ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 9-4 in their last 13 games, 12-5 in their last 17...are 12-5 since a 5-game losing streak...are 5-7 at home, but 9-4 on the road...played 12 of first 18 games of the season away from Safeco Field.

- Runs/Game the Mariners are averaging 4.20 runs per game, ranking 5th in the American League. Goodbye Baseball - The Mariners homered in 9 straight games April 21-30, their longest streak this sea-.
- son...their 15 home runs since April 21 rank 4th in the AL & T7th in MLB (also: NYM).
 - For Openers the Mariners are 5-4 in the first game of a series; 9-7 in all other games.

Batting Around - the Mariners have batted around (10 men to plate) once this season (4/5 at TEX). COLISEUM SUCCESS... the Mariners are 20-11 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of the 2013 season, including 5 straight wins...Seattle was 7-3 against the A's in Oakland last season...Seattle is undefeated in its last 5 series in Oakland (4-0-1)...have not lost a series in Oakland since April 3, 5-6, 2014 (2nd game postponed due to poor field conditions).

KEEPING THINGS CLOSE ... of the last 13 games at the Coliseum between these two clubs, seven games have been decided by one run, including the last two games...nine of those 13 games have been decided by three runs or less...Seattle is 7-0 in the last seven games decided by one run at the Coliseum.

BULLPEN BULLIES ... Seattle's bullpen has posted a 1.57 ERA (8 ER, 46.0 IP) with 52 strikeouts in its last 16 games since April 13...in that span, the bullpen has the best ERA in Majors ahead of Chicago-AL (1.65), Oakland (2.21) & Kansas City (2.24)...overall, Seattle's bullpen has a 2.41 ERA (19 ER, 71.0 IP), which ranks 4th in the Majors behind Chicago-AL (1.60), Baltimore (2.23) and Kansas City (2.33)...four Mariners relievers have ERA's under 2.50: Steve Cishek (0.75), Nick Vincent (1.74), Vidal Nuno (2.16) and Joel Peralta (2.45)...Tony Zych (3.00) and Mike Montgomery (3.09) are right behind.

ROAD TRIPPIN'...Nelson Cruz went 3-for-4 last night and has hit safely in his last 6 road games...overall on the road, he's hitting .360 (18x50) with 7 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and a 1.051 OPS in 13 games...his .360 batting average is the 7th-best road average in the American League.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN ... the Mariners are 9-4 on the road this season, T3rd-best record in the American League behind Chicago (12-5), Boston (7-3) and tied with Detroit (9-4)...Seattle has won all four road series this season, winning two of three at Texas, at New York-AL, at Cleveland & at Los Angeles-AL...the last time the Mariners won four straight road series to open a season was part of a 7-series streak in 2001.

KUMA & THE KING ... Hisashi lwakuma & Felix Hernandez are a combined 14-4 with a 2.76 ERA (55 ER, 179.1 IP) with 143 strikeouts in 26 starts against the Athletics in Oakland...Felix is 11-3 with a 2.67 ERA (46 ER, 155.0 IP) with 126 strikeouts in 22 starts at the Coliseum, while Iwakuma is 3-1 with a 3.33 ERA (9 ER, 24.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts in four starts.

ROAD OPS...the Mariners have three players in the Top-12 in the American League for road OPS...Nelson Cruz (1.051) ranks 4th, Robinson Canó (1.014) ranks 8th and Seth Smith (.958) ranks 12th...Seattle's .769 road OPS ranks 3rd-best in the American League behind Boston (.811) & Detroit (.789).

ELITE 2B ... Robinson Canó recorded his 450th career double in the 4th inning last night...he became the 5th second baseman in Major League history with 2,000 hits, 450 doubles, 200 home runs and 1,000 RBI... he joins Roberto Alomar, Craig Biggio, Jeff Kent and Rogers Hornsby.

SETH THE SPARK...Seth Smith's .413 on-base percentage this season ranks 4th in the American League and 15th in the Majors...his .920 OPS is the 13th-best in the American League...Seattle is 10-4 when he hits in the second spot in the lineup, where he's hitting .313 (15x48) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI, 8 walks and a .945 OPS.

A-OAK-I STREAKING ... Norichika Aoki has hit safely in all 13 career games against Oakland (with an atbat)...in 14 career games against the A's is hitting .346 (18x52) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 RBI and a .404 on-base percentage...the 13-game hitting streak is T2nd-longest active hitting streak against Oakland behind Boston's Dustin Pedroia (14) and Chicago-AL's Jose Abreu (13).

GETTING SERIE-OUS...the Mariners have won 5 straight series (2-1 at NYY, 2-1 at CLE, 2-1 at LAA, 2-1 vs. HOU & 2-1 vs. KC) and have won 6 of 8 series overall this season...the Mariners last won at least 5 straight series when they won 6 consecutive series from May 18-June 5, 2011...in that stretch: vs. LAA: 2-0, at SD: 3-0, at MIN: 2-1, vs. NYY: 2-1, vs. BAL: 2-1, vs. TB: 3-1.

TWO OUTS, SO WHAT ... the Mariners have recorded 44 two-out RBI this season, which ranks T3rd in American League, T9th in Majors...Robinson Canó is tied for A.L. with 12 two-out RBI (2nd in Majors behind Bryce Harper-WAS, 17), Kyle Seager's 8 two-out RBI ranks T7th & Nelson Cruz's 7 ranks 13th.

LEAGUE LEADER ... Robinson Canó ranks 2nd in the American League with 8 home runs, behind Toronto's Josh Donaldson (9)...he leads the A.L. and is T4th in the Majors in RBI with 24, trailing only Colorado's Nolan Arenado (25), New York-NL's Yoenis Cespedes (25) & Chicago's Anthony Rizzo (25) and tied with Washington's Bryce Harper.

AS YOU KNOW ... the Mariners are 20-11 in Oakland since the start of 2013... BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that the .645 winning percentage in that span is the best by any visiting team at the Oakland Coliseum?...Seattle ranks just ahead of Texas (18-10/.643)...Seattle has won 5 straight games at the Oakland Coliseum...the 5-game win streak is the 2nd-longest by the Mariners in Oakland, trailing only an 8-game streak July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008...the current win streak began July 5, 2015 and included a three-game sweep Sept. 4-6, 2015.



is 7th-best in the American League (min. 75 GS), with rotation-mate Felix Hernandez holding the top spot with a 2.83 mark (OAK's Sonny Gray is 2nd at 2.93). CAREER...in 4+ seasons with Seattle, Iwakuma has combined to go 47-28 with a 3.23 ERA (246 ER, 684.2 IP) with 576 strikeouts in 116 games, including 102 starts... since joining the Mariners rotation on July 2, 2012, his 3.16 ERA (230 ER, 654.1 IP) as a starter is the 7th-best in the American League (min. 600.0 IP) and 11th-best in the Majors; he ranks behind just Felix Hernandez (2.83), Chris Sale (2.97) & David Price (3.04) among current A.L starters...in 2013, he was an American League All-Star and was named the Mariners MVP Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.

100 STRONG...has made 116 career appearances in the Major Leagues (102 starts) since joining the Mariners in 2012...amongst American League pitchers with at least 80 starts since his debut season, Iwakuma has the 4th-lowest ERA (3.23; Felix Hernandez is 1st at 2.86) and the 5th best strikeout-to-walk ratio at 4.24.

500 Ks...recorded his 500th career strikeout by fanning Mitch Moreland in the 2nd inning of his win at Texas on Aug. 18, 2015...hit the milestone while walking just 118 Batters...according to **STATS LLC**, is tied for 6th-fewest walks by a pitcher before recording his 500th strikeout since 1914 (LAD's Kenley Jansen leads with 104 BB/500K)...had 1,175 strikeouts over 11 years in Japan before his MLB career.

2015 SEASON RECAP... went 9-5 with a 3.54 ERA (51 ER, 129.2 IP) with 111 strikeouts in 20 starts with Seattle last season, including 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 ER, 45.2 IP) with 43 strikeouts in his final 7 starts...Seattle won 11 of his final 16 starts of the season when he was 9-4 with a 2.82 ERA (34 ER, 108.1 IP) with 97 strikeouts.

NO-NO...threw the 5th no-hitter in Mariners history (4th by a single pitcher) on Aug. 12, 2015 vs. the Baltimore Orioles...was Iwakuma's first MLB complete game... the 2nd Japanese-born pitcher with an MLB no-hitter (Hideo Nomo, 2x)...4th no-no in MLB this season...first no-hitter in the American League since Felix Her-nandez (Aug. 15, 2012 vs. TB)...mixed his off-speed pitches well, according to **ESPN Stats & Info**, threw his lowest percentage of pitches in the strike zone in his career (41 percent, 11 percentage points below his season average entering the day), still throwing 77 of 116 pitches for strikes.

THE INJURY...suffered a right lat strain and was placed on the disabled list on April 24, 2015 (retro to April 21)...on the DL April 21-July 6...second DL stint of Major League career after suffering a torn tendon in right index finger during spring training in 2014.


