pitched in a Triple-A game against the Cubs on the A's lone off day of the spring March 16...allowed a .263 (20-for-76) opponents batting average...surrendered just one home run in 19.1 innings...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...did not allow a run in his first two starts (5.0 ip), allowed nine in his next two (10.1 ip, 7.84 ERA), and one in 4.0 innings in his final start.

2015 RECAP: Split his first season in the A's organization between Oakland and Triple-A Nashville...went 1-8 despite a 3.56 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in 18 games, including 13 starts, over four stints with the A's...surrendered just five home runs in 86.0 innings for an average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings...that ranked third best in the AL among pitchers with at least 81.0 innings.

WINNING PERCENTAGE AND ERA: His .111 winning percentage was the lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 10 games started... it tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts, but was the lowest among pitchers with an ERA under 5.00...the last Major League pitcher with at least 10 starts, an ERA under 3.75 and a winning percentage of .111 or less was Zane Smith, who went 1-13 (.071) with a 3.49 ERA in 48 games, including 17 starts, for the Braves and Expos in 1989...no American League pitcher has done it since 1968 when Rickey Clark (1-11, 3.53 ERA with California) and Fred Talbot (1-9, 3.36 ERA with New York) both did it.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 1-5 with a 2.28 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in nine games in Oakland, 0-3 with a 5.12 ERA and .274 opponents average in nine games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-8 with a 3.58 ERA and .258 opponents average in his 13 starts...had no decisions, a 3.38 ERA and .135 opponents average in five relief appearances...walked 21 batters in 75.1 innings as a starter (2.51 per nine innings), nine in 10.2 innings in relief (7.59)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced were 0-for-3 with a walk and hit by pitch.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 7.62 ERA and .379 opponents batting average in the first inning compared to a 2.84 ERA and .214 opponents average from the second inning on...was 0-4 with a 5.21 ERA in 10 games against AL West competition, 1-4 with a 2.25 ERA in eight games against all other teams...the A's were 3-10 (.231) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts.

2015 WITH OAKLAND: Began the season at Nashville and was recalled by Oakland April 23...pitched exclusively in relief during his first stint and logged a 3.38 ERA in five relief appearances before he was optioned back to Nashville May 10...returned June 30 and went 0-2 with a 2.53 ERA in two start befre he was sent back to Nashville following his start July 5... was called up a third time July 11 and allowed two runs in 6.1 innings in a no decision that day at Cleveland...was optioned back to Nashville the next day but returned for good July 25... went 1-6 with a 3.86 ERA over his final 10 starts...combined with Fernando Rodriguez and Fernando Abad on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Baltimore Aug. 4 in Oakland for his first and only win as an Athletic...struck out a career-high 10 batters Aug. 9 against Houston...did not allow a run over the first five innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-7 with a 3.65 ERA and .230 opponents batting average in 13 games, including 10 starts, in his Triple-A debut with Nashville...allowed just one home run in 69.0 innings...struck out 70 batters and issued 19 walks (2.48 per nine innings) for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.68...his .230 opponents batting average included a .228 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .231 against right-handers...opponents hit .195 with the bases empty, .282 with runners on.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (0-0, --- ERA): Will be selected from Triple-A Nash-ville tomorrow and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...allowed just one run in each of his starts...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers...was 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, three starts, with the A's this spring...is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 16 of its first 22 games for a 2.93 ERA (25 er in 76.2 ip)...that includes 10 games in which it has allowed no earned runs.
- Has tossed 76.2 innings, which is the most in the American League, and allowed just 13 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.53) and ranks second in strikeouts per walk (5.15).
- Is tied for the AL lead in saves (9), ranks third in save percentage (90.0%), fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.276) and slugging percentage (.340) and is tied for fifth in wins (4)...has the fifth highest opponents batting average (.242).
- Has allowed just 2-of-33 (6.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors...allowed both of its inherited runners to score last Friday night after stranding each of its first 28 inherited runners.
- First batters faced are 16-for-64 (.250) with six walks (.314 on-base percentage)...the opponents batting average is fourth highest in the AL.
