### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-13) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (13-11)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three from Houston to start the homestand after losing five of the last six games on the last road trip...are now 13-13, which marks the seventh time this year the A's have been exactly .500... have been as high as three games over .500 (10-7 on April 22) and as low as three games under .500 (4-7 on April 15)...are in third place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Texas by a season-high tying 1½ games for the fourth consecutive day... have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, six days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's lost to Houston yesterday, 2-1...it was their first one-run decision since April 19, a span of 15 consecutive games decided by more than one run...are now 5-4 (.556) in one-run games...rank second in the American League in one-run wins (Chicago, 6) and tied for third in one-run games...lost 13 of their first 14 one-run decisions last year and did not win their fifth one-run game until June 16 (number six came on June 21)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year to set Oakland records for lowest winning percentage and most losses in one-run games...had their first walk-off win of the season Friday night to improve to 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the five wins are tied with Cincinnati, Minnesota and Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and the seven games are tied for third...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the AL in extra inning wins (Seattle, 3)...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's had their season-high four-game home winning streak snapped yesterday...are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (three games)...are 5-8 at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Cleveland, 3-5)...have a streak of 39 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...this homestand marks the A's only six home games during a 25-game stretch from April 19 to May 15...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 8-5 (.615) on the road...begin a nine-game road trip to Baltimore (three games), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) on Friday...are batting .254 and are averaging 4.23 runs per game on the road compared to .217 (91-for-419) with an average of 2.77 runs per game (36 runs in 13 games) at home...have the third lowest batting average and third fewest runs scored at home in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed two hits and lost yesterday, marking the eighth time in Oakland history the A's allowed two hits or fewer in a game and lost (last: April 23, 2015 at Los Angeles-AL)...however, walked seven batters and have now issued 87 free passes for the season, which is third most in the American League...have a 2.00 ERA (6 er in 27.0 ip) and .151 (13-for-86) opponents batting average over the first three games of the homestand after logging a 6.61 ERA and .307 opponents average over the final six games of the last road trip...have four pickoffs, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 5)

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-6 with a 7.05 ERA (35 er in 44.2 ip) and .296 (53-for-179) opponents batting average over the last nine games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 8-11 for the season, and the 11 losses are tied with Minnesota for second most in the American League (Houston, 13)...are tied with Kansas City for the most walks (67)...Sean Manaea and Jesse Hahn became the A's sixth and seventh different starting pitchers this year on Friday and Saturday...the seven starters are tied with Baltimore and Minnesota for the most in the AL...have surrendered 14 home runs over the last 14 games after allowing five over the first 12 contests...the A's are 5-0 when their starting pitcher goes at least seven innings.

**OFFENSE:** After shutting out the Astros Saturday, the A's are now the only American League team that has not been shutout...are one of four Major League teams that have not been blanked (COL, PHI, PIT)...are batting .256 (130-for-507) with 62 runs scored over the last 15 games (4.1 runs per game) after hitting .210 with 29 runs over the first 11 contests (2.6 runs per game)...have a .289 on-base percentage, which is second lowest in the majors...have the third fewest walks in the AL (63), the fourth fewest

doubles (35) and the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.380)...however, are tied for the second most triples (5)...have hit 15 home runs in the last 11 games after hitting 12 over the first 15 contests.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors over the last 10 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for sixth in the majors in errors (19)...led the majors with 45 errors this spring and 126 last year...have nine unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 15)...rank second in double plays (32).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 9 (.444) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the AL in plate appearances (22) and tied for third in pinch hits (4)...have gone 274 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 0-3 on Monday and are one of three American League teams that are winless on Monday (Kansas City, 0-2; Cleveland, 0-1)...began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 21 of the last 23 games...are 12-9 (571) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...have been successful in 3-of-5 (60.0%) replay challenges...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...last year, the A's had at least eight players on the DL 54 days with a season-high of 11 from May 22-24...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**IN APRIL:** The A's went 13-12 in the month of April, which marks the third time in the last four years the A's have finished with a winning record in April...the 13 wins were four more than the A's April total from a year ago...the offense walked just 62 times, which were the fewest in the month of April in Oakland history (minimum 20 games)...had a .291 on-base percentage, which was fifth lowest in April in Oakland history...recorded 10 saves, which matched the 1989 club for second most in April in Oakland history (14 in 1988).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Seattle in the second series of the season...have now won five of their last six games against the Mariners, all in Seattle...have a four-game losing streak in Oakland, which is the A's second longest home losing streak against the Mariners (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...10 of the A's last 16 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 18 of the last 25 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 47-51 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 330-258 against Seattle...that includes 179-114 in Oakland, 150-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** is batting .404 (19-for-47) over his last 13 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and is tied for the American League lead in saves...**Marc Rzepczynski** has stranded all 11 of his inherited runners, which are second most in the majors among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score (Osich SF, 12).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2001** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Toronto...Miguel Tejada homers twice and drives in four runs...in **2012** Brian Fuentes records the 200th save of his career in the A's 4-2 win at Boston...he becomes the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 save plateau.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (1-2, 4.03 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and the 26th of his career, all of which have come with the A's...made his Major League debut with five relief appearances for Toronto in 2014...was one of four players traded to the A's for Josh Donaldson following the 2014 season.

**FIRST THREE STARTS, LAST ONE:** Allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings in his last start after allowing four runs on 10 hits in 17.2 innings over his first three starts...surrendered three home runs in his last start after yielding two over his first three...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received no run support in two of his four starts and three runs of support in his other two...his season run support average is 2.42 (6 rs in 22.1 ip)...last year, he was 1-9 in 13 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 5-0 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...his career numbers are 1-11 in 15 starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-1 with a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) and .167 (7-for-42) opponents batting average in two starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) and .289 (13-for-45) opponents average in two starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 2-for-15 (.133) with runners in scoring position...has held left-handed hitters to a .179 (7-for-39) batting average, compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...however, has issued five of his seven walks to lefties...last year he issued 24 of his 38 walks to lefties...has allowed a .136 (3-for-22) batting average to hitters leading off an inning and has issued two walks for a .208 on-base percentage...opponents are 5-for-46 (.109) with two strikes.

**LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Picked up his first win of the season April 20 at New York (AL), which snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to last year...that was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012...compiled a 5.04 ERA and .267 opponents batting during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from July 10, 2015 to April 12, 2016.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...shutout the White Sox on two hits over the first five innings, but Mat Latos blanked the A's on one hit over the first six innings...the scored was tied at 0-0 when he walked Cabrera to lead off the sixth...Abreau followed with a two-run home run and Graveman left after 5.1 innings trailing 2-0.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning...walked Pujols to start the inning and Calhoun singled him over to third...Simmons then grounded into a double play and Graveman was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the A's leading 3-1...Oakland built a 4-1 lead before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...allowed a one-out solo home run to Gregorius in the second inning, but that was the only run he would surrender in 6.1 innings of work...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit a week ago today...allowed a career-high 10 hits, including a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered single runs in each of the first two innings on a Cabrera home run in the first and an Aviles RBI single in the second...then yielded a three-run home run to Cabrera followed by a solo home run by Victory Martinez in the fifth and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

**2015 RECAP:** The rookie right-hander went 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA in 21 starts over two stints with the A's before his season ended in late August due to an oblique injury...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-2 with an 8.27 ERA in four starts before he was optioned to Nashville April 26...was brought back May 23 and went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over his first nine starts following his return...then went 0-5 with a 5.82 ERA over his final eight starts beginning July 10...was placed on the 15-day disabled list Aug. 24 with a strained left oblique.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started (21), ranked fifth in innings pitched (115.2), ninth in strikeouts (77) and tied for ninth in wins...had one of seven complete games by an AL rookie.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .275 (61-for-222) against lefties and .278 (65-for-234) against righties...surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs to righties...had a .369 slugging percentage against lefties, .474 against righties...opponents hit .271 with the bases empty, .285 with runners on...10 of the 15 home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .356 average against the opponents three, four and five hitters compared to .233 against all other hitters...had a .235 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .289 the second time and .317 after that.

**THIS AND THAT:** Was 4-4 with a 3.22 ERA in 11 starts at night, 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 10 starts during the day...walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his 21 starts.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Went 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA in four starts with Nashville...allowed one home run in 24.1 innings...held the opposition to a .213 batting average, including .118 (4-for-34) against left-handed hitters compared to .267 (16-for-60) against right-handers...allowed five runs in 5.0 innings in his first start for the loss...then went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA over his final three starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Sonny Gray (3-2, 3.81 ERA):</b> Allowed just one run on three hits in 7.0 innings in his first start for the win...is 2-2 with a 4.64 ERA and .259 opponents batting average in four starts since then...is 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA in three starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 7.00 ERA in two starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-4 A's loss at Detroit last Wednesday (2.0 ip, 2 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...is 4-1 with a 2.14 ERA (59.0 ip, 46 h, 18 r, 14 er, 18 bb, 54 so, 4 hr) in nine career starts against Seattle...had no decisions and a 1.35 ERA in two starts last year...the bullpen blew the save in both games...went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts during the spring...allowed a .311 opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...was named to his first American League All-Star Team last year...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 10-for-11 (90.9%)

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in its past four games and 13.2 innings...has now allowed one run or fewer in 20 of its first 26 games, including 14 games where it has not yielded an earned run...has a 2.49 ERA overall, which ranks fourth in the American League.
- Has tossed 90.1 innings, which is the most in the AL, and allowed just 20 walks, which is tied for second fewest...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.99) and ranks third in strikeouts per walk (4.05).
- Has allowed just 4-of-42 (9.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Leads the majors in saves (10) and ranks second in save percentage (90.9%)...ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.271) and grounded into double plays (11), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in slugging percentage (.323) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (6).

- Has not walked a batter and his 12.1 innings pitched are the most in the majors among relievers that have not issued a walk.
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in wins (2).
- Has a win in two games against the Mariners (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is 1-0 with three saves, no blown saves and a 1.74 ERA (2 er in 10.1 ip) in 10 games in his career.
