OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-16) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (16-11)

SATURDAY, MAY 7, 2016 — ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS — 1:05 P.M. EDT / 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP RICH HILL (3-3, 2.53) VS. RHP MIKE WRIGHT (1-2, 5.18) / RHP JESSE HAHN (1-0, 0.00) VS. RHP UBALDO JIMENEZ (1-3, 5.20) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Seattle in a three-game series to close out the last homestand and now have a season-high tying four-game losing streak (April 11-15)...are 0-4 in May and are the only Major League team that is winless this month...have lost nine of the last 12 games after winning a season-high six straight contests from April 16-22...are a season-high tying three games under .500 at 13-16 (also 4-7 on April 15)...that is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...are tied for third in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 4 games...have spent one day in sole possession of first place this year, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, eight days in third, four days tied for third, four days in fourth and three days tied for fourth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost three of their last four games by one run and are now 5-6 in one-run decisions... are tied for the American League lead in one-run games, are tied for third in wins and tied for fourth in losses...are 5-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra inning games and are tied for second in the AL in extra inning wins...are 3-0 when the game is tied after seven innings and 4-1 when it is tied after eight innings.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 16 hits Wednesday against Seattle...surrendered 41 hits in the three-game series against the Mariners, which were their most hits a three-game series since allowing 43 against Texas from Sept. 9-11, 2011...now have a 5.46 ERA (68 er in 112.0 ip) and .284 (124-for-437) opponents batting average over the last 13 games after posting a 2.69 ERA and .231 opponents average over the first 16 contests...rank sixth in the American League in strikeouts (231) and walks (92)...are tied for third in pickoffs (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 7.14 ERA (50 er in 63.0 ip) and .313 (81-for-259) opponents batting average over the last 12 games after going 6-5 with a 2.88 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over the first 17 contests...are 8-13 for the season, and the losses are tied for fourth most in the American League...are tied for the second most walks (70) and home runs allowed (22).

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs on Wednesday after tallying eight runs over the previous four games...are one of three Major League teams that have not been shutout (Colorado, Pittsburgh) and have a streak of 50 consecutive games with one or more runs scored, which is the longest active streak in the majors...are batting .217 (36-for-166) over the last five games after hitting .270 over the previous 10 contests...have a .287 on-base percentage, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Philadelphia, .282)...have the second fewest walks (68), third fewest doubles (37), and the fifth lowest batting average (.235) in the American League... however, are tied for the third most triples (5).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the last 13 games after making 15 over the first 16 contests...lead the American League and are tied for fourth in the majors in errors (21)...have nine unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...rank third in double plays (35).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a nine-game road trip to Baltimore (three games), Boston (three games) and Tampa Bay (three games) today after being postponed yesterday...this trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 in which the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to New York (3-0), Toronto (1-2) and Detroit (1-3) and are 8-5 (.615) on the road, which is the fourth best road record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last homestand against Houston (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 5-10 (.333) at home, which is the worst home record in the AL and third worst in the majors...are batting .254 (117-for-460) and are averaging 4.23 runs per game (55 runs in 13 games) on the road compared to .219 (114-for-521) with an average of 3.06 runs per game (49 runs in 16 games) at home... are averaging the second fewest runs per game at home in the AL and have the third lowest batting average.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's began the season by facing three consecutive left-handed starting pitchers but have faced righties in 24 of the last 26 games, including each of the last 11...are 12-12 (.500) in games started by a right-hander, 1-4 (.200) against lefties...the five games against left-

handed starters are tied for fourth fewest in the American League (Boston, Kansas City and Minnesota have four each).

WEATHER PERMITTING: Today will be the first doubleheader for the A's in exactly two years (May 7, 2014 vs. Seattle)...did not play a doubleheader last season....yesterday was the A's first rainout since April 4, 2014, at home against Seattle.

THIS AND THAT: This trip concludes a stretch that runs from April 19 to May 15 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of 25 games in the Eastern Time Zone...after the game in Tampa Bay on May 15, the A's will have just two more series in the Eastern Time Zone, both in Ohio (at Cincinnati, June 10-12; at Cleveland, July 29-31)...the A's are 8-4 on Friday, Saturday and Sunday compared to 5-12 from Monday through Thursday...have been successful in 4-of-6 (66.7%) replay challenges, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...the A's designated hitter has entered the game defensively five times this year...from 1996-2015, the A's had the DH enter the game on defense a total of 11 times...the last time they did it at least five times in a season was 1995 when it happened seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Danny Valencia from the disabled list yesterday, marking the first time they have reinstated a player from the DL this year...currently have seven players on the DL (H. Alvarez, R.J. Alvarez, Bassitt, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard) and have used the DL eight times this year...R.J. Alvarez, Doubront and Parker are on the 60-day DL...Henderson Alvarez is on a rehab assignment...used the DL 23 times last year, which matched the 2010 club for second most in Oakland history...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lost the season series last year for the second time in the last three years as they went 1-6 against the Orioles...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a four-game series at Baltimore...currently have a five-game losing streak, which is the A's longest against the Orioles since May 23, 1998-April 23, 1999, when they lost eight straight... have lost four straight in Baltimore, which matches the A's longest losing streak ever at Camden Yards (Sept. 11, 1993-April 26, 1994 and July 21, 1998-April 23, 1999)...are 7-13 against the Orioles over the previous three seasons...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-258 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-132 in Oakland and 128-126 in Baltimore...are 61-52 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 992-938 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

A scoring change has been made in the April 29 game against Houston...in the fourth inning, credit Correa with a stolen base and take away the caught stealing and error by **Yonder Alonso**...Alonso's 240 total chances are the most among American League first basemen with no errors...**Coco Crisp** is a .348 (49-for-141) career hitter at Camden Yards, which is the fifth highest batting average in this ballpark among players with 150 or more plate appearances...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .393 (22-for-56) over his last 16 games after hitting .209 over his first 12 contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play... it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 1991 Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he homers in the first, doubles in third, homers in the fourth, homers in the sixth for his club record tying third home run and then walks in the eighth inning with a chance for his fourth home run...he has seven RBI on the evening...in 1997 the A's and Milwaukee set a major league record for the longest 1-0 nine inning game...the Brewers win the game in 3 hours and 20 minutes, breaking the previous record of 3:07.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (3-3, 2.53 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS: Is 3-2 with a 2.15 ERA (7 er in 29.1 ip) and .219 (23-for-105) opponents batting average over his last five starts...has struck out 38 batters over that span (11.66 per nine innings)...allowed four runs, two earned, in 2.2 innings in his first start on April 4 against Chicago (AL), an Opening Day assignment where he replaced an ill Sonny Gray.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) and .185 (12-for-65) opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 0-3 with a 4.85 ERA (7 er in 13.0 ip) and .275 (14-for-51) opponents average in three starts at home...is now 4-1 with a 1.62 ERA (7 er in 39.0 ip) and .178 (24-for-135) opponents batting average in six starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those six starts and has fanned 54 in 39.0 road innings (12.46 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

STRIKEOUTS: Is tied for sixth in the American League in strikeouts (41)...37 of those came in April, which was the fifth best April total in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 137 strikeouts in 105.0 innings over the last four vears (11.74 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in most pitches per inning (18.3) and tied for seventh in unearned runs (3)...leads the majors in hit batters (5) and is tied for the lead among ML pitchers in errors (2).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.52 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA (6 er in 13.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed an earned run after the third inning (14.1 ip)...has a 4.58 ERA (9 er in 17.2 ip) in innings 1-3...opponents are batting .265 (18-for-68) over the first three innings and .167 (8-for-48) after that...has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 12 of his 13 walks to right-handed hitters...opponents are 1-for-13 (.077) with runners in scoring position and two outs.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...it will be his 11th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 5-4 with a 2.07 ERA (14 er in 61.0 ip) and .186 (40-for-215) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

FIRST START: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...tossed just 2.2 innings, which was the fourth shortest outing by an A's starter on Opening Day and the shortest since Barry Zito lasted 1.1 innings against New York (AL) in 2006...did not allow a run over the first two innings but then surrendered four runs, two earned, while recording just one out in the third...Eaton had a RBI triple and Rollins followed with a RBI single before two runs scored on a Canha error.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of lannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the second inning on a two-out solo home run by lannetta... blanked the Mariners on two hits, a walk and a hit batter over his final four innings.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Kansas City April 15 in Oakland...yielded two runs in the first inning on a Cain RBI single and a double play...the A's got one of those runs back in the second but he allowed a RBI single to Morales in the third...was relieved by Rodriguez after tossing 106 pitches in 4.1 innings.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed a RBI single to Hicks in the second inning but the A's tied the game in the fourth...yielded another run on a Romine RBI single in the bottom of the fourth but the A's tied the game in the fifth and scored twice in the seventh to give him the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Detroit May 1...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and did not walk a batter...allowed just

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston last Sunday in Oakland...allowed just two hits but issued four walks in six innings...yielded a home run to Altuve to start the game and Rasmus had a sacrifice fly in the third inning...retired 10 of the final 11 batters he faced.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-2 with an 11.25 ERA in four spring training starts...also pitched in minor league games on March 20 and 25... issued 15 walks in 12.0 innings...the walks matched the most by an A's pitcher over the last 19 springs (Ron Mahay, 2000; Omar Olivares, 2000)... opponents hit .293 (12-for-41)...allowed 13 runs on 10 hits and 12 walks over his first three starts (7.2 ip, 15.26 ERA) before yielding two runs on two hits and three walks in his final start (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA).

2015 RECAP: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse in the Washington organization and finished it by going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA in four September starts with Boston...the starts were his first as a major leaguer since making 13 with Baltimore in 2009...struck out 36 batters in 29.0 innings (11.17 per nine innings) and walked just five for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.20... allowed a .141 batting average, including .138 with both of his home runs against right-handers compared to .158 against left-handers...yielded a 154 average with runners in scoring position...was signed by Washington to a minor league contract March 3 and started the season at Syracuse... was 2-2 with a 2.91 ERA in 25 relief appearances with the Chiefs when he was released June 24...went 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the Long Island Ducks of the independent Atlantic League before signing a minor league deal with Boston Aug. 14...compiled a 3-2 record and a 2.78 ERA in five starts with Triple-A Pawtucket before his promotion to Boston Sept. 8...combined for a 5-4 record and a 2.83 ERA in 30 games with Syracuse and Pawtucket...struck out 61 batters in 54.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (1-3, 4.40 ERA): Is 0-2 with an 8.18 ERA and .392 (20-for-51) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA and .159 opponents average over his first three starts...has allowed a career-high 10 hits in each of his last two starts after surrendering 10 hits total over his first three...has received no run support in two of his five starts and three runs of support in his other three...his season run support average is 2.20...has a 2.25 ERA over the first four innings, a 9.35 ERA from the fifth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Seattle last Monday in Oakland (6.1 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 7.59 ERA (10.2 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, including two starts, against Baltimore...went 1-2 with a 4.73 ERA and .253 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, this spring.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville a week ago today and made his 2016 debut that day against Houston...it was his 17th start as an Athletic and the 29th of his career...it was his first since July 1, 2015 against Colorado as he spent the final three months of the 2015 season on the disabled list with a strained right forearm...went 6-6 with a 3.35 ERA in 16 starts with the A's last year after going 7-4 with a 3.07 ERA in 14 games, 12 starts, in his Major League debut with San Diego in 2014...was traded to the A's following the 2014 season in a deal involving Derek Norris.

LAST START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston a week ago today in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh.
