OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-12) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (7-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight to start the homestand after losing five of the last six games on the last road trip...are in third place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 1½ games for the third consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, five days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and three days tied for fourth...have been exactly .500 six times...have been as high as three games over .500 (10-7 on April 22) and as low as three games under .500 (4-7 on April 15).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won the first two games of this series and have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...currently have a streak of 38 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Houston (2-0) and Seattle (three games)...now have a season-high four-game home winning streak after losing seven of the first eight home games...are 5-7 at home, which is tied for the third worst home record in the American League...this homestand marks the A's only six home games during a 25-game stretch from April 19 to May 15...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 8-5 (.615) on the road...are batting .254 and are averaging 4.23 runs per game on the road compared to .216 (83-for-384) with an average of 2.92 runs per game (35 runs in 12 games) at home...have the third lowest batting average and third fewest runs scored at home in the AL.

IN APRIL: The A's went 13-12 in the month of April, which marks the third time in the last four years the A's have finished with a winning record in April...the 13 wins were four more than the A's April total from a year ago...the offense walked just 62 times, which were the fewest in the month of April in Oakland history (minimum 20 games)...had a .291 on-base percentage, which was fifth lowest in April in Oakland history...recorded 10 saves, which matched the 1989 club for second most in April in Oakland history (14 in 1988).

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Hahn became the A's seventh different starting pitcher in seven days yesterday...the seven starting pitchers used by Oakland this year are tied for the most in the majors (BAL, CIN, COL, MIN, SD)...Hahn became the second A's starter in the last five games to not allow a run...however, Oakland starting pitchers have a 5.55 ERA (15 er in 24.1 ip) over that span...have a 7.68 ERA (33 er in 38.2 ip), .319 (51-for-160) opponents batting average and 10 home runs allowed over the last eight games...compiled a 2.88 ERA, .230 opponents batting average and eight home runs over the first 17 contests...are 8-10 for the season and the 10 losses are tied for third most in the American League...have issued 63 walks, which is second most in the AL (KC, 65)...the A's are 5-0 when their starting pitcher goes at least seven innings.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their first shutout of the season yesterday...however, have allowed six runs or more in five of the last eight games and have a 5.37 ERA (40 er in 67.0 ip) over that stretch...opponents are batting .280 (73-for-261) with 12 home runs...had a 2.83 ERA, .232 opponents batting average and 12 home runs over the first 17 games...rank second in the majors with four pickoffs (LAA, 5).

OFFENSE: After shutting out the Astros yesterday, the A's are now the only American League team that has not been shutout...are one of four Major League teams (COL, PHI, PIT)...are batting .258 (122-for-472) with 61 runs scored over the last 14 games (4.4 runs per game) after hitting .210 with 29 runs over the first 11 contests (2.6 runs per game)...have a .291 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...are tied for the third fewest walks in the American League (62) and have the fourth fewest doubles (34)...however, are tied for the second most triples (5) and have the fourth best batting average with runners in scoring position (.260)...have hit 15 home runs in the last 10 games after hitting 12 over the first 15 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 19 errors, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have nine unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 15)...are tied for second in double plays (31).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 (.625) in one-run games...rank second in the American League in wins and also have the second best record...all eight one-run games came over the A's first 14 contests...each of the last 15 games have been decided by two runs or more...had their first walk-off win of the season Friday night to improve to 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the five wins are tied with Minnesota and Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and the seven games are tied for second most to the Twins (10)...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the AL in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 9 (.444) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the AL in plate appearances (22) and tied for third in pinch hits (4)...have gone 273 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have an 8-3 record on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-9 from Monday through Thursday...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 20 of the last 22 games...are 12-8 (600) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...have been successful in 3-of-4 (75.0%) replay challenges, which is the third best percentage in the majors (Chicago-NL and Detroit, 4-for-5, 80.0%)...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...last year, the A's had at least eight players on the DL 54 days with a season-high of 11 from May 22-24...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have won the first two games of 2016 after losing the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...won both season series in interleague play and had won each of the first three since Houston moved to the American League West in 2013...went 9-10 last year, including 5-5 in Oakland and 4-5 in Houston...the A's lead the all-time series 42-23 (.646), which is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 40 or more times...12 of the A's 23 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-11 in Oakland and 19-12 in Houston.

Jed Lowrie is batting .419 (18-for-43) with six multiple hit games over his last 12 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and is tied for the American League lead in saves...**Marc Rzepczynski** has stranded all 10 of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich, SF).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991** Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992** Rickey Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356th as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (3-2, 2.42 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season but his first during the day...it is his 10th start in the last seven years and the 80th of his career...was signed by the A's as a free agent, Nov. 20, 2015...the A's are his seventh team and this is his 12th season in the majors...made 70 of his starts in his first five seasons with Chicago-NL (2005-08) and Baltimore (2009)...pitched exclusively in relief from 2010-14 before making four starts with Boston last year.

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (5 er in 23.1 ip) and .244 (21-for-86) opponents batting average over his last four starts...has struck out 34 batters over that span (13.11 per nine innings)...allowed four runs, two earned, in 2.2 innings in his first start on April 4 against Chicago, an Opening Day assignment where he placed an ill Sonny Gray.

STRIKEOUTS: Ranks fourth in the American League in strikeouts (37)...the 37 strikeouts were the fifth best April total in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 133 strikeouts in 99.0 innings over the last four years (12.09 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-2 with a 6.43 ERA (5 er in 7.0 ip) and .375 (12-for-32) opponents average in two start at home compared to 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) and .185 (12-for-65) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for sixth in the American League in wins (3)...ranks second in most pitches per inning (18.5), tied for fourth in unearned runs (3) and fifth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.35)...is tied for the Major League lead in hits batters (4) and is tied for the lead among ML pitchers in errors (2)...has not allowed an earned run after the third inning (11.1 ip)...has a 4.29 ERA (7 er in 14.2 ip) in innings 1-3...is 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) in his other three starts...opponents are 4-for-21 (.190) when leading off an inning but he has walked four and hit two for a .370 on-base percentage.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by Iannetta...blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City April 15 in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the second inning but the A's tied the game in the fourth...yielded another run on a Romine RBI single in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game in the fifth and scored twice in the seventh to give him the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Detroit last Tuesday...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...allowed just one run base runner as far as second base...retired each of the last seven batters he faced, 11 of the last 12 and 18 of the last 20.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25...issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)...opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20...allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 (11-for-80) with both of his home runs against right-handed hitters compared to .158 (3-for-19) against left-handers...yielded a .154 average with runners in scoring position...had a .242 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .091 after that.

WITH BOSTON: Was selected by Boston Sept. 8 and made his first start Sept. 13 at Tampa Bay...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out 10, but had a no decision in a 2-0 Red Sox win...it was his first start since July 27, 2009 against Kansas City...picked up his first win in his second start Sept. 20 at Toronto...struck out 10 in 7.0 innings again...then tossed the Red Sox only complete game shutout of the season, a two-hitter in a 7-0 win over Baltimore Sept. 25 in his only start at Fenway...walked one and struck out 10...it was his third career complete game, his first since Sept. 22, 2006 at Cincinnati...it was his second career shutout (Sept. 16, 2006 against Cincinnati)...it came in his 200th career appearance...took the loss in his final start Oct. 1 at New York (AL).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse...was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 10.17 per nine innings...allowed a .206 opponents batting average, including .190 against right-handed hitters compared to .250 against left-handers.

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-2, 4.03 ERA): Allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings in his last start after allowing four runs on 10 hits in 17.2 innings over his first three starts...surrendered three home runs in his last start after yielding two over his first three...has received no run support in two of his four starts and three runs of support in his other two...his season run support average is 2.42...is 1-11 in 15 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 A's loss at Detroit on Monday (4.2 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 3 hr)...is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (10.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 0 hr) in three career appearances, including one start, against Seattle...went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, this spring...led the A's and ranked seventh in the Cactus League in innings pitched (26.2).

- Has tossed 87.1 innings, which is the most in the AL, and allowed just 17 walks, which is the fewest in the majors...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.75) and ranks second in strikeouts per walk (4.53).
- Has allowed just 4-of-41 (9.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Leads the majors in saves (10) and ranks second in save percentage (90.9%)...ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (10), third in on-base percentage (.271), tied for third in wins (5), tied for fourth in fewest home runs (6), fifth in slugging percentage (.331) and tied for fifth in strikeouts (77).
