OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-14) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (14-11)

TUESDAY, MAY 3, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first four games of the homestand after losing five of the final six games on the last road trip...have now lost seven of the last 10 games since peaking at 10-7 on April 22...the loss last night dropped the A's 2½ games behind first place Texas, which is the A's largest deficit of the season...are in third place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, seven days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and three days tied for fourth...have been exactly .500 seven times this year...have been as high as three games over .500 (10-7 on April 22) and as low as three games under .500 (4-7 on April 15).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of the last two games by one run and are now 5-5 in one-run decisions...are tied for second in the American League in one-run wins, tied for third in games and tied for fourth in losses...had their first walk-off win of the season Friday night to improve to 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the five wins are tied with Cincinnati, Minnesota and Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and the seven games are tied for third...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of the last two games to snap their season-high four-game home winning streak...are 2-2 on this six-game homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-1)...are 5-9 at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...including this series with Seattle, the A's have a streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...this homestand marks the A's only six home games during a 25-game stretch from April 19 to May 15...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 8-5 (.615) on the road...begin a nine-game road trip to Baltimore (three games), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) on Friday...are batting .254 and are averaging 4.23 runs per game on the road compared to .215 (97-for-451) with an average of 2.79 runs per game (39 runs in 14 games) at home...are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 12 hits last night after surrendering 13 in the three-game series against Houston...have a 2.50 ERA (10 er in 36.0 ip) and .205 (25-for-122) opponents batting average over the first four games of the homestand after logging a 6.61 ERA and .307 opponents average over the final six games of the last road trip...have four pickoffs, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 5)...rank third in the American League in most walks (88) and tied for third in strikeouts (213).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-7 with a 6.88 ERA (39 er in 51.0 ip) and .306 (63-for-206) opponents batting average over the last 10 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 8-12 for the season, and the losses are second most in the American League (Houston, 14)...are tied with Kansas City for the most walks (68)...Sean Manaea and Jesse Hahn became the A's sixth and seventh different starting pitchers this year on Friday and Saturday...the seven starters are tied with Baltimore and Minnesota for the most in the AL...the A's are 5-0 when their starting pitcher goes at least seven innings.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .252 (136-for-539) with 65 runs scored over the last 16 games (4.1 runs per game) after hitting .210 with 29 runs over the first 11 contests (2.6 runs per game)...have a .287 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the majors...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.381), are tied for the third fewest walks and have the fourth fewest doubles (36)...however, are tied for the second most triples (5)...after shutting out the Astros Saturday, the A's are now the only American League team that has not been shutout...are one of four Major League teams that have not been blanked (COL, PHI, PIT)...have hit 17 home runs in the last 12 games after hitting 12 over the first 15 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors over the last 11 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (20)...have nine unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 15)...rank second in double plays (34).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 10 (.400) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the AL in plate appearances (23) and tied for third in pinch hits (4)...have gone 275 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 22 of the last 24 games...are 12-10 (.545) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges, which is tied for the best percentage in the American League...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez and Danny Valencia are on rehab assignments...last year, the A's had at least eight players on the DL 54 days with a season-high of 11 from May 22-24...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 13-12 in the month of April, which marks the third time in the last four years the A's have finished with a winning record in April...the 13 wins were four more than the A's April total from a year ago...the offense walked just 62 times, which were the fewest in the month of April in Oakland history (minimum 20 games)...had a .291 on-base percentage, which was fifth lowest in April in Oakland history...recorded 10 saves, which matched the 1989 club for second most in April in Oakland history (14 in 1988).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 3-1...lost the first meeting in Oakland last night after sweeping a three-game series in Seattle in the second series of the season...have won five of their last seven games against the Mariners but have a five-game losing streak in Oakland...that is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...11 of the A's last 17 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 19 of the last 26 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 47-52 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 330-259 against Seattle...that includes 179-115 in Oakland, 150-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis had his seventh career two-homer game last night, his first as an Athletic...has five home runs in his last 12 games after hitting no home runs over his first 13 contests...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .396 (19-for-48) over his last 14 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and is tied for second in the American League in saves...**Stephen Vogt** had his team-leading third three-hit game of the season last night...is now batting .315 (17-for-54) with three home runs and five RBI over his last 14 games after hitting .207 with no home runs and one RBI over his first nine contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980 Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-2, 3.81 ERA)

FIRST START AND LAST FOUR: Allowed just one run on three hits in 7.0 innings in his first start for the win...is 2-2 with a 4.64 ERA (11 er in 21.1 ip) and .259 (21-for-81) opponents batting average in four starts since then...his three wins are tied for eighth in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 7.00 ERA (7 er in 9.0 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he went 8-3 with a 2.63 ERA and five home runs in 16 starts on the road compared to 6-4 with a 2.82 ERA and 12 home runs in 15 starts at home...the road ERA was eighth lowest in Oakland history...it was second lowest over the last 34 years to his mark of 2.51 in 2014...is now 15-7 with a 2.75 ERA (66 er in 215.2 ip) in 33 starts on the road over the last three years compared to 16-12 with a 3.15 ERA (84 er in 239.2 ip) in 36 starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .182 (8-for-44) batting average...right-handers are batting .271 (16-for-59) with all three of his home runs, eight of his nine extra base hits and 11 of his 15 walks...has a .465 OPS against lefties, .906 against righties...the opponents four and five hitters are a combined 2-for-23 (.087) against him...the eight and nine hitters are 9-for-20 (.450)...has a .205 (15-for-73) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .300 (9-for-30) after that.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April and is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in the month...the 10 wins are his most in any month...is 4-2 with a 2.29 ERA (18 er in 70.2 ip) in 11 career starts in May...his May ERA is his second lowest for any month (1.64 in July)...is a combined 14-5 with a 2.35 ERA (46 er in 176.1 ip) in 27 career starts from the start of the season through May 31.

AGAINST THE WEST: Took the loss in his only start against an American League West team this year (LAA on April 11)...last year, he went 8-3 against American League West competition, 6-4 against everyone else...is now 20-9 with a 2.51 ERA (71 er in 254.2 ip) in 38 career games against the West compared to 16-13 with a 3.33 ERA (98 er in 264.2 ip) in 43 games against all other teams.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support twice this year and two runs or fewer three times...is 2-0 in two starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-2 in three starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more compared to 2-6 in 11 starts with two runs or fewer...is now 31-2 in 45 career starts with run support of three or more

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to pitch on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 2.57 ERA (4 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA (8 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) April 6 in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...allowed his only run in the third inning when Jackson led off with a double, went to third on an Eaton ground out and scored on a Rollins sacrifice fly...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City April 16 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first to give him the lead for good...also yielded a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto April 22...struck out five of the first six batters he faced and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning...the A's increased their lead to 6-1 before he allowed a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit last Wednesday...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed four runs in the second inning...Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning.

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-1 with a 2.14 ERA (59.0 ip, 46 h, 18 r, 14 er, 18 bb, 54 so, 4 hr) in nine career starts...is 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (4 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts at Safeco Field and 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (10 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland...had no decisions despite a 1.35 ERA (13.1 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year...the bullpen blew the save in both starts...the first came in a 5-4, 11-inning loss in Oakland on April 11...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced with the one exception being a lead off home run to Ackley in the third...left with a 2-1 lead and a runner on first in the eighth but the bullpen allowed that run to score plus two more for the blown save (Otero)...then had a no decision a A's 4-3 loss in 11 innings at Seattle May 8...allowed his only run in the second inning when Seager led off with a double and scored on a Morrison single...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the seventh inning for the blown save.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 5.60 ERA in four starts...also started in a minor league game March 24...tied for seventh in the Cactus League in wins...allowed a .311 (23-for-74) opponents batting average but issued just two walks in 17.2 innings...surrendered nine runs in his last two starts (8 er in 10.0 ip, 7.20 ERA) after yielding three in his first two (7.2 ip, 3.52 ERA)...went 1-0 with a 7.53 ERA and a .354 opponents batting average last spring.

2015 RECAP: Was named to his first American League All-Star Team...went 14-7 with a 2.73 ERA in 31 starts and ranked third in the AL in ERA...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.316) and OPS (.590), third in opponents batting average (.217), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.273), eighth in innings pitched (208.0) and tied for eighth in wins...finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting...set an Athletics single season record for putouts by a pitcher with 37...did not commit an error in 60 chances, which were the most in the majors and second most in Oakland history among pitchers with no errors...was 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...the ERA ranked sixth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 50 day innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 10-3 with a 2.04 ERA, .198 opponents batting average and five home runs in 18 starts before the All-Star Break compared to 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA, .244 opponents batting average and 12 home runs in 13 starts after the break...it marked the second consecutive season he had 10 wins before the break and four after the break...is now 23-8 with a 2.54 ERA (79 er in 279.2 ip) in 43 career games before the break, 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (0-0, 7.20 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Friday and made his Major League debut that night against Houston after just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...allowed just one run in each of his starts...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters compared to .268 against right-handers...was 1-1 with a 4.40 ERA in five games, three starts, with the A's this spring...is 16-9 with a 2.82 ERA in 42 games, all starts, in three professional seasons...has 257 strikeouts in 214.0 innings, an average of 10.81 per nine innings...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline.

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in its past five games and 16.1 innings...has now allowed one run or fewer in 21 of its first 27 games, including 15 games where it has not yielded an earned run...has a 2.49 ERA overall, which ranks fifth in the American League.
- Has tossed 93.0 innings, which is the most in the AL, and allowed just 20 walks, which is tied for second fewest...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.94) and ranks third in strikeouts per walk (4.10).
- Has allowed just 5-of-44 (11.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the majors.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10) and tied for second in save percentage (90.9%)...ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.270) and grounded into double plays (11), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in slugging percentage (.320) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (6).
