### 2015:

- **The Totals** – Was 0-0 with a 10.12 ERA (6 ER, 5.1 IP) with 3 strikeouts in 6 relief appearances with Baltimore.
- **Major League Recap:** Had his contract purchased by Baltimore on Sept. 1...allowed runs in 3 of 6 relief appearances the rest of the season...longest outing was 1.2 IP on Sept. 6 at TOR.
- **Pride of Baltimore** – Teamed with former Oriole and current Mariners catcher Steve Clevenger on Sept. 1 vs. TB to form an all-Baltimore-native battery for the 2nd time in Orioles club history (also: Johnson-Clevenger, 9/21/13 at TB).
- **Minor Work:** Spent most of the season as a long reliever with Norfolk (AAA)...was 4-1-1 with a 2.30 ERA (14 ER, 54.2 IP) with 67 strikeouts and 16 walks in 32 games (3 starts).
- **Throwin' Strikes:** Averaged 11.03 K/9.0 IP (67 K, 54.2 IP)...posted a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.19 (67 K, 16 BB).
- **Strong Start:** Posted a 0.57 ERA (1 ER, 15.2 IP) in his first 9 appearances (all in relief), including a streak of 13.2 consecutive scoreless innings over 8 outings (4/12 - 5/8/15).
- **What A Relief:** Worked 2.0 or more IP in 16 of 29 relief appearances.
- **Keeping It In The Park:** Allowed just 2 home runs in 54.2 IP with Norfolk.
- **Do The Splits:** Left-handed batters hit .197 (15x76) vs. Johnson while right-handed batters hit .237 (28x118)...opponents hit .222 (43x194) overall.
- **Injury Update:** Was on the DL with an oblique strain from June 18- July 4.

**PERSONAL:** Steven David Johnson...graduated from St. Paul's High School in Baltimore in 2005...was selected to Baltimore's All-Metro team all 4 years in high school, the 1st player in the 50+ year history of that honor to accomplish the feat...helped St. Paul's win their 1st ever MIAA "A Conference" Championships in freshman and sophomore years... is the son of former ML pitcher and current Orioles television analyst Dave Johnson, who was 22-25 in 77 ML games with PIT (1987), BAL (1989-91), and DET (1993).

**2005:** Pitched in 6 games (3 starts) for the GCL Dodgers (Rookie) in 1st pro season.

**2006:** Led the Pioneer League in strikeouts (86) at Ogden (Rookie)...was named league pitcher of the week, 6/26-7/2.

**2007:** Made 16 starts for Great Lakes...was 3-6 with a 4.85 ERA (44 ER, 81.1 IP).

**2008:** Went 9-2 in 13 starts at Great Lakes (Low-A) to earn starting assignment for East in Midwest League All-Star Game...was promoted to Inland Empire on 6/25 and made 11 starts the rest of season.

**2009:** Opened season at Inland Empire (High-A) in Dodgers system...was promoted to Chattanooga (AA) and made 2 starts before trade to BAL on 7/30...spent rest of season at Bowie...was named Eastern League pitcher of the week, 8/31-9/7 (2-0, 1.42 in 2 starts).

**2010:** Tied for the Eastern League lead in games started (28) and finished 5th in strikeouts (128) at Bowie...Led the Baysox in starts (28), innings pitched (145.0) and strikeouts (128)...struck out season-high 10, 7/20 against Binghamton.

**2011:** Split season between Norfolk and Bowie (AA)...was tied for 3rd in games started (17) and 4th in innings (87.1) and strikeouts (63) on Baysox staff...pitched for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League, posting a 2.96 ERA in 8 starts.

**2012:** Made 12 appearances (4 starts) in 4 different stints with the Orioles (7/2-3, 7/15, 8/8-9 & 8/14-end of season)...made his Major League debut on 7/15 vs. DET, worked 2.0 IP in relief...won his 1st ML start, 8/8 vs. SEA (2 ER, 6.0 IP), 23 years to the day after his father, Dave, made his 1st career start in BAL...was 3-0 with a 2.86 ERA (7 ER, 22.0 IP) in 4 starts

and 1-0, 1.10 (2 ER, 16.1 IP) in 8 relief outings...was just 5th Oriole ever to start ML career at 4-0 or better...did not allow a hit to opponents in 24 PA (3 BB) with RISP.

- **The Totals** – Was 3-1 with three saves and a 4.34 ERA (14 ER, 29.0 IP) with 24 strikeouts in 33 relief appearances with Los Angeles (NL).
- **Perfect Start** – Was 3-for-3 in save opportunities to begin the season.
- **Scoreless Streak:** Posted 5.2 scoreless innings of relief over his first seven appearances (April 6-23).
- **Rough Stretch:** After being activated from 15-day disabled list (neck strain) June 22, was 1-1 with a 7.53 ERA (12 ER, 14.1 IP) in 18 relief appearances (June 23-Aug. 9).
- **Second DL Stint:** Placed on the 15-day DL August 11-Sept. 1 with a neck sprain.

**PERSONAL:** Joel Peralta...resides in Bonao, Dominican Republic...carries the nickname "El Campeón" (the Champion), coined by Joe Maddon during their time together with the Angels...former shortstop idolized Tony Fernandez and Pedro Martinez as a youngster...signed by Oakland as a non-drafted free agent on July 4, 1996 by scout Luis Coronado.

- 1997:** Batted .247 for DSL Athletics with 5 doubles, 11 RBI and 4 stolen bases in 52 games.
- 1998:** Missed the entire season due to injury.
- 1999:** Converted to pitching after he signed with the Angels and converted 12 saves in DSL.
- 2000:** In first season in U.S., made 14 appearances with Rookie Butte and Short-A Boise.
- 2001:** Posted career-high 25 saves between Cedar Rapids and Arkansas...posted a 2.13 ERA and a 10.6 K/BB ratio (53 K, 5 BB) in 41 games for Cedar Rapids before being promoted to Arkansas on Aug. 2.
- 2002:** Began season with Arkansas...sent down to A Cedar Rapids May 20 after 12 outings...remained with Kernels the rest of season, going 5-0 with 21 saves and a 0.95 ERA.
- 2003:** Recorded 20 saves with AA Arkansas for a third straight season.
- 2004:** In 2004 with Salt Lake, fanned 68 batters in 56.0 innings...spent June and part of July on the DL with a right bicep strain.
- 2005:** Broke into the Majors with the Angels, making 28 relief appearances...recalled from AAA Salt Lake on May 23 and made his Major League debut May 25 vs. Chicago (AL), tossing 2.1 perfect frames with 4 strikeouts...over his first 11 appearances (May 25-June 22) compiled a 0.66 ERA (1 ER, 13.2 IP)...earned his first win July 6 vs. Minnesota...optioned to Salt Lake on Aug 30 and recalled Sep 12, but did not pitch after that.
- 2006:** Opened the season in Omaha and was recalled by Kansas City on April 17...spent the remainder of the season in the Majors, with the exception of a nine-day stint with Omaha in late July...Made 64 appearances and led the Royals bullpen with 73.2 innings...Earned his first Major League save on Sep. 29 at Detroit.
- 2007:** Spent the entire season with Kansas City, where he led the bullpen in innings for a second straight season...compiled a 3.80 ERA (37 ER, 87.2 IP) over 62 relief appearances...his 87.2 IP marked a career high, ranked among AL relievers (2nd) and the Majors (5th)...trailing AL leader Matt Guerrier (88.0 IP) by only 0.1 inning...was the most innings thrown by a Kansas City reliever in 15 years (Rusty Meacham, 101.2 IP in 1992).
- 2008:** Split season between Kansas City and AAA Omaha, with three stints in Majors...did not allow a run in 10 games (18.2 IP) for Omaha, allowing nine hits and posting two saves.
- 2009:** Split season between Colorado and AAA Colorado Springs after being released by Kansas City at the conclusion of spring training...signed with Rockies as a minor league free agent on April 8...made a total of 27 appearances over two stints in the Majors, including 11 consecutive scoreless appearances, May 25-June 23.

**2010:** Signed with Washington as a minor league free agent in Dec. 2009...had a 2.02 ERA (11 ER, 49.0 IP) in 39 relief appearances...selected from AAA Syracuse June 21...from the time of his first game (June 22) through season's end, ranked third among NL relievers with 49.0 innings pitched, trailing only Atlanta's Jonny Venters (52) and Colorado's Matt Belisle (49.2)...ranked among NL relief leaders (min. 30 apps) during that stretch with a .214 opponents' OBP (2nd), 7.35 base runners per 9.0 IP (2nd), 1.7 BB/9 IP (6th) and 5.4 K/BB ratio (7th)...following the season, pitched for Gigantes del Cibao of the Dominican Winter League...recorded 10 saves and a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, 17.0 IP) in 17 appearances.

**2011:** Recorded 71 appearances and six saves...ranked 2nd in AL in relief appearances (Jose Valverde, DET)...17 of his final 18 appearances (beginning Aug. 7) were scoreless with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER, 19.0 IP), allowing 10 baserunners (8 H, 2 BB) while striking out 20...held first batters faced to a .072 (5x69) average, the best mark in the Majors...per Stats LLC, since records first became available in 1974, only one major league reliever (min. 60 AB) has finished a season with a lower number: Yankee Mariano Rivera in 1999 (.048, 3x62)...lefthanders hit .155 (17x110) against him, the second lowest among Major League relievers (min. 100 AB) behind Koji Uehara (.130)...allowed 8.25 base runners per nine innings, second lowest among AL relievers behind Uehara (6.51) and just ahead of Rivera (8.36)...in the postseason, appeared in three games of the ALDS vs. Texas and did not allow a run...pitched in Games 2, 3 and 4.

**2012:** Had 76 appearances, tied with teammate Fernando Rodney for second in AL, and a career high at the time...led Majors with 37 holds, setting an AL record that he would eclipse again in 2013 (41)...his career-high 84 strikeouts tied for sixth most among AL relievers...struck out a career-high 11.28 batters per nine innings, 10th-best in the AL...had a .200 opponents average (49x245)...his .254 opp. OBP was 5th-lowest mark among AL relievers...served an eight-game suspension from June 22-29, stemming from his ejection June 19 at Washington...ejected before throwing a pitch when — at the urging of Nationals Manager Davey Johnson—umpires found foreign substance on his glove.

**2013:** Led Majors with a career-high 80 appearances, a club record for a righty and second overall in club history behind Randy Choate (85 in 2010)...third straight season of 70-plus appearances...set Major League record with 41 holds, breaking San Diego's Luke Gregerson's record of 40 in 2010...second straight year that he led AL in holds (37 in 2012)...his 41 holds in 2013 and 37 holds in 2012 were the two highest totals by any AL reliever since 1952, as far back as Stats LLC has researched...had a team-high 62 scoreless appearances, fourth most in Majors and third most in club history...opponents hit .184 against him, 8th-lowest mark in AL...held lefties to a .163 average, 6th-best in AL...pitched with Gigantes del Cibao in Dominican Winter League.

**2014:** Finished second on Rays staff with 69 appearances, despite missing time on the DL, July 13-27, with an illness...it was his first time on a Major League DL during his 10-year career...on July 4 at Detroit, made his 267th appearance in a Rays uniform, establishing a club record for most career appearances by a pitcher; broke the mark held by Esteban Yan (1998-2002)...allowed only 2-of-24 (8.3%) inherited runners to score; among pitchers with at least 20 inherited runners, ranked 2nd in AL history behind Cleveland's CC Lee (2-of-27, 7.0%) and was best mark in club history, topping Joaquin Benoit (8.7 in 2010)...opposing hitters were 0-for-25 off him with two out and runners in scoring position...the best mark by a Major League pitcher since San Francisco's Scott Eyre had the same numbers in 2004...his 10.52 strikeouts per 9.0 innings was the second-highest mark of his career...in his last 24 appearances beginning on Aug 6, he walked one and struck out 24...led the staff in holds for the fourth consecutive season with 18, tied with Brad Boxberger...has a club-record 115 holds with the Rays, second most in the majors since 2011 behind Washington's Tyler Clippard (124)...pitched in 10 shutouts and had two 1-0 wins, the first reliever in Rays history to win two 1-0 games in a season.

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** Appeared in the postseason in three of 11 seasons in the Majors (four series)...posted 6.2 scoreless innings over seven career postseason appearances in relief...was not included on the Rockies postseason roster for the 2009 NLDS against the Phillies...made three relief appearances for Tampa Bay in 2011 ALDS vs. Texas...pitched a scoreless eighth inning for Tampa Bay in 2013 AL Wild Card game vs. Cleveland...made two relief appearances for Tampa Bay in 2013 ALDS vs. Boston...made one relief appearance for Los Angeles (NL) in 2015 NLDS vs. New York (NL).
