Felix Hernandez has not allowed more than 3 earned runs in any of his last 15 starts against Oakland since the start of the 2013 season...in that span, he's 9-2 with a 2.18 ERA (26 ER, 107.1 IP) with 101 strikeouts...Seattle is 11-4 in those starts...in 8 starts in Oakland since 2013, is 5-1 with a 2.04 ERA (13 ER, 57.1 IP) with 44 strikeouts.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7-game, two-city road trip with the final of three games against Oakland (2-0)...will also play at Houston (4 G) on this trip...on recently concluded homestand, took 2-of-3 from AL West rival the Houston Astros, before taking two of three from the Kansas City Royals...today's game will be televised in the Mariners TV market on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 10-4 in their last 14 games, 13-5 in their last 18...are 13-5 since a 5-game losing streak...are 5-7 at home, but 10-4 on the road.

- Runs/Game the Mariners are averaging 4.35 runs per game, ranking 4th in the American League.
- Goodbye Baseball The Mariners homered in 9 straight games April 21-30, their longest streak this season...their 18 home runs since April 21 rank T1st in the AL & T2nd in MLB.
- For Openers the Mariners are 5-4 in the first game of a series; 10-7 in all other games.
- Batting Around the Mariners have batted around (10 men to plate) once this season (4/5 at TEX).

<u>SWEEPING SUCCESS</u>...Seattle is looking for its first sweep of the season...3 of the past 6 series between Seattle and Oakland have been sweeps (Seattle Sweeps: May 8-10, 2015 in Seattle, Sept. 4-6, 2015 in Oakland...Oakland Sweep: April 8-10, 2016).

<u>POWER CONTINUES, AVERAGE RISES</u>...Robinson Canó hit his 9th home run of the season last night, but his average is what has been climbing...in his last 8 games, he's hitting .375 (12x32) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.131 OPS...the 8-game run has raised his average to .267 on the season...in his first 18 games, he hit .219 (16x73) with 10 runs, 3 doubles, 6 home runs and 14 RBI.

SEAGER SWINGING...Kyle Seager has hit safely in 7 of his last 9 games since April 24...during the 9-game span, he's hitting .290 (9x31) with 6 runs, 4 doubles, 4 home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.178 OPS...in his first 16 games of the season, he hit .127 (8x63) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and a .479 OPS.

STARTING THINGS UP... Mariners starters did not earn a win in the first 9 games of the season... **Nathan Karns** collected the first win for the rotation on April 15 at New York-AL and since then, the starters have notched wins in 10 of the 12 Mariners wins, while posting a 2.83 ERA (34 ER, 108.0 IP)...in that span, Karns has 3 wins, **Felix Hernandez**, **Wade Miley** & **Taijuan Walker** each have two & **Hisashi Iwakuma** has one.

GETTING SERIE-OUS... the Mariners have won 6 straight series (2-1 at NYY, 2-1 at CLE, 2-1 at LAA, 2-1 vs. HOU, 2-1 vs. KC, 2-0 at OAK) and have won 7 of 9 series overall this season...the Mariners last won at least 6 straight series when they won 6 consecutive series from May 18-June 5, 2011...in that stretch: vs. LAA: 2-0, at SD: 3-0, at MIN: 2-1, vs. NYY: 2-1, vs. BAL: 2-1, vs. TB: 3-1.

<u>COLISEUM SUCCESS</u>...the Mariners are 21-11 at the Oakland Coliseum since the start of the 2013 season, including 6 straight wins...the .656 winning percentage in that span is the best by any visiting team at the Oakland Coliseum, ahead of Texas (18-10/.643)...the 6-game win streak is the 2nd-longest by the Mariners in Oakland, trailing only an 8-game streak July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008...the current win streak began July 5, 2015 and included a three-game sweep Sept. 4-6, 2015...Seattle was 7-3 against the A's in Oakland last season...Seattle is undefeated in its last 6 series in Oakland (5-0-1) and have not lost a series in Oakland since April 3, 5-6, 2014 (2nd game postponed due to poor field conditions).

KEEPING THINGS CLOSE...of the last 14 games at the Coliseum between these two clubs, seven games have been decided by one run, including two of the last three...nine of those 14 games have been decided by three runs or less...<u>Seattle is 7-0 in the last seven games decided by one run at the Coliseum</u>.

BULLPEN BULLIES...Seattle's bullpen has posted a 1.69 ERA (9 ER, 48.0 IP) with 53 strikeouts in its last 17 games since April 13...in that span, the bullpen has the 2nd-best ERA in Majors behind Chicago-AL (1.62), and ahead of Oakland (2.29) & Baltimore (2.35)...overall, Seattle's bullpen has a 2.47 ERA (20 ER, 73.0 IP), which ranks 4th in the Majors behind Chicago-AL (1.58), Baltimore (2.18) and Oakland (2.46)...four Mariners relievers have ERA's under 2.50: Steve Cishek (0.75), Nick Vincent (1.74), Vidal Nuno (2.16) and Joel Peralta (2.45)...Tony Zych - on DL (3.00) and Mike Montgomery (3.09) are right behind.

ROAD TRIPPIN'...Nelson Cruz is 4-for-8 this series and has hit safely in his last 7 road games...overall on the road, he's hitting .352 (19x54) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and a 1.012 OPS in 14 games...his .352 batting average is the 6th-best road average in the American League.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...the Mariners are 10-4 on the road this season, the best record in the A.L. ahead of Chicago (12-5), Detroit (9-5) and Boston (9-5)...Seattle has won all 5 road series this season, winning two of three at Texas, at New York-AL, at Cleveland, at Los Angeles-AL and taking the first two at Oakland...last time Seattle won 5 straight road series to open a season was a 7-series streak in 2001.

KUMA & THE KING... Hisashi Iwakuma & Felix Hernandez are a combined 15-4 with a 2.70 ERA (56 ER, 186.1 IP) with 146 strikeouts in 27 starts in Oakland...Felix is 11-3 with 2.67 ERA (46 ER, 155.0 IP) with 126 strikeouts in 22 starts here, while Iwakuma is 4-1 with 2.87 ERA (10 ER, 31.1 IP) with 20 K's in 5 starts.

ELITE 2B... Robinson Canó recorded his 450th career double in the 4th inning Monday night...he became the 5th second baseman in Major League history with 2,000 hits, 450 doubles, 200 home runs and 1,000 RBI...he joins Roberto Alomar, Craig Biggio, Jeff Kent and Rogers Hornsby.

<u>A-OAK-I STREAKING</u>...Norichika Aoki has hit safely in all 14 career games against Oakland (with an atbat)...in 15 career games against the A's is hitting .339 (19x56) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 6 RBI and a .403 on-base percentage...the 14-game hitting streak is tied for the longest <u>active</u> hitting streak against Oakland with Boston's Dustin Pedroia (14) and ahead of Chicago-AL's Jose Abreu (13).

AS YOU KNOW...Felix Hernandez is 11-3 in Oakland...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that his 11 career wins at Oakland Coliseum rank T2nd all-time by a visiting pitcher?...he's tied with Baltimore's Mike Flanagan...with his next win at Oakland, Felix will tie Tommy John (CWS, NYY & LAA) for most career wins by a visiting player in Oakland...Jamie Moyer ranks T4th with 10 wins (8 with SEA & 2 with BAL)...Randy Johnson ranks T7th with 9 wins as a visitor in Oakland (5 with SEA, 2 with NYY, 1 with ARI & 1 with SFG).

ABOUT FELIX...30-year-old right-hander is making his 340th career appearance/start and his 6th start of the season today vs. OAK.

- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013. In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes
- joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitcher to win the Cy Young...named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in
- Cy Young voting in 2014.

 ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days (7/6/84 at MIN).

 At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners

- At 19 years, 176 days on at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.

 Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.

 A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.

 Tossed 6.0+ IP in 276 of 339 GS (81.4%)...6.0+ innings in 83 of 101 starts since 2013 (82.1%), including 73 quality starts (231 career quality starts, Seattle record).

 Is 21-23 with a 2.41 ERA (160 ER, 361.2 IP) in 56 career GS in May...was 4-1 with a
- 2.00 ERA (8 ER, 36.0 IP) in 5 GS in May 2015.

LAST START...W#2 in Mariners 1-0 win over KC on April 29 at Safeco Field... overall allowed 5 hits, walked 3 and struck out 4 over 7.2 scoreless innings... his win tied Jamie Moyer for most in club history (145)...marked his 46th career starts tossing at least 7.0 inings and not allowing a run...also 9th career victory when team scores 1 run (last: 8/27/12 at MIN).

MAKE SOME ROOM, JAMIE ... in his last on April 29 vs. KC, Felix tied Jamie Moyer for the club record in wins at 145...when he takes over the lead, he'll be just one of two pitchers currently with their teams that hold the club record for wins or strikeouts, joining Colorado's Jorge De La Rosa (79 wins, 905 strike outs).

BELOW MENDOZA LINE...is limiting opponents to .165 (19x115) batting average this season, the 3rd-lowest mark in the Majors behind Cleveland's Danny Salazar (.139) and Tampa Bay's Drew Smyly (.151).

STRIKEOUT KING...struck out the Angels Rafael Ortega in the first inning on April 23 for career strikeout 2,163, passing Randy Johnson for the all-time strikeout lead in club history

ON THE CLUB RECORD LIST...Felix is making his 340th pitching appearance with Seattle, ranking second behind just **Jeff Nelson** (432)...on April 10th, Hernandez passed **Mike Jackson** for 2nd-most pitching apperances in club history...in his last start vs. the Yankees on April 16, Hernandez struck out 4 tying **Randy Johnson** (2,162) for the Mariners record for strikeouts...Hernandez is also 1 wins shy of tying **Jamie Moyer** (145) for most wins in club history.

EARLY RISER...Felix is 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA (2 ER, 18.0 IP) in 3 day starts this season (50-32, 2.89 ERA in 113 GS in career)...dating back to 2014, Felix is 13-4 with a 2.39 ERA (43 ER, 161.2 IP) over his last 24 day starts...his 2.39 ERA in day games since 2014 is currently the 2nd-lowest in the American League (min. 75.0 IP).

Making his 42nd career starts vs. the Athletics, his 2nd in 2016...overall is 22-8 with a 2.58 ERA (82 ER, 286.1 IP) with 272 strikeouts in 41 starts...he is 11-3 with a 2.67 ERA (46 ER, 155.0 IP) in 22 starts at Oakland Colisuem, including going 7-1 with a 2.24 ERA (24 ER, 96.1 IP) in his last 13 start at Oakland (dating back to 4/1/11)...went 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA (12 ER, 35.0 IP) in 5 starts in 2015. here is how Hernandez has fared against current Athletics 5 starts in 2015...here is how Hernandez has fared against current Athletics hitters:

YOUNG STRIKEOUTS

Felix recorded 2,148 career strike-outs before turning 30, the 4thmost by a pitcher before reaching 30 years of age: Walter Johnson (2,302), Sam McDowell (2,271), Bert Blyleven (2,250), Felix Hernandez (2,148), Nolan Ryan (2,085).

2,000 STRIKEOUTS

Felix recorded his 2,000th career strikeout May 10, 2015 vs. OAK (29.032), becoming the 4th-youngest pitcher to reach the 2,000-strike-out mark behind Blyleven (28.097), Sam McDowell (28.228) and Walter Johnson (28.235), and ahead of Nolan Rvan (29.213).

AN APRIL TO REMEMBER ... Felix went 2-2 with a 1.38 ERA (5 ER, 32.2 IP) ir 5 starts in the month of April...during the month he limited opponents to a .165 (19x115), while walking 18 and striking out 28...his 1.38 ERA is the 2nd-lowest in club history in the month of April, trailing only Floyd Bannister's 1.21 ERA in April in 1980...his .165 average was also the 2nd-lowest in April in club history, trailing only Hisashi Iwakuma's .160 opponent average set in 2013.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN... Dating back to 2014, Felix is 13-8 with a 3.02 ERA (72 ER, 214.2 IP) in 34 starts on the road...during this stretch his 2.99 ERA is currently the 6th-lowest in the American League, while his 218 strikeouts are the 4th-most...overall is 67-53 with a 3.17 ERA (392 ER, 1114.2 IP) in 169 career starts on the road...since 2005 on the road, leads the Majors in strikeouts (1,027), 3rd in ERA and innings pitched, 5th wins.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS...recorded his 35th career double-digit strikeout performance on April 10 vs. the Athletics...since 2005, ranks T4th (also: Johan Santana) in double-digit strikeout outings behind only Clayton Kershaw, LAD - 45, Max Scherzer, WAS - 36 and Tim Lincecum - 36.

THE FELIX QUALITY START...since 2009, Felix Hernandez has recorded 54 starts where he has thrown at least 8.0 innings and allowed 1 or fewer runs...that total is most among starting pitchers, ahead of Clayton Kershaw (52) and Cliff Lee (42)...the next closest AL pitchers (all starts in AL) is David Price and Justin Verlander with 28...has 91 GS of 7.0+ IP allowing 1 or fewer runs, most in baseball since 2009 (Kershaw-86).

PRIDE OF VENEZUELA...has 2,295.0 MLB innings, the most by Venezuelan-born pitcher, passing Freddy Garcia (2,264.0)...Felix already has the strikeout record by Venezuelan (2,170), and his 145 wins rank 2nd behind Garcia (156).

JUST GET HIM 3...since 2013 when receiving at least 3 runs of support, Felix is 39-2 with a 2.16 ERA (59 ER, 245.1 IP) in 48 starts...by contrast, is 8-25, 3.40 ERA (129 ER, 341.0 IP) in 53 starts where he received 2 or fewer runs of support...since 2013, Felix's 4.23 RSA is the 9th-lowest among Al starters.

30 STARTS IN 2015...Felix made his 30th start of the season on Sept. 20 vs. TEX, his 10th consecutive season with at least 30 starts...1 of only 2 players with an active streak of 10-straight seasons with 30+ starts, joining Dan Haren (11)...1 of 6 active players to have 10 or more seasons with 30+ starts.

200.0 IN 2015...Felix tossed 201.2 innings in 2015, his 8th straight 200.0 IP season, T1st in the Majors since 2008 (J. Shields)...his 8 200.0-inning seasons are most in club history (J. Moyer, 7 & R. Johnson, 6).

HE JUST WINS ... Felix won 18 games in 2015, marking his 7th straight season with at least 10 wins and his 9th 10+-win season in his career... his 7 straight seasons with at least 10 wins is currently T4th-longest among active pitchers: John Lackey (12, 2003-c), James Shields (9, 2007-c), Zack Greinke (8, 2008-c) and David Price (7, 2009-c)...he is also 1 of 8 active pitchers with at least 9 seasons with at least 10 wins.
