OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-15) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (15-11)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the first three games of May and are one of three American League teams without a win this month (New York, Tampa Bay)...have also lost eight of the last 11 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are a season-high three games out of first place in the AL West...remain in third place for the fifth consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, eight days in third, three days tied for third, two days in fourth and three days tied for fourth...have been exactly .500 seven times this year...have been as high as three games over .500 (10-7 on April 22) and as low as three games under .500 (4-7 on April 15).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of the last three games to snap their season-high four-game home winning streak...are 2-3 on this six-game homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-2)...are 5-10 at home, which is the worst home record in the American League and tied for fourth worst in the majors...it matches the second worst record after 15 home games in Oakland history (were 4-11 in 2001)...with a loss today, the A's would match their worst record after 16 home games in Oakland history (1968, 1994, 2001, 2015)...including this series with Seattle, the A's have a streak of 40 consecutive home series of three or more games without a sweep, which is the longest such streak in Oakland history (previous: 35, May 13, 1983-Aug. 1, 1984)...have not swept a series of three or more games in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto (four games)...this homestand marks the A's only six home games during a 25-game stretch from April 19 to May 15...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 8-5 (.615) on the road...begin a nine-game road trip to Baltimore (three games), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) on Friday...are batting .254 and are averaging 4.23 runs per game on the road compared to .214 (103-for-482) with an average of 2.73 runs per game (41 runs in 15 games) at home...are averaging the fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 7.14 ERA (46 er in 58.0 ip) and .312 (74-for-237) opponents batting average over the last 11 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 8-13 for the season, and the losses are second most in the American League (Houston, 14)...are tied with Kansas City for the most walks (69) and are tied for the second most home runs (21).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high tying 13 hits last night after yielding 12 in the first game against the Mariners...surrendered just 13 hits total in the three-game series against Houston to start the homestand...have a 3.60 ERA (18 er in 45.0 ip) and .236 (38-for-161) opponents batting average over the first five games of the homestand after logging a 6.61 ERA and .307 opponents average over the final six games of the last road trip...have four pickoffs, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 6)...are tied for second in the American League in strikeouts (222) but are fourth in most walks (89).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .197 (25-for-127) with eight runs scored over the last four games (2.0 runs per game) after hitting .270 and averaging 4.8 runs per game over the previous 10 contests...have a .287 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the majors...have the third lowest slugging percentage in the American League (.378), the fourth lowest batting average (.234) and the fourth fewest walks (67) and doubles (36)...however, are tied for the third most triples (5)...after shutting out the Astros Saturday, the A's are now the only AL team that has not been shutout...are one of four Major League teams that have not been blanked (Colorado, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh)...have hit 18 home runs in the last 13 games after hitting 12 over the first 15 contests.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors over the last 12 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (20)...have nine unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Minnesota, 15)...have turned at least one double play in each of the last eight games (11 double plays total) and have 35 for the season, which ranks second in the majors to Texas (41).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-5 in one-run games...are tied for second in the American League in one-run wins,

tied for third in games and tied for fourth in losses...had their first walk-off win of the season last Friday night to improve to 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...the five wins are tied with Cincinnati, Minnesota and Tampa Bay for the most in the majors and the seven games are tied for third...are 2-0 in extra inning games and rank second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 11 (.364) after starting the season 0-for-12...rank third in the American League in plate appearances (24) and tied for third in hits (4)...have gone 276 games since their last pinch home run, which is the longest active streak in the majors...the A's last pinch hit home run was by John Jaso on June 22, 2014 against Boston.

THIS AND THAT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 23 of the last 25 games, including each of the last 10...are 12-11 (.522) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges, which is tied with Detroit and Kansas City for the best percentage in the American League...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard, Valencia)...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez and Danny Valencia are on rehab assignments...last year, the A's had at least eight players on the DL 54 days with a season-high of 11 from May 22-24...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

IN APRIL: The A's went 13-12 in the month of April, which marks the third time in the last four years the A's have finished with a winning record in April...the 13 wins were four more than the A's April total from a year ago...the offense walked just 62 times, which were the fewest in the month of April in Oakland history (minimum 20 games)...had a .291 on-base percentage, which was fifth lowest in April in Oakland history...recorded 10 saves, which matched the 1989 club for second most in April in Oakland history (14 in 1988).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 3-2...have lost the first two games in Oakland after sweeping a three-game series in Seattle...now have a six-game losing streak in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...11 of the A's last 18 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 19 of the last 27 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 47-53 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 330-260 against Seattle...that includes 179-116 in Oakland, 150-143 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has three home runs in his last two games and six in his last 13 contests after a season-opening 13-game homerless streak...now has 26 home runs in 79 games dating back to Aug. 6 of last year...that is tied with Davis (BAL) for second most in the majors (Arenado COL, 27) over that span...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .403 (21-for-52) over his last 15 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests...**Ryan Madson** is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and is tied for third in the American League in saves...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .316 (18-for-57) with three home runs and five RBI over his last 15 games after hitting .207 with no home runs and one RBI over his first nine contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1935** Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland...in **1969** John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory.

5-2, 2.46 ERA (26 er in 95.0 ip)
Saves/Opportunities: 10-for-11 (90.9%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed just one run over its past six games and 18.1 innings (0.49 ERA)...has now allowed one run or fewer in 22 of its first 28 games, including 15 games where it has not yielded an earned run...has a 2.46 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League.
- Has tossed 95.0 innings, which is the most in the AL, and allowed just 20 walks, which is tied for second fewest...leads the majors in walks per nine innings (1.89) and ranks third in strikeouts per walk (4.25).
- Has allowed 7-of-46 (15.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the majors.
- Is tied for the Major League lead in saves (10) and ranks second in save percentage (90.9%)...ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.270) and grounded into double plays (11), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in slugging percentage (.328) and tied for fourth in fewest home runs (7).

61 RHP JOHN AXFORD

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his first 11 appearances (1 er in 12.1 ip, 0.73 ERA).
- Has not walked a batter and his 12.1 innings pitched are the most in the majors among relievers that have not issued a walk.
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in wins (2).
- Has a win in two games against the Mariners (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...is 1-0 with three saves, no blown saves and a 1.74 ERA (2 er in 10.1 ip) in 10 games in his career.

Last Year: Was 4-5 with a 4.20 ERA and a team-leading 25 saves in 60 relief appearances with Colorado...had a 2.70 ERA and .216 opponents average on the road, a 5.59 ERA and .298 opponents average at Coors Field.

- Has not allowed a run in his past eight games and 6.1 innings (4 h, 2 bb, 6 so) after yielding four runs in his first six games (5.1 ip, 6.75 ERA).
- Is tied for fourth among American League relievers in games pitched (14) and tied for eighth in wins (1)...is tied for third in home runs allowed (3) and tied for fourth in losses (2).
- His first batters faced are 4-for-11 (.364) with three walks (.500 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is tied for sixth highest in the AL.
- Has not allowed a run in seven games and 6.1 innings on the road...has a 6.75 ERA (4 er in 5.1 ip) in seven games at home.
- Has a win and save in three games against the Mariners (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 2-1 with five saves, a blown save and 1.60 ERA (6 er in 33.2 ip) in 31 games in his career.

Last Year: Missed 121 games due to two stints on the disabled list (strained left rotator cuff, strained left shoulder)...went 1-0 with four saves, a blown save and a 3.95 ERA in 12 relief appearances with the A's.

66 RHP RYAN DULL

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/0
First Hitters: 0-13

- Has allowed four runs in his past six games (3 er in 7.0 ip, 3.86 ERA) after starting the season with a seven-game, 7.1-inning scoreless streak...did not allow a hit over that span and is the first A's pitcher since at least 1913 to begin the season with seven consecutive hitless outings.
- Is fifth among American League relievers in opponents batting average (.104) and on-base percentage (.154), tied for seventh in innings pitched (14.1) and tied for eighth in games pitched (13).
- His first batters faced are 0-for-13 and he is one of five qualifying AL relievers not to allow a first batter faced to reach base.
- Has stranded all nine of his inherited runners, which are tied for the most in the AL among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.
- His opponents are 0-for-11 with runners in scoring position, including 0-for-6 with RISP in two outs.
- Has a 1.69 ERA in six games in his career against Seattle (5.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 8 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Was named the A's Organizational Pitcher of the Year after going 3-2 with 12 saves and a 0.74 ERA in 47 games with Midland and Nashville...made his ML debut in September and went 1-2 with a save and a 4.24 ERA in 13 games.

31 RHP LIAM HENDRIKS

- Did not allow a run in 2.2 innings in his first appearance but has allowed at least one run in six of his nine games since then (12 er in 12.0 ip, 9.00 ERA).
- Has tossed two or more innings in five of his 10 appearances and his 14.2 innings pitched are sixth most among American League relievers.
- Has the third highest opponents batting average among AL relievers (.387) and is tied for the fifth highest ERA (7.36).
- Has stranded all five of his inherited runners, which are tied for seventh most in the AL among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Has a loss in five games, including two starts, in his career against the Mariners (19.1 ip, 14 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 19 so, 2 hr, 1 hbp, 2.33 ERA)...the loss came in his only career complete game, Aug. 27, 2012 while pitching for Minnesota (9.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr, 1 hbp).

Last Year: Pitched exclusively in relief for the first time in his career and was 5-0 with a 2.92 ERA in 58 games with Toronto...had career highs in games and strikeouts (71) and career lows in ERA and opponents batting average (.240).

- Has not allowed an earned run in his past eight games and 7.2 innings (4 h, 1 r, 3 bb, 5 so)...has not yielded an earned in 12 of his 13 appearances overall (2 er in 12.2 ip, 1.42 ERA).
- Is a perfect 8-for-8 in save opportunities and the eight saves are tied for third most in the American League.
- Is tied for eighth among AL relievers in wins (1).
- Has a .200 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .136 (3-for-22) against left-handed hitters and .261 (6-for-23) against right-handers.
- Has not allowed an earned run in six games and 5.2 innings on the road and five games and 5.0 innings during the day.
- Has a save in two games against the Mariners (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a save and 2.00 ERA in eight games in his career (9.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 2 bb, 10 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2011 and was 1-2 with three saves and a career-low 2.13 ERA in 68 appearances with Kansas City...also had career lows in opponents batting (.205) and on-base percentage (.254).

- Has not allowed a run in 10 of his 12 appearances (2 er in 17.1 ip, 1.04 ERA)...has tossed more than one inning in eight of those outings and his 17.1 innings pitched are the most among American League relievers.
- Has stranded all seven of his inherited runners, which are tied for fourth most in the AL among relievers that have not allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Has a .172 opponents batting average...that breaks down to .114 (4-for-35) against right-handed hitters and .261 (6-for-23) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in nine games and 12.0 innings in his career against Seattle (4 h, 4 bb, 1 bb, 12 so).

Last Year: Started the year at Triple-A Nashville was promoted to Oakland May 7...spent the balance of the season with the A's and went 4-2 with a 3.84 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in 56 relief appearances.

- Has allowed two runs over his past five games and 4.0 innings (4.50 ERA) after not yielding an earned run in his first nine games and 7.0 innings.
- Has allowed his past three inherited runners to score after stranding each of his first 11 inherited runners.
- Has tossed less than one inning in nine of his 14 appearances...the 14 games pitched are tied for fourth among American League relievers.
- Has a .231 opponents batting average...that breaks down to .167 (3-for-18) against right-handed hitters and .286 (6-for-21) against left-handers.
- Is 2-0 with a 3.22 ERA in 13 games, including two starts, in his career against Seattle (22.1 ip, 19 h, 8 r, 8 er, 8 bb, 23 so, 1 hr).

Last Year: Began the season with Cleveland and went 2-3 with a 4.43 ERA in 45 games before he was traded to San Diego July 31...was 0-1 with a 7.36 ERA in 27 games with the Padres and combined for a 5.66 ERA in 72 games overall.

- Is 8-for-34 (.235) with four RBI over his last 11 games after hitting .130 with two RBI over his first 15 contests.
- Is 0-for-9 against left-handed pitching and 2-for-20 (.100) with runners in scoring position.
- Is 1-for-8 (.125) over his first three games in May after hitting .181 in 23 games in April.
- Hit his first career walk-off home run last Friday night against Houston, a three-run shot off Neshek in the bottom of the ninth...it was his third career game-ending RBI and his first home run as an Athletic.

Last Year: Batted .282 with five home runs and 31 RBI in 103 games in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...the batting average was his best in his four seasons with San Diego, as was his .361 on-base percentage and .742 OPS.

1 BILLY BURNS

- Is batting .224 (11-for-49) over his last 12 games after hitting .310 over his first 11 contests.
- Was caught stealing in the first inning last Friday after starting the season 6-for-6...is now 8-for-9 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts...ranks second in the American League in stolen bases and sixth in stolen base percentage.
- Also ranks third in the AL in plate appearances per strikeout (13.9) and tied for third in triples (2).
- Is batting .345 (19-for-55) at night, .139 (5-for-36) during the day.
- Is 4-for-14 (.286) against Seattle this year and is a .321 (25-for-78) career hitter against the Mariners.
- Had his second two-steal game of the season last Thursday at Detroit (April 12 vs. LAA)...it was the third of his career (May 31, 2015 vs. NYY).

Last Year: Batted .294 in 125 games in his rookie campaign and set an Oakland single-season record for batting average by a switch-hitter...led ML rookies in stolen bases (26) and multiple hit games (47) and topped AL rookies in hits (153).

16 BILLY BUTLER

- Grounded out as a pinch hitter last night and is 2-for-6 (.333) with a double and strikeout in the pinch...is tied for second in the American League in pinch hits and tied for fourth in pinch plate appearances (6)...is now 16-for-48 (.333) with two home runs, five RBI and eight walks as a pinch hitter in his career.
- Has not started since a week ago today and has started just eight of the A's first 28 games...five of his eight starts have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.
- Is 4-for-13 (.308) over his last seven games after going 3-for-20 (.160) over his first seven contests.
- Is 0-for-1 against Seattle but is a .313 (87-for-278) career hitter against the Mariners.
- Is hitting .273 (6-for-22) at night, .093 (1-for-11) during the day.

Last Year: Batted .251 with 15 home runs and 65 RBI in 151 games in his first season with the A's...the batting average was 20 points below his previous career low of .271 in 2014...his .323 on-base percentage matched his career low from 2014.

20 MARK CANHA

- Is 1-for-15 with nine strikeouts over his last seven games...has struck out 19 times in 39 plate appearances.
- Three of his five hits have been home runs.
- Is 1-for-16 (.063) in Oakland and 1-for-14 (.071) during the day.
- Started at third base Monday night...it was his third appearance at third base this year and the fourth of his career but it was his first start.
- Has four career home runs against Seattle, which are his most against any team.
- Four of his eight starts (three at first base, two in right field, one at third base, one at designated hitter) have come in games started by a left-handed pitcher.

Last Year: Was selected by Colorado in the Rule 5 draft prior to the season and traded to the A's...spent the entire season with Oakland, batting .254 with 16 HR and 70 RBI in 124 games...led AL rookies and ranked fourth in the majors in RBI.

3 CHRIS COGLAN

Current Streak: 0 for 6
Seattle Series: 0-5, 2 bb
Homestand: 2-16, 2 r, 2 bb, 4 so

- Is 2-for-28 (.071) over his last nine games and is hitting .150 for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the American League (Headley, NYY .147)...has the third lowest on-base percentage (.227).
- Has started 12 of the last 13 games at third base following the injury to Valencia...had just nine career starts at third base entering the season.
- Has started 23 games at five different positions (13 at third base, five at second base, two in left field, two at designated hitter and one in right field).

- Has made 22 of his 23 starts against right-handed pitchers...is 0-for-8 against lefties.
- Six of his 12 hits this year are for extra bases (two doubles, four home runs).
- Has a 180-game errorless streak as an outfielder...last committed an error in the outfield on July 25, 2014 against St. Louis.

Last Year: Had career highs in home runs (16), walks (58), stolen bases (11) extra base hits (47) and games played (148) and matched his best in triples (6) in his second season with Chicago (NL)...batted .250 and added 41 RBI.

4 COCO CRISP

- Is 4-for-25 (.160) with a home run and four RBI over his last seven games.
- Is batting .150 (6-for-40) at home compared to .281 (9-for-32) on the road.
- Is tied for 10th in the American League in stolen bases (4).
- Has three home runs in 22 games after hitting no home runs in 44 games last year.
