THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: APRIL 29

2005 - For the 1st time in 113 years, a National League game features 2 starting pitchers with over 300 wins in their careers...Chicago's **Greg Maddux** edges **Roger Clemens** for a 3-2 verdict on a **Jeremy Burnitz** solo homer off Clemens in the 7th...**Jeff Bagwell** launches the 449th and final homer of his career.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Astros will continue this 6-game, 7-day, 2-city road trip with the opener of this 3-game series tonight at the Coliseum, with the 1st pitch scheduled for 9:05 p.m. CT...RHP **Mike Fiers** (2-1) will get the start for Houston opposite the A's and LHP **Sean Manaea**, who is making his Major League debut.

VS. OAK: The Astros went 10-9 against the A's last year, including a 5-5 record at the Coliseum...Houston has 2 pitchers that are former A's in RHP **Luke Gregerson** (2014) and RHP **Pat Neshek** (2012-13), while the A's have 2 former Astros on their roster in IF **Jed Lowrie** (2012, 2015) and RHP **Fernando Rodriguez** (2011-12).

THIS TRIP: This 6-game road trip marks the club's 1st trip of the season to the west coast, which has taken them through Seattle (1-2) and now to Oakland over the weekend...on this date last year, the Astros completed an 8-1 west coast road trip, that featured stops in Seattle (2-1), Oakland (3-0) and San Diego (3-0).

STOKE THE FIERS: RHP **Mike Fiers** enters tonight's game carrying a 2-game winning streak, which included a victory in his last start on Saturday vs. BOS (2ER/5.1IP)...if he pitches the Astros to a win today, it would mark the Astros 1st time to win 1 of his starts against Oakland (0-3 so far) and would give Houston their 1st pair of back-to-back wins this season.

WEDNESDAY IN SEATTLE: The Astros salvaged the finale of their 3-game series in Seattle on Wednesday with a 7-4 victory behind a big day from 2B **Jose Altuve** (3x5, HR, 2RBI)...RHP **Collin McHugh** (2-3) pitched well enough and the Astros went 5x10 with runners ins scoring position to pick up the much-needed win.

RACKING UP WINS: RHP **Collin McHugh** has won 32 games over the last 3 seasons (2014-16), including a 19-win season in 2015...since Aug. 1, 2014, McHugh ranks 2nd in the Majors in wins.

BACK ON TRACK: The Astros bullpen has posted a 3.18 ERA (20ER/56.2IP) over their last 18 games since April 9...this followed a rough early stretch, in which the bullpen allowed 16 earned runs in their first 16.2 innings pitched (8.64 ERA) in their first 4 games.

STRONG-WILLED: Since allowing a run in his 1st outing of the season, RHP **Will Harris** has ran off 9 consecutive scoreless appearances (9.2IP), while allowing just 1 walk and 6 hits in that time frame.

INJURY UPDATES: CF **Carlos Gomez** was lifted from Wednesday night's game after being hit by a pitch and diagnosed with a right hand contusion...X-rays on the hand came back negative and he is day to day...RHP **Lance McCullers**, who's on the DL with right shoulder soreness, threw 3.0 innings in an extended Spring Training game on Wednesday, and is expected to be assigned to an affiliate shortly to continue his rehab process.

TEAM RANKINGS: Among American League teams, the Astros rank 2nd in extra-base hits (77) and in stolen bases (20), while ranking 3rd in home runs (28).

ELIAS SAYS: 2B **Jose Altuve** currently leads the American League with 9 steals, while ranking 2nd in slugging (.659), trailing only 3B **Manny Machado** (.678)...Altuve has an outside shot of finishing the month leading both categories, which would make him the 1st player to lead his league in steals and slugging in the month of April since OF **Lou Brock** did so for the Cardinals in 1967.

SPECIAL OPS: 2B **Jose Altuve** comes into tonight leading the AL in OPS (1.081), while ranking 2nd in OBP (.422) and in slugging (.659).

COLBY JACK: LF **Colby Rasmus** is the 1st Astros player to hit 7 home runs thru the club's first 22 games of a season since 2006, when 3B **Morgan Berg** and 1B **Lance Berkman** each had 9...Berkman finished with 45 home runs that season, while Ensberg finished with 23.

ON-BASE STREAKS: 2B **Jose Altuve** (19g) and RF **George Springer** (13g) are both riding lengthy on-base streaks, with Altuve's 19-game streak tying as the 4th-longest in the Majors this season...Altuve's streak is the 2nd-longest in his career, while Springer has reached base safely in 50 of his last 54 games, dating back to June 27, 2015.

KING OF THE COLISEUM: 2B **Jose Altuve** has hit safely in 26 of his 29 career games at the Coliseum, which included a 20-game hitting streak at the stadium from Sept. 5, 2013-Aug. 9, 2015...among players with at least 125 plate appearances at the Coliseum, Altuve's .346 (44x127) career average at the stadium ranks 2nd in Coliseum history, trailing only **Ichiro Suzuki** and his .358 mark (167x467).

BALLPARK PASS: Following this series, the Astros will return to Houston for a 10-game homestand, which ties as their longest homestand of the season...fans can catch 7 of the next 10 games at home with the Astros Ballpark Pass for May, a ticket special which gets fans entrance to all 10 Monday-Thursday home games in May for just \$49...the sale ends on Sunday May, 1 at 5 p.m. CT. and can be accessed at www.astros.com/ballparkpass.

LAST APP - 4/23 VS. BOS: earned his 2nd straight win...allowed 2 runs on 5 hits in 5.1 innings, striking out 6...after allowing the first 3 batters he faced to reach base (single, walk, RBI-single), settled down to retire 15 of the next 16 Red Sox hitters from the 1st-5th innings...loaded the bases in the 6th but only 1 run scored as **RHP Will Harris** (0ER/0.2IP) was able to escape the jam.

ABOUT FIERS: 30-year-old starter is making his 5th start in his 2nd season with Houston...was acquired via trade with **OF Carlos Gomez** from Milwaukee prior to the 2015 trade deadline...Houston gave up 4 prospects in the deal.

- in 13 starts as an Astro, has gone 4-2 with a 3.52 ERA (31ER/79.1IP) and 70 strikeouts.

THIS SPRING: went 0-0 with a 4.91 ERA (12ER/22IP) and 19 strikeouts in 6 games (5 starts) in Spring Training...did earn a 4.0 inning save on March 27 at DET...led the club in innings pitched this spring.

IN 2015: made 10 appearances (9 starts) with Houston last season, going 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA (23ER/62.1IP) and 59 strikeouts...following his trade to Houston, ranked 3rd among AL pitchers in opponent batting average (.197) and 11th in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (min. 60IP).

- completed his 1st full season in the Major Leagues with Houston and Milwaukee, setting single-season career highs in starts, innings and strikeouts.

FANNING THE FIRE: since making his MLB debut in 2011, ranks 10th among all Major League pitchers in strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (8.98, min. 425IP)...trails only **Darvish, Strasburg, Sale, Scherzer, Kershaw, Kluber, Harvey, Liriano** and **Archer** in that span.

- was 1 of 21 Major League starting pitchers last season to post a strikeouts per 9.0 innings mark above 8.90 (180SO/180.1IP for an 8.98 SO/9)...was the only pitcher out of that group with an average fastball velocity below 90 miles per hour (89.4 mph).

- only 1 other starting pitcher over the last 11 seasons (since 2005) produced a strikeouts per 9.0 innings mark above 8.90 while averaging less than 90 miles per hour on his fastball (min. 180IP): **RHP Jered Weaver** in 2010 (9.35 K/9, 89.9 mph).

IMMORTALIZED: threw the 1st no-hitter in the history of Minute Maid Park last season in what was his 3rd start with the Astros (Aug. 21 vs. LAD)...threw 134 pitches in the outing, striking out 10 and walking 3.

- was also his 1st career complete game, and 7th double-digit strikeout game...retired the last 21 batters he faced...was named the **AL Player of the Week** following his performance.

- marked the 11th no-hitter in club history and 10th individual no-hitter.

YOU SHALL NOT PASS: has walked only 3 batters in his 4 starts combined...his 3 walks rank T-3rd among ML starters with at least 15.0 innings pitched this season behind only **Jhoulys Chacin** and **Jake Peavy** (both 2 walks).

VS. OAK: will be making his 1st start this season, and 4th of his career vs. Oakland tonight...all 3 of his previous outings vs. the A's came in 2015, going 0-1 with a 3.57 ERA (7ER/17.2IP)...despite 2/3 of his outings being quality starts, the Astros have not won a game vs. OAK that was started by Fiers.

LAST APP - 4/24 VS. BOS: in his 6th relief appearance this season, pitched 3.1 scoreless innings, giving up only 3 hits with no walks and 2 strikeouts...entered the game with 2 men on and 1 out in the 5th and stranded both.

ABOUT DEVENSKI: 25-year-old is set to make his 1st Major League start, in only his 1st season in the bigs...prior to 2016, spent parts of 5 minor league seasons with the Houston organization...went 33-24 with a 4.37 ERA (221ER/455.1IP) in 111 appearances (64 starts) in that span.

- was selected to the Astros Major League roster on April 7...was slated to start for Triple A Fresno on their Opening Day on that day but instead joined the Major League team.

THIS SPRING: was a non-roster invitee at Astros Spring Training camp...went 1-0 with an 0.87 ERA (1ER/10.1IP) and 15 strikeouts in 4 appearances (1 start).

SWEET RELIEF: since being called up on April 7, has made 6 relief appearances, posting a 0.66 ERA (1ER/13.2IP)...5 of his 6 appearances were scoreless...inherited 5 runners, allowing only 6 to score.

- 3 of his 6 appearances have been at least 3.0 innings or more...is one of only 9 relievers since 2010 to post 3 relief apps. of 3.0 innings or more in his 1st 6 ML games.

- he ranks 3rd all Major League relievers in ERA (min. 10IP), while ranking T-3rd among AL relievers in innings pitched.

- went 3x5 with 2 doubles and hit his 3rd leadoff homer of the season on Wed. at SEA...marked the 7th leadoff homer of his career...is the 1st Astros player to record 3 leadoff home runs in a single season in the month of April...his 17 extra-base hits this month are the 2nd-highest total in a single month in his career, trailing only his 2015 September (19 extra-base hits).
- has reached base safely in 19 straight games...this ties as the 4th-longest on-base streak in the Majors this season and is the 2nd-longest streak in his career (29 games from Aug. 1-Sept. 1, 2015)...in the streak, is hitting .351 (27x77) with a .438 OBP.
- per Baseball-Reference, leads all MLB position players in WAR (1.8)...also leads the MLB in steals (9, is 9-for-10) and ranks T-2nd in runs scored (20)...among AL hitters, ranks 1st in OPS (1.081), while ranking 2nd in OBP (.422) and in slugging (.659).
- has been a much more patient hitter this season compared to last...his swing % is down to 39.8% from 52.2% in 2015...he has swung at less pitches out of the strike zone (20.6% from 37.7% in '15) and has increased his walk rate (10.8% from 4.8% in '15).
- named the **AL Co-Player of the Week** for the 2nd week of the season along with **Mark Trumbo** was his 2nd career Player of the Week award.
- leads MLB in batting avg. vs. LHP's (.354, 263x742) since his debut season of 2011.

- ranks T-2nd in the AL in triples...became the 2nd catcher since 2000 to record 2 triples within his club's first 9 games of a season, joining **J.P. Arencibia** (2011 with TOR).
- has recorded 151 extra-base hits as a catcher, which ranks 3rd in club history behind **Brad Ausmus** (222) and **Alan Ashby** (210)...ranks 2nd in club history for HR by a catcher (48), trailing **Ashby** (69)...is 1 of 3 AL catchers with 10+ HR in each of the last 3 years (2013-15), along with **Salvador Perez** and **Yan Gomes**.
- has been the top pitch framing catcher in the game this season...per Baseball Prospectus, leads all ML catchers in framing runs (4.9)...**Caleb Joseph** and **Yasmani Grandal** rank 2nd with 2.1.

- has just 120 Major League games under his belt, but is on an historic pace...his 25 homers are more than any Major League shortstop has recorded through 120 games in MLB history...his 77 RBI rank 3rd behind **Glenn Wright** (82, 1924) and **Vern Stephens** (79, 1941-42).
