OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-12) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (7-15)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost three of four at Detroit to start the week to fall from a tie for first place in the American League West to sole possession of fourth place...trail first place Texas by a season-high tying 1½ games... have lost five of their last six games after winning a season-high six consecutive games from April 16 to 22...are 11-12 for the season and the 11 wins are two more than the A's April win total from last year...need to win each of the two remaining games this month to avoid finishing with a losing record in April for the second consecutive season (9-14 in 2015)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, three days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Houston (three games) and Seattle (three games)...these mark the A's only six home games during a 25-game stretch from April 19 to May 15... went 2-4 on the last homestand against Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and third worst in the majors (Atlanta, 1-12; Miami, 2-7)...it matches the second worst home record after 10 games in Oakland history (fifth time, last in 2015)...have lost 18 of their last 24 home games dating back to Sept. 1, 2015...have played 38 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are now 8-5 (.615) on the road for the season...are batting .254 and are averaging 4.23 runs per game on the road compared to .207 (67-for-323) with an average of 2.60 runs per game (26 runs in 10 games) at home...in the majors, only Philadelphia (2.40) is averaging fewer runs per game at home...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have hit 17 home runs in 13 games on the road, seven in 10 games in Oakland.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in four of the last five games but have 18 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have nine unearned runs, which is tied with Detroit for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 12)...rank third in double plays (27).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six runs or more in five of the last six games and have a 6.61 ERA (36 er in 49.0 ip) over that stretch...opponents are batting .307 (62-for-202) with 11 home runs...had a 2.83 ERA, .232 opponents batting average and 12 home runs over the first 17 games...have allowed 198 hits for the second, which is second most in the American League (Houston, 220)...are tied for second in the American League in pickoffs (3).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed more runs than innings pitched in five of the last six games and have a 9.67 ERA (29 er in 27.0 ip) over that span...have allowed a .361 (44-for-122) opponents batting average and have surrendered nine home runs in 27.0 innings...had a 2.88 ERA, .230 opponents batting average and eight home runs over the first 17 games...are 7-10 for the season and the 10 losses are tied for second most in the American League...have issued 57 walks, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 58).

OFFENSE: The A's walked a season-high nine times yesterday after drawing just nine free passes total over the previous six games...have 58 walks for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...have the second lowest on-base percentage (.290)...stole a season-high tying three bases yesterday and are 14-for-17 (82.4%) for the season, which is tied for the second best percentage in the AL...are batting .231 (46-for-199) with 21 runs scored over the last six games (3.50 runs per game)... however, are 12-for-36 (.333) with RISP over that stretch...for the season, have the third lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.377), are tied for the third fewest extra base hits (58), have the fourth lowest batting average (.235), the fourth fewest runs per game (3.52) and the fourth fewest doubles (29)...have the second most triples (5).

CLOSE AND NOT CLOSE: Eight of the A's first 14 games this year were decided by one run but each of the last nine contests have been decided by three runs or more...are 3-6 in games decided by three runs or more and the losses are tied with New York for the most in the American League...the nine games are tied for third most...are 5-3 in one-run games...are

tied for the Major League lead in one-run wins and are tied for second in the AL in one-run games (Minnesota, 10)...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 9 (.444) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (21) and tied for third in pinch hits (4)...have gone 271 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors... the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 18 of the last 20 games...are 10-8 (.556) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Detroit, 4-for-5, 80.0%)...are 4-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for second in the majors in last at bat wins and games (Minnesota, 5-5)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the AL in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...last year, the team that did that the most was the Yankees with seven...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...the A's used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...won both season series in interleague play and had won each of the first three since Houston moved to the American League West in 2013...went 9-10 last year, including 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...the A's lead the all-time series 40-23 (.635), which is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 23 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 21-11 in Oakland and 19-12 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .333 (12-for-36) with three home runs and eight RBI over his last nine games after hitting .143 with no home runs and one RBI over his first 12 contests...**Jed Lowrie** has hit safely in an A's season-high tying seven consecutive games and is now batting .459 (17-for-37) with six multiple hit games over his last 10 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities and the seven saves are tied for second in the American League...**Josh Reddick** has hit safely in seven of his last eight games and is 12-for-34 (.400) with four multiple hit games over that stretch...batted .217 over his first 14 contests...**Marc Rzepczynski** has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich, SF).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-0, 1.50 ERA at Nashville)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut after just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...will become the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...the last to win was Bobby Cramer on September 13, 2010 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the previous 44 have combined for a 13-14 record and a 3.67 ERA.

2015 RECAP: Was acquired by the A's from Kansas City in the Ben Zobrist deal at the trading deadline and went 6-0 with a 1.90 ERA in seven starts with Double-A Midland...began the year in extended spring training with the Royals and combined for a 1-1 record and a 3.69 ERA in seven starts with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League, Single-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas...was 7-1 with a 2.66 ERA in 14 starts overall...struck out 90 batters in 74.1 innings (10.90 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .243 opponents batting average, including .198 (36-for-182) against right-handed hitters compared to .330 (31-for-94) against left-handers...surrendered three of his five home runs to lefties for a .511 slugging percentage...held righties to a mark of .275...opponents batted .323 with a .421 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.29 ERA in the first inning, a 4.20 ERA in innings two through four and a 0.46 ERA from the fifth inning on...his teams were 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments, including 7-0 at Midland...allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts, including no runs four times.

MORE MINORS: Made one start with the Royals affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League on June 24 against the Reds (no decision, 1.80 ERA)...was transferred to Single-A Wilmington June 29 and went 1-0 with a 3.66 ERA in four starts with the Blue Rocks...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in 3.2 innings July 9 against Frederick, but ended up with a no decision after Wilmington scored 10 times in the seventh inning for a 15-10 win...was transferred to Northwest Arkansas July 17 where he went 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA in two starts before he was traded to the A's with Aaron Brooks for Ben Zobrist and cash considerations, July 28...his six wins with Midland were the most in the Texas League following the trade...went 2-0 with a 2.89 ERA over his first three starts...then did not allow a run in three of his final four regular season starts, going 4-0 with a 1.13 ERA...tossed a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings in his first outing with Midland July 31 against Corpus Christi...allowed just three hits, did not walk a batter and struck out nine to earn Texas League Pitcher of the Week honors for the week of July 27 to Aug. 2...matched his season high by allowing 10 hits in an 8-7 win over Frisco Aug. 5...issued a season-high four walks Aug. 11 against Springfield and Aug. 22 against Tulsa...matched his season high with 7.0 scoreless innings Aug. 29 against Frisco...struck out a season-high 13 and did not walk a batter while tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his final regular season start Sept. 3 at San Antonio and earned TL Pitcher of the Week honors for a second time (Aug. 31-Sept. 7)...finished the regular season with a 15.0-inning scoreless streak...went 1-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two postseason starts for the Texas League Champion RockHounds (15.0 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 15 so)...the win came in Game 1 of the TL Championship Series against his former team, Northwest Arkansas...pitched for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League following the season and was named to the AFL Top Prospects Team after going 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six starts...led the league in strikeouts (33)...started for the East in the Nov. 7 Fall Stars Game (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 4 so)...was named AFL Pitcher of the Week Nov. 17 for his Nov. 13 start at Scottsdale (ND, 5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...has surrendered just 10 home runs (0.42 per nine innings)...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal...pitched in the Arizona Fall League in 2015 and started for the East in the AFL Fall Stars Game...led the Carolina League and the Royals farm system with 146 strikeouts in 2014...was rated as the Royals number six prospect by Baseball America following the 2013 and number three after 2014...was rated as the A's number two prospect following the 2015 season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (0-0, — ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making his 2016 debut...was 0-1 with a 2.04 ERA in four starts with the Sounds...allowed a .246 opponents batting average and issued nine walks in 17.2 innings...his last start was last Sunday against New Orleans...was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 Nashville loss (3.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 0 so)...took the loss in his only career start against Houston, a 6-1 A's loss last year on May 20 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 0-1 with an 11.15 ERA and .382 opponents batting average in five starts for the A's this spring before he was optioned to Nashville March 29...went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts in his first season with Oakland last year, a campaign that was cut short due to an injury...was placed on the disabled list July 11 retroactive to July 6 with a right forearm strain and missed the remainder of the season.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or fewer in 17 of its first 23 games for a 2.78 ERA (25 er in 81.0 ip)...that includes 11 games in which it has allowed no earned runs.
- Has tossed 81.0 innings, which is the most in the American League, and allowed just 13 walks, which is tied for the fewest in the majors... leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.67) and ranks second in strikeouts per walk (4.67).
- Is tied for the AL lead in saves (9), ranks third in save percentage (90.0%), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.334), fifth in on-base percentage (.272) and is tied for fifth in wins (4).
- Has allowed just 2-of-35 (5.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors...allowed both of its inherited runners to score a week ago tonight after stranding each of its first 28 inherited runners.
